The Board of Hendricks County Commissioners met at the Courthouse in Danville, Indiana on the above date, in the Commissioners room, it being the First Monday of said month.

PRESENT: GRANT SELLERS, HURSEL H. DISNEY & WILLIAM HAAG.

APPEARING BEFORE THE BOARD:

A delegation of ladies, with Mrs. Costin of Washington Twp. acting as spokesman, appeared before the Board and requested that the road running South from U. S. 36 be blacktopped from its present hard surface ending on to the South end of said road. Mr. Mason, road Supt., explained that material to lay a base for such work was frozen by the WPB. The ladies then asked for better maintenance of the road and for gravel to be placed on it. Once again Mr. Mason explained that gravel was being placed on the road and before the Commissioners adjourned drove them over the road for their personal inspection. Said inspection brought out that the road was in good condition, in a good state of repair and probably better kept than many other roads of a similar character.

Mr. Lee Chatham and his son-in-law, Anson Kellams, appeared before the Board and asked that the County repair a culvert and clean out a ditch close to Mr. Kellam's farm. Board took the matter under advisement.

Leon Bayliss, Deputy Sheriff, appeared before the Board and asked for permission to expend approximately \$45.00 for a Police Radiom to be installed in the Deputy Sheriff's car. Board approved the request.

IN THE MATTER OF SALARY OF FIREMAN:

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Board raised the wages of the Jail & Courthouse Fireman to \$125.00 per month to be effective as of April 1, 1944.

IN THE MATTER OF EMPLOYMENT OF ELECTION MACHINE SUPERVISORS & ASSISTANTS:

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the Board adopted the following wages for election machine supervisors and helpers.

50¢ per hour for assistants.

80¢ per hour for election machine supervisor and 10¢ per mile for car used in said work.

1.10 per hour for man and truck to set up machines.

Albert C. Parker was employed for the 1944 election machine supervisor and Mr. Alfred McClain as one assistant. Mr. Parker was directed to employ one other assistant.

Mr. Harry Ward was employed to deliver and set up the machines using his truck for the delivery of same. These arrangements having been made a month early the provision is hereby inserted that in the event any of said men be not available at election time then other men competent to do the work, be employed at the above wage scale.

"CONCURRENT RESOLUTION BY BOARDS OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF HENDRICKS AND THE COUNTY OF MARION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A BRIDGE ON THE COUNTY LINE BETWEEN HENDRICKS AND MARION COUNTY, STATE OF INDIANA.

"ON the Marion-Hendricks County line, 200 feet South of U. S. Road #40 on the West line of Section 21, Township 15 North, Range 2 East.

NOW THEREFORE, said Boards of Commissioners in joint session in the Commissioners room in the Court House at the City of Indianapolis, State of Indiana, declare and agree that public convenience requires and that a necessity exists for the construction of said bridge, all according to the plans and specifications heretofore prepared and filed by the Surveyor of Marion County and which have been ordered placed on file in the office of the Auditors of Marion and Hendricks Counties.

And it is now found that the estimated cost of construction of said bridge is Eighteen Hundred Dollars, and it is ordered and agreed that each County shall pay its apportionate share of said cost, as follows: Hendricks County shall pay 50% (Fifty Per Cent) thereof, but not to exceed \$900.00 (Nine Hundred Dollars); and Marion County shall pay 50% (Fifty Per Cent) thereof, but shall, if necessary complete same, expense not to exceed the total sum of \$1,335.08 (One Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Five & 08/100 Dollars) for its entire share.

It is further found that the County Councils of each of said Counties have duly appropriated sufficient funds for the purpose of paying the respective shares of each County as set out above.

THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that the Auditors of each of said Counties proceed to advertise for bids for the construction of said bridge, according to law, bids to be submitted and filed with the Auditor of Hendricks County and the contract to be executed by both Boards of Commissioners.

In reply to your letter of August 31, 1945, please be advised that the Commissioners of Marion County are in accord with the division of the County line road between Hendricks and Marion County which was agreed to by the Committee appointed at our joint meeting in Danville.

