IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, discussed the sealing of county roads and estimated that this should begin around the middle of May.

There was discussion on the county policy of berming and cleaning roadside ditches before starting the sealing process.

IN THE MATTER OF QUOTES

John Parsons, Hendricks County Systems Analyst, presented for Mr. Chris
Osborne two quotes for the IDACS configuration components for the Judicial
Computer System as follows:

Total cost for this approximates \$16,844.50 plus any incidentals.

Following discussion Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve the funds from the Juvenile Computer System Fund for the above amounts for the IDACS system. The motion was unanimously approved and the contract was executed. The Commissioners have signed a contract for wiring at a previous meeting.

IN THE MATTER OF CELLULAR PHONE FOR ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY

The Commissioners approved a cellular phone for the Animal Control Authority Department which will be funded from their Donation Fund at a cost of approximately \$289.00 on a motion by J. D. Clampitt seconded by Richard Myers. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF DOG QUARANTINE FORM

The County Attorney approved the dog quarantine form previously presented for his review.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter was presented from the Indiana Gas Company, Inc. requesting the right and privilege to construct, maintain and/or remove 410 feet of two inch plastic gas pipe line along or across county highways.

It is proposed to install four hundred ten feet of two inch plastic gas main along County Road 400 North south east of Brownsburg. This main extension will provide service to one new customer. The County Surveyor's office has been contacted and has stated no legal drains exist in the construction area.

Said Indiana Gas Company, Inc., covenants and agrees to construct said pipe line in an orderly and workmanlike manner, to replace all grade levels, drains, pavements or structures to as good a condition as when work was commenced, and to replace with comparable material and workmanship all roadways, pavements, or structures damaged by the construction of the contemplated project; all to the satisfaction and under the supervision of said Board of Commissioners or their designated representative.

Richard Myers moved to approve the request of the Indiana Gas Company, Inc. per staff recommendation and subject to permittee backfilling all excavation per the specifications and supervision of the Hendricks County Engineer. Also, this cut must be maintained by Indiana Gas Company for a period of at least three years. This line must also be pushed under the road - not cut.

J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter was presented from the Indiana Bell Company requesting permission to install conduits and pull-off drive in the May-June, 1992 time frame as follows:

To push 2-4 inch diameter PVC telephone conduits under both County Road 300 East and Old U. S. 36 where shown on prints. The depth will be approximately 48 inches. This work is a portion of a project to place fiber optic cable and electronic equipment to replace existing cables and to serve growth in that general area. Other new conduits will be placed in road right-of-way as shown. The remainder of conduits are being placed in private easements. Also as shown on print No. 3, we plan to install a pull-off drive on County Road 300 East approximately 300 feet south of old U. S. 36. This pull-off will provide access to our planned electronic equipment vault and cross-connect box. There is no side ditch at that location.

Commissioner Myers moved to grant approval for this request from Indiana Bell subject to permittee backfilling all excavation per the specifications and supervision of the Hendricks County Engineer. Also, this cut must be maintained by Indiana Bell for a period of at least three years. This line must be pushed under the road - not cut.

Commissioner Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was approved. unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISIONS

Minor Plat No. 425 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released and since it would be under \$1,000, that the maintenance bond requirement be waived.

IN THE MATTER OF HEALTH DEPARTMENT'S OLD CARS

Walter Reeder requested the Commissioners' advice on what steps to inaugurate next in the disposal of the Health Department's old cars. Proper advertising has been completed and the county has met all necessary criteria.

The Commissioners advised that a used car dealer be contacted to obtain the worth of the vehicles and then the county will accept day to day bids.

IN THE MATTER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT FUND ORDINANCE

HENDRICKS COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT FUND ORDINANCE NO. 1992-17
A proposal for a General Ordinance establishing the Law Enforcement Fund.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE HENDRICKS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS
COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. Law Enforcement Fund

- shall consist of deposits in the form of proceeds recovered by the Office of the Hendricks County Prosecutor, the Hendricks County Drug Task Force, and/or the Hendricks County Sheriff's Department in forfeiture actions filed pursuant to Indiana Code Sections 34-4-30.1 and 34-4-30.5, liquidations of personal or real property obtained from criminal defendants in those actions, and voluntary surrenders of funds and assets from criminal defendants.
- (b) The Law Enforcement Fund shall be appropriated for funding law enforcement activities conducted by the Hendricks County Sheriff's Department, the Hendricks County Drug Task Force, other special crime units, and for reimbursement of expenses incurred by the Prosecutor's Office in pursuing forfeiture and RICO actions.
- (c) All monies collected under this Section shall be transferred to the County Treasurer who shall deposit said funds and disburse as the Prosecuting Attorney directs, subject to the appropriation requirement of subparagraph (d). Monies remaining in the fund at the end of the year shall not revert to any other fund but shall continue in the Law Enforcement Fund.
- (d) Monies from this fund shall be subject to appropriation by the Hendricks County Council in accordance with Indiana Code 36-2-5-2.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage and compliance with I.C. 36-2-4-8.

IN THE MATTER OF RAILROAD CROSSING SOUTH OF AVON

Bud Landers and Roscoe Jenkins appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the Railroad crossing south of Avon on State Road 267 where the traffic is often held up for very long periods of time. Tom Underwood, Hendricks County Sheriff, explained that by State statute ten minutes is the maximum time that the crossing can be closed at one time.

Following discussion the Commissioners requested the County Sheriff to send a letter to the Railroad office informing them that this situation will be monitored and tickets will be issued to offenders and those responsible will be cited into court.

IN THE MATTER OF AVON, INC.

County Attorney, Gregory Steuerwald, announced that the Auditor's Office had been working to obtain the number of property owners in Washington Township and the figure is 8,816. For those wishing to oppose the incorporation of Washington Township as Avon, Inc. it would require 4,409 signatures to warrant a 50% majority plus one. The County Attorney also explained that where the ownership is by wife and husband it can be counted as two. If it is an estate with five names as owners then five signatures can be counted.

It was also noted that the county would not be responsible for sending the required certified letters to the property owners and residents of Washington Township.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, requested the permission of the Commissioners to loan a compressor belonging to the Highway Department to the R.E.M.C. to use at their safety instruction school. The Commissioners approved his request.

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Mr. Lawson also requested permission to haul stone to the Fairgrounds to the arena area. The Commissioners approved his helping out if it did not interfere with the regular Highway routine.

Russ expressed his gratitude to the Commissioners for their plaque presented to him at his Twenty-Fifth Anniversary Reception.

IN THE MATTER OF ZONING HEARINGS

Robert Jarzen, Hendricks County Plan Commission Administrator, announced that there will be eleven zoning hearings and requested the Commissioners desire whether to list them all at one time or to split them up between several Commissioners' meetings.

The Commissioners decided to split the hearings between several Commissioners' meetings and Mr. Jarzen will work this out with the Secretary.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY HOME COPIER

Darlene Truesdale, County Home Superintendent, reported on her visit to the County Council to request a copier and presented quotes for a larger copier which the Council had suggested.

Commissioner Clampitt moved to allow Mrs. Truesdale to purchase a copier from Minolta for \$2,995 with the payment to be taken from the Commissioners' equipment budget. Commissioner Myers seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF OSHA

Susan Fair, Hendricks County Personnel Director, presented information which she has obtained regarding Occupational Exposure to Bloodborne Pathogens.

This is a new law involving OSHA and their policies for vaccines. Since it is so new Mrs. Fair will continue to investigate and will obtain additional information if possible.

IN THE MATTER OF EASEMENT FOR TOWN OF DANVILLE

Walter Reeder, County Engineer, explained to the Commissioners a request from the Town of Danville for an easement of approximately 1.50 acres of the 4-H Fairgrounds property. He said it was proposed that the county will pay for the cost of building the rest rooms and will contribute \$5,000 toward building the dumping station.

J. D. Clampitt moved to authorize Hursel Disney, President of the County Commissioners to execute this easement across the 4-H Fairgrounds to the Town of Danville and to retain it until all of the details are completed between the County and the Town.

Hursel Disney seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF BRIDGE NO. 65

The County Engineer presented a contract for additional costs for professional engineering services for the design of Bridge No. 65 located on County Road 450 North and County Road 575 East over a branch of White Lick Creek which will not exceed a total fee of \$45,505.00.

Commissioner Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to allow the additional cost for related construction on Bridge No. 65 and to execute the agreement with Aecon, Inc. Commissioner Myers seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF HEALTH DEPARTMENT CARS

It was reported that Iacoli Auto Brokers will purchase the two old cars from the Health Department for \$550.00 each. Mr. Reeder investigated with Dugan Chevrolet for cost estimates for these vehicles and was told that this was very acceptable.

J. D. Clampitt moved to sell the cars to Iacoli Auto Brokers for \$550.00 each and his motion was seconded by Richard Myers. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF URBAN BOUNDARIES FOR BROWNSBURG AND PLAINFIELD

Mr. Reeder had spoken to Rich Carlucci from the Town of Plainfield and to Mark White from the Town of Brownsburg and neither of them were satisfied with the urban boundaries which IDOT had supplied.

IN THE MATTER OF RIGHT OF WAY ON TENTH STREET AND RACEWAY ROAD

Discussion was held concerning right of way acquisition on Tenth Street and Raceway Road.

Richard Myers authorized the County Engineer to make offers for this right of way acquisition. J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve claims numbered: 15900-15904 dated May 11, 1992; 16000-16318 dated May 15, 1992; 16400-16434 dated May 15, 1992 and 16500-16532 dated May 15, 1992.

The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF EXPOSITION HALL ADDITIONS

Commissioner Myers moved to enter into a contract arrangement with Cave Construction, Inc. to construct stairs and a retaining wall on the south side of the Exposition Hall at an additional cost of \$5,300.00.

Commissioner Clampitt seconded the motion approving additional costs of \$5,300 to construct stairs and a retaining wall on the south side of the Exposition Hall. The motion was approved unanimously.

The other quote received was from George Harvey & Son, Inc. in the amount of \$10,100.00.

IN THE MATTER OF SOUTH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUILDING

Gregory Steuerwald, County Attorney, reported that he had met with Bob Wood, Attorney for the Danville Community School Corporation, and the School Corporation is still willing to grant the county the South Elementary School building but there will not be a vacancy until January 1, 1994 and it is possibile that they would need it until June 1, 1994. He also reported that there is a possibility that they will retain the south end of this property to be used as a park or playground.

They listed three things they would request:

- 1. Every means to keep the building (do not demolish or destroy it)
- 2. The south end of the property be kept for park or playground
- 3. The liability expense of the property be assumed by the county (Hazardous materials)

IN THE MATTER OF CLAIM AGAINST COUNTY

The Commissioners noted the receipt of a tort claim notice from Kimberly Lawrence.

IN THE MATTER OF APPOINTMENT TO CLAYTON PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD

It was recommended that the appointment to the Clayton Public Library Board be continued for another week by a motion by J. D. Clampitt and seconded by Richard Myers. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF ATTENDANCE OF SEMINAR

Pick Up will be arranged with Indianapolis Recycled Fiber at all four sites for a \$20.00 fee.

Other related items were discussed involving individual collection options, logos, flyers, etc.

Mary Anne Lewis, Hendricks County Animal Control Officer, reported on Vandalism at the Shelter.

She also distributed monthly reports to the Commissioners for their review.

Commissioner Clampitt complimented Ms. Lewis on the fine job she is doing at the Shelter.

The meeting recessed for lunch and resumed at 1:00 P.M. for further business.

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IN THE MATTER OF WETZEL ENGINEERS, INC.

Mr. Don Borches and Mr. Richard B. Wetzel, introduced themselves, and presented booklets displaying information about their company and expressed a desire to be considered for engineering work in the future.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONING HEARINGS

Robert Jarzen, Hendricks County Plan Commission Administrator, and Mr. Lee Comer, Attorney, appeared for rezoning hearings for three different requests as follows:

Zoning Request No. ZA-18/GU92-05 from Ed Hines petitioned for rezoning from R-2 Medium Density Single Family to I-2 Light Industrial District. IN THE MATTER OF AVON JR. ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Mr. Gregg Scott, President of the Avon Jr. Athletic Association, distributed brochures with an explanation of their needs and a drawing of the ball diamonds accommodating approximately 1,500 young people who participate in softball, football, etc. annually.

Mr. Scott explained that last year a vehicle hit one of the dugouts and, fortunately at the time no children or spectators were near. The safety of all involved has been a great concern and they are requesting that a guard

rail be placed at two of the dugouts along County Road 625 East.

The Commissioners directed the County Engineer to investigate this area and report back to them at the June 8, 1992 meeting as to how the request could be granted.

IN THE MATTER OF CARTERSBURG ROAD

President Disney also instructed the County Engineer to investigate a problem on Cartersburg Road approximately three-quarters of a mile south of the railroad crossing where the road makes a sharp turn near the William Hughes property to see if there is a need for a guard rail.

