### SUMMARY OF LAWS REGULATING ENUMERATION OF MALE INHABITANTS

- 1 Each Township Assessor, personally, or by Deputies, shall in the year 1955, at the time and during (65-624) the period when such Assessor lists property for taxation, ascertain the name and age of every Acts 1937 white and colored male inhabitant over the age of twenty-one years.

- 2 The Township Assessor or Deputy Assessor shall write said names in a book or books to be (65-602) furnished by the County Auditor and shall number the names numerically.
- 3 The Township Assessor, on or before July 1, 1955, shall file with the County Auditor another book (65-603) or books furnished by the County Auditor, in which the Assessor has arranged all the names enumerated in said township in alphabetical order.
- 4 Said Township Assessor, before making his return to the County Auditor, may correct any error (65-606) or mistake or supply any omission.
- 5 After the Assessor has made his return to the County Auditor, if said Assessor discovers any (65-608) error, mistake or omission, he shall make an affidavit, setting forth the facts in detail and transmit same to the County Auditor.
- 6 When the County Auditor receives affidavits setting out in detail any errors, mistakes or omissions, (65-608) it shall be his duty to attach said affidavits to the original book filed by said township assessor.
- 7 The County Auditor, immediately after all the returns of the enumeration shall have been received, (65-609) shall give notice to the public, including the aggregate number of all white and colored male inhabitants in each township and in the entire county; and stating that said enumerations are subject to inspection by the public with a view to the correction of any errors, mistakes or omissions.
- 8 When the County Auditor discovers or is informed of any error, mistake or omission, it is his duty (65-610) after investigation to make necessary corrections in the enumerations as returned. Such corrections shall not be made by altering the book as returned by the Assessor, but the Auditor shall enter up all corrections in the shape of orders, in a book provided for that purpose, and to be signed by him.
- 9 The County Auditor shall file with the Auditor of the State of Indiana, before September 1, 1955, a (65-611) verified statement, giving the aggregate number of male inhabitants enumerated in each township and in the County. Said statement shall also show, in making corrections, how many names were added to, and how many names were deducted from the enumeration as returned by the Township Assessor.
- 10 The Auditor of the State of Indiana shall prepare and furnish to the County Auditors, samples of all (65-614) the forms which may be necessary in making the enumeration. The County Auditor shall procure, at the expense of their respective counties, all the books and blanks according to the forms prescribed by the Auditor of State and shall deliver to said township assessors such books and blanks, as are necessary to enable the said assessors to perform the duties required of them.
- 11 Whenever, in any one township, there is more than one book used to enumerate the inhabitants, the (65-614) several books used shall be lettered on the outside—Book A, Book B, Book C, etc. The township assessor in transferring the names from the "numerical book" to the "alphabetical book," shall insert in the "number column" the letter of the book and the number of the name thus:

**LAWS REGULATING ENUMERATION OF MALE INHABITANTS**

65-601 [7698]. TIME FOR MAKING.—In the year 1866, and again in the year 1871, and at the end of each successive period of six (6) years after the said last mentioned year, an enumeration of the white male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, of this state, shall be made in obedience to the requirements of the constitution and according to the provisions hereinafter contained. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), 2, §1, p.41.]

65-602 [7699]. DUTY OF TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE.—The township trustee of each township of the several counties in the state is charged with the duty of making said enumeration, and shall, at the times mentioned in the first section (§65-601) of this act respectively, ascertain the name and age of every white male inhabitant over the age of twenty-one (21) years, residing, at the time of making such enumeration, within the bounds of his township; and shall write, or cause to be written, said names in a book or books to be provided for that purpose, setting opposite to each name the age of the person, as nearly as the same can be ascertained, and shall number said names in numerical order as they are written down in said book or books. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §2, p.41.]

65-603 [7700]. TIME AND MANNER OF MAKING.—The said township trustee shall perform the duties required of him in the foregoing sections between the first day of January and the first day of July of each year in which an enumeration is provided for in the first section of this act, and shall, on or before the first day of July, in each of said years, arrange in alphabetical order, in another book to be provided for that purpose, the names of all the white male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, of his township, who may have been enumerated as aforesaid under the preceding sections of this act, showing opposite to the name of each person, his age, as nearly as the same could be ascertained. And the said township trustee shall attach to said book his affidavit, to be sworn to and subscribed before some officer authorized to administer oaths, setting forth that the said book contains, as he verily believes, an honest, true, correct and complete enumeration of all the white male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, resident at the time of taking said enumeration in his township (naming it); that no person has been enumerated or returned in said book who was not at the time of making said enumeration a white male inhabitant, over the age of twenty-one (21) years of said township, to the best of his knowledge, information and belief, and that he has not, knowingly or negligently, omitted to enumerate and return in said book any white male inhabitant over the age of twenty-one (21) years who was resident therein at the time of making said enumeration; which book, with the affidavit aforesaid, shall, on or before the first day of July in each of said years, be returned by the said township trustee to the auditor of his county, who shall file and preserve the same in his office, noting therein the date of such returning and filing. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §3, p. 41.]

