The election board called a meeting 9:30 a.m. Tuesday, January 13, 1976. For the purpose of Amo Town Election request. All members were present: Billie Dee Falls, Steve Keck & Glen M. Harvey. Also present was the town attorney James Lowry.

After reviewing the petition presented to the board, the names were checked and found an inefficient number of registered voters.

A copy of this letter was given to the town attorney, James Lowry.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Re: Petition for Election  
Amo, Indiana

Please be advised that the petition dated October 22, 1975 which is entitled "NOTICE TO THE CITIZENS OF AMO, INDIANA, HENDRICKS COUNTY." (A copy of which is attached hereto) which was filed with the Hendricks County Election Board has been determined to be inadequate to cause an election to be called.

The law concerning this matter is embodied in Burns Ind. Stat. Ann. IC 31-1-17-2, a copy of which is attached hereto. As you will note, any petition for an election must be signed by 25 "registered voters". We were only able to confirm 21 signatures as representing "registered voters", particularly since we are declining to accept any names where one person has signed as "Mr. & Mrs.". No person may sign for another and we were unable to determine just who had signed in such cases.

Furthermore, we feel that someone should give us a statement, preferably a sworn statement, that (1) no election has been held for more than ten years and (2) that the petition was presented to the Town Board and that the Town Board refused action.

We also feel that any petition should state that the signers are residents of the town and are registered voters. Although the law does not specifically so state, we feel that the petition should be sworn.

We would suggest, before filing another such petition, that legal counsel be consulted to advise as to the proper procedure.

It is our hope that our position is understood since we feel that to conduct an election based on this petition would place the legality of any such election in doubt and create more problems than it solves.

Inspector would receive \$30.00- \$15.00- \$15.00 total \$60.00, Judges \$30.00, Clerks \$30.00, Asst. Clerks \$30.00, Sheriffs \$30.00, Absent Voters Board \$20.00 per day plus mileage (state rate), (3-1-22-21 Act 1975. P.L. 14).

The Election Board met 5:00 a.m., Tuesday, May 4, 1976, in the Clerk's Office, for the purpose of the Primary Election. Members of the Board present were: Steve Keck, Billie Dee Falls and Glen M. Harvey. Mr. Greenlee and Mr. Buris were on hand all day to assist in voting machine trouble.

Had minor trouble, mostly people confused. There were actually only 3 machine problems. These were fixed in short time. The 3 problems were in: Middle South, Liberty Center, and Guilford 5.

Sheriff Dept. was on hand at all times this day. At 2:00 p.m. three cars from Sheriff's Dept. took one member of Election Board in each car and delivered absentee votes to the 47 precincts.

There were only 72 Certificates of Error, with a close to 50% turn out. We thought this was very good.

The Canvassing Board assembled in the Clerk's Office around 6:00 p.m., organized, and were given instructions of their duties.

Precinct returns started coming in at 7:12 p.m. and the last precinct was in at 10:35 p.m. All tallies were entered in the proper forms by 2:00 a.m., May 5, 1976. The Canvassing Board adjourned until 8:00 a.m. to continue tallying the votes for certification, and was completed by mid afternoon. The totals are as follows:

Dear Clerk,

May 11th is the last day for you to supply my office with a complete copy of the returns of the vote cast for all candidates not voted for wholly within the limits of your county at the primary election. Because the State Board of Canvassers must meet next week, it is very important that you get this information to us as soon as possible.

I would greatly appreciate it if you would include complete returns for all of the offices that were included in my certification to you earlier. This would include those U.S. Congress, State Senate, State Representative, Judge and Prosecuting Attorney candidates that are voted for within the limits of your county. I need these returns for both the 1976 Election Report and to complete our official records. I would like to have certified returns from you in the same manner and along with those for multi-county contests.

In order to avoid some of the problems we experienced two years ago, I would like to request that on this certification you be careful to place your official seal and your signature. I would also like to point out that we need the vote totals written out "in words". The form used by many counties provides for both written and numerical totals. That format is very helpful.

Please note that if any candidates now wish to withdraw or resign from the ticket they will do so with the office where they filed their declaration of candidacy. This change is a result of Public Law 10 of 1975. This is but one more reason why we need to know the results of all races in which declarations were filed in this office, whether or not only one county is involved.

