## A SPECIAL ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE COUNTY CORRECTIONS FUND

WHEREAS, SEA 395, (1986) AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning corrections, added I.C. 11-12-6 to the Indiana Code to provide for the establishment and funding of a county corrections fund; and

WHEREAS, I.C. 11-12-6-6 provides that a county legislative body may annually adopt an ordinance to elect to receive deposits from the State Department of Correction and to establish a county corrections fund; and

WHEREAS, the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing on Monday, February 5, 1990 at 1:00 P.M. in the Commissioners' Room on the third floor of the Courthouse, and

WHEREAS, the county corrections fund may be used only for funding the operation of the county jail, jail programs, or other local correctional facilities; and WHEREAS, the county legislative body may elect to receive deposits at either Level 1, Level 2, or Level 3 funding; and

WHEREAS, Level 3 is the most appropriate level of participation for Hendricks County; therefore;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Hendricks County Board of Commissioners hereby elect to receive deposits

from the Department of Correction in accordance with I.C. 11-12-6.

SECTION 2. Hendricks County Board of Commissioners hereby elect to receive such deposits at Level 3 funding.

SECTION 3. There is hereby created a "county corrections fund", to be administered by the Hendricks County Council. The fund shall consist of deposits received from the Department of Correction in accordance with I.C. 11-12-6.

SECTION 4. The County Corrections fund may be used only for funding the operation of the county jail, jail programs, ot other local correctional facilities. Any money remaining in a county corrections fund at the end of the year does not revert to any other fund but remains in the county corrections fund.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage.

- 3. A description of the boundaries of each precinct established is attached hereto, made a part hereof and marked exhibits A001 through A069 and which are on file for inspection in the office of the county engineer, the county clerk; and county auditor.
- 4. The estimated number of voters in each precinct established by this Order is set out in exhibits B001 through B069 attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference and which are on file for inspection in the office of the county engineer. the county clerk and the county auditor.
- 5. That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date specified by the State Election Board or on the first date permitted under I.C. 3-11-1.5-25 if no effective date is specified by the State Election Board.

## ORDINANCE 1990 - \_\_\_\_

ESTABLISHING A MORATORIUM ON THE PLACEMENT OF OFF-PREMISE SIGNS IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA

WHEREAS, Section 36-7-4-601 of the Indiana Code allows the County Commissioners to zone the unincorporated areas of the county and the right to regulate how real property is developed, maintained, and used; and

WHEREAS, an off-premise sign is defined as a sign which directs attention to a business commodity, service or entertainment conducted, sold or offered at a location other than the premises on which the sign is located; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Federal Highway Beautification Act of 1965 as implemented in Title 23, Code of Federal Regulations to control outdoor advertising signs in order to protect the public investment in highways, to promote the safety and recreational value of public travel, and to preserve natural beauty; and

WHEREAS, the State of Indiana has entered into an agreement with the U.S. Department of Transportation to carry out National Policy Relative to Control of Outdoor Advertising in Areas Adjacent to the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways and the Federal-Aid Primary System; and

WHEREAS, the current Hendricks County Zoning Ordinance does not adequately address the regulation of off-premise signs in regard to the placement, size, or number of signs permitted; and

WHEREAS, Hendricks County is currently revising its Zoning Ordinance and the revised ordinance will include regulations controlling the placement of off-premise signs; and

WHEREAS, the Hendricks County Plan Commission in an advisory body to the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners for planning activities within the unincorporated area of the county; and

WHEREAS, The Hendricks County Plan Commission passed a resolution dated February 13, 1989 which recommended to the Board of County Commissioners that a moratorium on the placement of new, off-premise signs in the unincorporated areas of Hendricks County be established and should remain in effect until the revised Zoning Ordinance is adopted by the County Commissioners.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Board of Hendricks County Commissioners establish a moratorium on the placement of new, off-premise signs in the unincorporated areas of Hendricks County effective immediately. This moratorium will remain in effect until the revised Zoning Ordinance is adopted by the County Commissioners.

This Ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its passage and approved according to law.

If any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of this amendment shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this amendment.

