DITCHES.

Ditches shall be excavated along both sides of the entire line of read.

The dimensions of the ditches may be varied by the engineer in charge All ditches must present a regular and uniform appearance.

The fall of the ditches shall be so constructed as to lead all of the water from the read to be nearest outlet. All old ditches that may threaten to wash into the read shall be so filled and made so compact that the water shall not follow or wash them.

. GRADE.

The grade lines on the profile shows the grade of the sub-grade of the read bed and the op or surface of the read bed must be made to coincide with and conform osaid grade line, making cuts and fills of the depths shown on said profile.

EXCAVATIONS.

All cuts shall be excavated to a width of twenty four (24) feet at the subgrade. The slePes of all cuts shall be one and one half to one. (1-1/2 to 1)

EMBANKMENTS.

All embankments or fills shall be eighteen (18) feet wide at the sub-grade and the sides shall have a slope of one and one half to one (1-1/2 to 1) The contractor shall make easy approaches to all intersecting meads.

SEWER CULVERTS.

Sewer culverts shall be constructed along the line of road at such places and of such size and material as shown on profile. All culverts shall be eighteen (18) feet long, and longer where slopes or fills require. All outlets and inlets shall be so constructed that no water shall stand in or about the culverts.

BRIDGES.

At points indicated on the profile for the same shall be constructed bridges or arches of the length, span, wimbh and material as shown on the plan. All abutments, foundation for abutments, wing walls, bridge floors, sprande 1 walls and railing on arches shall be constructed of concrete mixed in the following proportions; One (1) part of accepted American Portland coment to six (6) parts of an accepted natural mixture of sand and gravel. The facing material the applied on the faces of all walls, abutments, wing walls, sprandel wal and all other parts which show shall be composed of one (1) part American Portland coment to two (2) parts of good clean sharp sand.

All cement to be used in this work must be the best grade of American Portland or a brand acceptable to the engineer in charge, and he shall have the right to subject said cement to any test he may deem proper before accepting the same.

MACADAM.

For a width of eight (8) feet (4-1/2 on each side center of read) except section three (3) which shall be nine (9) feet (4-1/2 feet on each side center of read), the read shall be covered with macadam to a depth of ten (10) inches in the center and eight (8) inche at the sides, preperly rounder as shown on "Cross Section of Read" reffered to above, being an average depth of nine (9) inches.

Said macadam to consist of broken and screened stones any piece of which shall pass through a two (2) inch ring. The entire surface of said macadam shall be concred to a depth of three (3) inches with gravel evenly spread. This macadam to be held in place by earthen as shown on "Cross Section of Read". RIP RAP.

Report of Engineer and Viewers.

In the matter of the petition of Willis M. Jackson et. al. for the improvement of a certain highway on the County Line between the Counties of Hendricks and Putnam, between the townships of Marion in Putnam County and Franklin in Hendricks county, Indiana.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PUTNAM COUNTY, INDIANA.

We, the viewers and engineer, appointed at your June tern, 1905 to view and locate a certain highway, detirmine the width of the same, and the quality and quantity of stone to be used, estimate the cost of construction, including grubbing, grading, culverting ditching, macadam and all other things necessary for the completion of the highway, would respectfully report that on the 14th day of June, 1905, we met at the office of the Auditor Britian County, Indiana, pursuant to an order, and having been duly qualified we immediately proceeded to detirmine all things in this matter required of us by the law.

COUNTY LINE ROAD.

Beginning at a point where the Indianapolis and Greencastle Gravel road terminates on the County Line between Marion Township, Putnam County, Indiana and Franklin Township Hendricks County, Indiana at the sou the east corner of section twenty four (24) township fourteen (14) north range three (3) west; thence north 1/4° east, on the county Line between Putnam and Hendricks Counties, Indiana, a distance of fifteen thousand, eight hundre twenty six and seven tenths (15,826.7) feet, to the north east corner of Section twelve (12) township fourteen (14) North, range three (3) west, to where said County Line Road joins on to the termination of the Fillmore Road.

The minimum width of the right of way of said road shall be thirty five (35) feet seven and one half (7-1/2) feet to the right and twenty seven and one half (27.1/2) feet to the left of the stake line.

The maximum width of the right of way shall be sixty (60) feet, thirty (30) feet on eithe side of the center line, and shall occur where height of fills or depth of cuts makes such width necessary to maintain the proper slope to cuts and fills.

