WHEREAS, the Town Council of Trustees of North Salem has by ordinance dated May 1, 1990, designated the Hendricks County Plan Commission as the municipal plan commission for the Town of

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT:

BICIDIE

Section 1: The Board of Hendricks County Commissioners do hereby empower and authorize the Hendricks County Plan Commission to exercise and enforce within the boundaries of the Town of North Salem the same planning powers and duties as may be exercised by them in the unincorporate area of the county pursuant to Indiana Code 36-7-4-400. These powers and duties include:

(a) The development and implementation of a comprehensive development plan;

(b) The adoption, amendment and enforcement of a zoning ordinance and zoning regulations; (c) The adoption, amendment and enforcement of a subdivision control ordinance and regulations for the platting or replatting of subdivided land;

(d) The provision for any required permits for location of buildings, structures, or uses, and the imposition and collection, for the benefit of the county, of any applicable permit fees or other related fees as may from time to time be fixed and assessed from persons in the

(e) The development of public ways, thoroughfares and streets.

(f) The laying out and development of public ways and services to platted and unplatted

Section 2: In accordance with Indiana Code 36-7-4-410(b), residents of the Town of North Salem are eligible to be appointed citizen members of the Hendricks County Advisory Plan Commission. Section 3: The provisions of this ordinance are effective until such time as they are amended or repealed by the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners or until such time as they are and of the Town of North Salem serves written notice to the Hondricks Or until such time as the Town Council of the Town of North Salem serves written notice to the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners

hat they no longer want the County to exercise and enforce planning powers within the Town.

This Ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its passage and approved according o law.

If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this amendement shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of this amendment.



3. The Task Force would like to remain in service to the Commissioners.

4. The Task Force would like some direction from the Commissioners on the possibility of continuing the study of children in need of services and trying to organize and coordinate services that could be provided or other segments of the community that might have a need. For example those children that are placed outside the County that the Welfare Department needs to pay for, battered spouses and others who need short term shelter care.

This committee will meet again on July 26, 1990 at 1:00 P.M. in the Circuit Court Jury Room and wish some direction from the Commissioners. The County Attorney has attended all of the meetings.

The letter says "Over these last six months we have learned that Hendricks County is the only County that has a Task Force such as this, that Hendricks County in the only County that has

We believe we have been able to avoid being stampeded and coerced into spending a bunch of taxpayer's money for a facility where the costs would never justify the service it rendered because there are so few people it could serve. We will continue to look for alternate ways of cooperating.

All of us recognize that without the cooperation of Dennis Dawes and the Hendricks Community Hospital this program could have never succeeded and we all owe a great debt of gratitude for Mr. Dawes and the hospital service to our community."

Mr. Buddy Downs and Ms. Diane Shea of the firm Ice, Miller, Donadio and Ryan made a presentation to the Council, Commissioners, Town Representatives and others in attendance on alternative financing. Some of the options are as follows:

COIT (County Income Tax) may be imposed only if CAGIT (County Adjusted Gross Income Tax) is first repealed by the County Council. Hendricks County has been operating under CAGIT for twenty (20) years. The Council can impose, rescind, increase or freeze COIT, and increase the homestead redit, but it <u>cannot</u> lower the COIT rate. To impose, increase, freeze or rescind COIT, the Council effective July 1 of that same year, with proceeds being distributed at December settlement. Only propose or vote on a proposed ordinance a public hearing must be held and notice given ten days and fiscal bodies of each city or town within the County.

CEDIT (County Economic Development Income Tax) can be adopted by the County Council if CAGIT has been adopted, the COIT Council if COIT has been adopted, or either body if a county has no local income tax. The sum of CEDIT and CAGIT rates cannot exceed 1.25% and the sum of CEDIT and COIT RATES CANNOT EXCEED 1.00%. Revenue must be used for economic development or capital projects or for retirement of bonds. Tax Levy Notification to Taxpayers is performed by use of the 17-Line Statement which lists estimated expenditures and estimated funds available for the period of July 1 of the current year through December 31 of the ensuing year.

