Following this statement and a full discussion of the Board, the Board unanimously voted to issue a letter of reprimand to Mr. Morris, to issue a press release along lines set out in Mr. Lind's statement, to notify M. Dale Palmer special attorney for election Board in this matter and Prosecuting Attorney of Hendricks County, that the Board is now closing its files on the matter. The Board thanked Mr. Lind for his co-operation and meeting adjourned.

Mr. Lind made a full disclosure to the Board and stated that his client was willing to assume full responsibility in the matter and further stated that he did not know at the time, and did not have any intention, and did not realize that he was violating any of the laws of the State of Indiana or any of the election regulations concerning a matter of this kind. The Board then determined that it would be to the best interest of all concerned to accept Mr. Lind's statement, to issue a reprimand on behalf of the Board to Mr. George Morris, and to call off the scheduled hearing to investigate the matter on Tuesday, May 28, 1963, at 10:00 a.m. So far as the County Election Board is concerned, as Mr. Morris has admitted his part and responsibility in this matter, the Board will take no further action in the matter.

Instruction machines 129460 (Center 2) and 8832 (Center 3) were reset, inspected and sealed after this meeting and the Board adjourned at 12 noon.




All members of the Hendricks County Election Board met, along with the two voting machine custodians, in the Clerks office at 5 AM, E.S.T.

A rash of minor voting machines mal-functioning was reported by some eight (8) precincts from opening of polls at 6 AM through about 6:30 AM., it was evident from many of these trouble calls that the precinct boards were not thoroughly familiar with machine operation as the majority had failed to set the party lever correctly. However no machine failure necessitated issuance of paper ballots and from mid morning on voting ran very smoothly. All calls were handled by the Board and the custodians.

A total of 417 absent ballots were delivered by the Board prior to 6:00 P.M.

At 7 P.M. the Election Board became the canvassing board and remained in session with assistant boards composed of Messers Richard Hoban and Scott Hosier Jr., along with Mesdames Lucille Pedigo and Mary Frances Ashley until 12:30 AM Wednesday 8 May 1968. As all precincts had been received and compiled the Board adjourned and dismissed the assistant canvassers.

This subject machine was prepared in late April and set aside as a standby machine but was eventually used in Lincoln Precinct 7 as a second machine due to the anticipated heavy vote there.

The Hendricks County League of Women Voters have requested that a machine be made available to them for instructional and educational purposes in conjunction with the Lincoln Township Home show scheduled to get under way this week end.

This request has been duly made of both the Hendricks County Election board and Board of County Commissioners, and the use of a machine has been approved by the former Board.

Since machine number 63031 must undergo extensive teardown in order to prepare it for the November 1968 General Election the Hendricks County Election Board in compliance with Burns 29-5113 hereby petitions the Superior Court to allow the keys to machine to be released to the custodian so that he may:

A. Prepare the machine for demonstrational purposes per the request of the League of Women Voters.