SPECIFICATIONS.

ROAD BED.

Before grading the road bed is to be grubbed of all stumps, trees stones and all other obstructions the full width of the right of way, excepting such trees as the engineer may order to be left standing for shade purposes. All of said brees, stones, stumps and all other obstructions must be removed entirely from the right of way.

Contractors will be required to leave in place and preserve all monuments or corners to land, also all center, side-alope and station-stakes found on the right of way, and will be held responsible if the same are removed or destroyed.

When finished the grade must be a plane from one point of devation to another as indicated on the profile. No short elevations or depressions shall be left in the finished road bed.

The center of the **poad** bed must be six (6) inches higher than the edges of the same. The road bed must be a plane from the center to the sides, and the edges must be straight, not rounder off, and be finished smooth in a good workmanlike manner.

The road bed in all cases shall be twenty (20) feet wide, ten (10) feet on either side of the center line of the right of way.

All uneven places on the surface of the road bed must be leveled down or filled up towhether or not herein mentioned, provided or shown on the profile. At interset ing roads the road bed shall be curved into such intersecting roads so that there may be an easy approach from said roads.

FILLS.

Fills are to be made at such places and of such heights as shown upon the profile, and shall be of such width on top as in specified for the width of the road bed in these specifications. All fills shall have side slopes of one and one half (1-1/2) feet horizontal to one (1) foot vertical.

All fills shall be made from the nearest cuts or side scrapings on the right of way, and must be built up from side to side, full width at the same time with the center. All fills must be completed and allowed to settle, and be examined and accepted by the Emgineer or Superintendent before any crushed stone is placed upon them.

CUTS.

Cuts are to be made at such places and of such depths as are marker upon the profile a nd must have sufficient width for road bed, side-ditches and side slopes. The side slopes are to be one (1) foot horizontal to one (1) foot vertical.

If in making the cuts there shall be an excess of dirt over that needed to make the fills of the specified deminsions, the excess shall be disposed of as directed by the engineer.

DITCHES.

Ditches are to be excavated along the sides of the road bed and parallell with the same, except where otherwise ordered by the Engineer. The contractor will be required to gradually curve the ditches autward from the road bed at the points where said ditches leave cuts and empty water at the side of fills, the amount of said curve to be detirmined by the engineer. The ditches shall as a general rule be of such dimensions as are indicated in drawing No. 1. but these dimensions may be varied as the engineer may direct.

The inside edge of the ditch must be a plane from edge of road bed to bottom of ditch.

The outside of the ditch must have a slope of one (1) foot horizontal to one (1) foot vertical. The ditches must be regularlt graded on the bottom so that water that may flow into them shall continue uninterupted down to the outlets, leaving no ponds or polls by the roadbed.

Should there be any culverts omitted on the construction of the road or by the Emgineer the contractor shall be required to cut through any or all high places in the ditch that the water may flow down to the next culvert or outlet marked on the profile.

The contractor will be required to open outlets.from the side ditches and culverts a sufficient distance, not exceeding fifty (50) feet, from the right of way to give free outlet to all water from the same.

Where old ditches run in the road bed they shall be filled up and new ones cut at the proper places.

From at or near station 55 to at or ner station 65 the channel of the stream running along the east side of the road shall be widened to a width of not less than sixteen (16) feet and a depth sufficient to maintain a uniform rate of fall in the bed of the streams and to provide sufficient earth to make the fill adjacent thereto of the proper heigth.

This excavation shall be made in a neat and workmankike manner and parralell to the center line of the road and a sufficient distance to the east of the road bed to not encroach upon the proper construction of the same. The fill of the road shall be proctected on its east sid throughout all that part of the above mentioned in which it is subject to the wash of the stream by a rip rap wall of large flat stone, said wall to be of a height to extend from the bed of the stream to the top of the fill.

The rip rap wall may be made of sand stone if suitable sand stone can be procured.

CONCRETE PIPE CULVERTS.

Culverts shall be constructed at such places and of such dimensions and materials as are marked on the profile.

The concrete used in these culverts shall be of such material and mixed in such a manner as is hereafter specified for concrete work.

The culvert shall be laid in a straight line and at right angles with the center of the road, with the center of the culvert in the center of the road bed, unless otherwise ordered by the engineer.

