



Summers, are members of said Association and in good standing, and the Board now grants to said members aforesaid the power of Constable, who shall have power to pursue and arrest horse thieves and all other criminals against the laws of the State of Indiana, and to serve all papers relating to the same, and to follow and pursue such criminals in and through any part of the State of Indiana; and in the absence of warrant shall have power to arrest and hold in custody without warrant and for such time as may be necessary to procure a warrant.

The Auditor is hereby authorized to issue to each of said persons aforesaid a Certificate of such authority in compliance with this appointment.