ORDINANCE 1992-25

ORDINANCE OF THE HENDRICKS COUNTY CODE OF SECTION 35-47-2-1 POSSESSION OF DEADLY WEAPONS PROHIBITED WITHIN HENDRICKS COUNTY GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS : EXCEPTIONS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA: Section 1:

A section 35-47-2-1 of the Hendricks County Code is added, reading as follows:

Section 1 - Definitions

- (a) "deadly weapon" means: (1) a loaded or unloaded firearm; or (2) a weapon, device, taser or electronic stun gun, equipment, chemical substance, or other material that in the manner it is used, could ordinarily be used or is intended to be used, is readily capable of causing serious bodily injury.
- (b) "firearm" means any weapon which is capable of, designed to or that may be readily converted to expel a projectile by means of an explosion.

Section 2:

Except as provided in Section 3 of this chapter, a person shall not possess on or about his person within any Hendricks County Government Building, any deadly weapon. Any person in violation of this section shall be subject to a fine of up to \$1,000 per violation and the Hendricks County Attorney is hereby authorized to enforce this ordinance through the Hendricks County Court System.

Section 3:

Excepted persons: Section 2 of this chapter does not apply to the following persons while on duty or while appearing in court to testify in an official capacity: Law Enforcement Officers (35-41-1-17), Indiana Department of Correction Officers, Court personnel, or employees of the United States duly authorized to carry deadly weapons.

Off duty officers not testifying in official capacity are not exempt.

Section 2:

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The provisions of this amendment are severable.

Section 3:

This amendment becomes effective upon publication.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, reported to the Commissioners on the current Highway activities and the mowing and patching that is being done on the county highways.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter was presented from United Telephone Company of Indiana requesting permission to replace a buried cable along the south side of County Road 350 permission to replace a buried cable along the south side of County Road 350 North, east for approximately 6,600 feet to provide service for new housing and to replace deteriorated buried cable. It will be necessary to cross two culverts with aerial cable and the buried cable will be placed approximate-two culverts with aerial cable and the buried cable will be required and by 3 to 6 feet from the road edge. Work area protection will be required and flagmen will be utilized.

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve this request per staff recommendation and with a three year maintenance provided by The United Telephone Company of Indiana, Inc. with all work to be done under the supervision and approval of the County Engineer. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter from Indiana Gas Company, Inc. was presented requesting permission to construct, maintain and/or remove 320 feet of two inch plastic gas pipe line along or across county highways.

It is proposed to install 320 feet of two inch plastic main along the west side of Dan Jones Road starting at the Dan Jones Road and County Road 100 South intersection. This main extension will provide gas service to one new customer. The County Surveyor's office has been contacted and has stated no legal drains exist in the proposed construction area.

Said Indiana Gas Company, Inc., covenants and agrees to construct said pipe line in an orderly and workmanlike manner, to replace all grade levels, drains, pavements or structures to as good a condition as when work was commenced, and to replace with comparable material and workmanship all roadways, pavements, or structures damaged by the construction of the contemplated project; all to the satisfaction and under the supervision of said Board of Commissioners or their designated representative.

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve this request per staff recommendation subject to the permittee backfilling all excavation per the specifications and supervision of the Hendricks County Engineer. Also, this cut must be maintained by Indiana Gas for a period of at least three years. The line must also be pushed under the road - not cut.

The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter from Indiana Gas Company, Inc. was presented requesting permission to construct, maintain and/or remove 190 feet of four inch plastic gas pipe line along or across county highways.

It is proposed to install 190 feet of four inch plastic gas main along or across county highways.

It is proposed to install 190 feet of four inch plastic gas main along County Road 100 North approximately 500 feet east of Griswald Road. This main extension will provide gas service to one new customer. The County Surveyor's office has been contacted and has stated no legal drains exist in the proposed construction area.

Said Indiana Gas Company, Inc., covenants and agrees to construct said pipe line in an orderly and workmanlike manner, to replace all grade levels, drains, pavements or structures to as good a condition as when work was commenced, and to replace with comparable material and workmanship all roadways, pavements or structures damaged by the construction of the contemplated project all to the satisfaction and under the supervision of said Board of Commissioners or their designated representative.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve this cut permit request from Indiana Gas Company, Inc. per staff recommendation subject to a three year maintenance by Indiana Gas Company. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF AVON JR. ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Walter Reeder, County Engineer, reported that a traffic study taken on County Road 600 did warrant a guard rail being placed in that area. The estimated cost would be \$3,100.00 to install it.

Commissioner Clampitt moved to have the Highway Department install approximately 190 feet of guard rail along County Road 600 East at the Avon Baseball diamond and place signs where needed.

IN THE MATTER OF CARTERSBURG ROAD

Commissioner Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to install guard rail on Cartersburg Road along the William Hughes property. Commissioner Disney seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TURN LIGHT

It was reported that there is a need for a turn light at Dan Jones Road and U. S. 36.

IN THE MATTER OF TDS TELEPHONES

Mr. Reeder reported that the county's needs did not warrant purchasing the telephones offered for sale by TDS Communication Corporation of Indiana.

IN THE MATTER OF BROKEN GLASS AT JAIL

The County Engineer informed the Commissioners of the possibilities regarding the glass at the county jail where previously there was some damage due to falling stones.

Mr. Reeder recommended an overlay of protective unbreakable glass to be installed over the window panels to avoid any future breakage. Hoosier Glass Company will install these overlays at a cost of \$970.00.

J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to cover the four windows with the protective unbreakable glass at a cost of \$970.00. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF VETERANS MEMORIAL

It was reported that the total cost to the county on the construction of the Veteran's Memorial will be approximately \$3,211.80.

IN THE MATTER OF SERVICE AWARDS

Susan Fair, Hendricks County Personnel Director, reported that the service awards have been received. When the exact date is established she will send notices to the recipients and will notify the Department Heads.

The County Attorney reported that there has not been an agreement prepared by the Danville School Corporation for signatures regarding the South Elementary School but there will be further discussion at their meeting tonight.

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IN THE MATTER OF REQUEST FOR EQUIPMENT

A request was presented from Kevin J. Hinkle, Hendricks County Prosecuting Attorney, for additional equipment for the computer system at a cost of \$635.00 from Paper Peddler, Inc.

J. D. Clampitt moved to approve the request for additional equipment for the Prosecuting Attorney relative to the computer system. Richard Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF WEIGHTS & MEASURES REPORT

The monthly and annual reports were presented from Mr. Charles Colbert,
Hendricks County Weights & Measures Inspector, for the review of the Commissioners.

These reports were acknowledged, reviewed and will be placed on file in the Commissioners' office for future reference.

IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve claims numbered: 17700-18088 dated June 15, 1992; 18200-18362 dated June 15, 1992; 18500-18513 dated June 15, 1992; 18600-18607 dated June 4, 1992; 18700-19351 dated June 24, 1992 and 19400-19468 dated June 8, 1992.

The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONING

Mr. Gregory Steuerwald, Hendricks County Attorney, opened with remarks explaining that even though the Commissioners meeting is a public meeting the rezoning hearings have had their public hearing before the Plan Commission previous to this. Therefore, the Commissioners do not have to entertain any further comments from the public unless they wish to ask for response.

President Disney then explained that it was the Commissioners decision to allow one representative for each party to speak for five minutes only.

Mrs. Kartow was spokesperson for her husband and presented her remarks favoring a rezoning from R-1: Low Density, Single Family to C-2: General Commercial District.

Mrs. Marie Mounts spoke opposing the rezoning and mentioned that the property has been posted for sale.

Mr. Disney called for the vote of the Commissioners. J. D. Clampitt moved pursuant to the recommendation of the Plan Commission to deny this request and keep the property listed residential. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONING

ZA-23/LB92-02 rezoning request from Ray's Trash was presented requestig a change from R-1: Low Density, Single Family to C-2: General Commercial District.

Mr. Lee Comer, Attorney for Ray's Trash Service, Inc., explained that there was no intention of this company opening a landfill as has been rumored and that this business has been established in this same location for 27 years.

Their intention is to have no other business than Ray's Trash.

Kenneth Main spoke opposing this rezoning because he lives across the road and he is fearful of a land devaluation if the Trash Service is expanded. Mr. Howard Cox who lives near the Matthew property spoke opposing the rezoning to finish out the time allotted to Mr. Main.

Richard Myers moved to rezone this property to the prior classification which was taken away from them January 1, 1992 per staff recommendation which is C-2 General Commercial District. J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONING

ZA-24/LB92-03 rezoning was presented requesting a rezoning from R-1: Low Density Single Family to I-2: Light Industrial for Ray Matthew's Trash Service, Inc.

The Plan Commission made no recommendation. Mr. Jarzen read a list of permitted uses for the classification of I-2 Light Commercial and it was noted that all persons who were to receive proper notification had been properly notified.

Lee Comer, Attorney for Ray's Trash Service, Inc., read a letter which had been received by them from Mr. Jim Mooney, Hendricks County Economic Development Commission Director, informing them of the support for planned development along U. S. 40. Mr. Ray O'Neal from PSI reported that two and one half years ago aerial photographs were made of this area and registered with the Indiana Development Commission for potential development to promote growth within the State.

Mr. Jeff Payne who is a resident of Lakewood Estates spoke for those opposing the rezoning saying that the sewage structure in that area would not be adequate for one hundred industrial sites.

J. D. Clampitt moved to continue this hearing until July 13, 1992 at 2:30 P.M. with no public input at that time. Richard Myers seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF ORDINANCE

Richard Myers moved to approve the Ordinance regarding the Amendment to Ordinance No. 1992-17 relating to the checking account of the Law Enforcement Fund. J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

HENDRICKS COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 1992-22 ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1992-17

LAW ENFORCEMENT FUND - CHECKING ACCOUNT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE HENDRICKS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA: SECTION 1.

- (a) That the County Commissioners have previously enacted a Law Enforcement Fund which consists of deposits in the form of proceeds recovered by County law enforcement agencies in drug and other criminal forfeiture actions.
- (b) That said funds, after appropriation by the County Council, may be used

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to fund law enforcement activities conducted by the Hendricks County Drug Task

- (c) That said funds, after appropriation, may need to be used by the Hendricks County Drug Task Force in order to purchase drugs, controlled substances, stolen property and to pay confidential informants.
- (d) That in order to facilitate the expenditure of the appropriated funds by the Hendricks County Drug Task Force the Law Enforcement Fund Ordinance should be amended to permit the Prosecuting Attorney to establish a Law Enforcement Fund Checking Account, which may bear interest, to hold funds for useage by the Hendricks County Drug Task Force after said funds have been appropriated by the Hendricks County Council.
- (e) The Prosecuting Attorney is hereby authorized to place funds appropriated from the Law Enforcement Fund in a NOW account or similar account which may bear interest; the Prosecuting Attorney shall account to the Auditor of Hendricks County, Indiana for all interest earned on said account; the interest earned shall be kept and retained in said checking account and used for the purposes set forth for the principal sums.
- (f) In establishing said checking account, the signatures of the Prosecuting Attorney or his Chief Deputy and one of the Hendricks County Drug Task Force investigators must both be given in order to withdraw funds from the checking account.

SECTION 2. This Amending Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage and compliance with I.C. 36-2-4-8.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY EMPLOYEE INSURANCE

President Disney introduced Mr. John Yoho, an insurance broker, and then introduced Mr. Jeff Fox from the Nyhart Company, Inc. Mr. Fox presented detailed information on a self-insured Health insurance program.

Currently the County employees are insured through an arrangement with Lincoln National.

Many responded and Mr. Fox reassured the group that ID cards would be distributed and the plan could be drafted so that no referrals would be necessary as on the current plan. Claims will be paid on an average of within 5.5 days and a possibility that there would not be a list of Doctors or Hospitals one must choose from as in the current plan.

Following discussion J. D. Clampitt moved that the Commissioners approve the program and recommend that the County Council concur with the implementation of the self-insurance program. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF CONTRACT

Commissioner Myers moved and Commissioner Clampitt seconded a motion to approve a contract with the State Board of Animal Health for bovine brucellosis and Tuberculosis testing. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF AVON, INC.

Mr. Orville Woody, representing TAC, Inc. appeared before the Commissioners to announce that on June 6, 1992 there was a special meeting of TAC, Inc. and they voted to withdraw the petition to incorporate Washington Township as Avon, Inc. The meeting recessed for lunch and resumed at 1:00 P.M. for further business.

IN THE MATTER OF ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL ORDINANCE

Deanna English, Hendricks County Environmental Health Director, reported some minor changes in the On-Site Sewage Disposal Ordinance, and said that overall this Ordinance will bring Hendricks County into compliance with the State on Septic Systems.