65-604 [7701]. ASSISTANTS.—The said township trustees may make the enumerations of their respective townships personally, or may appoint one or more assistants, and every such assistant shall, before entering upon the performance of his duties, take and subscribe an oath, to be filed with and preserved by said township trustee, for the honest and faithful performance of his duties in making the said enumeration. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §4, p.41.]

65-605 [7702]. DUTY OF ASSISTANTS.—Where an assistant is appointed by the trustee, either the whole duty of enumerating the township shall be assigned to such assistant, or a particular portion of the township, designated by definite lines or boundaries, shall be assigned to each assistant, and such assistant shall make the enumeration of all the white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years who were, at the time of making such enumeration, residents of the township, or of so much thereof as may have been assigned to him by the trustee as aforesaid. The said enumeration shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the second section (§65-602) of this act, in a book to be furnished by the township trustee to said assistant for the purpose. And the said assistant upon the completion of said enumeration, shall take and subscribe an affidavit before the township trustee, or some other officer authorized to administer oaths to be attached to and returned with said book to said trustee, setting forth that the said book contains, as he verily believes, an honest, true, correct and complete enumeration of all the white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years, resident at the time of the taking of said enumeration within said township, or so much thereof (describing it) as may have been assigned to him as aforesaid by the township trustee; that no person has been enumerated or returned in said book who was not, as he verily believes, at the time of making such enumeration, a white male inhabitant over the age of twenty-one (21) years, of the said township, or the portion thereof assigned to said assistant; and that he has not, knowingly or negligently, omitted to enumerate and return in said book any white male inhabitant over the age of twenty-one (21) years who was a resident of said township, or the part thereof so assigned to him as aforesaid, at the time of the making of said enumeration, which book and affidavit shall be returned by said assistant at such time, before the first day of July in each of said years, as the said township trustee may direct, and shall be filed and preserved by said trustee in his office as one of the records thereof. The date of the filing thereof shall be noted therein and said book shall at all times be open to the inspection of the public. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §5, p.41.]

65-606 [7703]. REMOVAL.—Correction of errors.—The said township trustee may, at his pleasure, remove any assistant ap-

pointed by him under the provisions of this act, and appoint another in his stead, and may, at any time before making his return of the enumeration to the county auditor, correct any error or mistake, or supply any omission in the enumeration as made and returned by any assistant appointed by him; but such correction shall be made without altering or mutilating the book and return made by the assistant. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §6, p.41.]

65-607 [7704]. ENUMERATION BY TRUSTEE.—Whenever the township trustee shall personally make the enumeration of his township or any portion thereof, the same shall be made in a book as provided in the second section (§65-602) of this act; which book shall have attached thereto a certificate of said township trustee, signed by him, that the same contains an honest, true, correct and complete enumeration of all the white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years who were at the time of making said enumeration resident within said township, or such part thereof (describing it), as may be included in said book; and said book, with said certificate attached, shall be filed and preserved by said township trustee, in his office, as one of the records thereof, and shall at all times be open to the public for inspection. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §7, p.41.]

65-608 [7705]. ERRORS.—The said township trustee may, at any time before the making of his return to the county auditor, as required by the third section (§65-603) of this act, correct any error or mistake or supply any omission which may have been made either by himself or any of his assistants in making the enumeration of his township, or any portion thereof; and if the said township trustee shall discover any such error, mistake or omission, after having made his return to the county auditor, it shall be his duty, immediately upon the discovery of such error, mistake or omission, to make and sign a statement in writing, to be verified by his affidavit, and to be without delay transmitted to the auditor of the county, setting forth the facts in detail in relation to said error, mistake or omission, and wherein such error mistake or omission consists; and it shall be the duty of said auditor to attach said communication to the original book returned by said township trustee; and such communication shall be treated as a correction or amendment of said book. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §8, p.41.]