## CABLE TELEVISION ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the Hendricks County Cable Television Ordinance.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance to provide good cable television pictures and service to the residents of Hendricks County. Indiana by the establishment of minimum standards for all persons and firms providing such services in Hendricks County. Indiana.

Section 3. Definitions. For the purpose of this ordinance the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations, shall have the meanings as set forth herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words in the present tense shall include the future tense; words in plural number shall include the singular number, and words in singular number shall include words in plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- (1) "County" shall mean Hendricks County, Indiana.
- (2) "Commission" shall mean all the Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, as a board.
- (3) "Commissioner" shall mean any one Commissioner of the County Commissioners of the County.

- (4) "Cable Company" shall mean any person or firm who transmits television signals, by any means, to residents of the County.
- (5) "Subscriber" shall mean any person or firm, resident in the County, who receives television signals from a Cable Company.
- (6) "Hearing Officer" shall mean any person who is appointed by the Commission to conduct an Administrative Hearing under this ordinance.

Section 4. Conformance. All television cable franchises, licenses, and ordinances granted by the Commission prior to the effective date of this ordinance are hereby modified to conform to the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 5. Franchise. All Cable Companies operating in the County shall be required to have a Television Cable Franchise executed by the Commission. Such Franchise shall have a definite termination date and shall be subject to the provisions of this ordinance. The Commission may impose any additional terms and conditions in the Franchise deemed by the Commission to be in the best interest of the residents of the County.

Section 6. Minimum Number of Channels. All Cable Companies operating in the County shall transmit at least thirty five (35) television channels to subscribers. Of those thirty five (35) channels at least two channels shall provide regular broadcasts of news and weather, and at least one of the thirty five channels shall provide pay per view broadcasts, and at least one of the thirty five channels shall be dedicated for community messages

that the Cable Company shall charge a reasonable fee for, or which the Cable Company shall provide free of charge.

Section 7. Signal Quality. The Cable Company shall transmit, in color or in black and white, as broadcast by the Broadcaster, television pictures, undistorted from ghost images, with good sound. The signal must be transmitted with adequate strength to produce good pictures with good sound at all outlets without causing cross modulation in the cables, or interference with other electrical or electric systems. The Cable Companies shall be prepared to demonstrate to a subscriber that a signal of adequate strength and quality to provide a good picture and good sound is being delivered to that subscriber's residence.

Section 8. Free Services. All Cable Companies shall offer free basic cable service to all schools when the Cable Company's cable lines pass said facilities or when cable services are offered to properties adjoining said facilities.

Section 9. Discrimination. All Cable Companies shall offer their services at the same price to all residents of the County, except that the Cable Companies may modify charges for installation of their system to individual residents. Nothing herein contained shall prohibit a Cable Company from offering a "special" service program to all members of a specific neighborhood or section of the County in the quest of increasing the Cable Company's subscriber base in that neighborhood or section of the County.

Section 10. Maintenance. The Cable Companies operating in the County shall maintain, at their own expense, adequate service and repair facilities in such a manner that all subscriber service calls are responded to within seventy two (72) hours of the receipt of notice of an outage, and within one hundred and twenty (120) hours of the receipt of a service call for service other than an outage. At the request of the subscriber who has suffered an outage, the Cable Company shall credit the account of such subscriber for a prorated daily sum representing the number of days the subscriber's service was out as compared to the total monthly basic service rate paid by the subscriber. Exempted from the provisions of this paragraph are outages caused by acts of god, or acts of any third persons over whom the Cable Company has no control. Subscribers shall have the right to execute a written waiver of the provisions of this Section. Any such waiver shall be for any one incident and the Cable Company shall not require subscribers to execute a standing or continuous waiver.