The concrete pipe culverst shall be built in accordance with the Drawing marked "Concrete Pipe Culvert" and the dimensions marked upon the drawing shall govern for 12 inch pipe culvert.

For 15 and 18 inch culverts the same dimensions shall govern as for the 12 inch except that the concrete around tile shall be five (5) inches thick.

All pipe shall be laid to a true grade of not less than five (5) inches in twenty two (22) feet.

The tops of the bulkheads shall be finished by a coating of cement mortar composed of one (1) part cement and two (2) parts sand.

CONCRETE CULVERTS.

All concrete culverts shall be constructed in accordance with drawing No. 2.

The length of the nulvert shall correspond to the width of the road way or bottom of fill, and shall be built in a straight line at right angles to the center line of the right of way, unless otherwise ordered by the engineer, with the center of the culvert in the center of the right of way. The arch shall be built upon a wooden center which shall be left in place until the arch had become thouroughly set, and shall not be removed until the engineer has examined the arch and given his consent to its removal. In building the culverts proper forms shall be used, and also in building the bulkheads. The tops of the bulkheads shall be finished in the same manner as those for the concrete pipe culvert.

CONCRETE.

All concrete used in this work shall be comPosed of one)1(part Portland cement two (2) parts sand and Five (5) parts of broken lime stone.

The Portland cement to be used must be of some good American brand, subject to the approval of the engineer.

Sand must be clean sharp sand, of coarse, angular grains, free from loam, dirt, vegetable matter and all foreign substance.

Broken limestone shall be crushed so that each stone will pass in any direction through a ring one and one half (1-1/2) inches in diameter, and must be free from dust, fine stone and dirt.

In handling the stone in must be dumped so that it will not become mixed with earth or trash, and no stone or sand which has become so mixed shall be used in this work.

The cement and sand shall be first measured and mixed together on a platform, dy dry, by shoveling until no streaks of cement appear in the sand. The cement and sand shall then be spread out in a layer of even thickness in the center of the platform and the five (5) parts of broken limestone shall be added in a layer of even thickness. Then water may be added and mixing continued until the entire mass of cement, sand and stone reaches the consistency of saft mortab. In no case shall there be enough water added to cause the cement and sand to wash from the stone. As soon as the concrete is thouroughly mixed it shall be shoveled into the forms in layers not exceeding eight (8) inches in thickness.

As soon as each layer of concrete is shoveled in the sand and cement of the concret shall first be drawn into perfect contact with the surface of the forms by a tamping motion of a thin, limber spade, and the concrete shall then be tamped until water flushes to the surface. Before throwing in each layer of concrete the forms shall be dampened.

No concrete work shall be done in freezing weather.

The engineer may require concrete to be proctected from heat by a suitable coveringhe may also require it to be kept damp by sprinkling.

After the forms are taken down from the concrete work all honey comb or uneven places shall be neatly filled and troweled down smooth with a cement mortar composed of one (1) part cement and two (2) parts sand.

All concrete culverts shall have the bottom of the waterway paved with limestone or boulders not less than five (5) inches in their least dimensions, which shall be lad to a true grade in a neat and workmanlike manner. The forms shall be taken down as soon as the concrete has set sufficiently to bear its own weight.

MACADAM.

The road bed shall be covered with crushed stone to a width of nine (9) feet and a depth of nine (9) inches. The somme shall consist of hard limestone crushed so that each stone will pass in any direction through a ring one and one half (1-1/2) inches in diameter.

If the quarry selected to quarry the stone shall be one in whick the ledges of stratified limestone are of a thickness less than one and one half (1-1/2) inches then the crusher used to crush this stone shall be so regulated that it will sufficiently crush the thinnestledge in the quarry.

If at any time during the construction of the road the contractor shall dilever upon the road bed as macadamizing material any crushed stone which contains any considerable percent of large flat slabs or pieces of stone larger than will pass through the above specified ring, the superintendent in charge of the work shall at once notify the contractor or his foreman of the condition of the stone being furnished, and any such stone distributed after the contractor or his foreman has been notified shall be kept account of by the superintendent and will not be paid for.

The stone shall be dumped between boards nine (9) inches high until full and in no case shall the boards be removed until full.

The height at the center shall be indicated by stakes so driven so that their tops will come nine (9) inches above the finished road bed.

When the stone has been spread out it must form a plane from the tope of the center stakes to the tops of the boards.

