HENDRICKS COUNTY ORDINANCE NUMBER SEVEN, 1977

WHEREAS, Public Law No. 158, of the 1975 Acts of the Indiana General Assembly (IC 17-202.501 through IC 17-2-2.5-7) provides the power to the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, to adopt an ordinance to license certain business activities henever it is in the public interest in



the conduct of the affairs of said county to do so and,

WHEREAS, said Board of Commissioners deems it to be in the public interest of the citizens of Hendricks County, Indiana, to regulate the licensing of massage parlors and such licensing the applicable to such business activities in the incorporated communities in Hendricks County, Indiana, as well as the unincorporated areas;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners, State of Indiana as follows, to-wit: Section One, General Definition: Whenever used in this chapter, the following words and phrases shall be defined as herein stated.

(a) "Bath House" means any building, room, place or establishment other than a regularly licensed hospital, dispensary, hotel, rooming house or public oldging house, where members of the public are provided with baths, regardless whether steam, vapor, water, sauna, or otherwise. (b) "Massage Parlor" means any building, room, place or establishment other than a regularly licensed hospital or dispensary where non-medical and non-surgical manipulative exercises are practiced upon the human body with or without the use of mechanical or bath devices, by anyone not a physician, osteopath, chiropractor, podiatrist, or physical therapist duly registered with and licensed by the State of Indiana.

(c) "Massage" means any methof of treating the superficial soft parts of the body for remedial or hygienic purposes, consisting of rubbing, stroking, kneading or tapping with the hands or instruments.

(d) "Massage School" means any bath house or massage parlor defined in (a) and (b) above, where the act of massage as defined in (c) above is either taught or practiced.

(e) "Massage Therapy" means the act of body massage, either by mechanical or electrical apparatus for the purpose of reducing or contouring the body by the use of oil rub, salt, hot and cold packs, cold showers and cabinet baths.

(f) "Massage Therapist" means any person who practices, administers or teaches all or any of the subjects or methods of treatment defined in subsection (e) above as massage therapy.

(g) "Massage Therapy Clinic" means any shop, establishment or place of business where any or all of the methods of massage therapy are administered or used.

(h) "Massage Therapy School" means any duly registered massage therapy establishment where a tuition is charged for the instruction of massage therapy techniques.

(i) "Private Club" means an organization or association maintaining club rooms or other recreation of social facilities used primarily for purposes other than a bath house or massage parler, membership in which is limited to persons paying a regular dues or assessment.

Section Two. License required.

(a) It is unlawful for any person or firm to operate, conduct, or maintain a massage school, massage parlor, massage therapy clinic or bath house without a license to operate such massage school, massage parlor, massage therapy clinic, or bath house issued by the County Auditor.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person or firm licensed to operate a massage school, massage parlor, massage therapy clinic or bath house to employ or permit any person to perform a massage unless such person be licensed as a massage therapist by the County Auditor.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to be employed as a massage therapist or to perform massages for a fee unless such person be licensed as a massage therapist by the County Auditor. Section Three. Applications for Licenses.

(a) The application for a license to operate a massage shool, massage parlor, massage therapy clinic, or bath house shall contain the following information and shall be individually signed by the applicant:

1. Name of applicant and aliasest

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2. Resident address of applicant and former addresses for the past three years;

3. Business address of applicant;

4. Number of massage tables, shower stalls, or other such individual units;

5. The age, date of birth, and citizenship of the applicant, in the case of individuals, and of the manager and officers in the case of a corporation;

6. The names, addresses, ages, citizenship and designations of each person connected with the applicant's establishments;

7. Whether the applicant or its manager or officers have ever been previously engaged in operating a massage school, massage parlor, massage therapy clinic, or bath house;

8. Whether any applicant, or in the case of a corporation, it's managers, officers, directors, or stockholders have ever been convicted of any act of violence, moral turpitude, sex offense, or prior violation of this ordinance;

9. The application shall state thereon that: "It is unlawful for any person to make a false statement on this application and discovery of a false statement shall constitute grounds for denial of an application or for revocation of a permit." 10. Type of license being applied for by the applicant.

(b) [b) Along with the operators application for a license, there shall be filed a verified application for a massage therepist license by each individual who is employed in the establishment who is required by the chapter to be licensed. The application shall contain the following information:

1. Name and aliases;

2. Age, date of birth, and social security number;

3. Address and former addresses for past three (3) years;

- 4. Citizenship;
- 5. Nature of work performed;
- Whether convicted of any public offense concerning an act of violence, moral turpitude, sex offense, or prior violation of this ordinance. 6.

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- 7. The application shall state theron that: "It is unlawful for any person to make a false The application shall state therein discovery of a false statement shall constitute grounds statement on this application or for revocation of a permit." for denial of an application or for revocation of a permit."
- (c) Along with aforesaid applications for license there shall be filed a certificate from a duly Along with aforesaid apprications, on a form prescribed by the County Health Officer of Hendricks licensed medical practitioner, on a form prescribed by the County Health Officer of Hendricks licensed medical practicities, and applicant is free from communicable diseases and that said ex-County, certifying that said ex-amination has been made within thirty (30) days prior to the application for the license or permit herein sought.
- (d) All applicants for license to engage in the practice of massage therepy must submit a certificate of affidavit of their respective qualifications as to schooling, training, and experience and where and how obtained.
- (e) Each applicant shall be photographed and have his or her fingerprints taken by the Hendricks County Sheriff, which fingerprints and photograph shall constitute a part of the application.

Section Four. License Fees.

The annual license fee for each person who operates or is employed by a massage parlor, massage

therapy clinic, or bath house or any combination thereof shall be determined in accordance with the following

scale:

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- (a) "Class A" licenses shall be required for all private health clubs. The fee for said license to be fifty dollars (\$50.00) annually.
- (b) "Class B" licenses shall be required for all other owners of the above mentioned businesses, the fee for said license to be two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) annually.
- (c) "Class C" licenses shall be required for massage therapists, the fee for said license to be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) annually for each therapist.

Section Five. Operations.

- (a) No massage school, massage parlor, massage therapy clinic, or bath house shall be operated or conducted in, or without a separate opening to living quarters. There must be a separate opening to living quarters, and a separate entrance to the place of business. No one shall use the building quarters for a place of habitation.
- (b) All licensed operators or permit holders under this ordinance shall display their license or permits in a visible location in their establishment.
- (c) All licenses or permit holders shall be subject to all other town or city ordinances, county ordinances and State of Indiana statutes and the regulations of various administrative bodies of the town, city, county and state, and violation of such regulations, ordinances or statutes shall be grounds for revocation of licenses or permits.
- (d) No person shall be employed by any licensee under this chapter or to be within view of any of the services rendered by any licensee under this chapter or to be within view of any of the services rendered by a massage parlor, massage therapy clinic, or bath house who has not reached the age of twenty-one (21) years.

The license shall also be revoked by the Auditor if he finds after notice and hearing that any license holder has made a flase statement on the application provided for herein. - (f) The license shall be valid for one (1) year and may be renewed for another one (1) year period upon the filing of a new application and payment of the license fee as set out in Section Four. Section Seven. Signs and Advertising.

Any persons, firms or corporations, whose business operations are covered in whole or in part by this ordinance, shall limit their outdoor signs to only one sign, and that sign shall be on the premises where the business is operating and the sign shall not exceed nine (9) square feet, and shall set forth the name, business hours, and the professional services offered to be performed by said business. The lighting on said sign shall be limited to one (1) non-flashing light per side.