65-609 [7706]. AUDITOR'S NOTICE.—It shall be the duty of the auditor of each county, immediately after all the returns of the enumeration shall have been received by him from the several township trustees of his county, to give notice, by publication in two (2) newspapers of his county, if so many there be published therein, and, if not, in one (1) newspaper, stating that the township trustees of the several townships of the county had made and returned their enumerations of the white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years of their respective townships, and that the said enumerations are subject to the inspection of the public at the auditor's office, and inviting an examination thereof, with a view to the correction of any errors, mistakes or omissions therein. The said notice shall also state the aggregate number of white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years in each township of the county, and the aggregate number in the entire county, according to the said enumeration and return. In case there should be no newspaper printed in the county, the notice required by this section shall be given by posting up printed hand-bills at the door of the courthouse, and in the auditor's, clerk's, treasurer's and recorder's offices of the county, and at three (3) public places in each township of the county. Said notices shall be posted up by the sheriff of the county, for which he shall receive the same fees as are allowed by law for other similar services, to be paid out of the county treasury. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §9, p.41.]

65-610 [7707]. AUDITOR TO CORRECT MISTAKES.—Whenever the auditor of any county discovers or is informed of any error, mistake or omission in the enumeration of any township as returned to him by the trustee thereof, it shall be the duty of the said auditor to investigate the matter and correct any error or mistake, and supply any omission that may have been made, as the facts shall justify upon the completion of such investigation. Such correction shall not be made, however, by altering the book as returned by the township trustee, but the auditor shall provide a book for the purpose, in which he shall enter up all corrections in the shape of orders, to be signed by him, specifying the corrections made and the omissions supplied, giving the name of each person stricken from or added to the enumeration of any township, with the reason for such correction; and the auditor may subpoena witnesses, when necessary, as to the facts involved in any such proposed correction. Said subpoenas shall be served as in other cases, and the like fees shall be allowed and paid, and the record of said correction shall be preserved as one of the records of the auditor's office. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch. 2, §10, p.41.]

65-611 [7708]. REPORT TO AUDITOR OF STATE.—The auditor of each county shall, on or before the first day of September in each of said years, make and certify to the auditor of state a statement, verified by his affidavit, giving the aggregate number of white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years in his county, and in each township of his county, according to the enumerations as made and returned under the provisions of this act, including the corrections made as hereinbefore provided for. The said statement shall also show how many persons the auditor, in making said corrections, added to and how many he deducted from the enumeration of each township as returned by the trustee thereof. The county auditor shall certify that the said statement contains the true number of white male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, resident in the several townships of his county, respectively, at the time of taking said enumerations, according to the returns of the several township trustees of said county respectively, as corrected by the

auditor under the provisions of this act; and that, in making said corrections, no person was, as the said auditor verily believes, added to said enumeration who was not, at the time of the making thereof, a white male inhabitant over twenty-one (21) years of age, of the township, to the enumeration of which he was so added; and that the name of no person was, as the said auditor verily believes, stricken from said enumeration, who was, at the time of the making thereof, a white male inhabitant over the age of twenty-one (21) years, of such township. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §11, p.41.]

65-612 [7709]. DUTY OF AUDITOR OF STATE.—The auditor of state shall as soon as practicable after receiving the complete returns of the enumeration from all the auditors of the several counties of the state, make out and certify a tabular statement of the number of white male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, in each township and in each county of this state, and also the total number in the entire state, according to the said returns so made by the several county auditors; which tabular statement the said auditor of state shall cause to be published, by one (1) insertion in each of the two (2) leading daily newspapers which may at the time be printed and published at Indianapolis; and he shall also submit the same tabular statement to the general assembly at the commencement of their next session after the making thereof. And he shall also, prior to the meeting of the general assembly, cause to be printed for the use thereof, three hundred (300) outline maps of the state showing the relative size, shape, and position of each county; and within the outlines or boundaries of each county, as exhibited on the map, shall be printed the name of the county and the figures representing the number of white male inhabitants over the age of twenty-one (21) years therein, as shown by the said enumerations and returns; which maps shall be delivered to the president of the senate and speaker of the house of representatives, at the commencement of the session, for the use of the members, in the proportion of one hundred (100) for the senate and two hundred (200) for the house. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §12, p.41.]

