MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND  
TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF DANVILLE

The Hendricks County Commissioners and Board of Trustees for the Town of Danville met in special session in the court house on Saturday, March 25, 1961, primarily for the purpose of discussing sewer and water main construction in the streets and roadways.

In connection with North Washington Street it was determined that the water main trench should be mechanically tamped or filled with fill-sand and a 4-inch top surface with # 63 crushed stone. The road crossing at the Anderson Garage corner is to be filled with 12 inches of # 63 crushed stone.

In connection with Mackey Road, Lincoln Street and other county road streets where trenching can be accomplished not closer than 3 feet from the edge of the pavement, tamping or sand-fill will not be required. When it is necessary to trench within 3 feet of the pavement edge then mechanical tamping or fill-sand procedures are to be followed.

It was determined that backfill equipment with metal track or cleats should not operate on the blacktop paving.

The President of the Board of Trustees indicated that the water and sewer main contractors have maintenance bonds with the Town requiring the contractors to maintain all street cuttings in good condition for one year. It was determined that the liability for street damage under the contractors' bonds would not be terminated until the engineers for the Town and the Board of Commissioners have inspected and approved the construction sites.

It was determined that the contractor shall be directed to contact the Town Engineer and the County Highway Superintendent or County Engineer in all cases of emergency which would cause undue hardship or expense. The engineers are then to determine such procedure to be followed with the idea of holding expense and inconvenience to a minimum.

It was determined that the contractors may temporarily close short portions of streets or roadways during working hours but all emergency vehicles and school busses shall be rendered directive assistance in passing all construction areas in order to see that no peril is encountered.

It was determined that all problems and conditions pertaining to the future installation of sanitary sewers by the Town shall follow the same procedures as specified for water main construction.

It was concluded that it shall not be required of the Town to secure a special permit for construction along or across county road streets but the Town is to provide in its contractor's bond the requirement that the presently existing conditions shall be restored and in cases where the Town performs such work with its own forces it will promptly restore all road cuttings and protect all pavement edges. A copy of these procedures be furnished the contractors before any work of the nature above undertaken is started.

A delagation from Lincoln township, consisting of Mr. Harvey B. Hartsock, Mr. James E. McGinnis, Mr. Robert T. Starr and Mrs. Herbert White appeared before the Board complaining of road drainage problems along their properties on Locust Lane.

They were assured the matter would be referred to the County Engineer and that corrective measures would be taken in accordance with his professional recommendations.

Since this portion of roadway has not yet been accepted by the County, Mr. Allen, was advised to bring this matter to the attention of Pierce, Gruber & Beam, Inc., engineers on the project, for correction.

The following resolution was brought up for second reading and final action.

1961 RESOLUTION PERTAINING TO  
PETITIONS FOR RE-ZONING

WHEREAS, it is provided in Burns 1951 Replacement Chapter 53-764 that the county zoning ordinance may be amended by the filing of petitions therefor with the County Auditor, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and expedient that such petitions be acted upon without delay, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that a complete and accurate record be maintained at all times correctly reflecting all changes or amendments to the zoning ordinance, and

WHEREAS, it is requisite that full and complete records pertaining to changes or amendments be maintained at all times to facilitate the right to appeal by any real estate owners feeling aggrieved by the action of the Hendricks County Planning Commission or Board of Commissioners on all petitions filed in accordance with the prevailing statutes:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that all procedures pertaining to petitions for re-zoning shall be as follows:

- A. All petitions shall be in writing, signed by the owner or owners of the real estate in question, and shall contain a full legal description of the real estate involved in said petition.
  - B. Such petitions shall be filed in the office of the County Auditor and by him immediately referred to the Hendricks County Plan Commission for consideration and recommendation.
  - C. The Plan Commission shall cause notice of hearing on such petitions be given as required by law; hold hearings, make such investigations and determinations as the matter warrants.
  - D. The secretary of the Plan Commission shall file a written report of the recommendations, together with proof of publication of notice of public hearings on such petitions and a statement showing when such public hearings were held. Also a copy of an ordinance effecting any amendment to the county zoning ordinance as the Plan Commission may recommend.
  - E. The County Auditor shall present the original petition for rezoning, the proof of publication of notice of public hearing, the written report of the Plan Commission and proposed ordinance at the next regular or special meeting of the Board of Commissioners for action.
  - F. Subsequent to action by the Board of Commissioners on such proposed ordinances, the auditor shall file all papers pertaining to each petition in a permanent post binder record to be known as the Re-zoning Record, which shall be kept and maintained in the auditor's office at all times.
- Be it further resolved that henceforth it shall not be required that petitions for re-zoning, proof of publication, recommendations of the Plan Commission need be copied verbatim in the proceedings of the Board of Commissioners, but a brief abstract of such proceedings shall be sufficient.

The following Petition of Harrison Homes, Ind., for permit to improve Nash Drain, along with signed easements necessary for completion of proposed improvements, was received, considered and approved.