Section Eight. Pre-existing Operations.

All persons, firms or corporations to which this ordinance is applicable, who are presently operating within the jurisdiction of the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, shall make application for license as required herein within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this ordinance.

Section Nine. Penalties and Remedies.

(a) Penalties:

All persons, firms, or corporations violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punished by fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and not more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the first offense and not less than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) for each additional conviction thereafter.

(b) Remedies:

The Board of Commissioners, the Hendricks County Prosecutor, the Hendricks County Auditor, or any designated enforcement official, may institute a suit for injunction in the Circuit or Superior Courts of Hendricks County, Indiana, to restrain an individual, firm or corporation from violating the provisions of this ordinance.

Section Ten. Complaints.

All complaints of alleged violations of the provisions of this chapter shall be made in writing to the County Auditor. Upon learning of violations of the provisions of this chapter and/or related ordinances or laws, the Auditor shall utilize the enforcement remedies as provided herein.

After a hearing thereon, if the Auditor should determine that said license shall be revoked,

no refund of license or permit fee shall be due.

Section Eleven.

Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

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Section Twelve.

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This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after passage, publication according to law. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA UNDER AUTHORITY OF CHAPTER 174 ACTS OF JOINTY COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA UNDER AUTHORITY OF CHAPTER 174 ACTS OF 1947 AND ALL ACTS AMENDATORY OR SUPPLEMENTAL THERETO, GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF INDIANA. That Section 1 entitled Definitions be amended by replacing subsection (g) as follows to-wit:

(g) Hendricks County Animal Control Authority:

The provisions of the Ordinance shall be enforced by the Hendricks County Animal Control Authrority, whose membership shall consist of ten (10) members as follows: The Hendricks County Sheriff and the Chiefs of Police of Plainfield, Brownsburg and Danville, who shall serve thereon by virtue of their offices; one County Commissioner and one County Councilman to be appointed from their respective memberships at the regular meeting in December of each year, to serve for a period of one (1) year; one representative from the County Health Department to be appointed by the County Health Board in December of each year, to serve for a period of one (1) year; four lay members, one of whom shall be a licensed Veterinarian residing in Hendricks County, and one of whom shall be a Township Trustee of Hendricks County, who shall be appointed by the Hendricks County Commissioners and serve for a period of three (3) years. In making the initial appointments of the lay members to the Board, the County Commissioners shall appoint one (1) member to serve a period of one (1) yéar, which member must be during his appointed term a member of the Humane Society of Hendricks County, Indiana; the second member for a period of two (2) years; and the third member to serve for a period of three (3) years. All members, excepting those who serve by virtue of their office term, shall expire on December 31 on the last year of their term.

This amending ordinance shall be in full effect from and after January 1, 1978.

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



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IN THE MATTER OF PERSONAL APPEARANCES (PATSY WYNN)

Patsy Wynn appeared to request permission for the Kappa Kappa Kappa Sorority to hold the annual Art Show in the rotunda of the Court House during the second week in May, 1978, as in the past. The Commissioners granted them permission to do this.

(RUSSELL WIDENER)

Mr. Russell Widener, representing the Hendricks County Senior Citizens Service Corporation, appeared on behalf of that group requesting that the county fund a portion of this organization. Mr. Widener said that their group wanted to try to provide transportation, home mursing care and various other services to the senior citizens of Hendricks County. The Federal Government under the Senior Citizens Act of 1977 has funds that would fund 90% of the cost the first year and the county 10%, then the government would fund 75% the second year and the county 25% the second year and then the government would fund 60% the thrid year and the county 40%. 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

My name is Jean Ann Milharoic, 5991 Oak Mill Drive East, Plainfield, Indiana. I an here today as a taxpayer and property owner in Hendricks County. Recent events have caused me grave concern that I feel I must make known. I can no longer stand back and watch some of the things go on that I have seen happen in recent months. I have come to the County Commissioners/County Council because you are the elected officials of this county on whom we taxpayers rely for a good sound county government with sound judgement in choosing those appointed officials to run affairs of the county. Therefore, responsibility for the actions of those appointed officials can be and should be placed on your shoulders. The appointed officials should be accountable to you for their actions and you, in turn. are accountable to the people of this county who elected you.

I wish to register a complaint against Flan Director Nike Graham. Since we moved here in late January of 1977, we have noticed that he often oversteps his boundaries in dealings with both the Plan Connission and the Board of Zoning Appeals. He often gives his personal opinion rather than offering good sound advice for the county. This has be apparent in present dealings with the Plan Connission about Prestwick. He must remember that he is a servant of the public in his position as Flan Director.

He should keep his comments in public to his own area of concern with each case. I do not believe incidents of this nature are good for the county or the county agencies dealing with him. Certainly he has a right to his personal feelings; however, in his position he should have certain ethical conduct in public for which he should be held accountable for which I must, in turn, hold you accountable. a getting into the same type of training

My next complaint is against the very recent "special" hearing by the zoning board on the Islamic Center. This should never have made it to the zoning board, but be handled in a court of law for violation of the county zoning ordinance. Instead, it seems this was entirely ignored, and it begins to reek of political overtones.

I would like to have you obtain the tape of the proceedings of the Islamic hearing, not the typewritten transcript, but the tape itself. Please listen carefully to the entire proceedings.

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The attorney for the muslim group, Mr. Steve Keck, was allowed to continually bring in religious freedom (at one time he even had Mahmoud Rashdan tell us all about Islam:) while the remonstrators were very careful not to infringe on their religious freedom and stick only to the zoning issues involved. These findings showed clearly that this Center is detrimental to the surrounding community especially that property to the north of this land.

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The remonstrators also showed that this Center is a profit making business concern with the "church" as incidental to the purposes forth stated. The remonstrators also had the sheriff himself explain we are getting into the same type of traffic and security problems that are present with IRP! During his testimony I also found that the county is very short on personnel on the sheriff's department. Just where are my tax dollars going I wonder?

Please listen carefully to the legal advice given by Mr. Vandiver, attorney for the zoning board in this particular case. He advised that if the board voted against the Center, they would have to show cause for turning this down in a court of appeals. This in turn would cost the county money. He further actually made the motion for the board so that it would be worded in the best possible way

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to keep this board from having to give legal reasons later. Well, what about giving me some legal reasons for allowing something to even be heard when clear violations of a "cease and desist" order by Mike Graham last December had been made. also stipulated that the muslims must follow county guidelines. How can we expect them to follow county guidelines when they have already proved that they could care less for obeying orders already given them last July and again in December with the issuance of the "cease and desist". Also the new zoning board member looked directly to Mr. Vandiver for advice, because he wasn't sure what to do. Mr. Vandiver should have given the legal ramifications for both sides of the issues and sit back and let the board take over.

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The consequent actions of the zoning board leads me to believe that this county can now be considered an "open" county to anything or anyone who can't get zoning anywhere else. If our appeals board is so worried about being asked to show cause for their actions, then anyone can do anything they want if they first let the board know that they will appeal a "no" vote in a court of law, which is what Mr. Keck did.

