The Board met at 8:15 A.M. in the Clerk's office with all members present. The Hendricks County Auditor was also present and read to the Board from Commissioners Record Book 23, page 222. This record for May 3, 1926 showed that the Commissioners of Hendricks County had created the office of Justice of Peace for Middle Township by appointing James Koontz as Judge. Further checking revealed that Willis K. Schenk had served in this capacity in the late 1940's and although the office had become vacant at his death the Commissioners had evidently never declared the office vacated.

By virtue of the Auditor's testimony this Board then voted unanimously to include the name of Donald L.

McKee as candidate for Justice of Peace, Middle Township, on the Democrat Party machine ballot.

The Secretary was instructed to request Mr. McKee to allow the Board to not reprint Township ballots which have been previously printed with out his name.

The Brownsburg Town Board Referandum that had been presented during the September 16th meeting, was then discussed and by unanimous vote was deemed acceptable and further ordered to be placed on the Lincoln Township voting machines. However the Secretary was ordered to notify the Brownsburg Town Board that they would be held responsible to draft an affidavit to qualify each elector wishing to vote for the said referendum. This affidavit was also to be flexible enough to fit the requirements of absent voter balloting. Additionally the Town Board was also instructed to print the referendum ballots to be used by the Clerk in all absent ballot voting.

Lastly the Secretary and machine custodian were instructed to enter this referendum on the Lincoln machines (precincts 1 thru 6) so that it could be locked out for Lincoln Township electors presently themselves who are not town residents or who would not subscribe to the affidavit previously set out above.

The Town Board of Brownsburg will submit the affidavit and ballot forms to this Board, for its ruling as to form before it is used in conjunction with this forth coming General Election.

- WARD V All of Town South of Stafford Road (Contains all of Guilford 6 and part of Guilford 4).

By unanimous vote the Secretary was to accomplish the following:

- A. Request a letter from Town of Plainfield outlining how they intended payment of election costs incurred by County for the 1971 Primary and Town General Election.
- B. Endeavor to find a Printer in Plainfield, to print ballots, machine front, and legal advertising and order 100 absent ballots as soon as possible.

The Board was given a petition containing forty (40) names filed with Clerk of Circuit Court on March 15, 1971 from Dennis L. Hope, Box 42, North Salem, Indiana.

Said petition requested that this Board conduct a Town Election in North Salem for Town Trustees and Clerk Treasurer.

It was found that Burns 29-4401a applied to this situation. Upon checking further with the/Town
Clerk it was determined that no prior request or petition had been filed there for an election. Therefore

Secondly, even if these individuals whose names appear on both pieces of paper, are registered voters and residents of the Town of North Salem, and while the title above their signatures is "Petition for Election of Town Trustees and Town Clerk-Treasurer for North Salem, Indiana", the paper does not actually petition any individual/or individuals or any body politic of any relief.

For the foregoing reasons, we question that these pieces of paper are in fact a petition for anything.

If an election for town offices is to be held in North Salem, then any such election would probably have to be held by the Hendricks County Board of Election Commissioners for the reason that the Town of North Salem has no election board to carry out the duties and responsibilities of holding the election as called for by Burns Ind. Statutes 29-4401. As we understand the law, that section states that town election boards shall perform all duties in providing and preparing polling places that are required of county election boards and town election boards are to provide the necessary stamps, ink pads, printed ballots, county election boards and town election boards are to provide the necessary stamps, ink pads, printed ballots, county election boards and town election boards are to provide the necessary election board, it would not be easier for the Town to handle such election than for the County to do so.

While the Town Board stands ready to assist the County Election Board and to comply as best it can with its limited obligations under the law, the Town does not now have any appropriations for funds nor any moneys budgeted for elections.

We again hasten to add that we will be happy to do whatever we can to assist the County in holding such election even though Town Trustees have no duty whatsoever in regard to calling an election at the expiration of their term. We understand that this is the case based upon opinion of the Attorney General for the State of Indiana in Opinion No. 51 of the year 1953.

- C. Gambold requests, by motion, that the Clerk be directed to print 50 sample ballots per precinct and 1000 official absent voters ballots. Seconded by Keck.
- D. Falls moves that election supplies and printing be purchased from Burford and The Republican. Seconded by Keck.
- E. A motion was made by Falls that all absent voters ballots, that are not in the hands of the Circuit Court Clerk by 8:00 A.M. on election day, be considered as too late to be carried to the precinct inspectors to be counted for that particular election. Seconded by Gambold.
- F. Considerable discussion was had among the members of the Board concerning apportionment of the 27 Republican and 16 Democrat Delegates to the State Convention. Previously, in general, each township had been given one delegate regardless of their turnout or total vote. Mr. Keck pointed out that since this division would allow a considerable disparity to exist in the apportionment of the Democrat Delegates (Burns 29-3004 and 3605) resulting in a possible lawsuit against this Board, he felt action should be delayed and studied. This statement, considered as a motion, was adopted.

Gambold then made a motion that the voters of the county be apprised of this possible change and Monday, February 14, 1972 that a meeting be called of this Board at 9:30 A.M./in the Assembly Room of the Court House for any person to express himself so that the members of this Board will be better advised to their wants. Seconded by Falls.

No other business coming before the Board it dismissed at 10:30 A.M.

Gambold, Jr. is already properly on the Republican Primary Ballot and has never been removed. It is further my opinion that John J. Gambold is eligible to run for the office of Clerk of Hendricks County Circuit Court in view of the fact that the voters will be given an opportunity in the fall election to determine if the said office can be held for more than eight (8) years.

Upon arrival in Plainfield and its environs this portion of the Board did find that these cards were being passed out at various polls by unknown individuals. The Board asked them to discontinue this practice and notify the person for whom they were working to desist the practice and destroy the remaining supply. (2) When and in the event two (2) Candidates run for board member from the same township the ELECTED member receiving the lowest total number of votes shall take office on July 1 of the year following the primary election year."