##### PETITION TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS TO NASH DRAIN

Comes now Harrison Homes, Inc., by its engineers, the P. E. MIDDLETON CO., INC., 37 East Ninth Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, and petitions the Board of County Commissioners and the County Surveyor of Hendricks County as follows:

1. There now exists a Nash Drain created by order of the Hendricks Circuit Court.
2. The area serviced by this drain has changed from agriculture to urban use, requiring improvement of the drain to properly serve the area covered.
3. Harrison Homes, Inc. has obtained the necessary easements and now desires to improve the drain entirely at its expense under the terms of the Acts of 1933, Ch. 264, Sec. 20, as finally amended by the Acts of 1951, Ch. 204, Sec. 1 (Burns Indiana Annotated Statutes 27-120).
4. Harrison Homes, Ind., under the terms of this act will bear entirely the expense of the improvements and upon its completion return the improved drain to the County Surveyor for maintenance and repair.

Excerpts from the minutes of the Board of Zoning Appeals meeting of Jan. 19, 1960, relating to permit for conditional use and provisions applicable thereto, were read by Mr. Parsons, Sec. of Plan Commission.

Mr. Ford, speaking for Raceway Park, Inc., expressed the opinion that the traffic snarl and bottleneck during the recent meet was almost wholly attributable to inclement weather and unsettled ground conditions within the Park, and that with the advent of settled weather and ground conditions facilities within the Park would be improved to the extent that traffic conditions on the outside would be vastly improved.

Mr. Raber suggested and it was finally agreed that if conditions warrant, Hunter Road would be temporarily closed during race meets to all traffic, except residents living thereon, and to those Raceway Park would issue windshield stickers, allowing the holders of same free access to and from their premises. Except for the holders of these stickers, no traffic, other than in emergency cases, would be allowed on Hunter Road between #136 and 30th Street.

#### IN THE MATTER OF PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Mrs. Watts, Mrs. Feistal, and Mrs. Griner, all of Maple Grove Subdivision in Guilford Township appeared before the Board regarding traffic speed control, especially on Smith Road, Campbell Drive, Tulip Drive and Maple Lane within Maple Grove subdivision.

Mr. Robert Barker appeared in regard to acceptance of roads and streets of the Belleville Addition into the County Highway System.

There seems to be some question as to whether the roadway from the Belleville Addition out to U. S. #40 has ever been dedicated to public use; and unless and until it has been so dedicated, consideration of request cannot be taken up.

Mr. Baker was advised to determine definitely the status of the access route to U.S.#40.

Mr. Earl Green of Washington Township appeared, asking that the County Highway Dept. replace the washed out entranceway to his property on Tenth Street Road.

The Highway Supervisor was directed to replace the washed-out boiler and make the repairs necessary to restore crossing as needed.

Wilfred Himsel, Urban Lawson and Ralph Black appeared, suggesting that sewer under New Maysville was too small to carry run-off from their properties, thus causing flooding of fields and over-flow of roadway.

After Discussion it was moved, seconded and carried that the County Surveyor be directed to determine the necessary sewer requirement for proper drainage of the area involved and report to the Board at their next meeting.

Mr. Dennis Grounds of Center Township appeared stating that improper roadway drainage along his property was causing water to back up into his barn.

Mr. Armstrong was directed to check into this situation, also, and make recommendations at the next meeting of the Board.

#### IN THE MATTER OF QUALIFICATIONS OF HIGHWAY SUPERVISOR AND SALARY SCHEDULE OF DEPUTIES

Mr. John Swaim and Mr. Clyde Hux, Field Examiners from the office of the State Board of Accounts, currently assigned to examination of the Hendricks County Offices, came before the Board for information as to qualifications of the Highway Supervisor and salary of the Deputy officers, such matters not being on record.

RE: QUALIFICATIONS OF COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERVISOR

Let it be known that Dale Elsbury came into the County Highway Department as Bridge Foreman on or about November 1955, having had in excess of three years bridge construction experience with a regular bridge contractor, Winslow & Hall, about three years of which time he served in the capacity of foreman for said contractor.

That the previous bridge and road contract, together with his experience in the Highway Department of Hendricks County prior to January 1, 1961, sufficiently qualifies him for the position of County Highway Supervisor in the opinion of the Commissioners, within the fair and reasonable interpretation of the statute of 1959, pertaining to the County Highway Supervisor's qualifications.

This memo is to relate the original hiring of said Dale Elsbury, because the precise experience herein stated existed at the time of his hiring in 1960, and through oversight no memo was made of same.

RE: SALARY SCHEDULE OF DEPUTY OFFICERS

Whereas the County Commissioners did on or about consider and specifically agree upon salaries of deputies in the offices of the Hendricks County Auditor, Treasurer, Clerk, Recorder and Sheriff that were to be submitted to the County Council for consideration and appropriation; that said deputy salary schedule was included in the current budget as submitted to the County Council; that thereafter said budget was approved by the County Council and appropriation made in accord therewith; that said appropriation was subsequently approved by the Board of State Tax Commissioners and appropriate tax ordinance adopted; that through misprision of the County Auditor or the County Commissioners the minutes of such approval of salaries has been omitted from the minutes; that this entry is made to supply such omission.

In further reference to the salary schedule in said budget it appears that the salary of the Deputy County Surveyor was filed and ultimately considered by the State Board of Tax Commissioners at \$4,800.00, whereas the maximum should have been \$3,900.00.

It is now moved and seconded that the 1st Deputy Surveyor be compensated as follows: at a salary of not to exceed the maximum specified by statute, which is \$325.00 per month. Motion was unanimously carried.

#### IN THE MATTER OF FILING MORTGAGE EXEMPTIONS

It was suggested and recommended by the field examiners of the State Board of Accounts that the filing of mortgage exemption applications in the Court House be done by County employees, hiring extra help if necessary, with the County retaining the filing fee as miscellaneous revenue.