CAGIT (County Adjusted Gross Income Tax) is adopted by ordinance by the County Council on a county-wide basis at rates of 1/2%, 3/4% or 1%. If an employee lives in a county that has not adopted a local income tax the rate is 1/4%. Proceeds are distributed in the same manner as propery tax levies. Local Option tax dollars are divided into property tax replacement and certified shares. If income from the current year local option exceeds the amount collected in the base year on the certified shares, it becomes new monies for additional expenditures. County Council may rescind the tax by adopting an ordinance to rescind after January 1 but not before June 1 of any year. If an ordinance to rescind is adopted, it becomes effective July 1 of the year in which the ordinance is adopted.

It was reported that fourteen (14) Counties in the State currently have CEDIT in addition to CAGIT.

There was additional discussion on the topic and the meeting was adjourned.



### IN THE MATTER OF CABLEVISION ORDINANCE

Jerry Hoffman from the Avon area was present and applauded the Commissioners for their concern over the Cablevision services in Hendricks County. His main concern was whether the adoption of a new ordinance would jeopardize the unilateral change in the contracts already in place.

Dan Zielinski, representing Gregory Steuerwald, county attorney, reported that this Ordinance was separate from any other and that there is no conflict. Commissioner Disney explained that some of the complaints on the White River Cablevision in the Cartersburg area were corrected last week.

Ron Ennis from American Cablevision reviewed statistics of the growth in 1988 and 1989 and the projection of new growth in the subdivision areas. A letter was received from American Cablevision announcing their increase in rates effective in August.

Following this discussion Hursel Disney moved to adopt the Cablevision Ordinance as advertised. J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

### THE HENDRICKS COUNTY CABLE TELEVISION ORDINANCE NO. 1990-10

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the Hendricks County Cable Television Ordinance.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance to provide good cable television pictures and service to the residents of Hendricks County, Indiana by the establishment of minimum standards for all persons and firms providing such services in Hendricks County, Indiana.

Section 3. Definitions. For the purpose of this ordinance the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations, shall have the meanings as set forth herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words in the present tense shall include the future tense; words in plural

(1) "County" shall mean Hendricks County, Indiana.

(2) "Commission" shall mean all the Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, as a board.

(3) "Commissioner" shall mean any one Commissioner of the County Commissioners of the County.

(4) "Cable Company" shall mean any person or firm who transmits television signals, by any means, to residents of the County.

(5) "Subscriber" shall mean any person or firm, resident in the County, who receives television signals from a Cable Company.

(6) "Hearing Officer" shall mean any person who is appointed by the Commission to conduct an Administrative Hearing under this ordinance.

Section 4. Conformance. All television cable franchises, licenses, and ordinances granted by the Commission prior to the effective date of this ordinance are hereby modified to conform to the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 5. Franchise. All Cable Companies operating in the County shall be required to have a Television Cable Franchise executed by the Commission. Such Franchise shall have a definite termination date and shall be subject to the provisions of this ordinance. The Commission may impose any additional terms and conditions in the Franchise deemed by the Commission to be in the best interest of the residents of the County.

Section 6. Minimum Number of Channels. All Cable Companies operating in the County shall transmit at least thirty five (35) television channels to subscribers. Of those thirty five (35) channels at least two channels shall provide regular broadcasts of news and weather, and at least one of the thirty five channels shall provide pay per view broadcasts, and at least one of the thirty five channels shall be dedicated for community messages that the Cable Company shall charge a reasonable fee for, or which the Cable Company shall provide free of charge.

Section 7. Signal Quality. The Cable Company shall transmit, in color or in black and white. as broadcast by the Broadcaster, television pictures, undistorted from ghost images, with good sound. The signal must be transmitted with adequate strength to produce good pictures with good sound at all outlets without causing cross modulation in the cables, or interference with other electrical or electric systems. The Cable Companies shall be prepared to demonstrate to a subscriber that a signal of adequate strength and quality to provide a good picture and good sound is being delivered to that subscriber's residence.

Section 8. Free Services. All Cable Companies shall offer free basic cable service to all schools when the Cable Company's cable lines pass said facilities or when cable services are offered to properties adjoining said facilities.