At junctions with other roads and at sharp turns the stone shall be widened out as directed by the engineer.

The contractor must at all times keep the highway open for public travel and will be held responsible for all damages caused by his neglect in any manner.

All implements, tools, machinery, materials, labor and other things necessary for the completion of this road according to be plans, profile and specifications shall be furnished by the contractor at his own expense. All work of whatever kind shall be done in a neat and workmanlike manner.

before removing the gauge boards a slight bank of earth shall be thrown up against each side of the macadam. Said bank shall have a base of sixteen (16) inches and a height equal to the width of the guage boards.

BRIDGES.

All of the bridges on this road shall be Steel "I"beam bridges and shall be of such style and dimensions as is shown on the drawings of the same which are hereby incorporated in and made a part of this report. The length of the span of each bridge is marker upon the profile of the road.

The bridges shall have a floor of white oak two and one half (2-1/2) inches thick which shall be free from potten knots, wind shakes and other serious imperfections

The iron work of each bridge shall recieve one coat of good paint after erection.

The abutments of the several bridges shall be built of concrete made of the same material and mixed in the samemanner as is specified for concrete work, and of the dimensions as specified upon the drawing of the same.

The excavation for the abutments shall be carried to a depth sufficient to insure stability, and in all cases shall be subject to the direction of the engineer or superintendent.

The waterway of all bridges between the abutments and wings shall be paved with boulders or sandstone of an approved quality, and shall be laid to a true grade of not less than five (5) inches in twenty (20) feet, in a neat and work-manlike manner.

RIP RAP CROSSINGS.

At or near station 9 plus 10 shall be constructed a rip rap crossing which shall be made by excavating the bed of the stream for adepth of not less than one (1) foot, and a width equal to the width of the road bed. The width of the crossing measured parrallell with the center of the road bed shall be twenty five (25) feet. The stone used in paving this crossing shall be either limestone or boulders

whose vertical dimensions shall not be less than one (1) foot when laid.

When the paving is in place the joints between the stones shall be completly filled with crushed stone such as is used to ballast the road bed and the top of the pavement thouroughly covered with the same.

PROSECUTION AND REPAIR OF WORK.

All of said work to be completed as soon as the weather will permit and as directed by the proper authorities under the written agreement to be entered into by and between the parties when the contract is let.

During the progress of the work the contractor will be required at his own expense, and under the direction of the engineer or superintendent and whenever required so to do, put and keep in good repair all of the respective work. In no case shall the work be done in a manner otherwise than that laid down by the specifications, except by the direction of the engineer

SUBLETTING.

The contractor to whom may be awarded the building of this road or any part thereof will not be permitted to sublet the same, or any part thereof, without the recorded consent of the Board of Commissioners of Putnam County, Indiana, nor any event without being responsible for all contracts for labor, tools, machinery, materials and board of laborers for the construction of the work of such sub-contractor, or any part thereof.

TIME LIMIT.

The contractor to whom may be awarded the building of this road will be required to obligate himself by contract to complete said road within a limited amount of time, said time not to exceed eighteen (18) months from date of contract, and on failing to complete said road within the specified time limit shall forfeit twenty (20) percent of the contract price, due consideration being taken of weather conditions.

COST.

We, the viewers and engineer, estimate the probable cost of said road to be as follows.

DITCHES.

Ditches shall be excavated along both sides of said road. To depth to be not less than 12 inches measured from the shoulder of road bed, 12 inches wide at bottom with side slopes of not less than one to one. the ditches shall be so constructed as to lead all the water from the road to the nearest outlet. All old ditches which may threaten to wash into the road shall be so filled and made so compact that the water will not follow or wash them.

GRADE.

Where red lines appearson the profile, the present grade shall be cut or filled to conform to same. All grading shall be allowed to stand four weeks before placing macadam thereon, unless by written permission of engineer.

EXCAVATIONS.

All excavations shall be made 24 feet wide at the sub-grade. The outside slopes to all cuts shall be one foot to one foot.

EMBANKMENTS.

All embankments od fills shall be eighteen (18) feet wide at the sub-grade and the sides shall have a slope of one to one. The contractor shall make easy approaches to intersecting roads.

SEWER CULVERTS.

Sewer Culverts shall be placed along the line of road at such places and of size and material as shown on profile. All sewers shall be 20 feet long. All outlets and inlets shall be so constructed that no water shall stand in or about the sewers.