They stated that if an agent of a financial institution or real estate broker qualified to



file mortgage exemptions was privileged to operate within the court house, then the same privilege should be extended to any other person so qualified.

#### IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY HOME INSPECTION

A report of inspection of the County Home by the State Fire Marshal Department was laid before the Board, stating in part:

"This Department has caused an inspection to be made of the above captioned subject. Our inspection reports there are no recommendations to be made at this time."  
The report noted and ordered filed.

#### IN THE MATTER INSURANCE CLAIM

Meridian Mutual Insurance Co. submitted a claim for payment in the amount of \$48.74, for recovery of payment by them for repair on 1956 Ford 1/2 ton pick-up truck, owned by Harold Larison, assertedly damaged while being pulled from a snowdrift by county highway employees.

County Highway Supervisor, Dale Elsbury, explained that the truck had been abandoned in the center of the highway, without keys, and that in the process of clearing the road for traffic the truck had to be moved, and that reasonable care was exercised in so doing. Other workmen involved in the operation were Delbert Allee and "Butch" Lantz.

The County Attorney recommends that in view of the circumstances, there is no liability on the part of the Commissioners, and that the Meridian Mutual Insurance Company be advised that their claim is respectfully declined.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.

#### IN THE MATTER OF STOP SIGNS

Sheriff Bayliss appeared before the Board recommending that all road intersections in the County now posted as 4-way stops, be reclassified and that at each such intersection where feasible, one of the intersecting roads be designated as preferential and such intersection be posted as a 2-way stop.

Motion was made, seconded and unanimously adopted that Sheriff Bayliss, County Engineer Armstrong and Road Supervisor Elsbury be authorized to reclassify and post any intersection in the interest of safety and better traffic control.

#### IN THE MATTER OF RENAMING CO. LINE ROAD

A communication from the Metropolitan Planning Department was read, stating that the Indianapolis Post Office had requested that the roads on the borders of Marion County, now all commonly known as County Line Roads, be renamed to eliminate confusion caused by the name of "County Line Road" being applied to several different roads.

To comply with this request, Marion County suggests that the road between the two counties be named Marion-Hendricks Road.

By unanimous consent the Board, by way of counter proposal, suggests the name "Hendricks-Marion Road", and directs that the Metropolitan Plan Commission be so advised.

#### IN THE MATTER OF SPEED REGULATION

The County Attorney, Mr. Raber, laid before the Board the following resolution, prepared as per instructions in May 1 meeting.

#### RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING SPEED REGULATIONS IN CERTAIN AREAS

WHEREAS: the Board of Commissioners is authorized to determine and declare a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit in compliance with Chapter 141 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1959, and

WHEREAS: pursuant to engineering and traffic investigations at the locations hereinafter designated, conditions are found to exist which, in the opinion of the Board of Commissioners, the statutory prima facie speed permitted is greater than is reasonable,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana:

Section I. That a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit at the following described areas, to-wit: the county road known as Smith Road from the South right of way line of the Pennsylvania Railroad, southward to U. S. Highway #40, county road known as Campbell Street from the Washington Township line Southward to U. S. Highway #40, and the county road running East and West through the village of Friendswood from State Highway # 67 Westward to the midsection line of Sec. 17, Township 14, Range 2 East, shall be twenty (20) miles per hour.

Section II. The County Highway Superintendent shall cause to be erected at all approaches to said roads, regulation speed signs or signals.

Section III. A violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable as provided in the Motor Vehicle Statutes of the State of Indiana.

Section IV. Whereas, an emergency is found to exist, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

#### IN THE MATTER OF 30th STREET IMPROVEMENT

County engineer, Robert Armstrong reported on preliminary work on 30th street improvement. On his recommendation that the grade at 39th Street and Hunter Road be raised, the Highway Supervisor was to be instructed to haul fill dirt from Turpin Road, where berming work was in progress, to bring the grade up to recommended level.

#### IN THE MATTER OF PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Phyllis Jackson, of Union Township, appeared regarding the dust problem created by trucks serving contractors on construction work on #74.

Mr. Armstrong reported that he had contacted Calumet Paving Co. and that they had promised, verbally, to take necessary steps to control dust, but had apparently made no move in that direction. Mr. Armstrong was directed to make further contact and insist that proper dust control measures be taken.



Mr. McCullough, representing the Pittsboro Town Board, appeared with the suggestion that in making street improvements in the Town of Pittsboro that arrangements be made whereby portions of streets maintained by the County may, by agreement, be exchanged, on an equitable basis, for portions of the street maintained by the Town in such a manner that improvement work by either the Town or County would be completed from curb to curb, rather than each party being obligated to maintain or improve longitudinal sections of the street.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the County Engineer and the County Highway Supervisor meet with the Pittsboro Town Board in an effort to reach agreement and work out an equitable plan in this matter.

Also, they were asked to agree as to the placement of "YIELD" signs at the intersection at the north edge of Pittsboro, to replace the "STOP" signs now in use at that location.

A delegation of the following persons:

Wilson Spicer, Eugene Sego, Ira Heiny, Charles Barron, Albert Wooden and Ralph McKee,

all residents of Price's Suburban Heights, Section 2, in Washington Township appeared in regard to requirements for blacktopping of streets in said Section 2 of Price's Suburban Heights, in view of acceptance into the County system.