Section 9. Discrimination. All Cable Companies shall offer their services at the same price to all residents of the County, except that the Cable Companies may modify charges for installation of their system to individual residents. Nothing herein contained shall prohibit a Cable Company from offering a "special" service program to all members of a specific neighborhood or section of the County in the quest of increasing the Cable Company's subscriber base in that neighborhood or section of the County.

Section 10. Maintenance. The Cable Companies operating in the County shall maintain, at their own expense, adequate service and repair facilities in such a manner that all subscriber service calls are responded to within seventy two (72) hours of the receipt of notice of an outage, and within one hundred and twenty (120) hours of the receipt of a service call for service other than an outage. At the request of the subscriber who has suffered an outage, the Cable Company shall credit the account of such subscriber for a prorated daily sum representing the number of days the subscriber's service was out as compared to the total monthly basic service rate paid by the subscriber. Exempted from the provisions of this paragraph are outages caused by acts of God, or acts of any third persons over whom the Cable Company has no control. Subscribers shall have the right to execute a written waiver of the provisions of this Section. Any such waiver shall be for any one incident and the Cable Company shall not require subscribers to execute a standing or continuous waiver.

Section 11. Hearings. A subscriber who feels a Cable Company has violated the provisions of this ordinance shall have the right to submit a formal letter of complaint therefor with the Commission. Said sums may be modified from time to time by the Commission so that the expense of engaging a Hearing Officer or of conducting the hearing shall be borne by the Cable Company. The hearing shall follow the rules of evidence except that hearsay evidence shall be admissible except that no recommendation or findings of fact shall be based solely upon hearsay evidence.

The Hearing shall be conducted within thirty days of the request of hearing filed by the Cable Company, unless the Commission shall grant a continuance for additional time as may be requested by the Cable Company. The report and recommendation of the hearing by a Hearing Officer or by a Commissioner shall be in writing, and shall be delivered to the Commission who shall then determine what, if any, violation has occurred and the appropriate penalty, if any, which should be levied. In the event of a claim of a violation of this ordinance not filed by a subscriber, all the provisions of this section shall apply except that provision requiring a written notice from a subscriber. In the event the Cable Company fails to file evidence of resolution of a complaint within the period provided for herein, or fails to request a hearing as set forth herein, the Commission shall proceed to accept the complaint as though it was verified by a hearing, and shall proceed accordingly.

Section 12. Violations. A Cable Company who is determined to have violated the provisions of this ordinance shall be penalized by fine, loss of franchise, or both fine and loss of franchise. A fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per day for each day of outage, or a fine not to exceed the total mum of Five Handred Dollars (\$500) in the event of a violation other than an outage, shall be the maximum penalty for the first violation of a Cable Company within a twelve month period. The finding of a second violation by the same Cable Company violating the same provision of this ordinance within the same twelve month period shall be a maximum of Two Handred Dollars (\$200) per day for each day of outage, or a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) in the event of a violation other than an outage. The finding of a third violation of the same provision of this ordinance within a twelve month period shall bear the same maximum penalties as the second violation except that the Cable Company committing such third violation within said periodmay further include the penalty of a probationary franchise status for the balance of the same twelve month period. A subsequent violation of the same provision of this ordinance within the same twelve month period shall give the Commission the right to revoke the franchise of the Cable Company effective one hundred twenty days from the date of any such order.

assignee or purchaser has a financial capability to operate the system being acquired, and a sufficient service capability to service the system being acquired. Any such approval of assignment by the Commission shall be in writing, prepared by the Cable Company in a form approved by County Counsel. · 40

Section 14. Television Cable Board. The Commission shall have the right to create a Television Cable Board consisting of at least two residents of the County who are television cable subscribers, and two persons who are employed by television cable companies who may or may not be operating in the County, and one Commissioner. In the event of the creation of such a Television Cable Board, said group shall make recommendations to the Commission regarding Cable Companies, and members of said Board, except for the Commissioner, may be utilized as Hearing Officers pursuant to this ordinance.