Richard Myers moved to adopt the Ordinance as submitted. J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

HENDRICKS COUNTY ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. 1992-27

WHEREAS, IC 36-1-4-11 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, as amended, granted certain powers to the Board of County Commissioners relative to the adoption of ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, held a hearing in the Commissioner's Meeting Room on June 30, 1992 at approximately 1:45 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, after hearing testimony, found:

(1) That there are public health hazards associated with the improper disposal of sewage; (2) That due to the high clay content and due to a seasonally high water table found within the majority of Hendricks County soil types, use of on-site sewage disposal systems are likely to fail unless the soil limitations are recognized and overcome through proper design and construction; and (3) That there was a need to establish standards for design, construction and inspection of on-site sewage disposal systems.

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to promote the health, safety and welfare of the people of Hendricks County, Indiana by diminishing the health hazards created by failing on-site sewage disposal systems, be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana the following ordinance entitled, "Hendricks County On-Site Sewage Disposal Ordinance", be adopted.

I. DEFINITIONS

Agent means a registered environmental health specialist with knowledge of environmental health science employed by the Hendricks County Health Department or other persons selected by the Health Officer to assist in the administration of this ordinance.

Bedroom means any room which includes a closet that has the potential to be used for sleeping purposes.

Board of Health means the Hendricks County Board of Health having jurisdiction in Hendricks County, Indiana.

Commercial means any type of building other than a one or two family dwelling.

Division of Sanitary Engineering means a division within the Indiana
State Department of Health.

Hearing means a session in which witnesses are heard and testimony is taken.

Health Department means an agency governed by the Hendricks County
Health Officer and the Hendricks County Board of Health whose personnel
provide public health service to the citizens of Hendricks County.

Health Officer means the Health Officer having jurisdiction in Hendricks
County, Indiana.

Indiana State Department of Health means the state agency having authority to regulate on-site sewage disposal systems.

New Installation means all necessary work to install a new on-site sewage disposal system in conjunction with a new building being erected.

Notice of Violation means a written notification of an ordinance infraction.

Order means a written mandate a person is directed to obey.

Plot Plan means a graphic representation prepared by a registered engineer or professional land surveyor which identifies the topography, locations and elevations of current and proposed improvements as well as any other pertinent information required by the Planning and Building Department for an Improvement Location Permit.

Repair Installation means all necessary work to correct an existing on-site sewage violation at an existing building.

Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal System" means an Indiana State Department of Health regulation that established standards for residential sewage disposal systems and any amendments thereto. (Copy in Auditor's Office).

Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal" means an Indiana State Department of Health regulation that established standards for commercial on-site sewage disposal systems. (Copy in Auditor's office).

Violation means breach of law.

II. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND EXEMPTIONS

- A. All residential on-site sewage disposal systems shall be designed and installed in accordance with Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems: except as stated below.
 - 1. Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1-38 allows for a septic tank with a capacity seven hundred and fifty (750) gallons. In Hendricks County the minimum size of a new septic tank used in either a new or repair installation shall be a minimum of one thousand (1000) gallons.
 - 2. Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1-46 allows for a six (6) inch thick layer of straw to be used as a cover for aggregate in an absorption system. In Hendricks County the only allowable cover for aggregate in an absorption system shall be geotextile fabric with an effective opening size no smaller than twenty-hundredths (0.20) millimeters and no larger than eighty-five hundreths (0.85) millimeters.
- B. All designs for commercial on-site sewage disposal systems must have approval from the Indiana State Department of Health, Division of Sanitary Engineering prior to installation. All design and installation must be done in accordance with Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended

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"Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal" unless specific written exemption is obtained from the Indiana State Department of Health, Division of Sanitary Engineering.

Whenever a public or semi-public sewer becomes available and is within three hundred (300) feet of the property line of a residential or commercial property served by an on-site sewage disposal system or sanitary vault privy, a direct connection shall be made to said sewer and the on-site sewage disposal system or sanitary vault privy shall be abandoned properly in a manner that is acceptable to the Health Officer or agent.

III. PERMITTING

Before commencement of construction or repair of an on-site sewage disposal system or privy, the owner shall obtain a written permit signed by the Health Officer of Hendricks County. The permit shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the premises prior to the commencement of work. No person shall perform any work on such project until such permit is so obtained and posted on the premises. The application for such permit shall be made on a form provided by the Hendricks County Health Department. All permits are valid for a period of one year after the date of issue. The applicant shall provide the following information as minimum requirements.

A. Residential Permit Requirement

1. New Installations

- a. A plot plan prepared by a registered engineer and or professional land surveyor. The plot plan must be prepared in accordance with current standards of the Hendricks County Planning and Building Department and shall certify that the sewage disposal system will comply with this ordinance and Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems", if properly constructed and maintained.
- b. A soils analysis prepared by a soil scientist (Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1-29) in accordance with Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1-48.
- c. A floor plan of the proposed dwelling unit.
- d. All appropriate fees as outlined in the Hendricks County
 Board of Health's "Ordinance for Collection of Fees and
 amending all prior ordinance" Ordinance No. 1992-10.

2. Repair Installations

- a. An on-site investigation is required by an agent of the Hendricks County Health Department prior to the issuance of a permit.
- b. A diagram of the proposed system in relation to the existing septic system and well in addition to all other obvious
 structures on the property.
- c. All appropriate fees as outlined in the Hendricks County
 Board of Health's "Ordinance for Fees and Amending All
 Prior Ordinances" Ordinance No. 1992-10.

- B. Commercial Permit Requirements
 - 1. A soils analysis prepared as required by Rule 410 IAC 6-10-6(a)(7)
 - 2. A plot plan prepared by a registered engineer or professional land surveyor. The plot plan must be prepared in accordance with current standards of the Hendricks County Planning and Building Department and shall certify that the sewage disposal system will comply with this ordinance and Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal", if properly constructed and maintained and approved by the Indiana State Department of Health, Division of Sanitary Engineering.
 - An approval letter and a copy of approved plans from the Indiana State Department of Health, Division of Sanitary Engineering.
 - 4. All appropriate fees as outline in the Hendricks County Board of Health's "Ordinance for Collection of Fees and Amending All Prior Ordinances" Ordinance No. 1992-10.

C. FINAL APPROVAL

Final approval of the permit for an on-site sewage disposal system or privy shall not become effective until the installation is completed to the satisfaction of the Health Officer or agent. The Health Officer or agent, shall be allowed to inspect the work at any stage of construction. The applicant shall notify the Health Officer or agent when the work is ready for final inspection and before any underground portions are covered. The inspection shall be made within forty-eight (48) hours of the receipt of notice by the Health Officer of agent.

The Health Officer or an agent, bearing proper credentials and identification, shall be permitted to enter upon all properties at the proper time for the purposes of inspection, observation, measurement, sampling and testing necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance, Rule 410 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems" or Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal".

D. Permit Denial

1. Upon denial of a valid permit application, the applicant request a hearing with the Hendricks County Board of Health. The request must be in writing and received within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the denial. Upon receipt of the hearing request the Health Officer or agent shall arrange a time and place for the hearing and shall give the petitioner written notice thereof. Such hearing shall be held as soon as practical after receipt of the request provided IC 5-14-1.5 (Open Door Law) is complied with. If no such request is received within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the denial, the denial shall stand.

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- it is received the denial,

- At such hearing the petitioner shall be given an opportunity to be heard and to show evidence as to why the permit should be granted. Additionally, the Health Officer or agent shall be given time to explain why the permit was denied.
- 3. At the conclusion of the hearing the Hendricks County Board of Health shall sustain or overrule the permit denial depending upon its findings as to compliance with the provisions of this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal System" or Rule 410 IAC 6-10 "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal". If the Board of Health shall overrule the permit denial, then a permit shall be issued and signed by the chairperson of the Board of Health.
- 4. All proceedings of such hearing, including the findings and decision of the Board of Health, shall be summarized, reduced to writing, and entered as a matter of public record in the office of the Hendricks County Board of Health. In addition, all pertinent information (permit application and written correspondence) shall be included in the public record.
- 5. Any person may seek relief from any decision in any court of competent jurisdiction as provided by the laws of this state.

IV. ENFORCEMENT

- A. Whenever the Health Officer or agent determines there are reasonable grounds to believe there has been a violation of this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems", or Rule 410 IAC 6-10 as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal", the Health Officer or agent shall give notice of such alleged violation to the person or persons responsible, and to any known representative of such person, as hereafter provided.
 - Such notice shall:
 - Written;
 - Indicate the date and location of the violation; 2.
 - Clearly indicate the nature of the violation and the related ordinance citation;
 - 4. Allow a reasonable time for the performance of necessary remediation; and
 - 5. Be served upon the person or persons responsible, provided that such notice is deemed to be properly served. Proper service shall be any of the following:
 - a. Sent to the person directly;
 - b. Sent by registered mail to the last known mailing address
 - c. Posted in a conspicuous place in or about the property affected by the notice; and
 - d. Any other method of service authorized or required under the laws of this state.

- Any person or persons affected by any such notice issued by the Health Officer or agent may request and shall be granted a hearing on the matter before the Hendricks County Board of Health. The request shall be in writing and received within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of Notice of Violation at the office of the Hendricks County Health Department. Such request shall briefly state the reasons for the requested hearing. Upon receipt of a request for a hearing, the Health Officer or agent shall arrange a time and a place for such hearing and shall give the petitioner written notice thereof. Such hearing shall be held as soon as practical after receipt of request hereof, provided that IC 5-14-1.5.1 (Open Door Law) is complied with. Any notice served pursuant to Section IV-A of this ordinance shall automatically become an order if a written request for a hearing is not received within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the Notice of Violation is served.
- C. At such hearing the petitioner shall be given the opportunity to be heard and to show evidence as to why such Notice of Violation should be modified or withdrawn. Additionally, the Health Officer or agent shall be given time to explain the circumstances of the Notice of Violation.
- D. After such hearing the Hendricks County Board of Health shall sustain, modify or withdraw the Notice of Violation, depending upon its findings as to whether the provisions of this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1, "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems" or Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal", have been met. If the Hendricks County Board of Health sustains or modifies such Notice of Violation, it shall then be deemed to be an order.
- E. The proceedings at such hearing, including the findings and decision of the Hendricks County Board of Health, shall be summarized, reduced to writing, and entered as a matter of public record in the office of the Hendricks County Board of Health. Such record shall also include a copy of every Notice of Violation or order issued in connection with this matter as well as any other pertinent information. Any person may seek relief thereof from any court of competent jurisdiction as provided by the law of the state.
- F. Whenever the Health Officer, his agent excluded, finds that an emergency exists which requires immediate action to protect the public health, the Health Officer may, without notice or hearing, issue an order reciting the existence of such an emergency and require that such action be taken as he deems necessary to meet the emergency. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems: and Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal" such order shall be effective immediately. Any person

to whom such an order is directed shall comply therewith immediately, but upon petition to the Health Officer, shall be afforded a hearing, as soon as possible, in the manner provided in Section VI-B. After such hearing, depending upon the findings as to whether the provisions of this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems", or Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal", have been met, the Hendricks County Board of Health shall continue such order in effect, modify it or revoke it.

V. PENALTIES

Any person or persons who shall continue to violate any section of this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal Systems" or Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal" beyond the time limit provided in the order, shall be cited for said "violation" into a court having jurisdiction. Upon conviction, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the violator or violators shall be punished by a fine or no more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), plus court costs imposed. Each individual day that a violation is in existence shall (may) be deemed a separate offense.

VI. UNCONSTITUTIONALITY CLAUSE

A. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

VII. REPEAL AND DATE OF EFFECTIVE DATE

- A. Any ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, Rule 410 IAC 6-8.1 "Residential Sewage Disposal System", or Rule 410 IAC 6-10, as amended, "Commercial On-Site Waste Water Disposal" are hereby repealed.
- B. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approved according to law.
- C. Passed and adopted by the Board of Commissioners of Hendricks County on this 30th day of June, 1992.

IN THE MATTER OF PETITION TO VACATE ALLEY

Sharon Stegemoller, Attorney representing Hugh A. Johnson, appeared with

a request to vacate two alleys and a street in the Town of Coatesville.

It was determined that the Town of Coatesville has jurisdiction over matters such as this and the item was dismissed from the Commissioners' agenda.

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IN THE MATTER OF PERSONNEL MATTERS

Susan Fair, Hendricks County Personnel Director, reported on the meeting with Hospital officials and others regarding the blood borne pathogen standards. She recommended a line item in the 1993 budget to cover the cost which will be approximately \$85.50 per person and she estimated from 100 to 110 persons will need the vaccine.

J. D. Clampitt moved to pay this expense from the Special Contract account for 1992. Richard Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

Commissioner Myers recommended that there be some research to determine whether the local Board of Health could give the shots and whether the vaccine might be purchased from a local source.