Mr. Armstrong reports that drainage in said section seems to be adequate - open ditch meets standards of old specifications which would apply in this case. As to streets, he suggests that with the raising of one low spot and a 1-inch overall cover of stone (#73), blacktopping could proceed.

After cover of stone, petitioners should place in escrow funds sufficient to cover cost of bituminous material, then when blacktopping is completed Mr. Armstrong should be notified for inspection, after which streets may be accepted into County system.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to accept into the County Highway System, the streets of Price's Suburban Heights, Section 2, with the filing of the County Engineer's Certification of Approval.

It was unanimously agreed that request for release be rejected until roads & streets in said subdivision comply with standards adopted for same.

The Plan Commission laid before the Board recommendation for adoption of Master Plan of Thoroughfares for Hendricks County.

Accordingly the Board directed publication of Notice of Public Hearing for October 2, 1961, at 3:00 P.M. at the Commissioners place of meeting in the Court House.

#### IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY HOME SUPERINTENDANT CONTRACT

Roy Anderson appeared before the Board in regard to his expiring annual contract as Superintendent of the County Home. Motion was made, seconded and carried that his contract be continued one year from September 3, 1961, without change.

#### IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY PROPERTY INSURANCE

Noting that certain insurance on County property was expiring as of September 7, and the insurance survey as recommended at the July meeting had not yet been completed, Mr. Jensen was contacted for report as to his progress in analysis of our insurance program. He reported that sufficient information had not yet been assembled on which to base solid recommendations but that same would be completed within a week or two. It was moved, seconded and carried that Frank Martin be asked to affect another sixty day extension of coverage on the policy now expiring, thus deferring renewal until insurance study has been completed.

#### IN THE MATTER OF INSPECTION REPORTS

Reports covering inspection of County Jail, and of the Otis Elevator in the Court House were noted and ordered filed for future reference.

Report on the elevator recommends installation of gate with electric contacts on front entrance to the car. This was designated as not necessarily urgent.

Report of Employer's Group Insurance Companies on inspection of the County Jail, recommends as follows:

"In the interest and safety and accident prevention we are offering the following recommendation. The stairway to the jail should be repaired as there is a great deal of breakage on the steps rising to the jail."

#### CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 11th day of December 1961, by and between the Hendricks County Plan Commission and Hendricks County Surveyor's Office, of Danville, in Hendricks County, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer".

WITNESSETH: That,

WHEREAS, the County Plan Commission is desirous of developing a Use Map of the townships in Hendricks County not as yet zoned, namely (Eel River, Clay, Marion, Franklin, Union, Center, Liberty and Middle), to adequately serve and provide for the zoning needs of Hendricks County.

WHEREAS, the County Plan Commission has deemed it necessary to employ professional engineering services as are contemplated and provided by this agreement and to prepare said Use Map, as desired by the County Plan Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Engineer is duly licensed under the laws of the State of Indiana and is well qualified and desirous of furnishing the professional and engineering services desired and required by the county Plan Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, hereby mutually agree and covenant as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

The Engineer shall furnish and provide the professional services required in connection with:

#### SECTION 1 Development and Preparation of the

Item #1 Use Map for the remaining townships at present not zoned in Hendricks County, Indiana.



SECTION 2 Engineering Services

- (a) The Engineer shall conduct and make the Use Map, all in accordance with accepted standards for such work, and in such accurate and complete form as shall appropriately facilitate the County Plan Commission in the performance of its duties.

In preparing the field survey, the Engineer shall give due consideration to the new thoroughfare system.

SECTION 3 Information and Services to be furnished by the County Plan Commission

The County Plan Commission shall furnish the Engineer with the following:

- (a) A committee made up of representatives of the various communities and rural areas in the separate townships.

The above committee shall have representatives from business, farms, legal professions and school authorities.

- (b) Any other such information as from time to time becomes necessary in determining anticipated use of proposed facilities for these areas.

SECTION 4 Method of Payment for Professional Services in Preparing the Use Map

The Hendricks County Plan Commission, for and in consideration of the rendering of the professional services herein enumerated in the preparation of the Use Map shall pay to the Engineer an amount of twenty nine hundred eighty eight dollars (\$2,988.00).





The undersigned electors of Guilford Township in Hendricks County, Indiana, hereby petition the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, to abolish all present precinct boundaries in said Guilford Township and to create eight new precincts in said Guilford Township in the manner hereinafter described and in accordance with the drawings attached hereto and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A" and "Exhibit B," respectively.

The new precincts and the respective boundaries thereof petitioned for herein are described as follows:

#### Precinct No. 1.

Create a new precinct, to be designated as "Precinct No. 1," with boundaries as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the west corporate limits of the Town of Plainfield, Indiana (such west corporate limits being the center line of White Lick Creek), and the center line of Stafford Road extended west, in the Town of Plainfield, Indiana, and running thence west on and along the center line of said Stafford Road extended west to the center line of the north and south county road located immediately west of the Indiana Boy's School; thence north on and along the center line of said county road to the center line of U. S. Highway No. 40; thence westwardly on and along the center line of said U. S. SECOND: Said machines must each provide for at least nine (9) party rows of sixty (60) devices for voting for persons not nominated; and one (1) row of voting levers for voting on thirty (30) Constitutional Amendments or Questions and will be fully equipped with Primary Instructions.

