The average attendance by members at meetings ave aged better than 85% during the year. There were 12 absences out of a possible 81 attendances.

Many of the meetings were devoted to the study of the Planning Act and to methods of application in order to acquaint the members with their powers and duties. Several engineers and consultants appeared before the Commission, by invitation, to explain the functions of a

Careful study was fiven to the need of planning in Hendricks^County. This work clearly shows the urgency for planning and zoning to regulate and control the following:

(1) Land subdivision.

(2) Trailer Coach Parks.

(3) Junk Yards.

It has been agreed upon that items (2) and (3) are of immediate importance and should be acted upon early in 1952 when adequate funds are made available. It has been proposed that said items be regualted and controlled by a Master Plan to be prepared subsequent to a land use survey of Hendricks County. These matters are tentatively on the aggenda for 1952.

Definite action has been taken on item (1). After much investigation and study, the Commission prepared a rough draft of a Subdivision Control Ordinance. In the interest of prefecting this ordinance, Mr, Kenneth L. Schellie, Consultant, was engaged to criticize it, and to edit it. This work has been completed and copies have been mailed to seve al outstanding individ als residing in the County in the interest of furthering public participation. The Secretary published aa Public Notice on December 20th in two newspapers of general circulation in the County giving notice that a public hearing is to be held in the Assembly Room of the Court House at 1:30 O'clock P.M. January 3rd 1952 for the purpose of hearing public sentiments concerning the ordinance and its provisions.

Plans for 1952 include the holding of special meetings in the various Townships for the purpose of strengthening public support and to learn of the wants and needs of the various communities in the field of planning.

Unless otherwise voted, regular meetings of the Commission will be held on the second Wednesday of each calendar month.

There were 90 out of a possible 126 attendances during the year with an average of more than 715, this being 14% below the average during the year 1951.

On January 3rd, a public hearing was held on that part of the County Master Plan providing for the control of the subdivision of land within the territofial jurisdiction of the Commission and the ordinance was adouted by resolution. Whereupon, the ordinance was referred to the Board of Commissioners of the County which examined and approved it on the 15th day of February and put same into effect by filing it in the records of the

During succeeding meetings a basic study and inventory of existing situations in the County wasmade. Unoffical meetings were held in each of the twelve townships and prominent persons were invited to attend in order to receive the opinions of those persons as to what is needed in the way of planning and improvements. It was established that nearly all of the parties attending the townships meetings desired some kind of zoning for Hendricks County. This attitude, combined with the results of the Commission's own study, led to the decision that the County should be zoned and that improvements should be recommended to the Board of County Commissioners.

'he Commission, with the help of about two dozen persons interested in the welfare and orderly development of the County, made a study of the use of each and every tract of land in thr rural area of the County. On the 14th day of May , the Commission entered into a contract with Kenneth L. Schellie & Associates, Planning Consultants, for professional assistance in preparing the zone map and ordinance text for the proposed master plan. The ordinance and map are now in an advance stage of preparation and should be completed within two months and made ready for additional unofficial township meetings

claims.

IN THE MATTER OF MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS FOR PROPOSED DRIVES AND STREETS IN SUB-DIVISIONS OR PLATS

The Board adopted the following resolution describing the minimum requirements for any roads or drives through any sub-division or plat or connecting highway, to be petitioned as a part of the County Highway System.

- 1. Drives or streets shall have a width of not less than 50 feet except that dead-end drives or streets shall have a width of not less than 40 feet and shall terminate in a circular right-of-way with a minimum diameter of 80 feet.
- 2. All drives and streets to be graded, ditched, and bermed to provide adequate drainage.
- 3. The roadway of such drives or streets shall be surfaced to a width of not less than 18 feet

with 6 inches of compacted aggregate meeting the specifications as prescribed in "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction and Maintenance - 1946" of the State Highway Commission of Indiana References in the preceeding paragraph refer to the S.H.C. of I. specifications.