IN THE MATTER OF WHITLOCK SHERIFF'S SALE

Peggy J. Foster, Hendricks County Treasurer, appeared before the Commissioners to discuss a problem regarding a piece of property that had been sold in the County Tax Sale and then resold in the Sheriff's Sale.

After much discussion J. D. Clampitt moved to have the county attorney work with the County Treasurer and any other county office involved to correct this problem. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF STAFFORD ROAD STUDY

Roger DeVore, Don McGillam and Chet Skwarcan, representing D. E. McGillam and Associates, discussed the Stafford Road Study and presented a drafted agreement for engineering services.

This study will determine required roadway improvements based on projected traffic volumes, investigate available funding opportunities, estimate construction costs, coordinate with other agencies planning transportation improvements impacting Stafford Road, and if directed, proceed with right of way engineering, land acquisition, and design phases for this project.

Following extended discussion, Richard Myers moved to accept this proposed agreement subject to staff approval and recommendation which should be brought before the Commissioners at the July 6, 1992 meeting.

J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF COPY MACHINE FOR ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

Lydia Gibbs, Hendricks County Assessor, requested permission to purchase a copy machine for use in the Assessor's Office but did not have funds in the Budget for the purchase of it.

The Commissioners suggested that Mrs. Gibbs make arrangements to purchase the necessary equipment and it can be funded from the Commissioners' equipment account. However, she is to ask for it in her 1993 budget.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY PROPERTY

Rich and Bob Jensen from Stevenson-Jensen Agency, Inc. held a discussion with the Commissioners regarding their concern with the recent appraisal of county property and the values placed upon it.

The Commissioners suggested that they contact the Independent Appraisal, Inc. and discuss this with them since they were the company who presented the new appraisal figures.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISIONS

Cambridge Subdivision - The County Engineer recommended that the original requirement of \$297,000 be reduced to \$70,000 for the performance bond.

Minor Plat No. 343 - The County Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released and since it would be under \$1,000 the maintenance bond requirement be waived.

J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve these two requests for Cambridge Subdivision and for Minor Plat No. 343. Richard Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

Minor Plat No. 434 - The County Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released and since it is under \$1,000 that the maintenance bond requirement be waived.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve this request per staff recommendation. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF CIRCUIT COURT PLASTER PROBLEMS

It was reported that there is a wall plaster problem in the Circuit Court Room and a cost of \$1,200 was estimated to correct this problem.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to repair the plaster problem and fund it from the Cumulative Capital Remodeling Fund. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF ELECTRICAL PROBLEM IN COURTHOUSE

There was a lengthy discussion concerning the electrical problem in the Courthouse in the Clerk's office and also in the basement. When the power is down it effects the computer systems adversely.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion per staff recommendation to take whatever action necessary to correct the electrical system. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF BOILER REPAIR

Following discussion on the problems with the boiler in the basement of the Courthouse and the Old Jail (now the Museum) the Commissioners authorized the County Engineer to direct his staff to repair the gas boiler and bring the boiler up to standard at an approximate cost of \$13,000.00.

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IN THE MATTER OF NEW EQUIPMENT FOR ENGINEER'S OFFICE

Walter Reeder, County Engineer, requested a new blue print copy machine and a new copy machine.

J. D. Clampitt moved to authorize the County Engineer to purchase the two new machines. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF MINUTES

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve the minutes for the June 30, 1992 Commissioners' meeting. The motion was approved unanimously.

There being no further business presented the meeting recessed at 5:15 P.M.

IN THE MATTER OF ANIMAL CONTROL BUSINESS

Mary Anne Lewis, Hendricks County Animal Control Officer, thanked the Commissioners for the copy machine transferred from the Auditor's office. However the only location for it is in an area where there is moisture and she whishes to have the copy machine removed before it becomes damaged.

The Commissioners requested the County Auditor to contact the company where it was purchased and see if it can be traded in.

Mrs. Lewis also reported that she could obtain a flag pole, flag and all necessary components including installation from Flag Poles, Inc. for a total cost of \$171.00. Walmart could supply the same without installation for \$235.00.

The Commissioners advised her to make her purchase from the lowest most responsive proposal and to fund the purchase from the donation fund.

A new sign is needed for the side of the Animal Shelter and this can be obtained for a cost of \$132.00 and also funded from the donation fund.

There was considerable discussion on the forms needed for the Animal Control Department. The Commissioners instructed Mrs. Lewis to make the necessary changes

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and present the forms back to them for their review and approval at a later date.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BIDS Bids for Highway trucks were opened, reviewed and taken under advisement for staff review and recommendation at the June 28, 1992 meeting.

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, reported that the bid from Speedway International Trucks, Inc. had quoted the lowest most responsive and responsible bid for two tandem trucks. The bid price for two tandem trucks totaled \$99,209.76 including trade in of a total of \$24,000 for two trucks.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Disney seconded a motion to award the bid for two highway tandem trucks to Speedway International Trucks, Inc. for a total cost of \$99,209.76 which is \$4,000 less than the next closest bidder. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Lawson reported that the bid of Smart Ford, Inc. for a cab and chassis on a one ton truck with bed totaled \$19,871.55 and was \$500 less than the closest bidder.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Hursel Disney seconded a motion to award the bid for the one ton truck cab and chassis to Smart Ford, Inc. as the lowest most responsive and responsible bid received. The motion was approved unanimously.

The Highway Supervisor informed the Commissioners that they could expect delivery in about 120 days.

IN THE MATTER OF SHADY LANE

There was some discussion regarding the lowering of the speed limit on Shady Lane. Walter Reeder, County Engineer, will investigate the problem and will also confer with the county attorney on whose authority signs could be erected.

IN THE MATTER OF RIGHT OF WAY GRANT

Mr. Reeder reported that a counter proposal has been received from James and Edith Price through Kathleen Searcy acting with Power of Attorney for them on the Raceway Road and Tenth Street property. Following discussion the Commissioners agreed to accept the counter offer for the above mentioned property.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISION

Minor Plat No. 432 - The County Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released upon receipt of a maintenance bond in the amount of \$1,000.

Hursel Disney moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion per staff recommendation to approve the request for bond reduction. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

Mr. Reeder presented a letter from Indiana Bell requesting permission to make an opening within the public right of way to maintain and provide additional telephone facilities. The surface will be restored by the Indiana Bell Co. upon completion of the work and the work will commence and complete within

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ninety days of the permit issue date.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve the request from Indiana Bell per staff recommendation with the three year maintenance being done by Indiana Bell.

The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF STAFFORD ROAD STUDY

Representatives from D. E. McGillem & Associates, Inc. had presented an agreement to the Commissioners at the June 28, 1992 meeting for the development of the Stafford Road Improvement Study. The agreement was approved at that meeting and today the Commissioners executed the agreement.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY ROAD 601 SOUTH

A petition was presented to vacate County Road 601 South from William and Beverly Hack.

The matter was referred to the County Attorney to see if there is a need for advertisement of this request prior to the Commissioners' decision.

IN THE MATTER OF HENDRICKS COMMUNITY HOSPITAL

Gregory Steuerwald, County Attorney, presented a letter from the Hendricks Community Hospital's Vice President of Finance, John J. Komenda.

Accompanying the letter were "approval of transaction" forms which require the Commissioners signature. These forms authorize INB Bank, trustee for the Hospital's 1985 Bond issue, to purchase government securities to be held in escrow. This escrow will be used to make interim bond payments and to pay off the debt on its first call date (January 1, 1995). This relieves the County of any potential liability associated with the Hospital's 1985 bond issue.

J. D. Clampitt moved to authorize President Disney to execute these instruments. Richard Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve claims numbered: 21500-21885 dated July 15, 1992; 22000-22198 dated July 15, 1992; 22300-22314 dated July 15, 1992 and 22400-22407 dated July 2, 1992.

The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY VEHICLES

Discussion was held regarding county employees driving county vehicles home over night.

The Commissioners said that many of the county employees who take a county vehicle home are subject to emergency calls twenty-four hours a day seven days a week. This includes but is not limited to the County Engineer, Highway, Plan Commission and Animal Control Departments.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve the policy of suggesting that employees subject to emergency call take a vehicle home with them at night. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRADERS STATION SUBDIVISION

Lee Comer, Attorney, presented information to the Commissioners regarding the Traders Station Subdivision and a problem with the developer's bond release.

Mr. Noble Taylor has acquired a number of lots in this subdivision and has posted his bond and finished all the necessary requirements for release of the bond. However, Mr. Rothbard who has the remaining lots in this subdivision has not completed the work required by him as a developer.

The County Engineer does not want to release the bond which Mr. Taylor has paid for the entire subdivision because Mr. Rothbard has not completed his duties and the County Engineer will not have any leverage to force him to complete his part of the task.

Lengthy discussion was held regarding this problem and the final conclusion was to have the developers work this out with the County Engineer.

The meeting recessed for lunch and resumed at 1:00 P.M. for further business.

IN THE MATTER OF RC&D COUNCIL

Mr. Bill Beard representing the Research, Conservation and Development Council (RC&D), presented a twelve minute video regarding the purpose and goals of this Department.

Mr. Beard spoke complimentary words concerning our own County Engineer and County Plan Commission Administrator, who both serve on the RC&D Council Board of Directors representing Hendricks County.

He encouraged our County's participation and response.

President Disney complimented Mr. Beard on his presentation and kind words regarding our county representatives on the Board.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY EMPLOYEE AWARD PRESENTATIONS

Susan Fair, Hendricks County Personnel Director, assisted the County Commissioners as presentations were made to county employees who have served five, ten, fifteen, twenty and twenty-five years with the county.

Each group was photographed with their plaques.

Mr. Disney remarked that this program was started last year and it was their sincere hope that it could be continued each year. Twenty five personnel were present for the award presentation and ten were unable to be present but will receive their plaques from Mrs. Fair later. Mr. Disney commented that it was an honor to have three Council members present, namely, Mr. Richard Turpin, Mrs. Linda Watson and Mr. John (Bud) Daum.

IN THE MATTER OF NEWS RELEASE

Sheriff, Tom Underwood, presented a news release from the National Fraternal Order of Police regarding a rap song with demeaning and lewd words encouraging killing of police being sponsored and supported by the Time Warner, Inc. The National Fraternal Order of Police are encouraging boycott of all Time

Warner products and the writing of letters to protest.

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The Commissioners discussed the notification of Time Warner, Inc. that they will consider revoking the franchise held in Hendricks County if Time Warner, Inc. continues to support this distasteful vulgar recording.

A letter was drafted to be sent to Time Warner, Inc. with copies also to be sent to the Fraternal Order of Police, Danville Police Department and to Sheriff Tom Underwood.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONINGS

The Board was advised that parcels under consideration in this rezoning hearing (namely, Watson, Saldana, Laskowski and Dunkin/Gladden) are requested amendments for rezoning of property back to the zoning as it was prior to January 1, 1992.

Mr. Bob Jarzen, Hendricks County Plan Commission Administrator and Mr. Lee Comer, Attorney, were present for these hearings.

Rezoning No. ZA-15/MI92-02 in the name of A. J. and Joyce Watson requested that the status of I-2 Light Industrial District be returned to their property which would change it from the current status of R-1 Low Density, Single Family.

This property is located on County Road 100 E and County Road 150 E east of County Road 150 E. The Plan Commission has given a favorable recommendation.

J. D. Clampitt moved per Board recommendation to have the property of A. J. and Joyce Watson rezoned from R-1 to I-2 Light Industrial District as it was prior to January 1, 1992. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Rezoning No. ZA-16/MI92-03 in the name of Joe Saldana requested that the status of I-2 Light Industrial District be returned to the property which would change it from the current status of R-1 Low Density, Single Family.

This property contains five acres and has direct access onto U. S. 136. It is a vacant piece of ground which the owner wishes to develop in a commercial fashion. The Plan Commission gave no recommendation. The Staff recommendation was to deny this request based on the way the land has developed.

Mrs. Kennedy spoke her concerns about the bad drainage problems in the area.

Mr. Comer commented that a number of homes in this area are zoned industrial
and it may take a commercial user to correct the problem for the whole area.

Commissioner Clampitt moved that the Board of Commissioners allow the rezonings favorable recommendation since it is being returned to I-2 Light Industrial as it was prior to January 1, 1992 and especially since it has been that way for 32 years. Hursel Disney seconded the motion regretfully and the motion carried with a two to one vote. Mr. Clampitt and Mr. Disney voted age and Mr. Myers voted nay.

Rezoning No. ZA-17/MI92-04 in the name of Jeff Laskowski contains 20 acres. The north ten acres is from the family and the south ten acres is being pruchased on a land contract. The Plan Commission gave a favorable recommendation.

J. D. Clampitt moved to approve the rezoning per staff recommendation to I-2 Light Industrial District as it was prior to January 1, 1992. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Rezoning No. ZA-22/GU92-07 in the name of Geraldine Dunkin and Gladden and

Company is located near the Town of Plainfield. The Plan Commission gave a favorable recommendation.

