The Clerk was authorized to place the names of the candidates on the ballots and also to buy any supplies which might be needed to carry out the work connected with the election.

By consent of all members Alfred McClain was re-appointed mechanic for the voting machines and Robert Parker was re-appointed as his assistant. The Clerk was authorized to talk to Mr. McClain and reach a decision concerning the salary to be paid to him and his assistant.

The Clerk was authorized to approve and mail out applications for Absentee Ballots as soon as the requests are made. It was estimated that two hundred and fifty Absentee Ballots be ordered.

Motion was made by John Edwards and seconded by Joe Stevenson that the Clerk contact the Secretary of State and inquire about the laws concerning the placing of names on the ballot in the case of unopposed Candidates for Office.

Motion was made by Joe Stevenson and seconded by Claude Hughes, Clerk that the allotment for meals for the Precinct Election Boards be raised to \$1.25. All other salaries to stay the same as they were for the Election year of 1956. It was agreed that Assistant Clerks be used in all precincts.

It was agreed that we order 600 Republican Sample Ballots and 600 Democrat Sample Ballots.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time the meeting was adjourned.