I have also been advised that our County Attorney, Mr. Al Deckard, originally purchased the land in question and sold it to the muslim group. He certainly has a right to buy and sell property, but as a

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public servant I at least expect him to check out the prospective buyers and what they wish to do with this land and what this means to the other property owners in the area. Maybe I'm wrong, but I feel my property and it's value were sold down the river in exchange for a business deal by an official of this county which to me is a clear conflict of interest with the property owners in this area which he should be representing. 

Mr. Al Deckard, Hendricks County Attorney, gave his recommendations in writing to the Board of County commissioners and read them to all present and they are as follows:

TO: Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana

Re: IWD Waste Disposal operation east of Danville, Indiana.

As per your request, this is to advise that we have researched the law as regard to the above waste isposal operation.

We have concluded that Hendricks County Ordinance 1967-1 regulating garbage and waste disposal in Hendricks County is still in full force and effect.

We have further concluded that the conditional use permit, granted by the Hendricks County Board of Zoning Appeals, was for a land-fill operation and that the aforesaid operation does not come within the landfill operation as described in Ordinance 1967-1 and in SPC-19.

The Ordinance 1967-1 as proposed by the Hendricks County Board of Health was passed pursuant to .c. 17-2-22-4 (effective 1953), which permitted local governments to regulate waste disposal.

That although the Stream Pollution Control Board, by its regulation SPC-18, require waste disposal permits and sets minimum standards for their operation, the State of Indiana through its Board of Health and Stream Pollution Control Board has not pre-empted the area specifically enough to prohibit local government from passing and enforcing their own laws, as long as they are compatible.

A "landfill" as defined in Ordinance 1967-1 is as follows:

"Sanitary fill" shall mean and relate to the removal to and placing of garbage and rubbish in a specially prepared trench or its equivalent and the aforesaid contents thoroughly compacted and covered with at least six (6) inches of compacted fresh earth daily.

It is further described by Regulation SPC-18 a "landfill" means a "sanitary landfill" .:

"Sanitary Landfill" means an engineering method of disposing of refuse on land in a manner that protects the public health and environment by spreading the waste in thin layers, compacting it to the smallest practical volume, and covering it with compacted soil at the end of each working day.

The request directed to Mr. Michael Graham, as Planning Coordinator by I.W.D. proposed that mycellia was to be used as part of an experimental farming operation, would have been permitted on the land though it was zoned "Industrial".

We recommend the following:

1. That this matter be referred to the Hendricks County Board of Health and the Hendricks County Prosecutor, pursuant to the Ordinance 1967-1, for enforcement of having failed to obtain a permit as required by said ordinance and having disposed industrial waste as prohibited by the

said Ordinance. 2. That this matter be referred to Michael Graham, Hendricks County Planning Director, who concurs in this opinion, for the issuance of a Cease and Desist Order for any operation other than that permitted by Ordinance 1967-1, and for him to further notify the Indiana Stream Pollution Control Board of the zoning violation and request that their permit be invalidated immediately.

3. That the landowners adversely affected by the aforesaid operation seek legal advice as to whether or not the aforesaid operation constitutes an "actionable nuisance", and as to all remedies

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



Mrs. Weathers advised that she doesn't believe it will even hold up for the mailing of the tax receipts let alone the mailing of reassessment notices. After discussion the commissioners purchased a new heavier duty machine at a cost of \$4,257.00.

VIC BOYER

Mr. Vic Boyer of Electronics Snergy appeared and explained why his bid of the closed circuit TV system at the Jail was so much higher than the other bidder. He advised that the difference was in the type of cameras used type of cameras used and that his company had made an extensive study of the jail and felt that if any other type cameras other type cameraes were used with the lighting available at the jail that any new systems would not work. The commissioners adviced on The commissioners advised they still had the bids under advisement and intended to do further checking

REPORT OF THE HENDRICKS COUNTY GRAND JURY - 1979 TERM

The Hendricks County Grand Jury, 1979 Term, reports as follows:

- Date Convened: The Hendricks County Grand Jury convened on February 13, 1979. 1.
- Public Buildings Inspected: 2.
 - Hendricks County Home The Grand Jury inspected the County Home on February 13, 1979. The Α. home appeared to be in good repair and functioning properly, except front steps of the home were snow covered and hazardous. The snow should have been revoved. Also, several paint cans were found in the basement which should have been removed.
 - Hendricks County Jail The Grand Jury inspected the County Jail on February 13, 1979. The jail Β. had been previously inspected by the State Jail Inspector and no serious problems were found by the Grand Jury. It was noticed, however, that there was inadequate ventilation in an area where several juveniles were doing some painting.
 - Indiana Boys School The Grand Jury inspected the Indiana Boys School on February 22, 1979. The С. only critical comment is that safety rules need to be enforced in the wood-working classes, and all other classes involving hazardous activities by the students.
- 3. Cases heard: The Hendricks County Grand Jury heard evidence involving the circumstances surrounding the death of Rebecca Huey on January 13, 1979, at 315 North Tennessee Street, Danville, Indiana. The Grand Jury states:

37 persons appeared and gave testimony.

Β. That 91 exhibits were marked and introduced to the Grand Jury.

С. That the Grand Jury heard evidence for six days and deliberated for two days.

D. That the Grand Jury believes that the investigation of Mrs. Huey's death was not handled professionally, however, the Grand Jury is not making any allegations of intentional misconduct of the authorities involved. In particular, the following should be reported:

(1) The first official on the death scene was David Ogden, Danville Policeman. Mr. Ogden had the responsibility to take charge of the death scene in order to secure it and preserve evidence, but he failed to do so.

(2) The two ambulance technicians should have given more effort in administering first aid to Mrs. Huey.

(3) Mr. Bruce Baker was the Deputy Coroner called to the scene. Mr. Baker requested an autopsy, but in the opinion of this Grand Jury, should have also done the following: (a) called the Hendricks County Prosecuting Attorney; (b) called the Hendricks County Prosecuting Attorney's Investigator, (c) sealed off the house; (d) ordered photographs taken of death scene; (e) made an inventory of the deceased's clothing and personal effects, and (f) should have kept the deceased's clothing and personal effects for later use by police investigator's.

(4) The Danville Police Chief, Mr. Charles Williams, Sr., did not assume the responsibility which his position dictates at the scene of Rebecca Huey's death. While his junior officers thought further investigation of the death scene was needed, he, apparently, did not believe further action necessary. Cheif Williams did not order photograpsh taken of the home or death scene. It is the opinion of the Grand Jury that Chief Williams should have called the Prosecuting Attorney and reported the death of Mrs. Huey. Further, the Grand Jury feels that Chief Williams used poor judgment in allowing Mrs. Carmen Patterson, a newspaper reporter, to read the official police report of the death of Rebecca Huey.

Recommendations:

The Grand Jury feels that Hendricks County Law Enforcement Officials should set up procedures by which a suspicious death can be investigated effectively. Further, the Grand Jury believes that a Death Investigation Team should be formed on a county-wide basis to investigate all deaths in the county, other than those from natural causes.

IN THE MATTER OF ORDINANCE NO. 1979-9

AMENDING

ORDINANCE NO. 1967 - 1

The Hendricks County Commissioners adopted a new ordinance for Landfill operations and trash

hauling in Hendricks County as follows:

An ordinance regulating the transportation of refuse, refuse disposal, facilities, and refuse processing facilities by establishing standards for operating such vehicles and facilities and by establishing a licensing system for enforcement of those standards.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, Ordinance No. 1967 - 1 regulating the disposal of garbage and rubbish on lands situated outside any incorporated town, requiring license permits, and providing for penalties for violations thereof be amended

to read as follows:

Chapter I. - Purpose and General Policy

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County finds that improperly operated landfills and other refuse disposal and processing facilities can (1) endanger the health and welfare

of the citizens of this County by causing or contributing to the pollution of ground and surface waters, (2) result in nuisances and a hazard to the public health, and (3) provide a breeding place for flies, rats, and other vermin. It is therefore declared to be the public policy of this County to eliminate and prevent these health and safety hazards by establishing standards for the proper operation of refuse disposal and processing facilities.