65-613 [7710]. AUDITOR OF STATE MAY CORRECT MISTAKES.—If at any time after the return of said enumerations to the auditor of state by the several county auditors, it shall be made satisfactorily to appear to the auditor of state, by affidavit filed, that any fraud, error or mistake has been committed in making or correcting the enumeration in any township or township of any county, or in returning the result of any such enumeration to the county auditor or auditor of state, it shall be the duty of the auditor of state, through some citizen of the county in which the fraud or mistake is alleged to have taken place, to be by him appointed a commissioner for that purpose, to fully investigate the matter and report the facts with the evidence taken, and upon which a report shall be based to the auditor of state, who shall submit such report and evidence to the general assembly. The auditor of state may prescribe rules for conducting such investigation; and the commissioners appointed by him shall be sworn to perform their duties faithfully and impartially. And such commissioner may swear and examine witnesses touching the matters to be investigated, and, for that purpose, may compel the attendance of witnesses before him at any place within the county where the witnesses reside. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §13, p.41.]

65-614 [7711]. BLANKS.—It shall be the duty of the auditor of state, with the least practicable delay after the taking effect of this act, to prepare and furnish to the auditors of the several counties of the state all the forms which may be necessary to be used by the county auditors or the township trustees, or their assistants, in carrying out the provisions of this act. And it shall be the duty of the county auditors of the several counties of this state to procure, at the expense of their respective counties, all the books and blanks (prepared according to the forms which may be furnished by the auditor of state) which may be necessary to enable the township trustee to perform the duties required of them by this act; which books and blanks shall be furnished and delivered by the county auditors to the township trustees respectively, with the least practicable delay. The auditor of state shall, at the time of furnishing the aforesaid forms, furnish to the auditor of each county a sufficient number of printed copies of this act (the same to be certified by and printed under the supervision of the secretary of state), as will enable such county auditor to furnish one (1) copy to each township trustee in his county, and retain two (2) copies in his own office. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §14, p.41.]

65-615 [7712]. FALSE STATEMENT—PERJURY.—If any officer or person who is required, by the provisions of this act, to verify any statement or return by his oath or affidavit, shall willfully and corruptly suppress the truth, or make any false statement in such statement or return, he shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and, upon conviction thereof, shall suffer the penalty prescribed by law for that offense. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §15, p.41.]

65-616 [7714]. OFFICIAL NEGLIGENCE—PENALTY.—If any officer or person charged with the performance of any duty by the provisions of this act, shall fail to perform such duty, or fail to perform it within the time prescribed by this act, such officer shall thereby be deemed to be guilty of official negligence, and shall, for every such offense, forfeit and pay not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500), to which may be added imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding thirty (30) days. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §17, p.41.]

65-617 [7715]. OFFICIAL FRAUD—PENALTY.—If any officer or person charged with the performance of any duty under the provisions of this act shall be guilty of any fraudulent act or omission in relation to such duty, such officer shall be deemed guilty of official fraud, and for every such offense shall forfeit and pay not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), to which may be added imprisonment in the county jail of the proper county not exceeding six (6) months. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §18, p.41.]

65-618 [7716]. INDICTMENT.—The grand juries of the circuit courts of the several counties in this state shall have jurisdiction to find and return indictments against all persons who may violate the provisions of the three (3) foregoing sections, or any or either of them; and the said circuit courts shall have power to try such indictments; and it shall be the duty of such courts to give this act in special charge to the grand jurors thereof. [Acts 1865 (Spec. Sess.), ch.2, §19, p.41.]

65-619 [7717]. COLORED MALES.—In addition to the duties imposed upon the township trustee of each township by the provisions of above act, they shall each make, or cause to be made, at the same time the white male inhabitants of each township are enumerated, an enumeration of the colored male inhabitants, if any in the township, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, in the same manner as by said act provided for the enumeration of the white males over twenty-one (21) years of age. And the names of the colored males shall be kept in a list separate from the white males, and designated as "colored male inhabitants"; and the list of white males shall be designated as "white male inhabitants". And such trustee shall also make return of the enumeration of the colored male inhabitants to the auditor of the county, at the same time and in like manner as provided in said act for making return of the white male inhabitants, and under the same penalties and provisions as there in now set forth. [Acts 1877, ch.38, §1, p.59.]