4. Corrugated Metal Sewer Pipe shall be provided for all drives and shall be so constructed as not to hinder or impair the drainage.

The Board reserves the right to inspect all drives upon proper petition and to reject any drives or streets which in their judgement does not meet the above specifications. The Board also reserves the right to designate the Highway Supervisor or his assistant as it's representative to inspect and report on the compliance with the required specifications.

In the event of extra-ordinary and hazardous situations as to terrain, contour, and drainage, the Board may, in its discretion require extra-ordinary right-of-way, grading or drainage, to meet the conditions therein prevailed.

The Board, or its duly appointed representatives, reserves the right to determine the feasibility and the matter of public utility of such proposed highway or an already existing highway.

IN THE MATTER OF LOCKS FOR THE COURT HOUSE DOORS

Comes now, Chester V. RADIO SERVICE AGREEMENT

This memorandum agreement made and entered into this 7th day of February, 1955, by and between the Board of Trustees of the Town of Danville, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as the Town, and the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as the County, Witnesseth:

1. That the Town and the County presently own jointly a base station radio unit, the services of which have been available to the Sheriff of Hendricks County, the law enforcement officers of the Town of Danville, and other qualified units or individuals on a limited basis.

II. That the Town proposes to undertake the operation of the base station radio unit on behalf of the County on a twenty four hour per day basis in order to provide a more complete and continuous radio service to the Sheriff of Hendricks County and other law endorcement and fire protection units within Hendricks County providing the County will share the cost of personnel expense necessary to operate such base station radio unit.

III. That the County finds it is necessary and proper that the Sheriff of Hendricks County have the use of continuous radio service for the proper performance of his duties, and is therefore willing to pay one half the cost of personnel expense necessary to operate such base station radio unit, providing nevertheless such half share does not exceed \$3,600.00 per annum;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, it is understood and agreed as follows, to-wit:

A. The Town shall operate the base station radio unit for and on behalf of the County in a manner capable of furnishing radio communication to the Sheriff of Hendricks County and his deputies as are or may be duly qualified, on a twenty-four hour per day basis.

B. The County shall provide and maintain its own remote control and mobile units at no expense to the Town.

C. The parties hereto shall jointly share the service maintenance expense of the Base Station radio unit.

D. The base station unit shall be operated at all times under a license heretofore granted to the County by the Federal Communications Commission and in compliance with all rules and regulations of said Commission.

E. The president of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Danville, the president of the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County's the Sheriff of Hendricks County shall constitute a Board of Control for the management and supervision of the base station radio system.

F. The Board of Control shall compile a concise manual embracing a wage schedule, hours, and working conditions for the operating personnel, employment and discharge of such employees, qualifications and fitness of operators, which shall be followed in the operation of the unit. Such manual shall be approved by the parties hereto.

G. The County share of the salaries or wages of operating personnel shall be paid by the Auditor of Hendricks County upon claims filed the same as applies to all other County employees. The claims of such employees shall be approved by one or more members of the Board of Control before filing with the County Auditor. The total amount of all claims of such personnel shall not exceed \$ 3,600.00 in any one year.

H. This agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the year 1955 and may be automatically renewed from year to year thereafter, providing the parties hereto make the necessary and legal appropriations therefor. Either party may terminate this agreement upon any anniversary date by written notice of its intention so to do, delivered to the other not less than sixty days before such anniversary date.

The Auditor informed the group and the Board that no dedication of Highways in the Craig-Manor Subdivision has been filed, and that no petition for the inclusion of such drives had been presented. ORDINANCE FOR COUNTY DUMPS

Comes now Chester V. Parker, Auditor of Hendricks County and presents to the Board affidavits of Edward J Weesner and Vera Hall, Editors and Publishers of the 2 weekly newspspers of opposite political faiths in said county, the same being the Hendricks County Republican and the Danville Gazette. From said affidavits, the Hendricks County Board find that the time has arrived for the consideration of Ordinance No. 1-1955 "County Dumps" The following Ordinance was adopted by unanimous Vote.