Section 11. Hearings. A subscriber who feels a Cable Company has violated the provisions of this ordinance shall have the right to submit a formal letter of complaint therefor with the Commission. The Commission shall give written notice to the Cable Company of such complaint, together with a copy of the letter of complaint. The Cable Company shall have thirty days from the date of the written notice from the Commission to resolve the complaint and give written evidence to the Commission

that such complaint has been resolved. The Cable Company shall have the right to dispute the claim of complaint by filing a written notice therefor with the Commission, and requesting a formal hearing to determine whether or not a violation of this ordinance has occurred. The Cable Company may request that either a Commissioner conduct the hearing, or that a Hearing Officer conduct the hearing. In the event the Cable Company requests a Hearing Officer then the Cable Company shall submit the sum of \$300 per day plus the sum of \$300 for a report, for each day estimated by the Cable Company to present its evidence. with its request. Said sums may be modified from time to time by the Commission so that the expense of engaging a Hearing Officer or of conducting the hearing shall be borne by the Cable Company. The hearing shall follow the rules of evidence except that hearsay evidence shall be admissible except that' no recommendation or findings of fact shall be based solely upon hearsay evidence.

The Hearing shall be conducted within thirty days of the request of hearing filed by the Cable Company, unless the Commission shall grant a continuance for additional time as may be requested by the Cable Company. The report and recommendation of the hearing by a Hearing Officer or by a Commissioner shall be in writing, and shall be delivered to the Commission who shall then determine what, if any, violation has occurred and the appropriate penalty, if any, which should be levied. In the event of a claim of a violation of this ordinance not filed by a subscriber, all

the provisions of this section shall apply except that provision requiring a written notice from a subscriber. In the event the Cable Company fails to file evidence of resolution of a complaint within the period provided for herein, or fails to request a hearing as set forth herein, the Commission shall proceed to accept the complaint as though it was verified by a hearing, and shall proceed accordingly.

Section 12. Violations. A Cable Company who is determined to have violated the provisions of this ordinance shall be penalized by fine, loss of franchise, or both fine and loss of franchise. A fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per day for each day of outage, or a fine not to exceed the total sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) in the event of a violation other than an outage, shall be the maximum penalty for the first violation of a Cable Company within a twelve month period. 'The finding of a second violation by the same Cable Company violating the same provision of this ordinance within the same twelve month period shall be a maximum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) per day for each day of outage, or a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) in the event of a violation other than an outage. The finding of a third violation of the same provision of this ordinance within a twelve month period shall bear the same maximum penalties as the second violation except that the Cable Company committing such third violation within said period may further include the penalty of a probationary franchise status for the balance of the same twelve month period. A subsequent

violation of the same provision of this ordinance within the same twelve month period shall give the Commission the right to revoke the franchise of the Cable Company effective one hundred twenty days from the date of any such order.

Section 13. Assignments. The television franchises granted by the Commission have not been granted for the purposes of speculation or resale, but rather to provide the residents of the County with good television cable service. The Television Cable Franchises granted by the County are not, therefore, transferable without the specific, written consent of the Commission. The Commission shall deny any consent to assignment unless the assignee, or purchaser of the franchise can clearly demonstrate to the Commission that the assignee or purchaser has a financial capability to operate the system being acquired, and a sufficient service capability to service the system being acquired. Any such approval of assignment by the Commission shall be in writing, prepared by the Cable Company in a form approved by County Counsel.

Section 14. Television Cable Board. The Commission shall have the right to create a Television Cable Board consisting of at least two residents of the County who are television cable subscribers, and two persons who are employed by television cable companies who may or may not be operating in the County, and one Commissioner. In the event of the creation of such a Television Cable Board, said group shall make recommendations to the Commission regarding Cable Companies, and

members of said Board, except for the Commissioner, may be utilized as Hearing Officers pursuant to this ordinance.

Section 15. Towns and Cities. Any incorporated towns and cities within the County shall have the election to submit their town or city to the jurisdiction of this ordinance. Unless a written notice is received from said town or city to be subject to the jurisdiction of this ordinance then all incorporated towns and cities within the County shall be exempted from this ordinance. In the event of an election from a town or city within the County to be within the jurisdiction of this ordinance any revenue received by the town or city from Cable Companies shall continue to be paid to said towo or city by said Cable Company.

