### "Why Canterbury College Failed"

During the past two years Kent D. Beeler has been asking questions concerning the "Demise" of Canterbury College. Of course, it's background was Central Normal College.

This treatise was in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Doctor of Education Degree in Indiana University.

He states "The agreement to release control of Central Normal College brought to an end 68 years of continued access to higher education under the aegis of that private normal college. Having survived three proprietorships, two incorporations, and 16 presidents while having enrolled over 60,000 students, Central Normal College officially ended its academic life on July 6, 1946."
