



In the matter of the petition of Everett Hopkins et. al. for the tiling of the Elias Lovett drain in Brown Township, Hendricks County, Indiana, would respectfully report that after first being duly qualified as the law directs and after viewing personally all of the lands and highways that would be affected by the tiling of said drain that they are of the opinion that the same can be accomplished at an expense less than the aggregate benefits to the lands and highways assessed for the construction of said work, and that the public convenience and welfare will be subserved thereby, and that said work will be of public utility in the county and will improve the public health of that neighborhood, and will also improve the public highways here-in-after described in this report.

And now the time having arrived for said sealed proposals to be received, one Cyrus Osborne offers to loan said county the sum of Six thousand (\$6000.00) Dollars for one year at 6% interest per annum, and one, John E. Vestal, offers to loan said county the sum of Six thousand nine hundred fifty two dollars and ten cents (\$6,952.10) for one year with interest at the rate of 6% per annum, and the same being the best offers made, both of said offers are accepted by the County Auditor and notes are executed to the said Cyrus Osborne and the said John E. Vestal, as provided by law on the 22nd. day of October 1904 for the above amounts respectively, with interest payable semi-annually and said amounts are paid to said County and said notes are delivered to said parties.