Section 15. Towns and Cities. Any incorporated towns and cities within the County shall have the election to submit their town or city to the jurisdiction of this ordinance. Unless a written notice is received from said town or city to be subject to the jurisdiction of this ordinance then all incorporated towns and cities within the County shall be exempted from this ordinance. In the event of an election from a town or city within the County to be within the jurisdiction of this ordinance any revenue received by the town or city from Cable Companies shall continue to be paid to said town or city by said Cable Company.

Section 16. Pre-Existing Franchises. All Cable Companies operating within the County under franchise, license, or ordinance prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall have a period of twelve months to conform to the provisions of this ordinance. Failure of any such Cable Company to so conform, subject to the right of the Commission to grant a time extension, shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

Section 17. Expiration or Termination of Franchise. Upon expiration or termination of a Cable Television Franchise, and the failure of the Commission to renew said Franchise, all lines and equipment of the former Franchisee shall either be removed by the franchisee on or before the termination date of the Franchise or such lines and equipment shall become the property of the County. Equipment, as referred to herein, shall be limited to equipment attached to said lines. The former Franchisee shall give written notice to the Commission of it's intent concerning said lines no later than sixty days prior to the expiration date of the Franchise, or sixty days prior to the effective termination date of the Franchise. The Commission shall not have the right to refuse to renew a Franchise without good cause.

Section 18. Exemptions. Exempted from the provisions of this ordinance are the signals from any television broadcaster located in the State of Indiana, broadcasting one television signal under a license issued therefor by the Federal Communications Commission of the United States of

Section 19. Rate Increases. Television Cable Companies operating in the County shall be prohibited from increasing their rate for basic cable service more than once in any calendar year without the consent of the Commission.

Section 20. Interpretation of Law. In the event any portion of this ordinance should be deemed to be unconstitutional or otherwise in violation of law, then that specific portion of this ordinance shall be stricken and the balance of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

The average daily traffic count at Wing's Court was 267.3 and on Tilden Drive it was 3585.2. 92.5% of the traffic on Wing's Court traveled at speeds below 30 miles per hour. 63.1% of these traveled at speeds of 25 miles per hour or less.

There is no posted speed limit for Wing's Court at this time. Tilden Drive has a posted speed limit of 30 miles per hour.

There is an abundance of children in Wing's Court and many of them was observed playing, walking and riding bicycles.

The Engineer recommended that 30 mile per hour speed limit signs be erected in Wing's Court, that a "No Outlet" sign be placed at the entrance of Wing's Court and a "No Parking Here to Corner" sign be installed on Tilden Road.



Black Creek Park, Sections 1 & 3 - The County Engineer recommended that the performance

and Minor Plat No. 194 - bonds be released upon receipt of maintenance bonds in the following amounts: Black Creek Park, Section 1 - \$10,100; Black Creek Park, Section 3 - \$11,000; Minor Plat No. 194 - \$1,700.





President Disney announced that the bid request for Printing, Classes 4 and 5 was advertised to be opened today at 9:00 A.M., that it is now past that time and no further bids will be accepted. Bids were received from: Freedom Press, Petri Printing, Paragon Graphics and The Republican. The bids were opened and several items were read from each bid. Mr. Steuerwald reviewed the bids and stated that, based on the expenditures made in Printing - Classes 4 and 5 in 1988 and 1989, it appears that purchases will be less than \$25,000 this year in either class.

Based on this finding, Commissioner Clampitt made and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to reject all bids as presented and to so notify the bidders.

Pursuant to I.C. 36-1-9-4, the Commissioners, as purchasing agent for the county may purchase the materials on the open market. To be fair to the printers who submitted a bid and in an effort to insure the county receives the best product at the lowest price all department heads and elected officials are to be instructed to review the bids and when ordering something under Class 4 and 5, get quotes from at least two of these four companies in order to go with the lowest quote. These will be the only authorized printers for Hendricks County offices. The motion was approved unanimously.