On or before May 24th you will be sending a complete certification of all those nominated in your county other than precinct committeeman. This list must contain the candidate's name, post office address, and party. At least one printer is supplying separate forms this year entitled Form F to be used for the delegates elected to the state conventions. This was done at my request so as to speed the certification process here in Indianapolis. I would appreciate it if all counties would either use such a form or provide typed lists on legal (8½x14) size paper and that delegates be certified separately

On November 2, 1976 I went to Hendricks County, Indiana, Center Township, Precinct 4 to vote at approximately 10:00 AM. When I entered the booth I closed the curtain. I then pulled the Democratic handle, pushed up the small lever over governor and senator and reached down to the American Party ticket and tried to pull down the small lever for governor and senator. The two small levers on the American Party ticket would not pull all the way down. When I tried to pull them the Democratic handle partially returned to its original position. I then asked for help. Mrs. Fern Gowin and Mrs. Betty Lawrence entered the booth. I told them I had pulled the Democratic handle, wanted to split my vote, but the machine would not work like I wanted to vote. I told them I wanted to vote for governor and senator on the American Party ticket. Mrs. Fern Gowin stated that I wouldn't be able to vote like that since I had already pulled the Democratic handle, that I could now only vote for the two above. ( Republican- Governor --Senator ) I then stated that she didn't know any more about it than I did and she left the booth. I voted a straight Democratic ticket after being told the machine wouldn't work the way I wanted to vote. I came out of the booth and my wife, Jean Day was engaged in conversation with the Sheriffs and Mrs. Gowin. Mrs. Gowin, my wife, Jean Day, Mr. Frank Leavitt and myself went outside of the poll room to discuss what was wrong and look at the ballot posted on the outside of the building. Mrs. Gowin stated if you pulled the Democratic handle or Republican handle first then you could not split your vote with the three parties listed at the bottom of the ballot, that since I had pulled the Democratic handle first I could only split with the Republican Party. She stated that if we (my wife and myself ) had wanted to vote for the American Party we should have pulled the American Party handle and then we could have scratched for Republicans, Democrats, or anyone else. The rest of the conversation was between my wife and Mrs. Gowin and appears in the affidavit of my wife, Jean Day. My last remark to Mrs Gowin was that she did not know <sup>what</sup> she was talking about because I had voted the same way for 20 years and that something was wrong if I could not vote that way this time.

Precinct changes — Publication of notice — State election board notified of change. — Whenever the county commissioners of any county shall, under the provisions of this article [3-1-8-1 — 3-1-8-7], change the boundaries of any precinct in such county, the said commissioners shall immediately give notice of such change by one [1] publication in two [2] newspapers of general circulation of opposite politics, printed and published in such county, if there be such; if not, said notice may be published in any two [2] newspapers of general circulation printed and published in such county, or if there be only one [1] newspaper published in such county, then publication in such one [1] newspaper shall be sufficient notice of such change of precincts.

Notice shall be given to the clerk of the circuit court, the board of registration and the state election board of changes made in precincts together with the estimated number of voters in each of the precincts as changed or created. [Acts 1945, ch. 208, § 82, p. 680.]

Gentlemen:

On April 5, 1978 at a state-wide meeting of the League of Women Voters we were made aware of an election law which was passed in 1977. This law is aimed at educating potential voters on the use of voting machines.

Since voter education is a major thrust of the LWV, our local league is interested in how this law has been implemented in Hendricks County. Recently two of our league members inquired into the present method used and how this method could be improved upon. Since we are a local league it follows that we are interested in local government.

We understand that there are problems to be overcome in implementing his law, however, we believe, as we are sure you do, that the needs of the voter must be considered.

The law provides that the machines be put in a place where the public usually assembles (i.e. shopping centers). Obviously this is stipulated so that the greatest number of voters possible may conveniently acquaint themselves with the use of the voting machine and become more familiar with the current ballot.

Also, the machines are to have instructors approved by both parties. This does not, we feel, necessitate two people, just one person acceptable to both parties. The reason for this too is obvious. One cannot learn how to use the machines without an instructor.

Finally, the machine is to be available for 12 hours a day. Working men and women cannot usually take time from their jobs to make use of this service, therefore, time beyond the usual working day is deemed necessary.