THIRD: The successful bidder shall guarantee the machines to do their work in an efficient and correct manner when operated in accordance with the laws and the printed instructions furnished for their use.

FOURTH: The said machines must all be furnished and shipped, addressed to the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, Court House, Danville, Indiana, on or before the day provided, that there shall be no delay caused by strikes, fires, or other causes beyond the control of the bidder.


FIFTH: The Board of County Commissioners will award the contract for the said machines to the lowest and best bidder, reserving the right to reject any or all bids submitted therefor.



The following agreement, relative to installation and construction of utility facilities within Hendricks County, properly executed by the Hendricks Telephone Corporation, was laid before the Board for approval and acceptance:

INDEMNIFYING AGREEMENT

Whereas, the HENDRICKS TELEPHONE CORPORATION has been or may be granted by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Hendricks permission to place poles and make excavations in, upon and under certain streets, highways, and other public places in the County of Hendricks for the construction and maintenance of its telephone plant in said county; such excavations, etc. to be made by said Telephone Company from time to time as conditions may warrant, under permit of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Hendricks.

Now, thereof, said HENDRICKS TELEPHONE CORPORATION agrees to restore all streets, highways and public places under which it has made excavations to the same condition if found or finds said streets, highways and public places before making them, to proceed with said work promptly and to avoid prolonged or unnecessary obstruction to the public street or highways and ingress and egress from private property.

Said HENDRICKS TELEPHONE CORPORATION further agrees to place its piles of material and equipment in such parts of the street and highways so as to interfere as little as possible with public travel and to barricade said excavations and piles of material and mark them with lights by night and flags by day to safeguard the public.

Said HENDRICKS TELEPHONE CORPORATION further agrees to refill and tamp all excavations so as to maintain the original surface levels; to replace lawn sod where removed; restore all breaks and cuts in curbing and street paving surfaces, to maintain and restore all pipes and drains to the condition in which they are found insofar as possible, and in all things to finish said construction work so that no private or public property will be weakened, destroyed or harmed.

Said HENDRICKS TELEPHONE CORPORATION further agrees to indemnify and save the County harmless from and against any and all claims of any person or persons whomsoever for damage to persons and property by reason of performance of any and all work for which permits may be given it by the County and to defend any suit that may be brought against said County for damage sustained or claimed to have been sustained by any person, firm or corporation caused or claimed to have been caused by said work or any act or omission of any contractor, subcontractor or employee in doing said work upon being notified by the County of the commencement of such suit, and to promptly pay any judgement that may be obtained against said County in any suit, including costs, by reason of such work if the Company has been duly notified of the commencement of such suit and has had an opportunity to defend same, and to comply with all laws, rules and regulations now in force or hereafter adopted relating to such work, the manner in which it is to be done and restoration of any place or places excavated to good condition as hereabove set out.

The following agreement, relative to engineering services for the rehabilitation of electrical installations in the Court House, properly executed by Fraps and Unversaw, Inc., was presented to the Board for approval and acceptance;

A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 23 day of January, 1962, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hendricks, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as the "Owner", and the firm of Fraps and Unversaw, Inc., Consulting Engineers, 3763 Broadway, Indianapolis, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the "Owner" intends to rehabilitate the electrical installation at the Court House in Danville, Indiana, and

WHEREAS the "Owner" is desirous of employing the "Engineer" to perform the engineering services hereinafter set out, and

WHEREAS the "Owner" is authorized to contract for the performance of the work set out herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and of the mutual covenants herein contained, it is agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1. The "Engineer" agrees to furnish and perform engineering services required for the construction of the above described improvement as follows:

- (a) To make necessary surveys, investigations, studies, preliminary general plans, and approximate estimate of cost, and report same to "Owner".
- (b) Upon approval of the preliminary plans and report by the "Owner", the "Engineer" shall make such additional surveys as are necessary and shall prepare plans and specifications in such detail as to clearly define the work contemplated and to enable contractors to make intelligent bids thereon, to prepare all necessary contract documents, including contract proposals, advertisements, bid and performance bond forms, instructions to bidders and other general and specific data. All contract documents are to be prepared in sufficient number to afford information to all Contractors, equipment manufacturers and others interested in placing of competitive bids for work proposed. The Engineer shall work in close cooperation with the "Owner" in preparation of the contract documents. All contract documents are to be for approval of the "Owner" and the various state authorities so concerned. The "Engineer" shall assist the "Owner" in receiving bids, shall tabulate all proposals, and shall assist in awarding contracts for construction.
- (c) Following award of the construction contract or contracts, the "Engineer" shall furnish general supervision consisting of periodic visits to the site by the "Engineer" or by a representative of the "Engineer", shall check and approve all working drawings, shall assist in a correct interpretation of plans and specifications, and shall check all periodical estimates for partial payment during progress of the work. The "Engineer" does not guarantee the performance of the contracts by the Contractors.

ARTICLE 2. The "Owner" agrees to pay the "Engineer" as compensation for such professional engineering a sum of money as represented by seven percent (7%) of the construction cost of the improvements, which sum or sums shall be paid as follows:

- (a) For all engineering services as outlined under Article I (a) a sum of money as represented by one and five tenths percent (1.5%) of the actual construction cost of work performed, said sum to be payable upon acceptance of the preliminary report by the "Owner".
- (b) For all engineering services as outlined under Article I (b) a sum of money as represented by three and five tenths percent (3.5%) of the actual construction cost of work performed.
- (c) For all engineering services as outlined under Article I (c) a sum of money as represented by two percent (2%) of the actual construction cost of work performed, to be paid in periodical installments based on the Contractor's periodical estimates.