Section 2. The Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County finds that there is a need to eliminate the blowing and spillage of refuse from vehicles which transport refuse and that there is a need for such transportation to be done in a sanitary manner.

Section 3. All existing refuse disposal and/or processing sites shall comply with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. The Hendricks County Health Officer or his representatives shall enforce the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 5. Before the Health Officer issues a local permit for operation of a refuse disposal nd/or a refuse processing facility, the applicant must first secure all appropriate zoning approvals from the Hendricks County Planning Commission and/or Hendricks County Board of Zoning Appeals.

Section 6. Before the County Health Officer issues a local permit for operation of a refuse disposal and/or a refuse processing facility, the applicant must first secure all appropriate permits from the Indiana Stream Pollution Control Board and/or the Indaina State Board of Health.

Chapter II. - Definitions

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this ordinance unless otherwise indicated clearly by the text.

(1) "Access Roads" means roads which lead to the entrance of a refuse processing or disposal facility, normally, a county, state or federal highway.

(2) "Aquifer" means a porous, water-bearing geological formation, such as sand, gravel, sandstone and fractured or cavernous limestone, from which water can be drawn by wells in useable quantities.

(3) "Bedrock" means cemented or consolidated earth materials, undisturbed by erosion or weathering, exposed on the earth's surface or underlying unconsolidated earth materials.

(4) "Board of Health" means the Hendricks County Board of Health.

(5) "Carcasses" means dead animals or portions thereof.

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(6) "Cell" means soil which is used to bury refuse.

(7) "Cover" means soil which is used to bury refuse.

(8) "Daily Cover" means that cover which is placed over refuse and compacted at the end of an operating day.

(9) "Decomposition" means the chemical or biological breakdown through time of refuse into constituent chemicals or other products.

(10) "Decomposition Gases" means gases produced by decomposition. (11) "Energy Recovery Operation" means the processing of refuse so that energy or gases may be recovered.

(12) "Facility" means, except in Chapter IV, any operation for the disposal or processing of refuse, including the site upon which the operation rests.

(13) "Final Cover" means cover placed and compacted over a refuse disposal area upon completion of the refuse disposal use of that area.

(14) "Flood Plain" means the area adjoining a river, stream, or lake, which would be covered by floodwater from the 100 - year frequency flood.

(15) "Floodway" means the channel of a river or stream and those portions of the flood plain adjoining the channel which are reasonably required to efficiently carry and discharge the peak flood flow of the 100 - year frequency flood.

(16) "Garbage" shall mean rejected food waste and shall include, but is not limited to, every waste accumulation of animal, fruit, or vegetable matter used or intended for food attends to the preparation, use, cooking, dealing in, or storing of meat, fish, fowl, fruit or vegetables.

(17) "Grading" means the contouring of land so that surface water flow and erosion are controlled according to a predetermined plan.

(18) "Groundwater" means water filling the pore spaces of earth materials below the water-saturated zone.

(19) "Groundwater Table" means the upper surface of the water-saturated zone.

(20) "Hazardous Wastes" means any solid or liquid waste with inherent dangers, including but not limited to, toxic chemicals, explosives, pathological wastes, radioactive materials, materials likely to cause fires, liquids, semi-liquids, sludges containing less than thirty percent solids, pesticides, pesticide containers, septic tank pumpings, and raw or digested sewage sludge.

(21) "Health Officer" shall mean the Hendricks County Health Officer or his authorized representative.

(22) "Hendricks County" shall mean those areas which are under the jurisdiction of the Hendricks County Health Officer and situated outside the corporate limits of any town.

(23) "Hydrology" means the properties, distribution, and flow of water on or in the

earth.

(24) "Incinerator" means any apparatus to burn waste substances in which all the

factors of combustion - temperature, retention time, turbulence, and combustion air - can be controlled and used for reduction of garbage, carcasses, or refuse.

(25) "Land Application of a Waste" means the application of hazardous waste onto land and incorporation into the surface soil.

(26) "Landfill" means a sanitary landfill.

(27) "Leachate" means liquid that has percolated through solid waste or other deposited materials and has extracted soluble or suspended substances from it.

(28) "Lift" means a horizontal layer of cells covering a designated area of a sanitary

landfill.

(29) "Manually Discharge Vehicle" means a vehicle which must be unloaded by the physical handling of refuse by a person, for example, a pickup truck.

(30) "Mechanically Discharged Vehicle" means a vehicle which unloads refuse auto-

matically, with hydraulic devices.

(31) "Modification" means a change in form or method of operation of any facility.

(32) "On-site Roads" means roads for the passage of vehicles from a site entrance to

the working face.

(33) "Operating Personnel" means persons necessary to properly operate a refuse dis-

posal or processing facility.

(34) "Person" shall mean an individual, partnership, association, syndicate, company, firm, trust, corporation, government corporation, department, bureau, agency or any entity recognized by law.

(35) "Point of Generation" means that place where a material initially becomes dis-

carded; foreprocessing of disposal; as frefuse.

(36) "Processing" means the method, system; corfother treatment of refuse so as to change its chemical or physical form or affecte it for disposal or recovery of materials, but excluding vehisles for the transportation of refuse from its point of generation.

(37) "Recycling Station" means a facility for the storage of separated solid Wastes prior to transportation to markets.

(38) "Refuse" means any combination of garbage and rubbish.

(39) "Refuse Disposal" means the permanent or semi-permanent placement of refuse in

any location.

(40) "Refuse Handling Equipment" means equipment used for the processing or disposal of refuse.

(41) "Regulation SPC-18" means the Indiana Stream Pollution Control Board regulation governing sanitary landfills and refuse processing facilities.

(42) "Resource Recovery Plant" means any facility which has as at least one of its purposes the processing of refuse into commercially valuable materials or energy.

(43) "Rubbish" shall mean and include such matter as ashes, cans, metalware, broken glass, crockery, dirt, sweepings, boxes, wood, grass, weeds, or litter of any kind.

(44) "Salvaging" means the controlled removal of materials from refuse for utilization,

(45) "Sanitary Landfill" means an engineering method of disposing of refuse on land in a manner that protects the public health and environment by spreading the waste in thin layers, compacting it to the smallest practical volume, and covering it with compacted soil at the end of each working day.

(46) "Scavenging" means the uncontrolled removal of materials from refuse.

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(47) "Sludge" means a semi-liquid sediment.

(48) "Soil Borings" means the drilling of holes in the earth for the purpose of identifying soil types, sub-surface materials, and groundwater table level.

(49) "State" means the Indiana Stream Pollution Control Board and/or the Indiana State Board of Health.

(50) "Surface Water" means water present on the surface of the earth, including: streams, lakes, ponds, rivers, swamps, marshes, or rainwater present on the earth.

(51) "Transfer Station" means a facility for the acceptance, holding, and loading of refuse into a vehicle for movement to a processing or disposal facility, excluding stationary compactors snd collection containers.