Is this discharge allowed: Mr. Reeder said the owner is required by code to drain the crawl space and, in Hendricks County, most owners do this with sump pumps. In the older subdivisions, the only place to drain the sump pumps was the street. It would cost a significant amount to correct this problem. He estimated that there probably are 75 subdivisions where this is a problem.

Commissioner Disney suggested that Mr. Lawson have the Highway Department correct these problems as rapidly as funds and staff allow. Mr. Lawson said the Highway Department would need to purchase a trencher to start this kind of work. Mr. Disney asked that he get some prices together for the Board's review.

## ORDINANCE NO. 1991-1

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE HENDRICKS COUNTY SOLID WASTE PLANNING FEE

WHEREAS, IC 13-9.5-2 requires each county in the State of Indiana, including Hendricks County ("County"), to either establish itself as a county solid waste management district ("county district") or to join with one or more other counties in the formation of a joint solid waste management district ("joint district") no later than July 1, 1991; and

WHEREAS, IC 13-9.5-4 and P.L. 10-1990, SECTION 21 require each solid waste management district so formed to adopt a district solid waste management plan no later than July 1, 1992; and

WHEREAS, IC 13-9.5-6 authorizes the county executive to impose fees on the disposal or incineration of solid waste at a final disposal facility located within the county, to pay costs associated with the preparation of a district solid waste management plan; and

WHEREAS, the task of preparing a district solid waste management plan involves the development of information about solid waste management activities and facilities in Hendricks County to enable the County to make an informed decision about whether to become a county district or a joint district; and

WHEREAS, the county executive held a public hearing in the Hendricks County Courthouse in Danville, Indiana, on January 14, 1991, pursuant to a notice published in accordance with IC 5-3-1; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA: SECTION 1. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them as follows:

- (a) "Final disposal facility" shall have the meaning prescribed at IC 13-9.5-1-14.
- (b) "Solid Waste" shall have the meaning prescribed at IC 13-9.5-1-26.
- (c) "Board of Commissioners" means the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners.

(d) "County auditor" means the auditor of Hendricks County.
 SECTION 2. A county solid waste planning fee is imposed at the rate of
 twenty-five cents (\$0.25) per ton on each ton of solid waste disposed of at

a final disposal facility in Hendricks County.

SECTION 3. The owner or operator of a final disposal facility located in Hendricks County is responsible for collecting the county solid waste planning fee imposed under Section 2 of this ordinance from persons delivering solid waste to the final disposal facility. The disposal facility owner or operator may deduct an amount equal to one percent (1%) of the fees collected and may

retain this amount as compensation for collecting and remitting the fees. SECTION 4. The remainder of the fees collected each month under Section

3 of this ordinance shall be remitted to the county auditor within ten (10) days after the last day of the month in which the fees are collected.

SECTION 5. The owner or operator of a final disposal facility shall make necessary records available to an employee designated by the Board of Commissioners for the purpose of verifying the amount of solid waste disposed of and the amount of fees being collected and remitted to the county auditor.

SECTION 6. The owner or operator of a final disposal facility that does not have a scale suitable for solid waste may determine the weight of the solid waste by conversion from the volume of the solid waste. In making this conversion, an owner or operator shall use the following conversion factors:

(a) Three and three-tenths (3.3) cubic yards of compacted solid waste equals one (1) ton of solid waste.

(b) Six (6) cubic yards of uncompacted solid waste equals one (1) ton of solid waste.

SECTION 7. (a) The fee imposed under Section 2 of this ordinance does not apply to solid waste that is received at a final disposal facility pursuant to a contract entered into before January 1, 1990, unless the contract contains a pass-through provision by which the transporter of the solid waste may recover the fees from the transporter's client.

