CANTERBURY CONQUERS ANDERSON 51-42

Anderson College lost for the second time this season, to Coach G. Johnson's Warriors when they were defeated 51-42 in a clean hard fought ball game. Scoring honors for the evening went to F. Hanson, who collected a total of 16 points on 6 field goals and 4 free throws. J. Wilson, Anderson's number one point collector was held to 10 points by Jim Springer who himself dumped in 14 points.

Playing a good defensive game Canterbury kept Anderson from getting in close to the hoop and the Warriors controlled the majority of the rebounds under their opponents basket. Trailing by two points 24-22 at the end of the first half, making

each shot count, and had a 6 point lead with 4 minutes to go in the game which was increased to 9 points by the final second.

WILL BE PLAYED

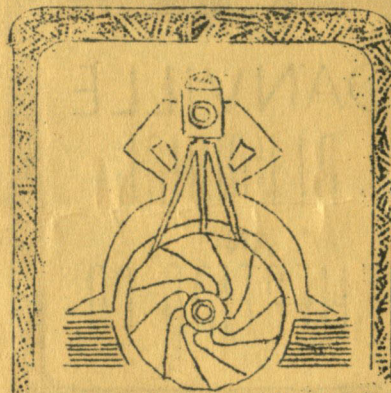

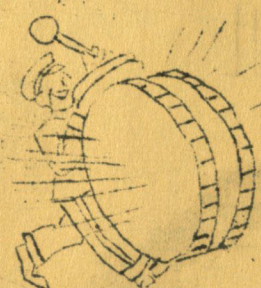

"Well, Jim. I didn't know you were in here. Say, how are you and Mary going to the game tonight? In your car? May Dick and I go along with you?