65-620 [7718]. COLORED MALES—REPORT TO AUDITOR OF STATE.—In addition to the duties imposed upon the auditor of each county under the provisions of above act, he shall, in addition to the notice required by section nine (§65-609) state therein, in a separate paragraph, the aggregate number of colored male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, in each township of the county, and the aggregate number in the entire county, according to the said enumeration and return. And he shall also certify to the auditor of state, in the certificate provided for by section eleven (§65-611), the aggregate number of colored male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, in his county and in each township of his county, according to the enumeration thereof, herein provided for; which shall be stated in a separate paragraph of said certificate. And such county auditors shall have the power, and it is hereby made their duty, under the penalties in said act to which this is supplemental, to revise and correct the list of "colored male inhabitants" in the same manner as now provided in section ten (§65-610) of said act. [Acts 1877, ch.38, §2, p.59.]

65-621 [7719]. COLORED MALES—DUTY OF AUDITOR OF STATE.—In addition to the duties imposed upon the auditor of state by the provisions of above act, he shall certify in a separate paragraph of his certificate, a tabular statement of the number of colored male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, in each township and each county of this state, and also the total number in the entire state; which shall be published as a part of the notice required by section twelve (§65-612) of said act, and be submitted to the next general assembly as therein provided. And on the maps in said section last named in addition to the statement now required, said auditor shall state the number of colored male inhabitants, over the age of twenty-one (21) years, in each county, as shown by said enumerations and returns. [Acts 1877, ch.38, §3, p.59.]

65-622 [7720]. COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS.—The several officers shall be allowed the same compensation for making the enumeration of the colored male inhabitants as is now allowed for their services in making the enumeration of the white inhabitants by section fifteen of above act. And for any violation of any of the provisions of this supplemental act, they shall be liable to prosecution and punishment as is now provided for by sections 16, 17, 18 and 19 (§65-615—65-618) of said act. [Acts 1877, ch.38, §4, p.59.]

65-623 [7721]. ENUMERATION OF VOTERS—COMPENSATION OF TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES' ASSISTANTS.—As compensation for their services for taking the enumeration of the white and colored male inhabitants of this state over the age of twenty-one (21) years, as provided for in chapter 2 of the Acts of the Special Session of the General Assembly of 1865 and in chapter 38 of the Acts of the Regular Session of 1865 and in chapter 38 of the Acts of the Regular Session of 1865 and in chapter 38 of the Acts of the Regular Session of 1865 and in chapter 38 of the Acts of the Regular Session of 1865, the assistants employed by the respective township trustees of this state shall be entitled to receive the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) per day for each day necessarily employed in making such enumeration. The compensation herein provided shall be paid out of the county treasury of the proper county, upon the order of the board of commissioners of such county, and shall be in addition to the compensation and allowances of the trustee as prescribed and fixed by chapter 159 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1917. The number of assistants to be appointed by any township trustee shall be determined by the trustee, with the approval of the township advisory board. [Acts 1925, ch.166, §1, p.403.]

65-624. ENUMERATION OF MALE INHABITANTS—WHEN—BY WHOM—FORMER LAWS IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT—TOWNSHIP ASSESSOR—DUTIES—FAILURE TO PERFORM—PENALTY.—All of the rights, power and duties conferred by law upon the several township trustees of this state relating to the periodical enumeration of the white and colored male inhabitants of this state, as prescribed in chapter 2 of the Acts of the special session of the General Assembly of 1865 and in chapter 38 of the Acts of the regular session of the General Assembly of 1877, are hereby continued in full force and effect and are hereby transferred to and conferred upon the township assessors of the respective townships of this state, and shall be held, exercised, performed and possessed by the several township assessors, respectively, under the laws now in force or hereafter enacted, subject to the following provisions of this act:

(a) Such enumeration of white and colored male inhabitants shall be taken in the year 1937 and in the year 1943 and every sixth year thereafter.

(b) Such enumeration shall be taken, in the years designated in paragraph (a) of this section, and at the time and during the period when such assessor lists property for taxation, as provided by law.

(c) Such enumeration may be taken by the assessor, personally, or by any of his deputies, if he has any deputies.

(d) For failure to perform his duties or for any violation of any of the provisions of this act or of chapter 2 of the Acts of the special session of the General Assembly of 1865 or of chapter 38 of the Acts of the regular session of the General Assembly of 1877 such assessor shall be subject to the penalties prescribed in chapter 2 of the Act of the special session of 1865. 65-625. TERMS DEFINED.—The term "township assessor" means the township assessor, where there is a township assessor, and the township trustee in townships in which the township trustee is ex officio the township assessor. [Acts 1937, ch.138, §2, p.790.]
