Thomas Post of Indianapolis came by train to Danville and after partaking of supper prepared for them, repaired to the Court House where were assembled some fifty or more soldiers who were regularly mustered into the "Grand Army of the Republic". After which the election of Officers was as follows;

Then there was an old fashioned "love feast" the usual camp songs &c &c when the New Post escorted the visitors to the Rail Road and bid them "good bye" and "God bless you!"

strous and brutal crimes of John M. Yoare - a Trustee of the Soldiers Orphans Home - against the inmates of that institution.

2^d That a decent respect for the moral and patriotic impulse of the State and a just duty due to the memories of the deceased soldiers and fathers of the victims - demand that the proper judicial authorities take notice of said crimes and punish the perpetrators to the extent of the law.

3rd That we view the criminal connivance and negligence of John W. White Superintendent of said Home with inexpressible indignation and most heartily endorse the recommendation for his removal from office.

4th That it is an insult to the Soldiers - dead and alive and disreputable to the great State of Indiana - in the sense of public benevolence and charity to associate those orphaned by the war, under the same roof, room, and management with feeble minded children, and a just recognition of the services rendered by the Soldiers, demand their complete and immediate separation.

5th That our Senator and Representatives in the General Assembly are hereby requested to use their best endeavors to secure the enactment of a law, at the present session, separating the Soldiers Orphans Home from the Asylum for Feeble Minded Children.

6th That a copy of these Resolutions be forwarded forth with to the Commander of the Department of Indiana G.A.R., and to each, our Senator and Representative for their information.

In qualities of courage patriotism, faithfulness to duty and fidelity to comrades few soldiers were the equal and perhaps none the superior of our late lamented comrade William N. Pierson.

Pension Bureau Procedure Liberalized By Secretary Work

It is apparent that while Secretary Work stands for economy in Government, he does not believe it should be at the expense of the defenders of the Nation. Following his order saving to pensioners the expenditure of more than \$200,000 yearly for the execution of vouchers, he has approved instructions of Commissioner Gardner to the Medical Referee of the Bureau looking to more liberal treatment for the disabled applicant for pension. The instructions, which embody the present-time spirit of the administrative officers of the Bureau toward those who held themselves willing to make the supreme sacrifice, follows:

Department of the Interior, Bureau of Pensions,
Washington, Aug. 13, 1923.

Office of the Commissioner.

The Medical Referee:

Examining surgeons are employed and paid by the Government and perform their official duties under their oaths of office. It is presumed that their duty has been properly performed in the absence of evidence to the contrary and due consideration should be given to their findings. If these are to be lightly set aside, their employment becomes a waste of money and should be abolished.

It is the duty of these examining surgeons as defined by the act of Sept. 22, 1922, to "specifically and accurately set forth the physical condition of the claimant and include a full description of every existing disability." As an aid to the proper performance of this duty, they have an approved book of instructions which, if followed, should produce satisfactory examinations. Unless a "satisfactory report" is made, payment for services rendered is in violation of law.

If the certificate of examination is accepted and paid for, the presumption obtains that this record is correct and directly states what the law prescribes said record shall contain. Certificates that lack essential and material information should be amended or supplemented. It is highly important that those charged with the determination of the medical side of claims should see that the findings of the examining surgeons are sufficient to serve the purpose for which intended under the law.

If examining surgeons report that they find no disability, nothing on which to base a rating, or if they make some report adverse to the claim under consideration, the claim should, in the absence of evidence to the contrary, be rejected. If evidence

In Memory

The undersigned, a committee appointed by Silcox Lodge No. 123, I. O. F. and Jesse S. Ogden Post 164 G. A. R. Department of Indiana, to prepare a memorial sketch of our deceased brother and Comrade, John L. Wilhoite, respectfully report the following:

John L. Wilhoite was born in Owen county, Kentucky, on the 27th day of September, 1829. He was married to Mary E. Terry, June 18th, 1854, in Owen county, Kentucky, by Rev. Labas Wilhoite. He enlisted in the service of the United States at eminence, Kentucky, on the 7th day of August, 1862, in Company C, 9th Regiment of Kentucky Cavalry Volunteers and was made First Sergeant. On the 8th day of October, 1861, at Lawrenceburg, Kentucky, while engaged in battle with a portion of Bragg's army, and making a charge with his company, his horse was shot under him and fell on him, he being unable to extricate himself until the horse was taken off of him by his comrades. By this he was severely injured in his left leg, hip and back, which was the cause of his death. After receiving this injury he was unable to perform much duty in the fall and winter following, but the exposure of camp life following the injury so much disabled him that in the early spring he was unable to go with his company and was left at a private house to be nursed and treated, his wife riding two hundred miles on horseback to go to him and nurse him. On becoming able to ride he again joined his Company and soon after they began the pursuit of John Morgan's forces and continued throughout his raid through Ohio and Indiana, until his capture, at which time they had been in the saddle twenty-two days, and were almost worn out.