> An Ordinance providing for the establishment and maintenance of rubbish dumps; prescribing rules, regulating the operation of said rubbish dumps and fixing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Ind.

Section 1: Definitions:

(a) The term "rubbish dump", as used in this ordinance shall mean any area set aside by the board of county commissioners for the deposit of rubbish.

(b) The term "rubbish" as used in this ordinance, shall mean and include such matters as ashes, cans, metalware, broken glass, crockery, dirt, sweepings, boxes, wood, grass, weeds or litter of any kind.

(c) the term "garbage", as used in this ordinance, shall mean and include rejected food wastes including every waste accumulation of animal, fruit or vegetable matter used and intended for food or that attends the prepartion, use, cookery, dealing in or storing of meat, fish, fowl, fruit or vegetables.

Section 2: Rubbish Dump Areas - Identification - Supervision and Control

(a) The Board of commissioners shall from time to time, establish rubbish dump areas which shall be clearly posted with sufficient identification markers.

(b) The control and supervision of all rubbish dumps shall be under the imeediate control and supervision of the county highway superintendent. He shall keep all rubbish seasonably pushed into holes, pits and ravines within each rubbish dump area and so maintain the area to permit vehicles to enter for the purpose of depositing rubbish.

(c) Any resident of Hendricks County shal have free access and use of said rubish dumps for the deposit of rubbish, provided that in the exercise of such right of access and use all rubbish shall be deposited at such places as indicated by specific instructions or posters erected at each site.

Section 3: Garbage not allowed;

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to deposit any garbage as defined in this ordinance, upon the site of any rubbish dump in Hendricks County.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to deposit any rubbish upon any public or private property in this county, other than upon the rubbish dump sites as provided by the board of county commissioners, without the written consent of the owner thereof if private property, or the person or agency having jurisdiction and contaol thereof if puclib property.

Section 4: Penalties:

(a) Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction, the violater shall bepunished for the first offense by a fine of not more than Five Hundred dollars; for the second offense by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars; and for a third offense and each subsequent offense by a fine of not more than One Thousand dollars to which may be added imprisonment for any determinate period not exceeding ninety days.

(a) Whereas an emergency exists, this act shall become in full force and effect immédiately upon its passage/

RESOLUTION SETTING-FORTH SPECIFICATIONS REQUIRED OF ROADWAYS FOR ACCEPTANCE INTO

COUNTY HIGHWAY SYSTEMS

WHEREAS, owners of real estate, proprietors and subdividers of real estate have occassion to construct roadways and driveways which are eventually submitted to the Board of Commissioners for acceptance and incorporated into the county highway system, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed equitable and just that such owners, proprietors and subdividers should construct such roadways and driveways in accordof subsequent maintenance of such roadways and driveways will be equalized with existing and planned county highways, and not place and extra burden upon the county for such maintenance, and 359

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners are of the opinion the adoption of definite and specific roadway and driveway specifications should be adopted for the guidance of owners, proprietors, and subdividers in the construction of such roadways and driveways in order to avoid confusion and uncertainity,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following specifications be and they are hereby adopted for the construction of roadways and driveways requisite for acceptance and incorporation into the county highway system, to-wit:

- I. All rights-of-way of highways shall be of a minimum width of Fifty (50) feet. Where such right-of-way does not enter upon or intersect an existing highway, a turn-around rightof-way of One Hundred (100) feet in diameter shall be provided.
- II. The road bed shall be not less than Twenty-Two (22) feet in width, constructed with a minimum of Eight (8) inches of compacted stone or #9 washed gravel, and provided with smooth berms on either side of said road bed. All berms shall be a minimum of Six (6) feet in width.
- III. All roadways shall be constructed to grade with ample road side ditches established to provide complete drainage in such manner that water will not stand or pool in such ditches. Road culverts of corrugated metal of sufficient capacity and weight, shall be installed for taking any water under the roadway or under any private driveway entering upon said roadway.
- IV. All approaches of private driveways upon the roadwayshall be of like construction and shall extend from the roadway

to the property line, turn-outs for mail boxes shall be provided and constructed the same as the roadbed.

