## INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS

## On Proposed Amendments to the Constitution OF THE STATE OF INDIANA

#### SUBMISSION OF AMENDMENTS

All amendments to the Constitution of the State of Indiana proposed by the Eighty-sixth General Assembly of the State of Indiana and agreed to by this, the Eighty-seventh General Assembly of the State of Indiana, shall be submitted to the electors of the state in the manner provided for the submission of constitutional amendments by Chapter 208 of the Acts of the Eighty-fourth General Assembly of the State of Indiana, being an act entitled, "An Act concerning elections; providing penalties for the violation thereof, and repealing all conflicting laws," approved March 6, 1945, as amended. Acts 1951, Ch. 92.

#### CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

#### TREASURER, CORONER AND SURVEYOR — TERM OF OFFICE

Section 2 of Article 6 of the Constitution of the State of Indiana is amended to read as follows: Sec. 2. There shall be elected, in each county by the voters thereof, at the time of holding general elections, a Clerk of the Circuit Court, Auditor, Recorder, Treasurer, Sheriff, Coroner, and Surveyor. The Clerk, Auditor, Recorder, Treasurer, Coroner and Surveyor shall continue in office four years; and no person shall be eligible to the office of Clerk, Auditor, Recorder, Treasurer, or Coroner more than eight years in any period of twelve years: Provided, That the Treasurer of each county re-elected at the general election in 1952 shall continue in office until January 1, 1957 and shall not be eligible for re-election to the office of County Treasurer at the general election in 1956. Acts 1951, Ch. 337.

#### PROSECUTING ATTORNEY — TERM OF OFFICE

That section 11 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Indiana be amended to read as follows: Sec. 11. There shall be elected in each judicial circuit by the voters thereof a prosecuting attorney, who shall hold his office for four years, and whose term of office shall begin on the first day of January next succeeding his election. The election of prosecuting attorneys under this section shall be held at the time of holding the general election in the year 1954 and each four years thereafter: Provided, That any such officer whose term is abridged by virtue of this section shall continue to serve until January 1, 1959. Acts 1951, Ch. 343.

The above Constitutional Amendments, one providing that the terms of the offices of Treasurer, Coroner and Surveyor shall be for a period of four years, and one providing that the term of Prosecuting Attorney shall be for a period of four years, are printed on the state ballot, as shown below, where a brief statement of each is printed with the words "Yes" and "No" within their appropriate squares so that the elector may indicate by "X" mark whether he or she is for or against each Amendment by making a cross (X) within the squares designated by such words.