(52) "Vector" means any living animal capable of harboring and transmitting microorganism from one animal to another animal or human.

(53) "Water Course" means the path taken by flowing surface waters. (54) "Water Table" means ground water table. (55) "Working Face" means that portion of a sanitary landfill where refuse is discharged from collection trucks and is compacted prior to placement of cover material. Chapter III. - Local Permit for Operation of a Sanitary Landfill Section 1. No person shall cause or allow the operation of sanitary landfill without a valid operating permit issued by the County Health Officer. Section 2. No application for a local operating permit for a new sanitary landfill will be accepted unless that sanitary landfill hold a valid construction plan permit and a valid operating permit from the State as specified by Regulation SPC 18. A copy of all plans and specifications approved by the State shall accompany all local permit applications. Section 3. No application for a local operating permit for a sanitary landfill will be accepted unless the facility has received all appropriate zoning approvals from the Hendricks County Plan Commission and/or Board of Zoning Appeals. Section 4. Complete application for operating permits for sanitary landfill must be made on forms provided by the Health Officer at least 30 days prior to proposed initial date of operation unless a shorter time is approved in advance by the Health Officer.

Section 5. Application for an operating permit for a sanitary landfill must be signed by the owner and the person who shall be responsible for the quality of operation, affirming that such person whall adhere to the method of operation specified in the plans, specifications, and description of project, and shall maintain operational quality at or above the standards set by this Chapter.

Section 6. (General Standards) Sanitary landfill operations must conform to the following minimum general standards of operation:

(a) All on-site roads shall be passable by vehicles, including automobiles, regardless

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(b) Any shelter or sanitary facilities provided shall be constructed in accordance with the requirements of the Indaina State Board of Health for such construction.

(c) Feeding of cattle, hogs, poultry or other animals at the landfill site is prohibited.

(d) No refuse deposit shall be made nearer than 600 feet to any dwelling without

written consent of the occupant and owner of the dwelling.

Section 7. (Water Quality) Sanitary landfill operations must conform to the following minimum water quality standards:

(a) Where groundwater monitoring wells are deemed necessary by the Board, the sampling frequency will be specified. Tests performed on groundwater samples shall include COD, pH, Fe., Cl, conductivity and other tests deemed necessary by the Board.

(b) Surface water courses and runoff shall be diverted from the sanitary landfill by

trenches and proper grading. The sanitary landfill shall be constructed and cover material graded and seeded so as to promote rapid surface water runoff without excessive erosion. Regrading shall be done as required during operation and after completion to avoid ponding and to maintain cover thickness.

(c) In no case shall solid waste be deposited within an aquifer. A barrier of undisturbed soil shall be maintained between the lowest portion of deposited refuse and the aquifer of a thickness to be determined by the Board based upon permeability and ion exchange properties.

Section 8. (Air Quality) Open burning of solid wastes is prohibited.

Section 9. (Aesthetics) A sanitary landfill shall at all times be operated in an aestheti-

cally acceptable manner. (a) Portable litter fences or other devices shall be used in the immediate vicinity face and other locations to control blowing litter. Windblown materials must be collected

the working

(b) Access to the site shall be controlled and shall be by established roadways only. and buried daily. The sanitary landfill shall be accessible only when operating personnel are on duty. Large containers may be placed outside the site entrance so that users can deposit waste after hours; the large containers and areas around them shall be maintained in a sanitary and litter-free condition. (c) Vegetation shall be cleared only as necessary. Natural windbreaks such as green

belts, shall be maintained where they will be maintained in a sanitary and litter-free condition. (d) A sign of at least 16 square feet shall be erected at the side entrance identify-

(e) Salvaged materials must be stored in transportable containers or in buildings while ing the operation, stating operating schedule and fees. awaiting removal from the site. In no instance shall salvaged materials be allowed to accumulate on the

(f) On-site roads shall be constructed in such a way as to minimize the tracking of groudn. mud or soil material onto public highways, or the operator shall maintain the equipment required to revove any mud or soil materials which are tracked onto the public highway. Policing of litter on roads upon the site shall be the responsibility of the owner and operator of that landfill.

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Section 10. (Gases) Decomposition gases generated within a sanitary landfill shall be controlled on-site. Decompostion gases shall not be allowed to migrate laterally from the sanitary land. fill site, nor allowed to concentrate in a manner that will pose an explosion or toxicity hazard.

Section 11. (Vectors) Effective means shall be taken to prevent the harboring, feeding or breeding of vectors. The presence of adult flies, roaches, mosquitoes, rodents and the immature stages of these and other vectors is inimical to public health. Effective control shall be indicated by the ab. sence of fly larvae, nymphs of roaches, larval mosquitoes, and all other immature stages of vectors, as well as by the absence of mature or adult stages of vectors.

Section 12. (Safety) A sanitary landfill shall be operated and maintained in such a manner as to protect the health and safety of personnel associated with the operation.

(a) Safety devices, including, but not limited to, roll bars and fire extinguishers shall be provided on all rolling equipment to protect the health and safety of operators.

(b) Provision shall be made to extinguish any fires in wastes being delivered to the site or which occur at the working face or within equipment or personnel facilities. Communication equip ment shall be available for emergency situations.

(c) Scavenging shall be prohibited to avoid injury and to prevent interference with operations.

(d) Traffic signs shall be provided to promote an orderly traffic pattern to and from the discharge area and, if necessary;, to restrict access to hazardous areas or to maintain efficient operating conditions. Manually discharged vehicles shall not hinder operation of mechanically discharged vehicles, No vehicle shall be left unattended at the working face or along traffic routes.

Section 13. (Operator Instructions) An operating manual describing the various tasks that must be performed during a typical shift, as well as safety precautions and procedures, shall be available to employees for reference. Employees shall be instructed as to these tasks and safety precautions and procedures.

Section 14. (Cover Applications) A cover of compacted soil shall be applied and compacted over all exposed solid waste by the end of each operating day. A final cover of soil shall be applied and compacted as each area is completed.

(a) Equipment shall spread all solid waste in layers, compact the waste, and place, spread, and compact the cover material. These operations shall be on a working face slope maintained at 3:1 or steeper.

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(b) All solid waste shall be covered by the end of each operating day. Daily cover shall be applied regardless of weather. The thickness of the compacted daily cover shall not be less than six inches.

(c) When any portion of a site reaches within two feet of final elevation, compacted final cover shall be applied, not less than two feet in depth. At the termination of operations at a site, final grading shall be done, and the area seeded with suitable vegetation to control erosion, Final cover shall have a slope of not less than 2 percent and be without depressions that will cause

Section 15. (Hazardous and Special Wastes) The disposal of hazardous and special Wastes must conform to the following:

(a) Under no circumstances shall hazardous wastes be accepted at a sanitary landfill unless authorized in writing by the state and by the local Health Officer.

(b) Certain bulky wastes, such as automobile bodies, furniture, and appliances shall be crushed on solid ground and then pushed onto the working face near the bottom of the cell or into a separate disposal and The special areas used only for bulky wastes shall be identified on the plan for the completed site.

(c) Procedures for disposing of dead animals have been established by law, I.C. (1971), 15-2-8-13. Any operation accepting carcasses shall comply accordingly. The soil shall be regraded periodically to keep water from ponding as a result of settlement.