Commissioner Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve the request for rezoning from R-2 Medium Density, Single Family to I-2 Light Industrial District. Commissioner Myers seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

Rezoning No. ZA-26/WA92-05 in the name of Helen Pecar requests to be rezoned from R-1 Low Density, Single Family and C-3 Office Commercial District to C-2 General Commercial District. This property is west of R.E.M.C. on old U.S. 36 and a portion is already zoned commercial. The back portion is zoned residential. They are requesting that the entire property be zoned commercial. White Lick Sewer and Indianapolis water will be available.

J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve the request to be zoned C-2 General Commercial District. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Zoning No. ZA-14/LB92-01 in the name of Tranex Realty is a request to be rezoned to C-4 Highway Commercial District from C-2 General Commercial District. The Plan Commission gave a favorable recommendation.

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve the zoning request from C-2 General Commercial District to C-4 Highway Commercial District per staff recommendation. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF E.D.C. QUARTERLY REPORT

Mr. James Mooney, Executive Director of the Hendricks County Economic Development Partnership, presented the Commissioners with a quarterly report of the activities for the past few months as well as future plans.

He informed the Commissioners of a briefing with United Airlines this morning and said that plans were a little ahead of schedule and that ground breaking will be either August 10th or 12th. Mr. Mooney remarked that contracts are starting to become a reality.

The E.D.C. Partnership is also recommending that the Towns plan to use a portion of their EDIT funds for E.D.C. work.

IN THE MATTER OF VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER'S REPORT

The Commissioners acknowledged a report of geographic distribution for Veterans expenditures for the fiscal year of 1991 from Billie J. Holmes, Hendricks County Veterans Service Officer.

This report will be placed in the Commissioners' office for future reference.

IN THE MATTER OF MINUTES

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve the minutes for the June 30, 1992. The motion was approved unanimously.

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There being no further business presented the meeting pecessed at 3:45 P.M.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter was presented from Indianapolis Water Company requesting permission to make an opening within the right-of-way of Red Oak Drive from Laurel
Oak Drive to Timber Climb 3,753 feet west and south in Oak Bend Estates.

This work is necessary to provide water service to the area. The main extension will be completed within ninety (90) days of the permit issue date.

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion per staff recommendation to approve the request of Indianapolis Water Company subject to permittee backfilling all excavating as per the specifications and supervision of the Hendricks County Engineer. This cut must be maintained by Indianapolis Water Company for a period of at least three years. At locations where the main is under the pavement, Indianapolis Water Company is required to install all laterals to each lot on both sides of the street at the time the main is installed. Where the main is located outside the pavement, Indianapolis Water Company will not issue a permit to connect until the person requesting permit shows proof of a County Highway/road cut permit. Where water main is within pavement, pavement must be removed to the curb so there is only one additional joint in the pavement.

The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF BRIDGE NO. 204

A change order for Bridge No. 204 located on the Morgan-Hendricks County line was presented to the Commissioners for their consideration. The change order was for a cost reduction equal to 50% of the invoice price of \$5.50 per ton.

Following discussion the Commissioners executed the document.

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IN THE MATTER OF INDIANAPOLIS RACEWAY PARK

It was reported that the Indianapolis Raceway officials had been contacted in regard to the crosswalk project presented at a previous Commissioners meeting.

They are willing to fence the parking lot and provide some type of gate in order to control the pedestrian traffic. Temporary signs will be installed prior to any event necessitating the crosswalk's use and will be removed upon the event's completion.

The crosswalk will be constructed of temporary tape which will be removed upon the event's completion. A crossing guard will be on duty when the crosswalk is in use to insure public safety.

The Commissioners authorized the County Engineer to respond with a favorable reply to these proposed plans.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

A letter from Indiana Bell Telephone Company, Inc. was presented requesting permission to install conduits in the July-August 1992 time frame in the right-of-way of County Road 700 N (Garner Road) just east and west of State Road 267, north of Brownsburg. Also, included is one push across County Road 700 N and one open cut. The open cut, just east of State Road 267, is proposed due to the number of conduits (15) being installed. A maximum of three can be included in one push and a bore large enough to accommodate all fifteen would require a 30 inch diameter bore and casing. Indiana Bell proposes to patch the cut with an INDOT specification repair.

The remainder of conduits to be installed are in State Road 267 right-of-way and in private easements.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve the request per staff recommendation and subject to permittee backfilling all excavation per the specifications and supervision of the Hendricks County Engineer. Also, this cut must be maintained by Indiana Bell for a period of at least five years.

The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF DETOUR AGREEMENT FOR U.S. 40 BRIDGE REPLACEMENT
Walter Reeder, County Engineer, presented a detour agreement between the
State of Indiana through the Indiana Department of Transportation and Hendricks
County for U.S. 40 bridge replacement over McHaffie Branch.

This agreement will detour all U.S. 40 traffic over the county road located on the Putnam/Hendricks County line from the junction of State Road 240 and State Road 75, east approximately .35 mile to U.S. 40, hereinafter referred to as the county road, during the bridge replacement over McHaffie Branch on U.S. 40, which is 0.1 mile east of State Road 75.

J. D. Clampitt moved to approve the detour agreement and Richard Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously. The Commissioners executed the agreement.

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IN THE MATTER OF OLD EQUIPMENT

Mr. Reeder reported that the Engineer's office had received their new blue line machine and were very happy with it. He thanked the Commissioners and said that there was an interested party in the old machine and requested the Commissioners guidance in disposing of it.

The County Attorney reported that if the value is less than \$500 it can be given away. The Commissioners advised an investigation of the worth of the old equipment.

IN THE MATTER OF ANIMAL CONTROL BUSINESS

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IN THE MATTER OF REZONING Robert Jarzen, Hendricks County Plan Commission Administrator, announced that the rezoning hearing for Mr. Frank Edwards will be next Monday, July 20, 1992 at 3:15 P.M.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONING HEARING

Rezoning No. ZA-24/LB92-03 in the name of Raymond H. Matthews for Ray's Trash Service, Inc. was continued from June 8, 1992 and was presented for a final decision today.

This petition was presented to the Plan Commission on May 21, 1992 and was given no recommendation by them.

The zoning request is from R-1: Low Density, Single Family to I-2: Light Industrial District.

Lee Comer, Attorney and Mr. and Mrs. Matthews, also Ray Matthews were in attendance favoring the petition. Mr. Kenneth Main was in attendance opposing the rezoning.

Following lengthy discussion with questions and answers from Mr. Jarzen, Plan Commission Administrator, Richard Myers moved to grant the rezoning petition from R-1 to I-2 as requested. J. D. Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Duke Merrion informed the Commissioners that an affiliate to Habitat for Humanity is being formed here and explained that this is a Christian ministry which provides housing for low income families.

Mr. Merrion presented a proposal for partnership between Hendricks County and Community Action of Greater Indianapolis.

He explained that there is no acceptance of county funds, but they would accept services from the county and they would accept waiver of permit fees. Mr. Jeff Martin, Realtor, has pruchased a piece of property and is willing to donate the house on it to Habitat for Humanity but there is a need for removal of the house by August 1st. Volunteers are assisting currently in the removal of timbers for this project.

The Commissioners complimented him for this fine program.

IN THE MATTER OF HENDRICKS COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Betty Bartley, President of the Hendricks County Historical Society, announced that the Indiana State Historical Society would appreciate locating a new exhibit of Circuit photos in our Courthouse rotunda for public display during the month of August.

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Darlene Truesdale and Debra Haines from the County Home appeared to discuss County Home business with the Commissioners. It was reported that when they attended the IAHA conference they learned that it is possible to increase the County Home resident's fees based on the actual cost to \$620.70 per month or cost based on effective business prudence of \$931.00 per month per resident. There was some discussion on A.R.C.H.

The new law was effective July 1st but it may be the first of the year before they can implement it at the County Home if the Commissioners approve this plan.

Mrs. Haines requested professional guidance for the preparation of the program and recommended that they consult with Mr. William M. Hartung with Edgewood Consulting Group in Indianapolis. The Commissioners approved her request.

Darlene Truesdale presented an application for residency at the County Home from Charles Edmonson Wheeler. Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve the application of Mr. Charles Edmonson Wheeler subject to the rules of the County Home Superintendent. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mrs. Truesdale also reported that it was not possible to locate stainless steel tables necessary for the county home but she has contacted two contractors who will design a table to meet Board of Health standards and that will fulfill their needs.

IN THE MATTER OF ANIMAL CONTROL BUSINESS

Mary Anne Lewis, Animal Control Officer, presented her June and July monthly reports to the Commissioners for their review.

A letter from the Hendricks County Humane Society was presented to the Commissioners expressing a desire to promote the adoption of pets from the Animal Shelter and the hope that some arrangement can be worked out between the Humane Society and the County Animal Shelter to accomplish this program.

It was also noted that Mary Anne Lewis has been doing an outstanding job as the Animal Control Officer and how much they appreciate receiving compliments on her work rather than complaints.

There has been discussion with the insurance carrier regarding volunteers assisting with some of the detail chores at the Shelter and it was requested that the liability insurance be checked before the program can be approved.

Tom Drake, Hendricks County Emergency Management Director, and Jeff Scull from the County Health Department presented copies of the hazardous material emergency plan to the Commissioners and to the county attorney.

Mr. Drake explained that Mr. Ken Rogers from the State Emergency Office Will be signing the Ordinance outlining the procedures.

The Commissioners recommended that Mr. Drake work with the county attorney regarding the Ordinance and the proper advertising.

IN THE MATTER OF PERSONNEL MATTERS

Susan Fair, Hendricks County Personnel Director, presented a proposed Holiday Schedule for 1993 for the Commissioners approval.

The Commissioners advised her to check with the three courts and they would accept the schedule subject to the Court's approval.

Mrs. Fair discussed with the Commissioners the possibility of presenting a contract for a particular county employee. The liability was questioned relating to this employee not being on the regular payroll.

Mrs. Fair had discussed this with our insurance carrier and it has been suggested that a special liability clause be included.

The Commissioners authorized Mrs. Fair to pursue this matter and to work with the county attorney regarding the legal aspects.

There will be a meeting on August 6, 1992 between Susan Fair, John Yoho and Jeff Fox regarding the Health Plan Document and she will present the results of this meeting to them at their August 10th meeting.

It was reported that Mrs. Fair also met with the officials from the Hendricks Community Hospital and they have offered a discount to county employees insured under the new health insurance plan. This discount would be an incentive and would lower the overall cost of the plan.

The Commissioners advised her to also contact St. Vincents Hospital,
Methodist Hospital and Indiana University Hospital to see whether they might
make a similar offer.

IN THE MATTER OF VETERAN SERVICE OFFICER'S REPORT

The July monthly report of Billie J. Holmes, Hendricks County Veterans' Service Officer, was presented and reviewed by the County Commissioners.

reference.

IN THE MATTER OF THANK YOU NOTE

A note of appreciation was presented and read from the Hendricks County Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 132 expressing their appreciation for the stand taken by the County Commissioners regarding the song by Ice-T called "Cop Killer" being discontinued from publication.

IN THE MATTER OF NOMINATION FOR AWARDS

Mr. Reeder, County Engineer, presented three nominations for Achievement Awards for Hendricks County to be presented at the 1992 AIC Conference on behalf of the County Auditor. The nominations are for "Cost Effective Infrastructure Improvements", "Economic Development Partnership" and "Citizen Participation".

The Commissioners reviewed these papers, complimented Mr. Reeder and Mrs. Bussell and approved their submission before the AIC Board for consideration.

IN THE MATTER OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTE RECORD BOOK

Mr. Reeder reported that a diligent search had been made for the missing Commissioners' Minute Book No. 1 and it can not be found. All minute books for Commissioners minutes are kept in the Auditor's office and are accounted for except the very first one.

IN THE MATTER OF TRANSFER OF TUITION CLAIMS

IN THE MATTER OF OAK BEND ESTATES

IN THE MATTER OF BUDGETS FOR 1993

Only two bids were received following the advertisement for striping of the county roads.

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Mar-Lar, Inc. submitted a letter stating that they could not meet the required deadline therefore would not be submitting a bid.

Chemi-Trol Chemical Company submitted a bid totaling \$31,628.15.

commissioner Clampitt moved to acknowledge the receipt of the above bid and that the bid of Chemi-Trol Chemical Company be referred to staff for review and recommendation. Commissioner Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF PETITION TO VACATE A PORTION OF C.R. 601 SOUTH William A. Waddick, Attorney, and William H. and Beverly M. Hack appeared to request the closing of a portion of County Road 601 South and to erect a gate at the point where the road ends.

