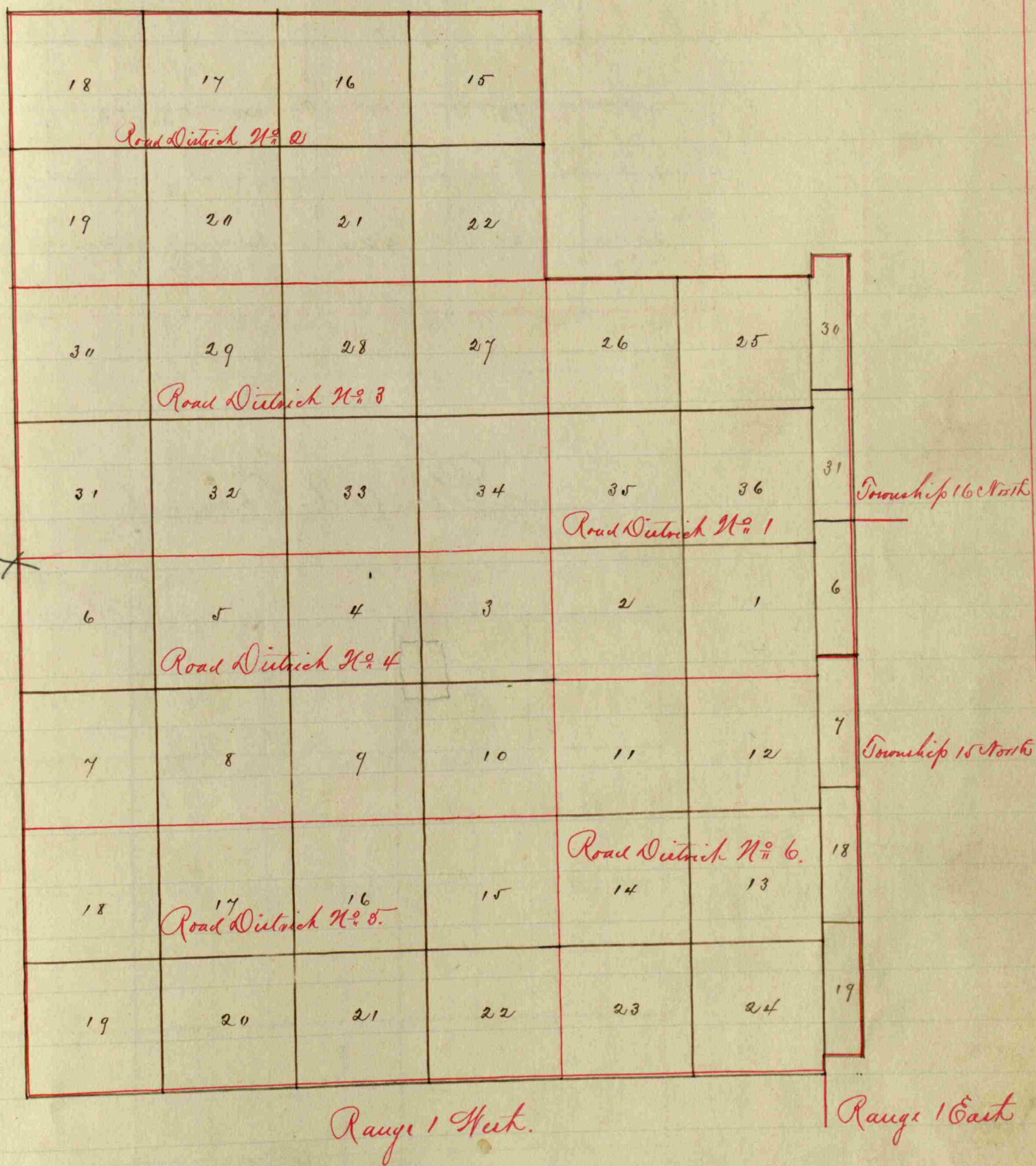

All post mortem examinations and other surgical Operations, and services rendered, not specified above, must be in proportion to the above fees, and must be proven to the satisfaction of the Board.

No allowance will be made for more than one visit or prescription of the same date, rendered any one patient, except in case of extreme necessity, proven to the satisfaction of the Board.

Every medical account must have Affidavit attached, setting forth, that the services were rendered as set out, and that it was absolutely necessary, and must be carefully itemized and the dates given, and must be shown to be by the order of the Trustees having charge of the same.

All goods, groceries and other articles furnished for use of the poor of the different Townships must be by the written order of the Trustees having charge of the same. All such accounts presented for allowance by the Board, must be carefully itemized, dates given, and totals made separately for each party to whom relief was given.