Section 16. (Equipment) At all times the equipment available shall be capable of spreading and compacting the solid waste and the cover material required for the most severe combination of solid waste delivery and weather conditions expected during any one operating day. Equipment manuals, catalogs, and spare parts lists shall be available at the equipment maintenance facility.

Section 17. (Records) A set of approved plans shall be maintained on site. An up-todate plot plan of the landfill site shall be maintained on site, with areas marked as they are filled or excavated.

Chapter IV. - Local Permit for Operation of Refuse Processing Facilities

Section 1. In this Chapter, "facilities shall mean all equipment, buildings, or other features of a project necessary to conduct the processing of refuse. Excluded are containers utilized for refuse collection and stationary compactors.

Section 2. No person shall cause or allow the operation of any refuse processing facility without an operating permit issued by the County Health Officer.

Section 3. No application for a local permit for a refuse processing facility will be accepted unless the applicant holds a valid construction plan permit and a valid operating permit from the State as specified by Regulation SPC 18. A copy of all plans and specifications approved by the State shall accompany all local permit applications.

Section 4. No application for a local operating permit for a refuse processing facility will be accepted accepted unless the applicant has received all appropriate zoning approvals from the Hendricks County Plan Commission and/or Board of Zoning Appeals.

Section 5. Complete applications for operating permits for a refuse processing facility must be made on form provided by the Health Officer at least 30 days prior to the proposed initial date of operation unless a shorter time is approved in advance by the Health Officer.

Section 6. Applications for permits to operate a refuse processing facility must be signed by the person responsible for maintaining operations within the limits and quality standards specified for that operation in this regulation and in the approval for that plant.

Section 7. Refuse processing facilities shall maintain the premises in a litter-free condition. Overnight refuse storage areas must be enclosed.

Section 8. Incinerator residue must be disposed of in a sanitary landfill holding a valid operating permit under this regulation.

Section 9. In the event of a breakdown or failure of any refuse processing facility, refuse normally accepted at that facility must be deposited at a sanitary landfill holding a valid operating permit under this regulation, until such time as the facility is fully operational again.

Chapter V - Permits and Duration

Section 1. Operating permits shall be valid for a period of two years from the effective date of the permit.

Section 2. An operating permit may be issued for less than two years if the Health Officer determines it is appropriate.

Section 3. A permit may be temporarily suspended by the County Health Officer upon violation by the holder of any part of the terms of this Ordinance, or revoked after a reasonable opportunity for a hearing by the Health Officer upon serious repeated violations.

Section 4. A separate permit shall be required for each refuse disposal and/or processing facility or method and a separate permit shall be required for each site.

Section 5. No permit signed by the County Health Officer shall be valid until countersigned by the Treasurer of Hendricks County. The County Treasurer shall countersign a properly signed permit or

license upon the payment to the Treasurer of Hendricks County of a permit fee in the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). All monies or fees collected under the terms of this Ordinance shall revert to

the General Fudn of Hendricks County,

Section 6. No fee shall be charged for any State, County or Municipally owned and operated public garbage and rubbish disposal site in Hendricks County; provided, nevertheless, the County Health Officer shall have full jurisdiction and control over the policing os such, within the terms of this Ordinance,

Chapter VI - Renewal of Permits

Section 1. Complete applications for renewal of permits must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of the expiring permit.

Section 2. Evaluation of an operating permit renewal application will be based on the quality of operation during the period of the previous permit. If the standards specified in this Ordinance have been met, the permit will be reissued.

(a) Evaluation will be based on reports of all inspections made during the evaluation period, with a minimum of eight inspections. No permit shall be renewed if the facility holding that permit has not been substantially in compliance with this Ordinance.

(b) No permit shall be renewed if, on more than half of the inspections, the operation did not meet requirements of this regulation, or if on more than one occasion one of the following had occured:

- (i) Acceptance of hazardous wastes, except as set out in the Ordinance.
- (ii) Open burning of refuse without efforts to extinguish the fire having been initiated prior to the inspection.
- (iii) Leachate flowing into a stream, lake, river, other surface water, or an aquifer without adequate control measures in operation.

Cahpter VII. - Permits for Refuse Hauling Vehicles

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person in Hendricks County, who does not possess an unrevoked permit from the Health Officer, to engage in the removal and/or the transportation of refuse from premises to a location other than the place of origin of such refuse for disposal.

(a) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any person disposing of only their own refuse if transported to an approved disposal site in a sanitary manner.

Section 2. Before a permit is issued by the Health Officer for the collection and transportation of refuse, all equipment and vehicles to be used shall be approved by the Health Officer or his authorized representative. All equipment and vehicles used to transport refuse to an approved disposal site shall be suitably constructed, sanitary type, refuse must be adequately covered and vehicles shall be cleaned as may be necessary to prevent nuisances and health hazards. Equipment other than the above shall meet the approval of the Health Officer.

Section 3. Any permit issued by the Health Officer shall contain the name of the person to whom the permit is granted and such other pertinent information as may be required by the Health Officer. A separate permit shall be required for each vehicle used to tarnsport refuse. No permit signed by the County Health Officer shall be valid until countersigned by the Treasurer of Hendricks County. The County Treasurer shall countersign a properly signed permit or license upon the payment to the Treasurer of Hendricks County a permit fee in the amount of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each vehicle. All monies or fees collected under the terms of this Ordinance shall revert to the General Fund of Hendricks County. Section 4. No fee shall be charged for any State, County, or Muncipally owned and operated full jurisdicts full jurisdiction and control over the policies of such within the terms of this Ordinance. Section 5. Only persons who comply with the requirements of this ordinance shall be entitled to receive and retain such a permit. The permit shall be for the term of one year on a calendar year basis and shall be renewable annually. No permit or renewal thereof shall be denied on arbitrary or capricious around

Section 6. Before any permit shall be issued, the applicant for such a permit shall first furnish proof of insurance with the Health Officer showing public liability and property damage insurance policy insuring the applicant against liability for damages sustained by a person other than the employee of said applicant and occasioned by the neglectful operation of the vehicle or vehicles of said applicant, and the insurance policy shall provide a minimum coverage in the amount of \$15,000 for the injury or death of any person as a result of any one accident, and shall provide a minimum coverage in the amount of \$30,000 for property damage. Such insurance policy shall be written by a company authorized to do business in the State of Indiana.

Chapter VIII. - Miscellaneous

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Section 1. (Exclusions) Disposal sites and operations which receive only rocks, brick, concrete or earth or any combiantion thereof shall be excluded from the provision of this regulation. Any operation wishing to accept any other inert fill may petition the Board or its designated agent for exclusion from this regulation. This exclusion is void if the disposal site or operation knowingly or unknowingly receives any matter than the above, or that approved by the Board.

Section 2. Any land application of Hazardous Waste sha-l require an operating permit from the Health Officer. No local operating permit for disposal of Hazardous Waste using a land application method shall be approved until the applicant has first secured written approval from the Indaina Stream Pollution Control Board and/or the Indaina State Board of Health. Application for operating permit must be made or forms provided by the Health Officer at least 30 days prior to the proposed initial date of operation unless a shorter time is approved in advance by the Health Officer. The applicant shall follow the same procedures as outlined in Chapter V of this Ordinance. Any land application of Hazardous Wastes which creates a problem by polluting ground and/or surface water, by creating a breeding place for vermins, or by creating a noxious, harmful or offensive odor shall be considered detrimental to the health and welfare of the citizens of Hendricks County.

