An Ordinance levying Taxes for the purpose of raising revenues for the County Fund, County Free Gravel Road Fund, and Bridge Fund of the Treasury of Hendricks County,

State of Indiana, Hendricks County,

Dec (1) Be it ordained by the Hendricks County Council of Indiana, That there shall be in the year 1899, assessed ^{and} collected the sum of Twenty-eight ²⁸/₁₀₀ (28%) cents upon each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property, and one hundred cents upon each taxable Poll in the County, which money when

collected shall be paid into the "County Fund" of the County Treasury.

Sec (2) That there shall be in the year 1899, assessed and collected the sum of Four ^{qu}/₂ (4¹/₂) cents upon each one hundred dollar's worth of taxable property in the County, which money when paid into the County Treasury shall be known as "County Free Gravel Road Fund," said fund shall be used for County Free Gravel Road purposes.

Sec (3) That there shall be in the year 1899, assessed and collected the sum of Seven ^{qu}/₂ (7¹/₂) cents upon each one hundred dollar's worth of taxable property in the County, which money when paid into the County Treasury shall be known as "Bridge Fund" and shall be used for Bridge purposes.