Following discussion and the review of a photograph of the area Commissioner Clampitt moved to allow a portion of County Road 601 South to be closed and a gate be erected by the county with the co-operation of Mr. and Mrs. Hack in determining the location of the gate.

Commissioner Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Waddick requested an agreement for signatures and the county attorney will prepare the instrument.

IN THE MATTER OF EASEMENT ACQUISITION OFFER

Art Welling, Attorney, presented a proposal to be sent to the Rost brothers advising them that the county wishes to purchase a portion of the abandoned rail-road south of State Road 40 that joins Six Points Road. The area has provided access to several businesses for over twenty five years and if closed off several jobs would be lost. IN THE MATTER OF RECYCLING

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, reported that he had made contact with someone regarding disposing of the tires picked up off the roadsides but facility is not taking on new customers at this time.

The Landfill will not accept any tires unless they are sliced or shredded. Following discussion regarding various options to solve a problem that has existed over several years it was finally decided to use the old barn or to purchase or rent another semi-trailer for storage.

IN THE MATTER OF CLERMONT HEIGHTS

It was brought to the attention of the County Commissioners that Clermont Heights Subdivision is having a problem with trucks being parked in the addition overnight there. The weight is causing tire tracks where they sit thus causing the road damage. It also creates a traffic hazard.

There was discussion relative to signs being erected limiting the parking weight of trucks.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to instruct the County Road Supervisor to purchase signs "No Parking trucks and tractors over 7000 lbs." to be erected in that area and in the meantime the County Attorney will prepare an ordinance to be adopted in order that violators of the ordinance can be arrested.

IN THE MATTER OF SUGARWOOD ESTATES

IN THE MATTER OF BID FOR ROAD STRIPING

The County Engineer reported that the bid referred to staff for review and recommendation from the last meeting regarding the county road striping was in proper form and the staff now recommends that Chemi-Trol Chemical Company be awarded the bid for a total amount of \$31,628.15 even though this was the only bid received.

J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to accept the bid from Chemi-Trol Chemical Company for the county road striping project. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF BURIED CABLE

Walt Reeder presented a letter from TDS Telecom or Communications Corporation of Indiana requesting permission to place buried telephone cables in Hendricks County. The addition of these cables will allow an upgrading of telephone service for existing customers as well as providing the needed facilities for future customers.

All cable additions have been noted on attached staking sheets and maps for review. Cable and pedestal placements will be made as close to the right of way as possible and all road bores will be made at a minumum depth of five (5) feet.

Commissioner Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve this request subject to the installation being maintained by TDS Telecom for a period of at least three years. The road must be bored under and not cut.

Commissioner Disney seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

This letter is on file in the Auditor's office.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

Mr. Reeder also presented a letter from Indiana Bell requesting permission to make an opening along the east edge of the County owned field bordering Meadow Drive where Sycamore Lane joins.

This work is necessary to maintain and provide additional telephone facilities.

The surface will be restored by this company upon completion of this work which will commence and complete within ninety days of the permit issue date.

J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve this request subject to Indiana Bell maintaining this area for a period of three years. The road must also be bored under and not cut. Hursel Disney seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISIONS

Minor Plat No. 413 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released upon receipt of a maintenance bond in the amount of \$1,600.00.

Minor Plat No. 367 - The Engineer recommended that the maintenance bond be released.

Gailcrest, Section 5 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be reduced to \$40,000.00.

The following items, however, must be addressed prior to any future bond reductions: 1. Erosion control measures must be implemented immediately in disturbed areas; 2. The rear swale behind Lots No. 59-66 needs redefined. The outlet for the required subsurface drain is not evident. Rip-rap is also required at this outlet; 3. The rear swale behind Lots No. 67-71 has no rip-rap placed at the outlet and it appears that the swale might have been cut too deep. This must be verified by the project engineer; 4. The main swale that runs from Section 5 to the offsite drainage easement has standing water in many areas. Erosion control is lacking in many places and silt is building up in the flow line of the ditch. This must be cleaned out for proper flow; and 5. Stop signs and street signs must be installed.

J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve all three requests mentioned above. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

A report was given indicating the results of a traffic study made on County Road 1000 S between County Road 275 W and County Road 350 W.

Following the report and discussion, J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to install 40 mile per hour signs at each end of the segment. Richard Myers seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

A second traffic study report was reported. This study was taken on County Road 625 E south of U. S. 36 to County Road 100 S.

This area has a high accident history in the one mile segment and has been placed on a high priority list.

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The staff recommended that additional signs be placed and relocation of some signs be made. The "Stop Ahead" sign facing northbound traffic it should be lowered to a height suggested.

IN THE MATTER OF RACEWAY ROAD

The County Engineer reported that a letter has been received from the Indianapolis Department of Transportation agreeing with Hendricks County that the location of the I 74 Interchange for the North-South corridor should be at or near the Hunter Road closing of I 74 and they are contacting the proper officials to amend the Master Thoroughfare Plan accordingly.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY HOME BUSINESS

Darlene Truesdale, County Home Superintendent, reported that there is no money in her budget for gasoline for the van. The Commissioners advised her to obtain the needed gasoline from the Highway Department and then request an additional appropriation for gas when she makes out the request for additional appropriation for utilities.

Mrs. Truesdale also requested cable for the county home residents but is having difficulty with the cablevision company. Commissioner Disney will contact the Cablevision Company.

There is also a great need for air conditioning for the kitchen and dining areas of the County Home.

Commissioner Clampitt moved to have air conditioning units installed and to fund this from the Cumulative Capital Fund. These units are for the kitchen and dining areas only.

Commissioner Myers seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF ANIMAL CONTROL BUSINESS

Mary Anne Lewis, Hendricks County Animal Control Officer, gave a report comparing statistics of the Animal Shelter for 1991 with current records of 1992.

She also discussed the amending of the Animal Control Ordinance to delete the phrase 'Animal Control Authority' and insert 'the Hendricks County Commissioners.'

The County Attorney will investigate these changes.

Mrs. Lewis also reported on the three requests for quotes for her printing needs. The Republican would not make a quote and Freedom Press and Petri Printing were not comparable. The lowest most responsive and responsible quote was a total of \$876.00 from Petri Printing.

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The Commissioners instructed her to accept the lowest quote.

IN THE MATTER OF ADA REPRESENTATIVE

It was reported that the Commissioners needed to appoint a representative to the ADA to evaluate the facilities here and bring them into compliance.

J. D. Clampitt moved to appoint Walter Reeder as the county representative to Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA). Hursel Disney seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF ABANDONED RAILROAD

The County Attorney informed the Commissioners of an offer to purchase the CSX Railroad's interest in the property located east of State Road 75 to Raceway Road (through Maplewood and south of Brownsburg).

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to offer an amount equal to the value established for taxpayers.

The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY EMPLOYEE INSURANCE

Minor Plat No. 365 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond requirement be reduced from the original requirement of \$10,000 to \$5,000.

IN THE MATTER OF BRIDGE NO. 216

The County Engineer presented a request from Warren T. Hobson and Associates, Inc. for a design change on Bridge No. 216 which will require a change in the specifications and ultimately an additional expense of \$6,165.00.

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Following some discussion Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion per staff recommendation to approve the changes in design for the Bridge No. 216 project. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF BRIDGE RE-INSPECTION

Mr. Reeder presented the results of a traffic study on County Road 725 North between County Road 200 West and County Road 300 West, which was the result of a complaint regarding the sight distance between cars coming over the hill and those exiting a driveway.

Two large shrubs at the end of the driveway reduce the sight distance to zero for cars exiting.

The crest of the hill is approximately 576 feet east of the drive.

Under heavy acceleration, it is possible to attain 45 miles per hour from the point at County Road 200 West to the crest of the hill. The required stopping sight distance based on a design speed of 50 miles per hour has been calculated to be 400 to 475 feet.

It is recommended that the residents at this address be requested to remove the shrubs at the end of their drive to alleviate the problem.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

A report was also given on another traffic study taken at 0 Road south of Clayton to U. S. 40.

This 1.5 mile segment has an excellent road surface and geometry punctuated by an unmarked reverse curve at County Road 600 South, which could catch an unfamiliar driver off guard. Pavement width is 21 feet edge to edge. Centary markings provide positive guidance throughout the segment which is moderately populated.

The recommendation is to install additional 50 mile per hour speed limit signs and reverse curve warning signs. Also to install reverse curve warning signs with advisory speed placards of 35 miles per hour and add signs to identify the cemetery entrances.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion per staff recommendation to approve the recommended road signage. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF DEAF CHILD

A family living in the second house south of County Road 600 East (Moon Road) has a deaf child and has requested an appropriate sign be posted in their area.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HENDRICKS COUNTY INDIANA ZONING ORDINANCE BY ESTABLISHING MAXIMUM LOT COVERAGE OF PERMITTED ACCESSORY BUILDING STANDARDS

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Hendricks County, Indiana, adopted the Hendricks County Zoning Ordinance on January 1, 1992;

WHEREAS, the Hendricks County ADvisory Plan Commission has recommended that the Zoning Ordinance be amended by the establishment of maximum lot coverage of permitted accessory building standards as a part of the ordinance process;

WHEREAS, the Hendricks County Advisory Plan Commission has conducted a public hearing on the proposed amendment and voted to forward a favorable recommendation to the County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the County Commissioners have received and reviewed the Plan Commission's report, have considered the Plan Commission's recommendations, and find that the adoption of the recommended amendment would promote the health, safety and convenience of the people of Hendricks County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Sections 9.6 and 10.6 of the Hendricks County Zoning Ordinance regarding maximum lot coverage to permitted accessory building in the R-1: Low Density, Single Family Residential District and the R-2: Medium Density, Single Family Residential District as follows:
 - 9.6 DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS

with

- C. Maximum Lot Coverage
 - 1. Principal building: 35%
 2. Accessory building: 3% or 600 sq. ft., whichever is greater
- 10.6 DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS C. Maximum Lot Coverage
 - 3% or 600 sq. ft., whichever is greater 1. Principal building: 35%
- 2. Accessory building: Section 3 This Ordinance shall be in full force and effective from and

after its passage and approval and publication according to law.

Minor Plat 390 - The Engineer recommended a release of the performance bond upon the receipt of a one year maintenance bond in the amount of \$1,000 and with the condition that the straw bales be removed from the swale. Minor Plat No. 379 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond

requirement be released.

Minor Plat No. 440 - The Engineer recommended the performance bond be released and since it would be under \$1,000 that the maintenance bond be waived. J. D. Clampitt moved per staff recommendation to approve all three requests as listed. Richard Myers seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF SUPERIOR COURT II REMODELING

Mr. Reeder reported that on the advice of counsel all bids received for the Superior Court II remodeling will be rejected and request for bids will be advertised for opening on October 27, 1992 at 1:00 P.M.

Commissioner Myers so moved and Commissioner Clampitt seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF JOINT MEETING WITH TOWN COUNCILS

IN THE MATTER OF SOUTH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The County Engineer discussed the contract with Schmidt Associates, Inc. regarding the remodeling of the South Elementary School.

Richard Myers moved to authorize the County Attorney and the County

Engineer to negotiate with Schmidt Associates, Inc. for this project. J. D.

Clampitt seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve claims numbered: 31300-31307 dated September 22, 1992 and 31400-31573 dated October 1, 1992.

The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF NATIONAL TRAINING SEMINAR

Gary Emsweller, Hendricks County Extension Agent, requested permission to attend a National Training Seminar to be held in Kansas City, Missouri on November 1 through the 6th. Mr. Emsweller is currently serving as President of our State organization.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve his request with the expenses to be funded from the Commissioners appropriation for attendance to state and national meetings. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF EQUIPMENT FOR THE EXTENSION DEPARTMENT

Mr. Emsweller also requested permission to purchase needed equipment for the Extension Department and he presented the following quotes:

The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF 4-H PROGRAM FOR INDIANA BOYS SCHOOL RESIDENTS

Mr. Emsweller informed the Commissioners of a recent program which was presented for the benefit of the residents of the Indiana Boys School related to 4-H. He reported that the program turned out to be a great success.

The Commissioners also agreed that it was a worthy project and complimented the Extension Department for their efforts.

IN THE MATTER OF "LEADERSHIP HENDRICKS COUNTY"

A new project entitled "Leadership Hendricks County" is designed to enhance the leadership skills of current leaders while preparing individuals for new positions of leadership for the future.

It is expected that this program will be available by 1993 and Mr. Emsweller commented that the Commissioners may want to become involved.

IN THE MATTER OF SOFTWARE PROGRAMS

John Parsons, Hendricks County Systems Administrator, informed the Commissioners that software programs are being brought in by employees for use on our computer equipment and there could be a great danger of a "virus" contaminating our system which could cause severe problems.