It is agreed by both parties that an estimated cost of construction as determined by the "Engineer" shall be used in computing the "Engineer's" fee until such time as actual construction cost is determined.

ARTICLE 3. If after preliminary drawings have been approved by the "Owner", and the "Engineer" has proceeded with detailed drawings and specifications and has performed work in prosecuting his authorization, new or substantially revised plans, sketches or working drawings are required by the "Owner" the "Owner" will pay the "Engineer" therefor, just and equitable compensation provided that said new or substantially revised plans, sketches or working drawings are not required by reason of any oversight, error or omission on the part of the "Engineer".

He states that they have been unable to get co-operation from Mr. Price in effort to bring streets up to standard, and that residents are prepared to make necessary improvements, provided they might have the Boards approval to omit certain portion of the street bordering on property still under ownership of Mr. Price.

Motion was made, seconded and passed that the Board approve such action by the petitioners, but that before proceeding further they notify Mr. Price by certified mail of their contemplated plans.

In regard to the above named subject, the following legal opinion was submitted to the Board by  
 County Attorney, Mr. Raber:

Gentlemen:

I have had under consideration your question of the nature and extent of record keeping and  
 accounting in the County Highway Department.

It is the intention of the State Legislature that the records of the County Highway Department  
 shall adequately disclose the following information at all times:

1. The receipts of the Department and the sources of such receipts.
2. The total outstanding liabilities of the Department at all times.
3. The expenditures of the Department in such detail as to properly reflect the purposes for  
 which the expenditures were made and to account for all funds received by the Department.
4. The cost per mile for construction, repair and maintenance of county highways by surface  
 types.
5. The cost of materials and equipment used by the Department.
6. An inventory of all highway construction and maintenance equipment, materials and supplies,  
 motor vehicles, office fixtures and other personal property under the control of the  
 Department. This inventory should show the disposition made of obsolete items.

The Legislature also provided that the inventory should be taken annually as of December 31 under  
 the supervision of your county highway Supervisor. A copy is to be filed with your Board, a copy filed  
 with the State Board of Accounts. This inventory should be re-examined and established in the event  
 of a change of highway supervisor at any other time.

I have examined in some detail the records presently kept in the office of the Highway Department  
 and it would appear from such examination that an honest effort is being made to keep reports and  
 records as will reflect the information specified by the Legislature.

I would call your attention to the fact that Chapter 229 of the Acts of 1961 specify that the  
 State Board of Accounts shall prescribe a uniform system of records that shall be kept by the Highway  
 Department. Your superintendent has been supplied with a manual setting forth suggested records in  
 detail and how these should be kept. The suggestions in the manual are quite voluminous and it is to  
 be noted that in counties of larger populations the County Commissioners are required to employ  
 clerical assistants who shall prepare and keep the records. An examination of the suggested records  
 indicates that unless you secure the services of persons well schooled in cost accounting, there is the  
 very likely probability that the records would soon fall into such a state of utter confusion that  
 their purpose would be defeated.

If you institute the system of record-keeping as suggested by this manual it apparently would be  
 necessary for you to apply to the County Council for a considerable appropriation to be used in the  
 employment of one or more clerical assistants, because the Highway Department has two main divisions,  
 namely, the road construction and maintenance proper and the bridge department. In many and in most  
 instances the work of these two departments is widely separated and it would therefore seem that  
 you would be obliged to use a clerical assistant for each of these departments as well as the main office  
 clerk. It is my belief that the appropriation for the clerk or clerks used in the county road construction  
 and maintenance should be paid out of the highway fund while the clerical assistants in the bridge  
 department no doubt should be paid out of the cumulative bridge fund.

In recent years the Board of Commissioners caused a survey to be made by competent engineers to  
 determine the condition of all bridges in the county. The report of this survey should be checked  
 from time to time by the County Engineer and amended as conditions warrant. I believe that is presently  
 being done in a satisfactory manner. If it is not, I believe you should take steps to see that it is  
 done because that is one of the important requirements laid down by the State Legislature.

Of course it is just as important to the citizenry of the county as it is to the Legislature that the highway records show a fair and honest picture for the benefit of all. Unless you have one or more persons in the Department who are skilled in cost accounting and can see fit to take them from the employment for which they were hired and put them on record keeping work, you should do so but as I stated before, it is better that simplified records showing the true and fair picture be kept than it is to attempt to keep complicated records inaccurately. Certainly the State Board of Accounts or any other interested department could not ask for more.

Regulation 7-106(a)

Report: The menus reviewed did not contain the recommended amounts of vitamin A foods and protein-rich foods. A fruit or vegetable or both were not always offered at each meal.

Recommendation: The recommended amount for vitamin A foods per week is at least four servings. Five ounces of a protein-rich food should be offered daily to the residents at the noon and evening meals. The menu planner might use the Menu Planning Check List as left with her to define the vitamin A and protein-rich foods. It is also recommended that a fruit or a vegetable or both be served at the noon and evening meals.

Regulation 7-106(e)

Report: The deep freeze registered a temperature of +10°F on day of survey.