Section 16. Pre-Existing Franchises. All Cable Companies operating within the County under franchise, license, or ordinance prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall have a period of twelve months to conform to the provisions of this ordinance. Failure of any such Cable Company to so conform, subject to the right of the Commission to grant a time extension, shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

Section 17. Expiration or Termination of Franchise. Upon expiration or termination of a Cable Television Franchise, and the failure of the Commission to renew said Franchise, all lines and equipment of the former Franchisee shall either be removed by the franchisee on or before the termination date of the Franchise

or such lines and equipment shall become the property of the County. Equipment, as referred to herein shall be limited to equipment attached to said lines. The former Franchisee shall give written notice to the Commission of it's intent concerning said lines no later than sixty days prior to the expiration date of the Franchise, or sixty days prior to the effective termination date of the Franchise. The Commission shall not have the right to refuse to renew a Franchise without good cause.

Section 18. Exemptions. Exempted from the provisions of this ordinance are the signals from any television broadcaster located in the State of Indiana, broadcasting one television signal under a license issued therefor by the Federal Communications Commission of the United States of America.

Section 19. Rate Increases. Television Cable Companies operating in the County shall be prohibited from increasing their rate for basic cable service more than once in any calendar year without the consent of the Commission.

Section 20. Interpretation of Law. In the event any portion of this ordinance should be deemed to be unconstitutional or otherwise in violation of law, then that specific portion of this ordinance shall be stricken and the balance of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

## ORDINANCE FOR ENDORSEMENT FEE FOR PLAT BOOKS

WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code 36-2-9-18(d), the Auditor of Hendricks County may collect a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each real property endorsement made by the Auditor; and

WHEREAS, said sum collected shall be placed in a dedicated fund for the use of maintaining plat books; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana is the governing body for said Auditor and County; and

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana agree that such fee shall be collected;

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED that in accordance with Indiana Code 36-2-9-18(d), the Auditor of Hendricks County, Indiana may collect a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each real property endorsement made by the Auditor of Hendricks County, Indiana.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that such fee shall in addition to any other fee provided by law and shall be placed in a dedicated fund for the use of maintaining plat books.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Auditor of Hendricks County, Indiana shall have the authority to collect a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each real property endorsement made by that office. Such fee shall be in addition to any other fee provided by law and shall be placed in a dedicated fund for the use of maintaining plat books.

# ORDINANCE 1990 - 18

# HENDRICKS COUNTY PLAN COMMISSION PLANNING AUTHORITY IN THE TOWN OF NORTH SALEM, INDIANA

WHEREAS, the Town of North Salem needs assistance in comprehensive planning, zoning enforcement, and issuing building permits and does not have the staff or financial resources to provide these services;

WHEREAS, Section 36-7-4-410 of the Indiana Code permits any municipality located in a county having an advisory plan commission as the municipal plan commission;

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Trustees of North Salem has by ordinance dated May 1, 1990, designated the Hendricks County Plan Commission as the municipal plan commission for the Town of North Salem.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT:

Section 1: The Board of Hendricks County Commissioners do hereby empower and authorize the Hendricks County Plan Commission to exercise and enforce within the boundaries of the Town of North Salem the same planning powers and duties as may be exercised by them in the unincorporated area of the county pursuant to Indiana Code 36-7-4-400. These powers and duties include:

- (a) The development and implementation of a comprehensive development plan;
- (b) The adoption, amendment and enforcement of a zoning ordinance and zoning regulations;
- (c) The adoption, amendment and enforcement of a subdivision control ordinance and regulations for the platting or replatting of subdivided land;
- (d) The provision for any required permits for location of buildings, structures, or uses, and the imposition and collection, for the benifit of the county, of any applicable permit fees or other related fees as may from time to time be fixed and assessed from persons in the unincorporated area.
- (e) The development of public ways, thoroughfares and streets.

(f) The laying out and development of public ways and services to platted and unplatted lands.

Section 2: In accordance with Indiana Code 36-7-4-410(b), residents of the Town of North Salem are eligible to be appointed citizen members of the Hendricks County Advisory Plan Commission.

Section 3: The provisions of this ordinance are effective until such time as they are amended or repealed by the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners or until such time as the Town Council of the Town of North Salem serves written notice to the Hendricks county Board of Commissioners that they no longer want the County to exercise and enforce planning powers within the Town.

This Ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its passage and approved according to law.

If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this amendement shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of this amendment.
