The Hendricks County Election Board met in the Clerk's Office at 5:00 A.M. EST according to Law. All members were present along with Messers. Greenlee, Norton and Smith. No count was reported by the prevoting check and only one machine trouble call was received! Marion Township was pinned so that a scratch vote was impossible for Trustee advisory board. This situation was corrected about 10:00 A.M.

A total of 27,221 voters were registered and entitled to vote at the election.

At 2:30 P.M. the Board dispersed to all precincts to deliver 524 Absent Ballots. Approximately 172 of these had been mailed while, 185 had appeared and voted in the Clerk's Office between the 5th and 31st of October. Fifty three (53) ballots had been mailed that were not returned in time to be distributed to the polls. (The last mail was met at 2:00 P.M. and all ballots that would be received by the Clerk after this point in time were ruled too late to be counted by the Election Board.)

At 6:00 P.M. the Election Board became the Canvassing Board. The first precinct to turn in was Center 1 (which was not in order) at 6:25 P.M. The last was Brown Township at 11:30 P.M. This Board, assisted by Messers. Scott Hosier Jr. and Richard Hoban along with Mesdames Edna Keeney and Sue Wood, finished canvassing and totaling the vote at 2:35 A.M. Wednesday, November 4, at which time they disbanded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent of the Indiana State Police Department, pursuant to the provisions of the Acts of 1945, Ch. 344, Sec. 10, and the Acts of 1945, Ch. 208, Sec. 11, is hereby requested to cooperate with this Board in the administration of the election laws and supervision of the procedures and actions of the Clerks of the Circuit Courts of all Counties of the State of Indiana, in the exercise of their powers and duties as such and ex officio as members and officers of the County Election Board, County Canvassing Board and Registration Officer of said counties, in respect to the general election held November 3, 1970, and particularly in respect to and limited to assigning sufficient police personnel immediately to make secure and provide continuing security of all absentee ballots, all voters' poll lists and all voting machines signed and/or used by the voters in said election in said counties, under the custody by the said respective Clerks, and said State Police personnel are authorized to place seals, in addition to all the seals provided by law, on each and all said machines."



The Ward Map of the Town of Plainfield was viewed and discussed. There are presently seven (7) voting precincts located wholly within the Town boundaries and five (5) Wards have been constructed, by the Plainfield Town Board, to maintain their five member board composition.

In general the Ward boundaries are as follows (town boundaries are understood):

- WARD I: Beginning at ^{North} Town boundary south on Avon Avenue to U.S. 40, east to Shaw & continuation to continuation of Park South down Harding to Stafford and west to the Creek. (Contains all of Guilford 2 and part of Guilford 4 precincts.)
- WARD II West boundary: Avon Avenue to U.S. 40 east to Town boundary. (Contains all of Guilford 3 and part of Guilford 5 and 11.)
- WARD III Bounded on West by Ward I north by II, south and east boundary as follows: beginning at SE corner at Stafford and Carr Roads, north to Buchanan, east to Simmonds, south to Section, east to Town boundary. (Contains parts of Guilford 4, 5 & 11)
- WARD IV Bounded on North and West by Ward III and on South by Stafford Road. (Contains parts of Guilford 5 and 10)
- WARD V All of Town South of Stafford Road. (Contains all of Guilford 6 and part of Guilford 4).

By unanimous vote the Secretary was to accomplish the following:


- A. Request a letter from Town of Plainfield outlining how they intended payment of election costs incurred by County for the 1971 Primary and Town General Election.





Gentlemen:

We are in receipt of the letter of Mr. Jack Gambold dated July 15, 1971, concerning the "Petition for Election of Town Trustees and Town Clerk-Treasurer for North Salem, Indiana".

While we recognize that two pieces of paper, one of which bears eleven signatures, and the other of which bears fourteen signatures with addresses of North Salem, Indiana, we have been unaware until receipt of your letter that all of these individuals were, in fact, registered voters. Secondly, even if these individuals whose names appear on both pieces of paper, are registered voters and residents of the Town of North Salem, and while the title above their signatures is "Petition for Election of Town Trustees and Town Clerk-Treasurer for North Salem, Indiana", the paper does not actually petition any individual/or individuals or any body politic of any relief.

For the foregoing reasons, we question that these pieces of paper are in fact a petition for anything.

If an election for town offices is to be held in North Salem, then any such election would probably have to be held by the Hendricks County Board of Election Commissioners for the reason that the Town of North Salem has no election board to carry out the duties and responsibilities of holding the election as called for by Burns Ind. Statutes 29-4401. As we understand the law, that section states that town election boards shall perform all duties in providing and preparing polling places that are required of county election boards and town election boards are to provide the necessary stamps, ink pads, printed ballots, etc. Since the Town of North Salem does not have the necessary election board, it would not be easier for the Town to handle such election than for the County to do so.

While the Town Board stands ready to assist the County Election Board and to comply as best it can with its limited obligations under the law, the Town does not now have any appropriations for funds nor any moneys budgeted for elections.

We again hasten to add that we will be happy to do whatever we can to assist the County in holding such election even though Town Trustees have no duty whatsoever in regard to calling an election at the expiration of their term. We understand that this is the case based upon opinion of the Attorney General for the State of Indiana in Opinion No. 51 of the year 1953.



This Board voted unanimously that the presented card did indeed incorporate an illegal slate and Messers Falls and Keck departed forthwith to see that it was suppressed.

Upon arrival in Plainfield and its environs this portion of the Board did find that these cards were being passed out at various polls by unknown individuals. 





I would suggest that your ruling dated February 28, 1968,
be amended to read as follows:

(1) When and in the event board members run at large for the office the ELECTED member receiving the lowest total number of votes shall take office July 1, of the year following the primary election year.

In the event the elected member receiving the highest of second highest total number of votes is the member whose term expires on July 1 of the year following the primary election year - then and in that event he would automatically continue to serve his term and the other elected member or members would take office July 1 following the primary election.

(2) When and in the event two (2) Candidates run for board member from the same township the ELECTED member receiving the lowest total number of votes shall take office on July 1 of the year following the primary election year."

Bill Falls seconded the motion and the motion was carried unanimously.