- V. In cases where the character of the local terrain require, the Board of Commissioners reserve the right to order or permit variance in these specifications, either for the purposeof enlarging upon or diminishing these requirements.
- VI. All materials and manner of construction shall be approved by the County Highway Superintendent. In the event any bridge or culvert is required, construction of the same shall not be undertaken until specifications for the same are approved by the county highway superintendent.
- VII. Owners, proprietors and subdividers desiring to have any roadway incorporated into and made a part of the county highway system shall construct and maintain such roadway for a period of one year prior to making such application.

In the alternative and subject to the discretion of the Board of Commissioners, such owner, proprietor or subdivider may furnish compliance bond with approved surety guarranteeing construction in accordance with these specifications and maintenance for one year after construction.

VIII. These specifications are not intended to and do not alter or amend any specification requirements for the construction of streets in subdivisions established under the rules and regulations of the Hendricks County Planning Commission Subdivision control ordinance now in effect or as may be hereafter amended.

The Board of Commissioners met upon request of the Brownsburg and Plainfield Planning Boards to consider zoning for those areas. Twenty-seven persons attended the meeting, including members of the Hendricks Co. Planning Comm.

Charles Campbell of Plainfield stated the purpose of the meeting was to review the rezoning situation and to propose a revision in order that the two respective towns may zone the area surrounding the towns for a distance of two miles and stated that a county ordinance would preclude the adoption of such zoning.

Claude Raber, county attorney, made statement as to the functions of the County Planning Board and stated that the Town Planning Boards had one delegate on the County Planning Board and they vote on matters relative to the vicinity of the town.

Ralph Norman, Chairman of the Hendricks County Planning Commission, commented briefly on the zoning and subdivisions in the County and the functions of the Town Planning Boards.

Frank Jessup, Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, made a very brief comment as to the reasons for the failure to adopt a zoning ordinance and Mr. Campbell suggested that zoning by districts be proposed. Frank Adgate proposed that the present subdivision ordinance be repealed and permit the towns to adopt zoning ordinance for the respective town.

Various questions were raised concerning a referendum for zoning as to why the subdivision ordinance should not be abolished and the proximity of the subdivision ordinance to zoning.

Harvey Hartsock, attorney, called attention to the selling of lots by the metes and bounds description and the failure of John Hufford to comply with the subdivision ordinance. Attention was also called to the numerous violations of the subdivision ordinance and Charles Tedrowe, Brownsburg, made comment that the subdivision ordinance has been violated and that the ordinance should be rescinded. Section 1. That permission be and hereby is granted to Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation, its successors and assigns, subject, however, to the terms and conditions hereinafter provided, to construct, maintain, operate, replace and remove a fourteen (14") inch petroleum products line underneath, along and across certain highways in said county, said pipe line to be installed underneath, along and across each of said highways at the point where it is intersected by the route of said pipe line as shown by the sketch attached hereto and made a part hereof, more specifically identified as Texas Eastern Drawing TPD-8-178, bearing the file

Section 2. That said pipe line shall be constructed, maintained and operated underneath and across each of said highways by such method and in such manner as not to interrupt traffic upon such highways and so as to afford adequate protection to traffic on such highway: provided, nevertheless, no construction work shall be started without first notifying the Hendricks County Highway Superintendent of the time and place such work is to be undertaken; and provided further that the methods used as same affects the interruption of traffic shall first be approved by said County Highway Superintendent or his representative.