BRIDGES.

At points indicated on the profile for the same shall be constructed bridges of the length of span, width, height and material as shown on the plans. All abutments, foundation for abutments, wing walls, bridge floors and sprandel walls shall be constructed of concrete mixed in the following proportions; one part of accepted American Portland cement to six parts of an accepted natural mixture of samd and gravel. All facing on parts that show shall be composed of one part American Portland Cement to two parts clean sharp sand.

MACADAM.

For a width of eight feet (\$-1 2 on each side of center of road) the road shall be covered with macadam to a depth of ten (10) inches in the center and eight (8) inches at the sides, properly rounded as shown on "Cross section of road bed", being an average depth of nine (9) inches. Said macadam to consist of broken and screened stones any piece of which would pass through a two inch ring. The entire surface of said macadam shall be

ROCK FORDS.

At such places as indicated on the profile rockfords shall be constructed by excavating and carefully placing rip rap stone 15 inches deep and 14 foot readway and as long as the stream demands.

RIP RAP.

As shown on the profile rip r ap shall be placed on the east side of road bed to prevent washing. Said rip rap to be at least 5 inches deep and wide enough to proctect road bed.

MATERIAL.

BRIDGES. At station 30 X IS shall be constructed a concrete bridge of thelength of span as shown on the profile. The concrete to be composed of one part best American Portland cement, to five parts of an approved quality of sand and gravel.

GRAVEL. For a width of 9 feet (4 I/2 en each side of center of road) the road shall be covered with an approved quality of gravel to a depth of I4 inches in the center and I0 inches at the sides properly rounded as shown on "Cross section of Road" beign average depth of I2 inches. Gravel to be held in place by warthen bank as shown as shown on "Cross section of Road", grade boards to be I0 inches wide.

MATERIAL. All material must be subject to engineer in charge. Any material condemned by engineer shall not be used, or, if used stand subject to engineer's discount.

USE OF HIGHWAY. The public shall in no way be debarred from the use of highway,

except in case of removing and rebuilding culverts and bridges, in such cases the road shall beeblocked no longer than necessary, The contractor shall begin placing the gravel at such distance from the pit that it will not be nesessary to haul gravel ever any part of the road, already built.

The right of way shall be thirty feet in width and where cuts and fills are need essary the right of way must be widened to allow the proper slopes as hereinafter provided. DESCRIPTION.

The right of way of said road shall be 30 feet wide, except where cuts and fills require a gr greater width: at all such places the right of way shall be sufficiently wide to preserve a sub-grade IS feet wide, exclusive of side ditches, and also to allow the banks or sides of

cuts and fills to be on the slope as the same is herein specified. Wherever, in he the opinion of the Superintendent and engineer in charge, a change in the location as described herein will avoid an abrupt hollow or other serious natural obstacles, and be, in their opinion, of great and everlasting good to the read, then and in that case the right of way and the road may be shifted to the right or left as they may order provided always, that the changes and costs of such damages and costs of such change shall not exceed the benefits thereof, and provided also, that such change shall not increase the cost of construction of said read.

DITCHES

Ditches shall be excavated along both sides of the entire line of road. The depth in no case to be less than eighteen inches measured from shoulder of the read bed eighteen inches wide at the bottom with side slopes of not less than one to one

The dimensions of the ditches may be varied by the Engineer in chag all ditches must present a regular and uniform apperance. The fall of the ditches sha conform to the general slope of the country, and must be so constructed as to lead all of the water from the road to the nearest natural outlet, All old ditches that may threaten to wash into the road shall be so filled and made so compact that the water shall not follow or wash them.

The ditch on east side from stake 94 X 80 to 96 shall be filled and the ditch constructed on the west side of road so as to turn the streamvalong west side.

The road bed along said stream shall be made of proper width on west side by cutting the west bank of said stream, thus throwing stream closer to fence.

GRADE.

The grade line on the profiles shows the grade of the sub-grade of the road bed and the top or surface of road bed must be made to conform to said grade line, making on the cuts and fills of the depth shown on said profiles.

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All grading shall be done and the same allowed to stane at least four weeks before the macadam is placed on the sub-grade.

PROVIDED that the constructing contractor may procure a written permission, signed by the engineer, for placing the stone earlier.

EXCAVATIONS.