(b) Any solid waste for which an exemption under this section is sought must be identified as to the particular contract which does not contain the pass-through provision. A copy of any contract for which the owner or operator of a final disposal facility desires to claim an exemption under this section must be filed with the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 8. The fee imposed under Section 2 of this ordinance does not apply to solid waste disposed of at a final disposal facility by a person that:

(1) generated the solid waste; and

(2) disposes of the solid waste at a final disposal facility that is owned by that person and is limited, for the purposes of the disposal of solid waste, to use by that person for the disposal of solid waste generated by that person. SECTION 9. The county auditor shall establish a fund to be known as the "Hendricks County Solid Waste Planning Fund." The Fund shall be administered in the same manner as all other county funds. SECTION 10. (a) Money in the Fund may be used only for the following purposes: (1) to pay expenses of administering the Fund (2) to pay costs associated with the development of a district solid waste management plan, including costs to develop information to enable the County to determine whether its plan should be prepared for a county or joint solid waste district. (b) A description of the activities to be undertaken, together with an estimate of the costs of such activities is attached as Exhibit A and is incorporated by reference herein.

WHEREAS, the county legislative body may elect to receive deposits at either Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3 funding; and

WHEREAS, Level 3 is the most appropriate level of participation for Hendricks County; therefore;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Hendricks County Board of Commissioners hereby elect to receive deposits from the Department of Correction in accordance with I.C. 11-12-6.

SECTION 2. Hendricks County Board of Commissioners hereby elect to receive such deposits at Level 3 funding.

SECTION 3. There is hereby created a "county corrections fund", to be administered by the Hendricks County Council. The fund shall consist of deposits received from the Department of Correction in accordance with I.C. 11-12-6.

SECTION 4. The County Corrections fund may be used only for funding the operation of the county jail, jail programs, or other local correctional facilities. Any money remaining in a county corrections fund at the end of the year does not revert to any other fund but remains in the county corrections fund. SECTION 5. ## ORDINANCES FROM "INFRACTION" TO "VIOLATION"

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 36-1-4-11 of the Acts of General Assembly of the State of Indiana, as amended, granted certain powers to the Boards of County Commissioners, relative to the adoption of ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Hendricks County Board of Commissioners held a public hearing pursuant to the legislative procedure established under Indiana Code 36-2-4 seq; and

WHEREAS, the penalty statute for the State of Indiana being Indiana Code 34-4-32-1, et. seq. mandates that violations of County ordinances shall be brought in the name of the municipal corporation; and

WHEREAS, the County ordinances penalty provisions inappropriately designated as "infractions" instead of "violations"; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this ordinance to amend all Hendricks County ordinances which have a penalty provision of "infractions" to state that the violation of the Hendricks County Ordinance is a "violation"; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, after having a public hearing found: the uniform enforcement of all Hendricks County as amended, is necessary. THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana that the provisions of this ordinance are effective within Hendricks County as follows:

1. Amendment of Hendricks County Ordinances. All Hendricks County Ordinances whose penalty provisions are inappropriately designated as an "infraction", be and are hereby amended to be designated "violation" of said ordinance. 2. Penalties. Any person or legal entity found to be violating any provisions of this ordinance or any prior ordinances of the Board of Commissioners shall be cited for said "violation" into a Court having jurisdiction. Upon conviction, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the violator shall be punished by

a fine of no more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00), including any court cost imposed. If such violation is continued, each day's violation shall be a separate offense.

3. Unconstitutionality Clause. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

4. Repeal and Date of Effect.

A) All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Commissioners and publication as required by law.

COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, STATE OF INDIANA, as follows, to-wit:

## SECTION 1

The Prosecuting Attorney for the 55th Judicial Circuit of the State of Indiana (Hendricks County) is empowered and authorized to create, direct and coordinate a drug task force in Hendricks County consisting of local law enforcement

## SECTION 2

The primary objective of the drug task force shall be to interdict drug trafficking in Hendricks County. This objective may be accomplished by conducting diversion and controlled drug investigations, by eradicating marijuana, by the interdiction of controlled substances in and out of Hendricks County and by purchasing narcotics and other controlled substances for the purpose of making

## SECTION 3

The Prosecuting Attorney for the 55th Judicial Circuit (Hendricks County) shall direct control, coordinante and supervise the drug task force and its fiscal operations. The Prosecuting Attorney may upon the express approval of both the Board of Commissioners and the Hendricks County Council, establish a new budget within his/her current Prosecutor's Office Budget in order to provide for the funding and operations of the drug task force. Funding for the drug task force may be obtained from federal, state, local or private resources, funds and grants. This section, however, does not create funding in and of itself for the drug task force nor does it permit the use of County monies from the general fund or the Prosecutor's Office general budget without the prior express approval of the Board of Commissioners and the Hendricks County Council.