Section 3. Sanitary landfills and other disposal operations which are closed after promulgation of this Ordinance shall be inspected by the Health Officer or his designated agent. Following final acceptance by the Health Officer or his designated agent, a detailed description, including a plan, shall be recorded by the owner or operator with the county's land recording authority. The description shall include general types and location of wastes, depth of fill, and other information of interest to potential land owners. The owner or operator shall maintain surface contours, continue periodic groundwater monitoring, and exercise any necessary controls over gas or leachate produced.

Chapter IX. - Enforcement

Section 1. The enforcement of this Ordianane shall be by the Hendricks County Health Officer.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Hendricks County Prosecuting Attorney, to whom the County Health Officer shall report any alleged violations, to cause proceedings to be commenced against the alleged violator of the provisions of this Ordinance, and to prosecute said matter to final determination. Section 3. Any person convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), for a first offense; for a second offence a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00); and for a third and each subsequent offense by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), to which may be added imprisonment in the county jail for any determinate period not exceeding ninety (90) days. Each day after the expiration of the time limit for abating insanitary conditions and completing improvements to abate such conditions as ordered by the County Board of Health, or by the County Health Officer, shall constitute a distinct and separate offense.

Chapter X. - Repeal

Section 1. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption

and its publication as provided by law.

Chapter XI. - Unconstitutionality

Section 1. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional, or invalid for any reason, the remainder os said Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval according to law.

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IN THE MATTER OF PERSONAL APPEARANCES

(JUDGE JOHN C. MOWRER) Judge John C. Mowrer of Superior Court II appeared before the Commissioners to ask whether the Commissioners had made a decision as to whether or not they could move one of the copying machines from the second floor to his office. The Commissioners advised the Judge they would pay the rental on the machine which he presently has in his office until such time as the new office building is completed and they can assess the use of one of the machines on the second floor after the offices moving to the new building are gone.

Mr. Franklin, Mooresville Street Commissioner, appeared and asked permission to change the ditch on the Morgan/Hendricks County line road just east of Indaina Street so that the water can flow straight down an open ditch on the north side of the road. The Commisisoners advised they would have the highway superintendent check into this matter and let Mr. Franklin know.

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(NELSON STEELE)

Nelson Steele of Butler Fairman and Seifert Engineering appeared and advised that Hendricks County-Putnam County bridge had been set for letting by the Putnam County Commissioners on June 4, 1979, as per the agreement between Hendricks and Putnam County.

(GARY ROGERS)

Gary Rogers, Hendricks County Sanitarian, appeared and advised he had checked into the problem of raw sewage in Peaceful Acres and had discussed the matter with the Board of Health and its attorney. The Board of Health attorney advised that the Board's attorney advised that the property owner where the tile was expelling the open sewage had a right to stop up the tile.

IN THE MATTER OF BOARD OF HEALTH REPORT

We feel we are best qualified for two reasons:

1. We pledge to build the finest system in Indiana and as good as any in the nation - a full 35 channel system that should be completely filled within one year after our system is completed.

2. We will be locally owned and managed.

Let's take point two first. The head of a large system in a nearby city with many franchises yet to develop has made the point they should be allowed to develop a system in this large city because his group is locally owned. However, their application has been vetoed, contested by many national cable concerns, lawsuits, threatened - I believe they have their hands full.

Be that as it may we believe his "local" point is well taken. We believe he is right - the franchise should be granted to local people. You grant us this franchise or approval and it will be locally owned. David is prepared to buy property here, move his family and make his home here in Hendricks County. We will becomed involved in civic, school and business organizations. Now for point one.

Programming plans have literally exploded since we first proposed our Hendricks County system. In April and May we attended both annual conventions of the National Cable Television Association and the Illinois - Indiana Association of which we are members in good standing.

At the National Convention Chairman Charles Ferris of the FCC admonished the cable industry for not presenting more than the usual transmission of television stations, plus some news and weather. The industry answered Mr. Ferris. In fact plans that had been in the planning stages for many months were pub-

licized for the first time at these conventions.

We propose to incorporate many of these ideas into our Hendricks County System. A qualified supervisor cannot be hired on this project because of the wage limitation set by the Federal government, and it is also impossible to place these participants under the supervision of the County Highway because of the entry level wage law.

Therefore, these participants have taken advantage of the benefits and trust placed in them. They have refused to comply with the county personnel policies. They have damaged equipment and property. While Mr. Harvey H. Hacker, the CETA administrator, physically worked with these participants, they marked and cleared over 120 bridges. However, Mr. Hacker cannot continue to work in the field. This has caused his administrative duties to be slighted.

As a result of these problems and many others, the Hendricks County Commissioners have ordered that Contract #PSP6-79-430 be terminated as of August 5, 1979 and the remaining money be deobligated and returned to

ORDINANCE OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA ORDINANCE NO. 1979-17

IN THE MATTER OF AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1979-17

WHEREAS, Chapter 174 of the Acts of the General Assembly for 1947, as amended, granted certain powers to County Plan Commissions, relative to the platting of lands within their jurisdictions; and WHEREAS, the Hendricks County Plan Commission of Hendricks County, Indiana, held a public hearing on October 8, 1979, pursuant to notice, and after having heard testimony from the Plan Commission staff and after having heard remonstrators, the Hendricks County Plan Commission found:

1. That a number of storm sewer systems in existing subdivisions in Hendricks County have not been sized properly to accomodate a reasonable storm intensity and that such conditions increase the damages caused by flooding; and

2. That some drainage swales within existing subdivisions discharge water into streets damaging the streets and greatly adding to the maintenance costs of said streets; and that such discharges create additional traffic hazards during winter freezing periods; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners after having considered the Subdivision Control Ordinance of Hendricks County, and all amendments thereto, and after having received the findings and recommendations of the Hendricks County Plan Commission and finding that said recommendations should be adopted.

NOW THEREFORE, in order to promote the health, safety and welfare of the people of Hendricks County, Indiana, by diminishing the hazards of flooding and minimizing the damage to the streets and roads in the County and traffic hazards created thereby, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, that the Subdivision Control Ordinance entitled "Subdivision Control Ordinance of Hendricks County, Indiana", enacted by the Board of Commissioner's of Hendricks County, Indiana, on February 6, 1961, and all amendments thereto, be amended by deleting subsection 2 of the Section entitled Design of Storm Drainage of Chapter 9 which subsection reads as follows:

(2) All rainfall data such as frequency, intensity and duration of storms. If complete Weather Bureau data are not available locally, the data in Miscellaneous Publication No. 204, U.S. Department of Agriculture, "Rainfall Intensity - Frequency Data" by David L. Yarnell, should be used. Intensity-duration curves should be plotted for storms of a 5-year frequency and this graph used for run-off supply quantities in conjunction with the design.

and by adding the following section:

(2) All storm sewer systems within the subdivision including inlets, manholes, street gutters, swales and course within the subdivision including inlets, manholes, street gutters,

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swales and sewers shall accomodate a 10-year rainfall intensity without flooding to the tops of the curbs.

In this subsection the word "swale" or pronouns in place of it shall mean an artifical waterway or segment thereof.

All water conveyed by a swale shall discharge into a storm sewer, an intermittent stream, a legal drain or one taken. a legal drain, or a natural ravine, provided proper erosion control measures are taken.

