

the Revised Laws of the State of Indiana of 1831
the Board of County Commissioners for the
County of Hendricks; Alexander McCalmant
appeared and produced a certificate of his Elec-
tion to the office of County Commissioner from
the first Commissioner District for the term
of three years. Reuben Claypool also appeared
and produced a certificate of Election to the
same office from the the third Commissioner
District for the term of one year: Thereupon
Board was helden at the Court house in Dan-
ville on Monday the fifth of September 1831
Mr. Alexander McCalmant and Reuben Clay-
pool. Unanimously agreed and Order-
ed that Alexander McCalmant be appointed
President of this Board.

A Petition is now presented by John H. Bryant and others for a County Road to connect Stilesville thence in a northerly direction by way of John M. Smiths Horse-mill on the best and best ground to intersect the road leading from Danville to Crawfordsville which is received and James T. Hadley, Grass Nichols and Dickerson Thompson are appointed to view a route for said road and report to the Board according to Law.

A Petition is now presented by Robert Tomlinson for leave to turn so much of the County road as angles his land which is received and Levi Cook, Charles Reynolds and James Pittman are appointed to view said road and proposed route and report to the session of County Commissioners as the Law directs.

Whereas at the last session of General Assembly of the State of Indiana George Miller was appointed Road Commissioner on two several State Roads in this County and he the said Miller has wholly neglected to qualify and act as such Commissioner it is therefore hereby ordered by this Board that James T. Hadley be appointed to fill the vacancy of said Miller and that he be clothed with all the powers as fully and clearly relative to the appointment as the said Miller was in his appointment of said road Commissioner.

Edward Strange School Commissioner produced to this Board a report which is ordered by said Board to be filed.

Ordered that James Green be allowed fifty cents for making the returns of Election from Liberty Township at the last annual Election.

Ordered that William McCalmar be appointed Constable in Washington Township and that he file in his Bond in the Clerks office in the sum of Five hundred Dollars with sufficient security before entering on the duties of his office.

Ordered that David Statesman be appointed supervisor in place of Jasper Vidito who requested to be released and that Statesman work the same district of road and same hands that the said Vidito was to have done.

Ordered that an election be held in Franklin township for the purpose of electing a justice of the peace for said Township on the second Monday in the next.

and referred to next meeting of the Board of
Commissioners.

Charles Westrees now application ^{for leave to}
turn so much of County road leading from Danville
to Mowsville as angles his land and therewith
Samuel Givim Jacob Waggoner and Philip Horn
were appointed to examine into the expediency
thereof and report to the next Board.

A petition presented by J. C. Julien and
others at the last Board of County Commissioners
for disannulling so much of the County road
leading from Danville to Indianapolis as lies
within this County and south of the state
road was again read and no objection thereto
being made it is therefore ordered by this
Board that said road be disannulled.

John C. Julien and Thomas Nichols having
each this day produced to the Board a certificate
of good moral character Ordered therefore that
the said Julien and Nichols be authorized and
licensed to open houses of entertainment and
retail spirituous liquors at their establishment
in Danville on their further and full com-
pliance with statute of Indiana in such
cases made and provided.

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September Term A.D. 1831

Ordered that Isaac Williams be appointed Constable in Centre Township and that before entering on the duties thereof he file his Bond in the Clerk office in the sum of Five hundred Dollars.

Ordered that J. C. Julian Be allowed Ten Dollars 87 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents for Holding an inquest over the dead ^{body} of an infant found in the town of Danville and for furnishing Burial ^{etc} for said infant and also for paying off all ^{cost} that accrued about said inquest.

Ordered that Samuel McPheters rebuild the Estray pen in Danville so as to be sufficient to hold Estray also to supply the gate of said pen with a good lock and attend to said pen or pound as the Law requires a pound keeper to do the said repair to be done by the first Monday in October next.

Ordered that Duran Mauzey furnish the Court house in Danville with good sufficient and neat conductors and figure heads and that he be allowed the sum of fifty nine Dollars for the same due and payable on the first of January 1832.

Ordered that the Sheriff of Hendricks County notify James L. Givan and Thomas Hunter former Agents of said County to attend at the next Board of County Commissioners for the purpose of making settlement with the County as there appears to us of Record to be a balance in their hands.

Ordered that Thomas Nichols be allowed Nine Dollars for house rents making Election return to Martinsville repairing the jail house steps and fifty rents he spaid out in sending for an affluat Judge at April Term of Circuit Court

September & November 1831

Ordered that the Sheriff forthwith sell the property left in his hands by Tyrol Winters who was confined in the County Jail and who has made his escape therefrom and that the proceeds arising from the sale thereof be made use of to defray the expense of said Winters whilst in jail.

November Term A.D. 1831

At the November Term of the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hen- dricks began and held at Danville on the 1st day of November 1831.

Present Sieuben Claypool Jacob Hen- drick also came forward and produced a certificate of his election to the office of County Commis- sioner from the second Commissioner District for the term of two years. A Board was then held by the said Claypool and Hendrick
Ordered that Sieuben Claypool be ap- pointed president pro tem.

Ordered that the Clerk of this board issue a license to John S. Hardesty to retail spirituous Liquors and foreign & domestic Groceries in this County for one year from this date.

Ordered that Issa Ash be licensed to retail foreign and Domestic merchan- dice in this County for one year from and after this date. Ordered that from the report of the Viewers Chales vertrees be allowed to turn the County Road as requested for by him at last Board.

November Term A.D. 1831

The viewers appointed at the last board of County Commissioners to examine into the expediency of turning much of the County Road as aughts the Land of Robert Tomlinson Report that they have attended thereto and believe it would be of great advantage to said Tomlinson for the road to be turned as petitioned for and that the publick would not be injured thereby Ordered therefore that said Tomlinson be left at liberty to turn said road.

Ordered that Absalom Snoddy, Jeremiah Stiles, and James Walls be appointed Trustees of the school section in Township fourteen north of Range two West.

Ordered that James Anderson be allowed two Dollars sixty two cents it being due him on account of a list of illegal assessments filed by him for 1830.



The undersigned Commissioner of the Greensburg and Clinton State Roads, in compliance with an act of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana entitled An Act for the relocation of part of the Greensburg and Clinton State Roads Approved January 29th 1831 did on the 21st day of November 1831 proceed to make said relocation that part of which situated in Hendricks County is as follows, to wit; Beginning on the line dividing the Counties of Morgan and Hendricks and running thence S $44^{\circ} 16' 35''$ W. 57 chains and 50 links to mile post No 52 — Thence same course 2 chains and 50 links to the South end of Hendricks Street in the Town of Stilesville, thence with said Street N. 20^o 30' W 7 chains and 50 links to the Cumberland Road, thence with said Road S. 69^o 30' W. 70 chains to mile post No 51. Thence with said Road 62 chains and 15 links to where said State Road leaves it in a direction to Clinton Distances taken in four pole chains and links and plotted by a scale of 11 chains to an inch.

commonly called Avinckupois Weight and sealed with
the initials letters of County inscribed thereon.

of County Seminary Filed 1832

Know all men by these presents that we George Faught P.S. Dicken and John Nichols are held and firmly bound unto the state of Indiana for the use of the Hendricks County seminary in the penal sum of six hundred Dollars lawful money for the true payment of which we do by these presents bind ourselves our heirs &c jointly and severally as witness our hand and seals this 27th day of February A.D. 1832