Following discussion on this matter the Commissioners authorized Mr. Parsons to give notification to all Departments and Offices that any software must be approved by John Parsons before being used in any of the county's equipment. The authorization was approved by Richard Myers, seconded by J. D. Clampitt and approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF NEW TELEPHONE LINE

Mr. Parsons explained the necessity of a new telephone line to be installed in the Computer Room to allow Kalamazoo, Michigan to access our modum relative to the Judicial Computer System. This will cost approximately \$11.85 per month.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve the installation of a new telephone line in the Computer Room to allow additional access for the Judicial Computer System. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF NEW TERMINALS IN AUDITOR'S OFFICE Maintenance will be cancelled on two terminals located in the Auditor's Office which was costing over \$1,000 for each and four new terminals will be installed at a cost for maintenance that will be less than it was for the previous two.

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IN THE MATTER OF RECYCLING ACCOUNT

The Commissioners instructed the Secretary to submit a letter requesting the County Council to transfer funds from (01-135-460) Special Contracts into a new line item for Recycling (01-135-399) in the amount of \$192.41.

IN THE MATTER OF VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER'S REPORT

The monthly report of Billie J. Holmes, Hendricks County Veterans Service Officer, was submitted to the Commissioners for their review.

This report will be on file in the Commissioners' office for future reference.

The meeting was recessed for lunch and resumed at 1:00 P.M. for further business.

IN THE MATTER OF ELECTION

Connie Lawson, Hendricks County Clerk, discussed Election matters with the Commissioners and informed them of the increase in new affidavits and the need for new voting machines.

J. D. Clampitt moved to allow Mrs. Lawson to purchase twenty new voting machines with the payment of same to be made after the first of January, 1993.

The motion was approved unanimously.

Mrs. Lawson also requested permission to spend equipment funds of \$20,000.00 from the Commissioners' budget. The Commissioners granted her request.

IN THE MATTER OF BIDS FOR UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK REMOVAL

Walter Reeder, County Engineer, reported that the staff had reviewed the bids for the removal of the underground storage tanks and recommended Petro Technology, Inc. at a cost of \$11,914.00 to remove the tanks.

Commissioner Myers moved and Commissioner Clampitt seconded a motion to approve per staff recommendation the bid of Petro Technology, Inc. in the amount of \$11,914.00 as the lowest most responsive and responsible bid received. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF REZONING HEARING

Mr. Larry Cranfill and Mr. Lee Comer, Attorney, appeared for the hearing on the rezoning ZA-28/WA92-06 for Cranfill Enterprises, Inc. from R-2 General and C-3 Office to R-3 High Density, Single Family Residential District.

This property is located in Washington Township on Dan Jones Road and U. S. 36 on the northwest corner. The Plan Commission gave the request a favorable recommendation. There were no objectors present.

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve this request per staff recommendation upon the recommendation of the Plan Commission Board. The motion was unanimously approved.

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Elvin Ray Cassity, Marion Township Trustee, and Judy White, representing the Center Township Trustee, appeared to request that the Commissioners grant them loans to fund their Poor Relief requests.

Center Township requested \$30,000.00 and Marion Township requested \$6,000.00. The payback will be from their 1994 budget according to Mary Jane Russell, Hendricks County Auditor.

He requested permission to install a plaque to be placed where the time capsule is buried. The Jaycees will provide funding.

Mr. Disney thanked Mr. Dever for the many efforts expended in this job well done. Mr. Devers request was granted by unanimous consent.

IN THE MATTER OF SWAP AND SHOP DAYS

A request for use of the restrooms in the Courthouse during Swap and Shop Days, October 10th and 11th, was requested by Mr. Devers and granted with instructions to contact Mr. Cassity, Courthouse Superintendent, relative to this request.

IN THE MATTER OF INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

Gregory Steuerwald, County Attorney, reviewed the agreement of Interlocal Cooperation for Hendricks County and the West Central Indiana Solid Waste District. This agreement allows the District to use Hendricks County's health program and P.E.R.F. (retirement) program for their personnel.

Following discussion J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve this agreement subject to the confirmation that Hendricks County will have no liability relative to prior service commitments and that the District reimburse Hendricks County for any expense incurred. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF MINUTES

J. D. Clampitt moved and Richard Myers seconded a motion to approve the minutes for September 21, 1992. The motion was approved unanimously.

There being no further business presented the meeting recessed at 2:38 P.M.

President Disney called the meeting to order at 9:35 A.M. The pledge was given and Commissioner Myers led the Board in prayer.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Walter Reeder, County Engineer, stated that he would be presenting information for Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor. Mr. Reeder said that Mr. Lawson mentioned that the Commissioners want to contract the work at County Road 800 E (Dan Jones Road) and U. S. 36 since the job will require special help in traffic control and the county should not be exposed to this liability.

The Board directed Mr. Reeder to contact Groninger's about doing this work since they have the asphalt contract.

IN THE MATTER OF LOAD LIMITS IN PLAINFIELD

Mr. Reeder said the Plainfield Town Board is meeting October 12, 1992 to discuss the problem created by reducing the load limit on some of their streets.

IN THE MATTER OF SNOW REMOVAL CONTRACTORS

Mr. Reeder stated that the contractors used last year for snow removal (Maxwell, Morely and Wood) received a \$1,000 retainer for liability insurance plus \$60 per hour. He asked if the Board wanted to go with the same arrangements for this year.

The Board directed the Highway Department to offer these same contractors the same \$1,000 retainer plus \$60 per hour for 1992-1993.

IN THE MATTER OF LOAD LIMITS ON SUBDIVISION STREETS

Mr. Reeder said he is asking, on behalf of Mr. Lawson, that a seven ton limit be placed on subdivision streets to keep semi-trucks from parking on these streets. Subdivision streets were not designed to withstand this weight and are being torn up by residents parking their semis on the streets.

Mr. Clampitt and Mr. Disney directed Mr. Steuerwald to prepare a proposed ordinance to correct the problem to be reviewed at their next meeting.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

Mr. Reeder presented a cut permit request from Excavating Plus, Inc. on County Road 900 N (Pine Creek Village). He stated that it was a condition of approval for the development of Pine Creek Village and the staff recommends approval.

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Mr. Myers made a motion to approve this request with the standard requirement. Mr. Clampitt seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT Mr. Reeder presented cut permits from Indiana Gas located on County Road 625 East and in Timber Bend Subdivision; along North Washington Street, County Road 151 North and Northridge Drive; and on County Road 200 North. Mr. Reeder said staff has reviewed these plans and recommends approval.

Mr. Clampitt made a motion to approve these requests with the standard requirements. Mr. Myers seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

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IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISION

Mr. Reeder asked the Commissioners to release the performance bond and waive the maintenance bond requirement for Minor Plat No. 313 located on the west side of County Road 475 East, just south of County Road 150 North. The work has been done on the project and it has been seeded, but the grass has not come up yet.

Mr. Clampitt made a motion to grant this request. Mr. Myers seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF SCHMIDT ASSOCIATES, INC.

A contract from Schmidt Associates, Inc. to start working on South Elementary School was presented by the County Engineer. Schmidt Associates, Inc. have stipulated that they will not automatically raise their price due to change orders, but will only raise them if the amount of work increases.

The Board executed the contract that was agreed upon at a previous meeting.

Mr. Steuerwald said that he would look into an addendum that would cover the change orders.

IN THE MATTER OF ADA EVALUATION OF COUNTY BUILDINGS

The County Engineer updated the Board of Commissioners on the ADA evaluation of County Buildings by reporting that the study has been done and documentation should be sent to the Board soon.

IN THE MATTER OF COURTHOUSE ANNEX DOORS

It was reported by the County Engineer that the Courthouse Annex doors on the east and west ends of the building are rusted through, do not latch properly and need to be replaced. Mr. Reeder presented an estimated cost to replace these doors and their frames for \$1,590.00.

The Board directed Mr. Reeder to hold off on this door replacement until Commissioner Myers has investigated some alternatives.

IN THE MATTER OF EMPLOYEE INSURANCE

The County Attorney said he could prepare an Ordinance for the Board's review if Sheriff Underwood will get him a copy of one from another county.

Sheriff Underwood said he would do this.

IN THE MATTER OF SHERIFF'S CARS

Sheriff Underwood discussed trading in the unmarked 1992 Sheriff cars for 1993 models at no additional expense.

Sheriff Underwood also stated that he would like to look into the rental of unmarked cars to use for undercover work. National Car Rental has a contract with Marion County and he wants to see if this would be economically feasible for Hendricks County. The Commissioners expressed their appreciation to Judge Boles for preparing this Proclamation.

IN THE MATTER OF WEST CENTRAL INDIANA SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT COORDINATOR

Deanna English, Hendricks County Environmental Health Director, introduced Cassandra Stockcamp to the Board of Commissioners. She stated that Cassie will be serving as the District Coordinator for the West Central Indiana Solid Waste Management District. Ms. Stockcamp will be working out of the Health Department until her office in the Battershell building is ready for occupancy.

Ms. Stockcamp stated that she is looking forward to working with the District and is available at any time to discuss questions or problems regarding solid waste that anyone might have.

Discussion was held regarding the disposal of tires based upon Mr. Summers' comment that the Highway Department picked up 67 more this last weekend that had been dumped along a county road on the east side of Washington Township.

The Board directed Mr. Steuerwald to prepare an ordinance regulating the host fee that Hendricks County will be receiving from the District. The Board felt that the cost for disposal of tires, etc. should be taken from the host fee moneys. Also to be paid for with this fee will be landfill testing and various recycling efforts.

IN THE MATTER OF CHEMICALS BEHIND HIGHWAY GARAGE

Mrs. English stated that she has quotes from two companies on testing the chemicals stored behind the Highway Garage. Mrs. English recommended having these chemicals tested and ultimately disposed of by Environmental Enterprises, Inc. due to the fact that the quote from Superior Solvents states that if they receive anything varying from the samples they took, there will be an additional charge or the material may be sent back.

Mr. Clampitt made a motion to contract with Environmental Enterprises, Inc. to test the material and for it to be properly disposed.

Mr. Myers seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMIT

The County Engineer presented a letter from Indiana Gas Comapny, Inc. requesting permission to install 167 feet of two inch plastic main along Marstella Lane north of Brownsburg. This main extension will provide gas

service to one new customer at 2606 Marstella Lane. The County Surveyor's maps indicate no legal drains are present in the area of construction.

Said Indiana Gas Company, Inc., covenants and agrees to construct said pipe line in an orderly and workmanlike manner, to replace all grade levels, drains, pavements or structures to as good a condition as when work was commenced, and to replace with comparable material and workmanship all roadways, pavements, or structures damaged by the construction of the contemplated project; all to the satisfaction and under the supervision of said Board of Commissioners or their designated representative.

Mr. Disney made a motion to approve this request per staff's recommendation and subject to permittee backfilling all excavation per the specifications and supervision of the Hendricks County Engineer. This installation must be maintained by Indiana Gas Company, Inc. for a period of at least three years. Also, the road must be bored under - not cut.

Richard Myers seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISION

Cambridge Square West, Section 2, Phase 1 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be reduced to \$20,000.00

Commissioner Myers moved to approve the request per staff recommendation and Commissioner Disney seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

Mr. Reeder presented a traffic study done by the Engineering Department of County Road 650 South, between County Road 200 West and County Road 350 West. Staff is recommending that a 45 mile per hour speed limit be posted at both ends of the curve; a Large Arrow sign be installed for the reverse turn in the eastbound lane accompanied by Reverse Turn Warning signs with 25 mile per hour advisory placards installed for each approach; the Large Arrow sign facing the westbound lane be replaced; and that the one damaged of the four delineators be replaced. Mr. Clampitt made a motion to accept the traffic study and to approve

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Mr. Myers seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

Mr. Reeder presented a completed traffic study of Oak Bend Estates done in answer to complaints regarding excessive speeds within the subdivision. Staff recommends posting of 25 mile per hour speed limit signs at each entrance into Oak Bend Estates since this is an urban area.

Mr. Myers made a motion to accept the traffic study and to approve the Highway Department's implementation of the recommendations.

Mr. Clampitt seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

Mr. Reeder presented a traffic study done of Cartersburg Road in the vicinity of Cartersburg. Staff recommends that the signage be modified per plans attached to the report; that the Board consider reconstruction of the Martin Road/Cartersburg Road intersection; that "buzz" strips be placed on each approach of Cartersburg Road; that plowable reflective centerline markers be placed on the three curves; that, since these projects are new to the County, it is recommended that a follow-up study be done to determine effective-ness; and that neither a flashing light or crosswalk be installed since those devices are for high pedestrian traffic only. Mr. Reeder stated that the cost for these projects would be \$1,400 for the buzz strips and \$1,200 for the centerline markers to be placed every twenty feet.

Mr. Clampitt made a motion to accept the traffic study and to approve the Highway Department's implementation of the recommendations.