This agreement established the division of the Marion-Hendricks County road, and is as follows:

"We found that the County line contains 12.657 miles of road of which .887 miles is already Marion County's road which leaves a total of 11.770 miles to be divided between Hendricks and Marion Counties. The distance from U. S. Road # 40 to State Road # 34 equals 6.10 miles and the distance from State Road # 34 to a point north where the road enters Marion County equals 4.657 miles and from U. S. Road # 40 south to Morgan County line equals 1.90 miles. Under the conditions that exist north of State Road # 34, I recommend that Marion County take all north of State Road # 34 and all south of U. S. 40 equalling 4.65 plus 1.90 of which .887 is their road. That would mean that Marion County would have 5.67 miles of road to maintain, and that Hendricks County would take between State Road # 34 and U. S. # 40 which equals 6.10 miles. I further suggest that all culvert and bridge repairs above \$100.00 on these roads be shared by each county."

SPECIAL PROVISIONS - BRIDGE LETTING

These special provisions together with the current standard specifications of the Indiana State Highway Commission shall govern the construction and repair of the following bridge, bids for which will be awarded _____.

Elrod Bridge - Franklin Township - Hendricks County
Marion Township - Putnam County

In case of conflict between the standard specifications and special provisions, the special provisions shall govern.

Each bidder shall furnish with his bid an approved Bond equal in amount to ten percent of the total of all work bid upon and in case the bidder is awarded a contract, he shall file with the joint Board of Hendricks County and Putnam County a Corporate Surety Bond in an amount equal to the sum total of all work awarded him.

In case his bid totals more than \$5000.00 he shall file with his bid a financial statement.

Bids and financial statements shall be submitted upon the forms furnished by the County Auditor of Putnam or Hendricks County and in the manner prescribed in said forms and shall be accompanied by a non-collusion affidavit attached thereto. Payments will be made on all contracts as prescribed by law and the bidder before receiving his final estimate on any contract shall file with the County Auditor of each county a clearance of indebtedness affidavit, showing that all claims which might become a lien against his contract have been paid in full. Comes now the Auditor and shows to the Board that on the 6th and 13th days of April, 1950, he caused to be published in The Hendricks County Republican a notice to the owners of land in Hendricks County assessed on account of the Edgar A Reitzel, et al, drain, notifying said land owners of the amount of the apportioned assessments on their land and of the fact that such assessments could be paid in full on or before the 10th day of May, 1950 without interest; also that he caused said notice to be published in the Danville Gazette on the 6th and 13th days of April, 1950.

Said notices and the proofs of publication thereof, having been examined, were, on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, approved as being in due form of law.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NUMBER 1

AN ORDINANCE for the establishment of a County Plan Commission.

WHEREAS, the Board of Hendricks County Commissioners deem it necessary and advisable to create a Plan Commission for Hendricks County in order to promote the orderly development, improve the health and promote the general welfare of the County of Hendricks;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of said County that:

Section One: There is hereby established a County Plan Commission under the authority provided in Chapter 174 of the Acts of 1947 of the Indiana General Assembly.

Section Two: The memberships of said Commission shall be as provided by statute and the official members are hereby designated as one member of the Board of County Commissioners, to be selected by such Board; the County Superintendent of Schools; the County Surveyor and the County Agricultural Agent, and five citizen members, each qualified by knowledge and experience in matters pertaining to the development of the County and holding no other office in county government, who shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners. All of the citizen members shall be residents of the county; three to be selected, one each from each commissioner's district and the remaining two to be selected at large; provided further that not more than three of said citizen members shall be of the same political party.

Section Three: Terms of Office:

(a) The term of office of the member of the County Board of Commissioners appointed to serve on the Plan Commission shall be co-extensive with term of office to which he has been elected, unless said Board, on its first regular meeting of each year, appoints another to serve as its representative.

(b) The term of office of the elected officials designated as members of the Plan Commission shall be co-extensive with the term of office to which they were elected.

(c) The citizen members shall be appointed for the following terms:

- One for a term of one year.
- One for a term of two years.
- One for a term of three years.
- Two for a term of four years.

The terms shall expire of the first Monday of January of the first, second, third or fourth year respectively, following their appointment.

Thereafter, as the terms expire, each new appointment shall be for a term of four years.