Recommendation: All frozen foods should be refrigerated at a temperature of 0° F or less. An accurate thermometer should be installed for frequent checking of temperature.

Regulation 7-106(f)

Report: The dishes and utensils are not pre-rinsed before washing.

Recommendation: Food Particles should be removed by careful scraping and rinsing in running water.

Regulation 7-106(g)

Report: A common towel is used in the kitchen for the drying of hands.

Recommendation: Hand washing facilities should include soap and an adequate supply of individual paper towels. Use of a common towel by food handlers is forbidden.

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. For the residents who must be served on trays, a larger tray is recommended to avoid the "cluttered" look and to make the meal more attractive in appearance.
2. For future budget planning the purchase of a new range, refrigerator and dish machine is strongly recommended.

The following ordinance for the establishment of a full time County Health Department was brought before the Board for consideration:

##### RESOLUTION BY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, HENDRICKS COUNTY FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF A FULL - TIME COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS the health of every individual is fundamental to his personal happiness, attainments and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS the health and physical fitness of the citizens is essential to the security and prosperity of the community, state and nation; and

WHEREAS the establishment of a full-time county local health department is recognized as the most

practical and economical way of securing health services that are necessary to offer maximum health protection to the people of Hendricks County; and

WHEREAS such a full-time health department offers more efficient and comprehensive health protection to the people through the services rendered by physicians, engineers, sanitarians, nurses, and other specialists who are trained and experienced in public health; and

WHEREAS the establishment of a full-time county health department is endorsed by the Indiana State Board of Health, Indiana State Medical Association, American Medical Association and other official and voluntary health agencies, in Indiana; and

WHEREAS: Section 604, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly, permits the establishment of a full-time county health department; therefore be it

RESOLVED: First, that the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, acting under authority granted by Section 604, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly provides for the establishment and maintenance of a full-time county health department in Hendricks County, Indiana. The full-time county health department established by this resolution to be in full force and effect as of January 1, 1963.

Finally, that the Hendricks part-time County Health Department will be dissolved and its records transferred to the full-time health department as of January 1, 1963, in accordance with Section 602, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly.

Appointment of Hendricks County Board of Health  
Full-Time County Health Department established by  
Resolution of Board of County Commissioners to  
become effective January 1, 1963.

Board of County Commissioners should immediately after passing resolution for the establishment of a full time county health department appoint a seven member board of health, giving due consideration to the following:

- I. Politics - No more than four of the seven members shall be from the same political party.
- II. Profession - At least two of the members shall be persons holding an unlimited license to practice medicine in Indiana; one shall be a licensed veterinarian, and one shall be a school superintendent.
- III. Term of Office - Original Appointees.

1st member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1963 ( 1 year appointment)  
2nd member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1964 ( 2 year appointment)  
3rd member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1964 ( 2 year appointment)  
4th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1965 ( 3 year appointment)  
5th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1965 ( 3 year appointment)  
6th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1966 ( 4 year appointment)  
7th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1966 (4 year appointment)

The Board should meet, as soon as possible after being appointed, to organize and appoint health officer and also to prepare budget for 1963.

##### ESTABLISHMENT OF A FULL-TIME COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS the health of every individual is fundamental to his personal happiness, attainments and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS the establishment of a full-time county local health department is recognized as the most practical and economical way of securing health services that are necessary to offer maximum health protection to the people of Hendricks County; and

WHEREAS the health and physical fitness of the citizens is essential to the security and prosperity of the community, state and nation; and

WHEREAS such a full-time health department offers more efficient and comprehensive health protection to the people through the services rendered by physicians, engineers, sanitarians, nurses, and other specialists who are trained and experienced in public health; and

WHEREAS the establishment of a full-time county health department is endorsed by the Indiana State Board of Health, Indiana State Medical Association, American Medical Association and other official and voluntary health agencies, in Indiana; and

WHEREAS Section 604, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly, permits the establishment of a full-time county health department; therefore be it

RESOLVED: First, that the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, acting under authority granted by Section 604, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly provides for the establishment and maintenance of a full-time county health department in Hendricks County, Indiana. The full-time county health department established by this resolution to be in full force and effect as of January 1, 1963.

Secondly, that the part-time Hendricks County Department, as presently established and operated in accordance with provisions of Section 602, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, will be accountable for all matters pertaining to health within its respective jurisdiction until the full-time county health department becomes effective on January 1, 1963.

Finally, that the Hendricks part-time County Health Department will be dissolved and its records transferred to the full-time health department, as of January 1, 1963, in accordance with Section 602, Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly.

- II. Profession - At least two of the members shall be persons holding an unlimited license to practice medicine in Indiana; one shall be a licensed dentist, one member shall be a licensed veterinarian; and one shall be a school superintendent.
- III. Term of Office - Original Appointees

1st member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1963 ( 1 year appointment)



2nd member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1964 ( 2 year appointment )  
3rd member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1964 ( 2 year appointment )  
4th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1965 ( 3 year appointment )  
5th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1965 ( 3 year appointment )  
6th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1966 ( 4 year appointment )  
7th member - January 1, 1963 to December 31, 1966 ( 4 year appointment )

#### COUNTY HIGHWAY ENGINEER EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

Be It Remembered that the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, desire to employ a County Highway Engineer under authority granted in Chapter 131 Acts of the General Assembly of 1963, and that Robert W. Armstrong of Danville, Indiana, holding Registered Engineers Certificate Number 3578, is desirous of undertaking employment as such County Highway Engineer, now, therefore, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. The said County Highway Engineer shall devote all time and experience necessary in the performance of the duties and obligations set forth and designated in said Chapter 131 of said Acts to the best of his ability subject to the policies established by the Board of Commissioners. In the performance of his work he shall undertake no project requiring the additional expenditure of public funds without first requesting and obtaining express authority from said Board of Commissioners so to do.