Mr. Myers seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF CIRCUIT COURT COMPUTER EQUIPMENT

Systems Administrator, John Parsons, stated that he has been talking to Circuit Court regarding the purchase of equipment compatible to their present system.

Mr. Clampitt said he had directed them to get with Mr. Parsons on what equipment should be purchased and to have him come to this Board with a recommendation.

Mr. Parsons stated that he would come back next week.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGH SCHOOL GOVERNMENT CLASS

Personnel Director, Susan Fair, presented a request from Mr. Harmon at the Danville Community High School to have students from his honors government class observe offices within the Courthouse to expose them to county government day-to-day operations. This program would begin the second week of January through the middle of May.

The Board agreed to this program with the understanding that, if other schools request a program such as this, schedules will have to be adjusted and with the request that each student fill out an employment application.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BIDS

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, asked that a date be set to accept bids for highway supplies.

The Commissioners scheduled receiving bids for highway supplies on December 7, 1992 at 10:00 A.M.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS Mr. Lawson, Highway Department Supervisor, stated that the Highway Department should consider trading for a new travel dirt loader. They currently have \$80,000 budgeted for equipment that they can carry over into the 1993 budget if an obligation is made to purchase this loader prior to the end of 1992.

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The Commissioners scheduled receiving bids for this travel loader on December 14, 1992 at 1:00 P.M.

IN THE MATTER OF CUT PERMITS

Five letters were presented from the Indiana Gas Company, Inc. requesting permission to construct, maintain and/or remove pipeline along or across county highways.

The first request proposes to install 1200 feet of two inch plastic natural gas line along the west side of County Road 600 East south of the Indiana Youth Center in Plainfield. The line will be approximately three feet west of the west line of the pavement and our trench will be eight inches wide and thirty-six inches deep. This line will improve service to the area.

Note: There are no legal drains in this area per the County Surveyor's Office.

The second request proposes to bore under County Road 1000 North just east of I-74 east of Brownsburg to feed a new regulator station being installed to improve service to this area. The line will be forty-eight inches under the road surface.

Note: There are no legal drains in this area per the County Surveyor's Office.

The third request proposes to install 1600 feet of four inch plastic gas main along the south side of County Road 600 North and 2000 feet of two inch plastic gas main along Raceway Road east of Brownsburg. The new mains will be approximately three feet off the road surface and the trench will be eight inches wide and thirty-six inches deep. The line will serve new customers in this area.

Note: No legal drains in this area per the County Surveyor's Office.

The fourth request proposes to install 1,600 feet of six inch plastic pipe along the south side of County Road 100 South west of County Road 1050 East of Avon. This line will serve the new Ashford Estates subdivision and we will install 1500 feet of two inch plastic pipe inside the Subdivision as noted.

Note: The legal drains in this area have been noted on maps attached. The fifth request proposes to install approximately 1650 feet of six inch plastic natural gas main along the north side of County Road 300 South on the north side of Plainfield. Part of this main will lay on a private easement and the portion on County Road right-of-way is noted on the drawing attached. This line will serve existing homes on County Road 300 South in this area.

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Note: No legal drains in this area per the County Surveyor's Office.

For all five requests Said Indiana Gas Company, Inc., covenants and agrees to construct said pipe line in an orderly and workmanlike manner, to replace all grade levels, drains, pavements or structures to as good a condition as when work was commenced, and to replace with comparable material and workmanship all roadways, pavements, or structures damaged by the construction of the contemplated project; all to the satisfaction and under the supervision of said Board of Commissioners or their designated representative.

Mr. Myers made a motion to approve these cut permits with the requirement that they comply with the Engineer's specifications and usual maintenance requirements. Mr. Clampitt seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISIONS

Minor Plat No. 419 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released and since it would be under \$1,000 that the maintenance bond requirement be waived.

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, gave an update on the road work being done in the County by the Highway Department.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

Walter Reeder, County Engineer, reported on a traffic study on County Road 200 North (21st Street) and County Road 1050 East done as a result of high accident frequency in this vicinity.

Two of the accidents involved contact with the barrier rail on the bridge structure. 21st Street is posted at 35 miles per hour speed limit and is near the Lake of the Lanterns trailer park and the hill preceding the intersection with County Road 1050 East.

As drivers exceed the speed limit the sight distance becomes more inadequate. As an ultimate solution, it is recommended that consideration be given to improving the vertical alignment of County Road 200 North. The most desirable way to improve the grade would be to lower the road a minimal amount at the crest

of the hill and to elevate the road in the area between the existing hill crest and the bridge.

It is recommended that for now, guard rail should be placed along the bridge and a sign should be erected saying "Slippery When Wet" and another sign be erected depicting Double Arrows.

Commissioner Clampitt moved and Commissioner Myers seconded a motion to approve staff recommendation for the correction of these problems revealed as a result of a traffic study. The motion was approved unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF TRAFFIC STUDY

A traffic study was also performed on County Road 700 North and County Road 1000 East as a result of complaints regarding the poor sight distance at the intersection. There have been three accidents in the last five years at this location.

The road surfaces and geometry are good but there is a conflict of speed limit signs on County Road 700 North and no speed limit signs on County Road 1000 East.

It is recommended that 40 mile per hour speed limit signs be erected on County Road 1000 East and that 40 mile per hour speed limit signs be posted where there are now 50 mile per hour signs on County Road 700 North.

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve the staff recommendation for this traffic study. The motion was unanimously approved.

IN THE MATTER OF FURNITURE FOR TREASURER'S OFFICE

This installation must be maintained by Indiana Gas for a period of at least three years. The road must be bored under - not cut.

A traffic study was completed on O Road, through Hazelwood.

Results of the study confirmed that there was a problem of speeding in the Hazelwood area and it is recommended that signage be adjusted to 35 miles per hour. It is also recommended that the Sheriff's Department be advised of this problem.

There is a reverse turn north of Hazelwood and just south of U. S. 40 on County Road O which should also be considered as part of this study.

The Safe Curve Speed Indicator showed a safe speed of about 25 miles per hour for both approaches. Therefore, the existing Reverse Curve Warning signs should be replaced with Reverse Turn Warning signs. It is recommended that 25 mile per hour advisory placards be installed on them. It is also recommended that Large Arrow signs be installed for each approach.

Discussion was held regarding the annual check on drivers using a CDL license. It was agreed that this should be a follow up for all participants.

IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY HOME APPLICATIONS

Darlene Truesdale, County Home Superintendent, presented two new applications for the County Home. Charles Allan Morrow from Center Township and Mary Gertrude Smith from Guilford Township.

Commissioner Myers moved and Commissioner Clampitt seconded a motion to approve both applications and signed the applications.

Ms. Truesdale discussed the rate increase for the ARCH program and the Commissioners advised her to contact the David M. Griffith Associates for assistance. Should it be necessary then she should contact Debbie Haines for additional help.

IN THE MATTER OF VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER'S REPORT

The monthly report of Billie J. Holmes, Hendricks County Veterans Service Officer, was presented, reviewed and will be filed in the Commissioners' office for future reference.

IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS

Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve claims with warrant numbers as follows: 17158-17474 dated February 19, 1993; 17475-17511 dated February 19, 1993 and 118579-118593 dated February 19, 1993.

The motion was approved unanimously.

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IN THE MATTER OF CHANGE OF VENUE CLAIMS

The Commissioners noted that there is a need for an additional appropriation of \$10,000 for the Change of Venue claims which have been presented to the Commissioners office for payment. No funds were allowed by the County Council at budget time.

IN THE MATTER OF ABANDONED RAILROAD

Gregory Steuerwald, County Attorney, presented an update on the CSX Railroad relative to the removal of six bridges and that six bridges would remain. Also the masonry arch will remain.

IN THE MATTER OF APPRAISAL

Mr. Steuerwald presented two appraisals on the property owned by Mr. Lee Comer in which the county has an interest.

Don Wright appraised the property at \$36,000 and P. T. Hardin appraised the property at \$29,212.50. This information will be made available to the County Council and Mr. Steuerwald will contact the owner of the property.

IN THE MATTER OF JAIL BOND RENEWAL

The County Attorney presented a letter from Barnes & Thornburg relative to the refunding of certificates of Participation for the Jail Bond. Richard Myers moved and J. D. Clampitt seconded a motion to approve the execution of this letter of request.

IN THE MATTER OF LEGISLATIVE MATTERS

A letter was also presented by Mr. Steuerwald from Barnes and Thornburg with respect to monitoring legislative proposals that might affect the County. The Commissioners executed this document.

IN THE MATTER OF ZONING AMENDMENTS

Mr. Jarzen requested a hearing date and time for five zoning amendments. The date of March 15, 1993 and the time of 2:30 P.M. was chosen for these hearings.

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IN THE MATTER OF E 9-1-1 NUMBERING SYSTEM

Mr. Jarzen distributed information regarding the numbering system for the E 9-1-1 which shows what areas have been completed and which ones are still being processed.

The meeting recessed for lunch and resumed order at 1:00 P.M. for further business.

IN THE MATTER OF DISCUSSION ON SMOKING IN COUNTY BUILDINGS

Gregory Steuerwald, County Attorney, addressed the Commissioners relative to the statute which he has reviewed concerning the smoking in county buildings.

Mr. Steuerwald reported that the county is not abiding by the intent of the law as he reviewed it and said that there were only two alternatives in his opinion. The Commissioners can either totally ban smoking in all county buildings and vehicles or they can choose to provide specific smoking areas with proper ventilation and total separation for smokers.

The Commissioners requested that the County Engineer investigate all areas to see whether or not separation with ventilation for smokers is feasible. The date of April 5, 1993 at 1:00 P.M. the decision will be made by the Commissioners on this matter.

IN THE MATTER OF MODERN VENDING, INC.

Kevin Vanarsdale representing Modern Vending, Inc. informed the Commissioners of the services which his company is able to provide. Following discussion he presented a contract to the County Attorney for review. Commissioner Myers moved and Commissioner Clampitt seconded a motion to accept this proposal subject to the County Attorney's approval of the written contract. The motion was approved unanimously.

The price of 50¢ per can and 5% commission was agreed upon if the contract is accepted.

IN THE MATTER OF E 9-1-1 SYSTEM

Mr. Jerry Larrison from Indiana Bell, Bob Jarzen, Plan Commission Administrator, and Tom Underwood, County Sheriff, were present for the presentation of the update on the E 9-1-1 numbering system.

It will possibly be two more months before the addressing is completed.

The cut over hopefully will be by the third quarter of this current year. Mr. Larrison suggested 65¢ to 70¢ as a surcharge for the first quarter

but said that the County Council will actually set the surcharge.

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The Commissioners thanked him for his report and strongly urged expediency in completing this project.

IN THE MATTER OF RADIO SCHOOL

Jay Wright appeared to request permission to hold a ten week school session for amateur radio operators using the Commissioners' Room for two hours one evening a week for ten weeks.

The Commissioners suggested that he check with the Emergency Management Department for space in their area with the Commissioners room as a second choice.

IN THE MATTER OF BROWN TOWNSHIP PROTECTION

Joyce McClain, Brown Township Trustee, and Loraine Turpin, a member of the Advisory Board, appeared to discuss more protection for the Brown Township area. Sheriff Underwood explained the manner in which he dispatches his deputies over the county and it is obvious that there is not sufficient coverage nor funds to provide it.

Sheriff Underwood will assist Ms. McClain and others from Brown Township in setting up "Crime Watch" with the first meeting to be March 15, 1993 when both Sheriff Underwood and Deputy Williams will assist at a meeting to be held at the Cornerstone Church in Brownsburg.

IN THE MATTER OF BEEPERS

Deanna English, Environmental Health Director, requested an additional beeper for Lucy Neal in her Department. She was assigned the number 539-3913.

IN THE MATTER OF PLAT BOOK COPIES

Walter Reeder, Hendricks County Engineer, reported a request from Transamerica Flood Hazard Certification Company in New Jersey for a complete set of Hendricks County maps to be used as overlays onto Federal Flood Maps. They are willing to pay approximately \$1,415 for the copies and requested a reply to their request.

Discussion followed and the Commissioners agreed to allow the County

IN THE MATTER OF HIGHWAY BUSINESS

Russell Lawson, Hendricks County Road Supervisor, informed the Commissioners that the Highway Department has been cutting bushes along County Road 825 E and County Road 700 S and caring for the equipment used so much during our heavy snows. The Commissioners complimented the Highway Department for their extra efforts during the recent snow storms.

IN THE MATTER OF APPRECIATION

Commissioner Disney requested that the Commissioners go on record extending their appreciation to the Town of Danville and their employees for cleaning the snow from around the Courthouse.

IN THE MATTER OF SUBDIVISIONS

Minor Plat No. 466 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be released and since it would be under \$1,000, that the maintenance bond requirement be waived.

Tattersall Manor, Section 4 - The Engineer recommended that the performance bond be reduced to an amount of \$40,000.00.