All cuts shall be excavated to a width of 26 feet at the subgrade. the slope of all cuts shall be one and one half to one.

EMBANKMENTS.

All embankments or fills shall be eighteen feet wide at the sub-grade and the sides shall have a slope of one and one half to one. The contractor shall make easy approaches to all intersecting roads. An allowance of IO per cent must be made for shrinkage on all fills 5 of over inches.

- Sewer culverts shall be constructed along the line of read at such places and of such size and material as shown on profile. All culverts shall be 22 feet long, and longer where slopes or fills require. All cutlets and inlets shall be so constructed that no water shall stand in or about the culvert.

BRIDGES.

AT POINTS INDICATED ON THE PROFILE FOR THE SAME SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED BRIDGES OF THE LENGE of span, width and material as shown on the plan and profile.

All abutments, foundations for abutments, wing walls, bridges, floors and railing on concrete bridges shall be consrete mixed in the following propertions;

One part of accepted Portland cement, five parts of approved gravel.

All parts of concrete, which will be exposed to view, must be spaded with the proper tools so as to produce a smooth surface on all finished work.

No plastering of any part of the work to produce a finish will be all ewed.

PAVING.

For a width of 9 feet (4 I/2 feet on each side of center line of road) the road shall be covered with macadam to a depth of 9 inches. Said macadam to consist of broken and screened stones, any piece of which will readily pass through a 2 I/2 inch ring, except 2 inches in thickness over the entire surface of said macadam which shall consist of screenings evenly spread on said macadam. This macadam to be held in place by earthern babk as shown on "Cross section of roads".

MATERIAL.

All material must be subject to inspection of engineer. Any material condemed shall not be used, or if used stand subject to 'engineer's discount.

USE OF HIGHWAY.

The public shall in no way be barred from the use of the highway, except in cases of removing and rebuilding culverts and bridges. In such cases, the road shall be blocked no longer

Readway.

The right of way of said road shall be 30 feet wide, except where cuts and fills fills require a greater width; at all such places the right of way shall be sufficiently wide to preserve a sub-grade IS feet wide, exclusive of the side ditches and also to allow the banks or sides of cuts and fills to be on the slope as the same is herein specifiwed.

Wherever in the epinion of the superintendent and Engineer in charge, a change in the location of the read from the location as described herein will avoid an abript hellew er other serious natural obstacles, and be , intheir opinion, of great and everlasting good to the road, then and in that case as they may order; Provided always, that the damages and costs of such change shall not exceed the benefits thereof; and provided also, that such change shall not increase the cost of construction of said road.

DITCHES.

Ditches shall be excavated along both sides of the entire line of read. The depth in no case to be less than IS inches and IS inches wide at the Bettem with side slopes of not less than one to one. The dimensions of the ditches may be varied by the engineer in charge. All ditches must present a regular and uniform appearance.

The fall of the ditches shall conform to the general slope of the coun-

GRADE.

All cuts shall be excavated to a width of 27 feet at the sub-grade. The slopes of all cuts shall be one and one-half(I,I/2) to one (I).

EMBANKMENTS.

All embankments or fills shall be IS feet wide at the Sub-grade and the sides shall have a slope of one and one-half (I,I/2) to one (I).

The contractor shall make easy approches to all intersecting reads.

An allowance of ten per ceht (10%) must be made for shrinkage on all fills of more than twelve inches.

SEWER CULVERTS.

Sewer culverts shall be constructed along the line of read at such places and of such sizes and materials as shown on the profile.

All culverts shall be Twenty (20) feet ang, except in cases where a greater length is is required as shewn on the plans.

For a width of 9 feet (4 1/2) feet en each side of Center line of read), the read shall be covered with macadam to a depth of nine inches. ROAD WAY.

The right of way of said road shall be thirty feet wide, except where cuts or fills require a greater width; at all such places the right of way shall be sufficiently wide to preserve a a sub-grade IS feet wide, exclusive of side ditches and also to allow the banks or sides of cuts and fills to be on the slope as the same is herein specified. All ditches must present a regular and uniform appearance.

The fall of the ditches shall conform to the general slope of the country and must be so constructed as to lead all of the water from the road to the nearest natural outlet unless otherwise provided by the profile. The grade line of the profile shows the grade of the sub-grade of the road-bed and the top or surface of the radd-bed must be made to conform to said grade line, making cuts and fille of the depth shown on said profile.