II. It is specifically understood and agreed that the jurisdiction of maintenance and control of all county roads, bridges and culverts by the Board of Commissioners shall not be in anywise abrogated by this agreement and that the County Highway Supervisor shall at all times be accountable primarily to said Board of Commissioners. It is to be remembered, however, that the County Highway Supervisor may, at all times he deems necessary, request and receive advice, recommendations and engineering services necessary for the proper and efficient fulfillment of his duties as such Supervisor in the maintenance, construction and repair of roads, bridges and culverts.

III. The County Highway Engineer shall receive for his services as herein outlined the salary presently provided for the County Surveyor in the amount of \$5400.00 annually; also the statutory ditch mileage reimbursement which is \$654.00; and he shall receive in addition thereto the sum of \$5000.00 as is appropriated from the County Highway Engineer Fund, making in all a total annual salary of \$11,054.00, payable as provided by law.

IV. The term of this employment shall begin January 1, 1964 and terminate December 31, 1964, unless otherwise terminated or modified as is provided by law. And this contract may be renewed on the same terms at the regular December 1964 session of the Board of Commissioners by consent of the parties hereto.

## IN THE MATTER OF COMMENTS ON GRAND JURY REPORT

SPECIAL COMMENTS ON REPORT OF GRAND JURY  
DATED JUNE 1, 1964

The report of the June 1 Grand Jury is submitted for consideration. The items designated in paragraph 2 of said report will receive attention as appropriations permit.

As to the subject matter of paragraph 3 of said report it is quite apparent that the Grand Jury was deprived of the benefit of much information and data which no doubt would have affected or radically changed the comments indicated in this report.

We, the Board of Commissioners, since our tenure, have steadfastly been of the opinion that the county lands must be maintained for future public use and benefit. In our considered judgment this policy would dictate that the crop lands be operated as such and the pasture lands be utilized, all with the idea of preventing soil erosion, the control of noxious weeds and undergrowth, and to maintain a presentable and orderly appearance in a highly developed community. To do otherwise would be folly. The future need for public lands unquestionably will be demanding and no one presently may predict that need.

To accomplish our decided purpose this Board of Commissioners instituted a program providing for a larger livestock complement, the acquisition and maintenance of necessary machinery and equipment, built and repaired adequate fencing, repaired and improved all structures, gave attention to adequate drainage, furnished equipment for maintenance of the County Hospital grounds during the first year of its operation, furnished equipment for the maintenance of the County 4-H Fairgrounds, and assists in the vegetable gardening of the county home.

During the years covered by the present grand jury report, additions, acquisitions and accretions indicated in the report of two reputable, disinterested and qualified appraisers, have been added to the county capital account. We incorporate detailed report in the minutes for public record: (1) In 1963 the farm recovered \$350.00 on a property damage loss which was deposited in the county General Fund and not credited to the farm account.

Giving due credit for the values added to the county farm by the operation of our program, and taking into consideration the total value of chattels, livestock, feed and equipment provided prior to 1961, and the additions thereto since 1961, the conclusion of the grand jury appears wholly incomplete and misleading.

We are not aware of any statutory authority to rent any of the county lands to other than non-profit organizations formed for the purpose of promoting the commercial, industrial or civic interest of the county. The availability of county lands for public purposes without cost is presently exhibited, to wit, the Hendricks County Hospital and the 4-H Fairgrounds; (2) the Indiana Guard Armory, and the Danville Conservation Club. Who can say how many other such needs will arise in the future. We have not lost sight of the fact that appropriate locations for future public uses may or may not be available when needed. We do know that if these lands are properly maintained, the problems of the future in that regard are settled. Likewise, we are convinced that our original policy is sound, and we would not deviate therefrom had we to make the decision anew.

#### Ordinance Regulating the Speed of Motor Vehicles Over Interior Streets of Subdivisions

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Hendricks as follows:  
**Section 1.** Intent and Purpose: It is the intent and purpose of this ordinance to establish uniform speed regulations over all interior streets within all subdivisions in Hendricks County.

#### **Section 2.** Definitions:

- (a) A subdivision is any area divided into lots or parcels of land, a plat of which has been filed with and approved by the Hendricks County Plan Commission.
- (b) An interior street is any public thoroughfare as shown on the plat of any subdivision, except the county highways existing at the time the subdivision was established.
- (c) Motor vehicle shall mean any motor driven automobile, automobile truck, motorcycle, motor bicycle, motor scooter or midget motor car.
- Section 3.** It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle over any interior street in any subdivision in Hendricks County at a speed in excess of Twenty (20) miles per hour.
- Section 4.** Penalty: Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) and not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.) to which may be added imprisonment for a term not to exceed one year.
- Section 5.** All ordinances and speed regulations heretofore adopted and promulgated pertaining to speed limits in any subdivision and any and all ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
- Section 6.** In as much as a present emergency exists, this ordinance shall take effect immediately after