Section 3. That said Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation, after installing said pipe line underneath any of said highways, and after replacing or removing said pipe line, or performing any work of maintenance or repair thereto, shall restore the surface of such highway to a condition substantially as good as the condition thereof immediately prior to the installation of such pipe line or the replacement or removal thereof, or the performance of maintenance or repair work, as this case may be. In the event of open excavation across any highway, the entire excavated area shall be replaced with crushed stone or coarse gravel, compacted and resurfaced the same as the existing roadway; providing said refill shall be under the supervision and approval of said County Highway Superintendent.

Section 4. That said Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation shall reimburse said County for any expense which the County may incur by reason of the construction, maintenance, operation, replacement or removal of said pipe line underneath any of said highways, or damage to any highways, bridges or drains of this County used or crossed by any contractor or sub-contractor in moving construction machinery or materials to and from the site of said proposed construction. And to insure the prompt compliance with the terms hereof, said Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation shall file with the Auditor of Hendricks County a good and sufficient indemnifying bond in the penal sum of \$10,000.00 Dollars, payable to the State of Indiana, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the obligations herein provided.

RESOLUTION SETTING-FORTH SPECIFICATIONS REQUIRED OF ROADWAYS FOR ACCEPTANCE INTO COUNTY HIGHWAYS SYSTEMS.

WHEREAS, owners of real estate, proprietors and subdividers of real estate have occasion to construct roadways and driveways which are eventually dubmitted to the Board of Commissioners for acceptance and incorporation into the WHEREAS, it is deemed equitable and just that such owners, proprietors and subdividers shoudl construct such roadways and driveways in accordance wiht recognized and approved specifications in order that the cost of subsequent maintenance of such roadways and driveways will be equalized with existing and planned county highways, and not place an extra burden upon the county WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners are of the opinion the adoption of definite and specific roadway and driveway specifications should be adopted for the guidance of owners, proprietors, and subdividers in the construction of such roadways and driveways in order to avoid confusion NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the following specifications be and they are hereby adopted for the construction of roadways and driveways requisite for acceptance and incorporation into the county highway system, to-wit: 1. All right-of-ways of highways shall be of a minimum width of fifty (50) feet. Where such right-of-way does not enter upon or intersect an existing highway, a turn-around right-of-way of one Hundred (100) feet in diametershall be provided.

The road bed shall be not less than twenty-two (22) feet in width, constructed with a minimum of seven (7) inches of compacted stone or

approval washed gravel or equivalent and an additional surface of not less two (2) inches of Class C, Bituminous mix surface, State Highway specifications, 1952. The road bed shall also be provided with smooth berms on either side of the road bed with a minimum width of six (6) feet.

3. All roadways shall be constructed to grade with ample road side ditches established to provide complete draininge in such manner that water will not stand or bool in suchdditches the Boadteulverts nof corrugated metal of sufficient capacity and weight, shall be installed for taking any water under the roadway or under any private driveway entering upon said roadway.

4. All approaches of private driveways upon the roadway shall be of like construction and shall extend from the roadway to the property line, turn-outs for mail boxes shall be provided and constructed the same as the

5. In cases where the character of the local terrain require, the Board of Commissioners reserve the right to order or permit variance in these specifications, either for the purpose of enlarging or diminishing these

6. All materials and manner of construction shall be approved by the County Highway Superintendant and a competent engineer. In the event any bridge or cultert is required, construction of the same shall not be undertaken until specifications for the same are approved by the County Highway Superintendant, and competent engineer.

7. Owners, propreiters and sub-dividers desiring to have any roadway incorporated into and made a part of the county highway system shall construct and maintain such roadway for a period of one year after completion, prior to making such application. In the alternative and subject to the discretion of the Board of Commissioners, such owner, proprietor or sub-divider may furnish compliance bond with approved surety guaranteeing construction in accordance with these specifications and maintenance for one year after construction.

8. These specifications are not intended to and do not alter or amend any specification requiremnets for the construction of streets in subduvusions established inder the rules and regulations of the Hendricks County Planning Commission, sub-division control ordinance now in effect or as may be hereafter amended.