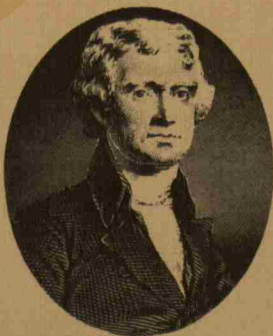

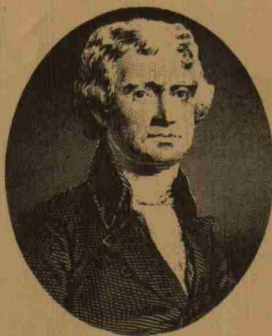

To the Members of the Election Board:

A unique situation has come up for the Democratic Party in Precinct Six of Guilford Township.

Within that one precinct two candidates for county office (Robert White, candidate for Sheriff and Sharon Kord, candidate for Recorder); Paul Midgley, Mr. White's campaign manager; Kelley White, Mr. White's daughter who has registered some fifty voters this year; John Higbee, the precinct committeeman and Democratic County Chairman; and Alma Higbee, wife of the County Chairman who has done extensive registration work in the past, all reside.

I feel there is sufficient justification for all those six people having registration kits.

The Clerk's office, however, has pointed out for me the section of election laws (page 73, paragraph 2 in the 1978 Election Laws of Indiana), that says "...additional deputy registration officers not exceeding two (2) for each party from each precinct..." shall be appointed.

However, the next paragraph, I believe, allows for situations such as exist in Guilford Six where all of those registrars will be registering voters from all parts of the County:

"The Clerk or registration board may appoint such other deputy registration officers and establish such sub-station registration boards as may be necessary to insure adequate opportunity for voters to register to vote."

I am hereby requesting that the Election Board through its powers granted by law in the above paragraph, authorize the County Clerk to provide voter registration kits to all the six persons named above. Pursuant to IC 3-1-9-4.5, several questions have been asked on the legality of declarations of candidacy's filed for precinct committeeman and delegate to the state convention. Many filings have been contested and denied access to the primary ballot by several county election boards. Since the statute is not clear the interpretation by the State Election Board is as follows:

The party affiliation of a candidate for precinct committeeman or a delegate to the state convention is determined by the party they voted for in the last primary election in which they participated, regardless of when it was.

Another situation may be a candidate running for the offices mentioned above who has been registered but has never voted in a primary election. His or her party affiliation would be which ever he or she chooses.


A ruling was reached on March 19, 1980 in Marion County Circuit Court agreeing with the above interpretation. Attached is a copy of that ruling.

It is my purpose by this letter and it would be our duty to see to it that any person legally entitled to vote may do so in a peaceful manner without threat of intimidation at the polling place.

 Concerning: Election Day Procedures

Last Spring the Hendricks County Grand Jury cited both political parties for lax procedures at the polls in a town election. In the May primary election a Guilford Township Inspector grossly mishandled absentee ballots and other sloppy procedures were present.

This year we have instructed our Precinct Committeemen and Election Board members to tighten our own operation at the polls and to speak out, formally protesting, if necessary, violation of election law.

Thursday, Marion County Prosecutor Steve Goldsmith announced that he had discovered an Indiana law requiring all protest papers of election procedures (challenges, affidavits, etc) be submitted to the Grand Jury.

That same Indiana law would, of course, apply to Hendricks County.

1. We intend to formally challenge voters who have moved out of the precinct and/or County.
2. We intend to formally protest any mishandling of absentee ballots.
3. We intend to bring to the Inspector's attention any electioneering inside the polling place. In the past, election board members have sometimes greeted voters passing down the tables with comments like: "Hi, George! Make sure you pull the right levers in there!"

After calling this to the Inspector's attention once, we intend to file legal paper if it happens again.

These changes are not being taken with any political goal or angry intent in mind. Most mistakes made in the past, I believe, were due much more to the arrogance or ignorance of the individual involved than to corrupt intent.

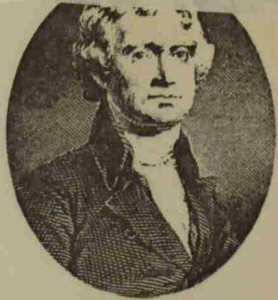