## SECTION 4

In order to fulfill the directives of this Resolution, the Prosecuting Attorney for the 55th Judicial Circuit (Hendricks County) is authorized to enter into leases and contracts on behalf of the drug task force for its operations, administrations and investigations.

## EFFECTIVE DATE

This Resolution shall be effective as of the 19th of February, 1991.



The County Attorney requested a letter from M.C.I. and reported that bids would be necessary for the equipment they were discussing. Mr. Reeder will continue to hold the Smithville Telephone contract for future reference.

Mr. Sterrett questioned Bob Jarzen, Plan Commission Administrator, concerning the progress of the house numbering system. Mr. Jarzen replied that this information was currently in the hands of the Indianapolis authorities for the zip plus four numbers. The Highway Supervisor also reported that the Highway Department workers are hot mixing and repairing other county roads now.

IN THE MATTER OF PERSONNEL DIRECTOR'S BUSINESS

Susan Fair, Hendricks County Personnel Director, reported that there had been a misunderstanding concerning her request for proposals for forms to be used by her Department. Betty Jean Weesner from The Republican corrected her proposal and as a result the lowest proposals were awarded to Paragon Graphics from Brownsburg for all four requests.

Dr. Ron Riggs and Colonel Dave Younce from the Sheriff's Department were also present to discuss the E.A.P. program (Employee Assistance Plan).



It was also decided that all appointments would be for one year except for the first Board who will serve through the end of 1992.

A tentative date of June 13, 1991 at 8:30 A.M. was set up if it is necessary to meet again before finalization of this program.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

Mrs. Karen Winkel from Stilesville requested speed limit signs to be posted. A traffic study was conducted regarding County Road 625 # north of Stilesville and south of County Road 550 S.

The results of the traffic study were as follows:

Because this segment is in a rural area and the pavement surface and geometry is fair, a speed limit of 50 miles per hour is justifies from Stileaville to County Road 600 S.

Therefore, it is recommended that 50 miles per hour speed limit signs be placed in the following positions:

In the northbound lane of County Road 625 ¥ just morth of County Road 700 S. In the southbound lane of County Road 625 # just south of County Road 600 S. Since the geometry of County Road 625 W deteriorates dramatically from County Road 600 S to County Road 550 S., It is recommended that we place to mile per hour speed limit signs in the following positions:

In the southbound lane of County Road 625 W just south of County Road 550 S. In the northbound lane of County Road 625 W just morth of County Road 600 S. Along the segment of County Road 625 W between County Road 500 S and County Road 600 S there are two consecutive dips which are quite extreme in geometry. These dips present a hazard to traffic traveling in excess of 40 miles per hour. Therefore, it is also recommended that "Dip" warning signs be placed approx-

imately 400 feet preceding the dips from both approaches.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion per staff recommendation and the traffic study results to post signs as recommended.

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, reported spray painting on County Road signs in Brown and Lincoln Townships.

Mr. Lawson also discussed with the Commissioners the problem on Tenth Street and Shiloh Road which was discussed at a previous meeting where a car ran into a residential home.

The Commissioners suggested that it be determined where the right of way is located and to try to work with the property owner and to discuss this with

the County Attorney if there is a problem that can't be worked out.

Mr. Lawson was authorized to purchase two Walkie-Talkie's for use in the Highway and Engineering Departments. The Commissioners advised Mr. Lawson to obtain quotes from different vendors prior to purchase.

IN THE MATTER OF FAX MACHINE FOR COURTHOUSE ANNEX Walter Reeder, County Engineer, spoke on behalf of the Health Department, the Plan Commission Department and the Engineer's Department in requesting a Fax Machine for use in the Courthouse Annex.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to purchase a Fax Machine for the Courthouse Annex and to fund this purchase from the Commissioner's equipment account.

The motion was unanimously approved.