He was discharged from said service on the 8th day of August, 1863, when he went back to Owen county, Kentucky to reside, but was so badly persecuted on account of his services to the Government that he removed from there in the spring of 1864, arriving here May 14. On the 22nd day of November 1865, he was initiated into Odd Fellowship in Silcox Lodge No. 123, at this place and was Past Noble Grand at the time of his death, being Grand Representative elect and would have served as such at the next communication.

On the 27th day of April, 1883, he was mustered into Jesse S. Ogden Post No. 164, G. A. R. at city organization. He was confined to his bed from his injuries October 2nd, 1889 and died October 24 1889, at 11:30 p. m.

He joined the Baptist Church in Owen county Kentucky, in September, 1859, removed his membership to the Missionary Baptist Church here in 1864 where he continued it until the organization ceased to exist, and two years ago last Easter Sunday connected himself with the Christian Church at this place.

Brother Wilhoite was an earnest Christian, unostentious and kind, brave as a soldier, and lived and died with the good will of all who knew him. His funeral was largely attended, the ceremonies having been performed by the members of Silcox Lodge No. 123, I. O. F., and Jesse S. Ogden Post No. 164, G. A. R., jointly on the 27th day of October, 1889, the Daughters of Rebecca, Woman's Corps and Sons of Veterans attending in a body.

Served eighteen months as brigade orderly—was captured at Welden railroad Sept. 1864, confined at Salisbury, N. C., exchanged and mustered out of the service, March 2nd, 1865.

He was a brave and faithful soldier—seldom sick—never despondent, and it was his abundance of good cheer and fidelity to duty that attracted the attention of Gen. Doubleday, who caused him to be detailed as brigade orderly, in which capacity he soon won the confidence and esteem of everyone about headquarters and by prompt and accurate discharge of duty continued to hold the place till Doubleday was gone and Gen. Rice, his successor killed and but two of the old staff remained for duty.

As a citizen he was a good neighbor, a good friend, a hater of deceit, a useful member of society, an aggressive enemy to all forms of immorality, an independent and positive thinker and ever ready to maintain his views on all current questions.

His recollection of army movements and army incidents was marvelous and as an entertaining and accurate conversationalist upon these topics, our Post has sustained an irreparable loss.

Comrade Lewis died of heart failure, March 14th, 1891.

The attention of the Commander-in-chief has been called to the fact that Conrads Waring the badge and uniform of the grand Army of the Republic participated in a recent demonstration where the confederate flag was carried and displayed.

For four long years you braved all the perils and vicissitudes of war to wipe out all that that flag represented. When your great work was accomplished the grand Union Armies had become the most powerful and effective the world had ever seen. They melted away like the snow on the hill tops under the beams of a noonday sun. you resumed the peaceful vocations of civil life, and the nation resumed once more its career of unparalleled progress, prosperity and happiness. There never was in the history of any civilized warfare such magnanimity evinced towards a foe, as the terms of the surrender of Lee's army at Appomattox. We had learned to admire the gallantry of the men we had vanquished as only men could admire them who had tested their endurance and valor upon many bloody battle-fields. When they laid down their arms we sought peace; we reached out the right hand of fellowship to all who would accept it on the broad grounds of American citizenship and unconditional loyalty. The contest had cost us untold millions of dollars and the lives of thousands of the bravest and the best who marched under the stars and stripes down into the jaws of death. not for a party or a creed for men of all

opinions and affiliations gave up their lives to save the nation from disruption and the flag from dishonor. To-day the same flag which floats over and protects the conquerors protects equally as well the conquered.

We admire the spirit which prompts the people of the South to commemorate the gallantry of the men who sacrificed their lives in the lost cause; but that civil conflict settled one great question, the battle for the union was right, the doctrine of Secession was wrong, and the Stars and Stripes, the emblem of liberty, equal rights, justice and law, is the only flag which the loyal people of this great nation respect and honor.

We saved our children the contest that they would have been compelled to encounter. We have given them a heritage of peace and prosperity instead of an enormous and expensive litigation to be settled by a jury of soldiers, and to-day every American citizen is in the full enjoyment of the fruits of our great labors.

We cannot afford to lose sight of the valor that achieved victory for the right. We can never forget what the contest cost us in blood and treasure. We must not forget that loyalty to country is not a mere sentiment, but that it requires a devotion to principle and that principle means that the flag which every Union soldier stood ready to defend with his life must now be saluted with honor. One of the great principles of our organizations is to teach the rising generations loyalty and fidelity to duty.

The Union soldiers have repeatedly said to the soldiers of the South: "We have no desire to arouse sectional animosities or passions engendered by the war."

give us loyalty and in return we will give you Fraternity." You have demonstrated your fraternity numerous occasions, but when comrades joined in the recent ceremonies in honor of the memory of a patriotic Southern journalist and Philanthropist, they found their fraternity confronted with the emblem of treason," which is an evidence to you that there lurks in the hearts of a few, a desire, by the display of that flag to fire the hearts of the young generation of the South to rebellion.