Swales shall not discharge water onto a street or over a curb except those swales created to provide individual later in the street or over a curb except those swales wale. to provide individual lot drainage for the two lots immediately adjacent to the swale.

Inlets designed to accomodate storm water discharge from swales shall be located at the rear property lines of the storm water discharge from swales shall be located at the rear property lines of the lots.

This Ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its passage and approved according to law.

If any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of this amendment shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any

other section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of this amendment.

REPORT OF THE HENDRICKS COUNTY GRAND JURY

The Hendricks County Grand Jury hereby reports to the Hendricks Circuit Court as follows: CLAYTON TOWN ELECTION NOVEMBER 6, 1979

The Grand Jury was disturbed by the apparent laxity demonstrated by the Clayton Town Election Board and other officials who were involved in the Town Election on November 6, 1979. It was apparent to the Grand Jury that it was common knowledge in Clayton that Mr. Terry Toney did not live in Clayton and that he had been forced to move fromClayton after his house was destroyed by fire. It was also common knowledge that he was renting and occupying an apartment in Amo, Indiana. Yet, no one on the Clayton Town Election Board challenged Mr. Toney's right to vote. Apparently, no one on the election board knew for a certainty, nor did they take the time or trouble to determine whether or not Mr. Jerry Kenworthy resided inside the Town of Clayton at the time of the election. Again, no members of the election board challenged Mr. Kenworthy's right to vote. Both Mr. Kenworthy and Mr. Toney, as well as other voters at the election, were only asked to list their mailing address rather than to state whether or not they lived or resided inside the Town of Clayton. It is also apparent to the Grand Jury that several of the members of the Clayton Election Board were lacking in an understanding of the duties and obligation of the positions that they were filling during the election. The Grand Jury feels that the election board was negligent in failing to challenge the vote of Mr. Toney and Mr. Kenworhty for the following reasons:

1. Mr. Toney's place of residence was common knowledge in the Town of Clayton.

178

2. At least one member of the election board knew that Mr. Toney was living in Amo and yet failed to challenge him.

3. The election board members made the assumption that Mr. Kenworthy's place of residence was in Clayton. The Grand Lucy for a lastic board in Clayton. The Grand Jury feels that more care should have been taken by the election board in reviewing Mr. Kenverthal reviewing Mr. Kenworthy's qualifications to vote, particularly since his brother was running for a seat on the Town Board.

The Grand Jury recommends that the Town of Clayton and in particular, the precinct committeemen, being duly elected by the voters of their party, tighten up on their voting procedures and put forth more effort to properly instruct the individuals chosen as members of the election board concerning their duties. It is also recommended that the committeemen make sure that the duties of the election board members are being properly performed during the election. The Grand Jury feels that the precinct committeemen should make certain that the election board has a clear understanding of all the statutes and town ordinances covering all elections. The Grand Jury feels that certain training and instruction should be given to the election baord members, rather than merely handing them a handbook with the rules concerning the election.

It is the further opinion of this Grand Jury that all precinct committeemen in Hendricks County should be made aware of their duties and obligations to the people who have elected them. They have an obligation to the obligation to the people to see that the poll books accurately reflect the eligible voters in the precinct. Party loyalties should be secondary to the rights of the people in Hendricks County to an honest election. The Grand Jury recommends that there be a general tightening up of voting procedures throughout Hendricks County. The voting laws are very explicit and should be closely followed in order to insure honest elections to all citizens of the County.

The Grand Jury further recommends that all precinct committeemen in Hendricks County be instructed to use care and discretion in selecting members of the election board in their precincts and that the committeemen then fully instruct these members as to their duties and obligations. The statutes covering voter requirements should be reviewed with the members of the election board prior to the election. All members of the election board should be made fully aware of what constitutes a fraudulent vote and of the fact that they are required to challenge any prospective voter if they have presonal knowledge or good reason to believe that the person does not meet the voting requirement.

As stated above, this Grand Jury heard testimony from Mr. Jerry W. Kenworthy and Mr. Terry Toney concerning their vote in the Town Election at Clayton on November 6, 1979. It is the opinion of this Grand Jury that Mr. Kenworthy did and does consider Clayton, Indiana as his primary residence and that his secondary residence is at the Casa Loma Mobile Home Park in Plainfield, Indianan. It is, therefore, the opinion of the Grand Jury that Mr. Kenworthy was eligible to vote in the Clayton Town Election held on November 6, 1979.

It is the opinion of the Grand Jury that Mr. Terry Toney was forced to temporarily move from Clayton, Indiana by the fire at his home in Clayton and that he considers his temporary residence as being in Amo, Indiana. Mr. Toney has maintained an active interest in the affairs of the Clayton community as indicated by his continued activity as a member of the Clayton Fire Department. The Grand Jury finds no evidence that Mr. Toney had any fraudulent intent in casting his vote in the Town Election. The Grand Jury feels that Mr. Toney was sincere in his interest in the election and had no personal interest in the outcome of the election other than that of any other citizen interested in the affairs of his home community.

HENDRICKS COUNTY HOME.

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The Grand Jury found the County Home to be in good repair and was in the process of being renovated as funds permit. The Grand Jury is impressed with the care given to the current residents of the home and the concern of the staff for the residents. The building is old, however, it is remarkably clean and well kept. The medical needs of the residents are being met adequately. Meals appear to be nutritious, well balanced and very adequate. The administration of this facility is commended by the Grand Jury for their judicious use of public funds. The Grand Jury suggests that the County Commissioners consider

special funding for the conversion of the present heating/cooling system to a more efficient and economical system.

The County Home currently has ten (10) people on its staff. The Grand Jury recommends that serious consideration be given to the hiring of at least three (3) more people at the Home. HENDRICKS COUNTY JAIL

The Grand Jury found the Hendricks County Jail to be clean, well kept, and well lighted. The Jail is generally in very good condition. The kitchen area is clean and well kept. The meals seem to be adequate for the needs of this type of facility. All indications are that the needs of the prisoners being held there are adequate. The Grand Jury found the staff at the jail very cooperative and knowledgeable about their work. The Grand Jury found a great deal of professionalism among the staff at the Sheriffs' Department. It is the feeling of this Grand Jury that the salaries of the Deputy Sheriffs and the remaining staff should be reviewed and brought more in line with the special requirements needed to promote this same type of professionalism in the future.

INDIANA BOYS' SCHOOL

The Grand Jury found the Indiana Boys' School facility to be well kept. The buildings are in good condition and extensive remodeling is being done on the old buildings. Good use is being made of the physical plant. The Grand Jury did find over - crowding in some areas, particularly in the intake area.

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The Grand Jury feels that the staff and administration of Indiana Boys' School is doing an excellent job in meeting the needs of the students. The Grand Jury does feel, however, that there is a shortage of security personnel that should be overcome.

INDIANA YOUTH CENTER

The Grand Jury, after meeting with the administration of the Indiana Youth Center, feels that serious over - crowding exists at Indiana Youth Center. There seems to be little possibility of this situation being alleviated in the foreseeable future. This facility is functioning at almost total capacity with no indication of a drop in commitments. There is a serious understaffing at the Youth Center, particularly in the security of the facility. This understaffing poses the potential for creating major problems for the residents of Hendricks County if not corrected.

INDIANA RECEPTION AND DIAGNOSTIC CENTER

The Grand Jury feels that the Reception and Diagnostic Center is well run, well administrated, and filling the function that it was specifically designed to do.
