He wrote:

In speaking about the fact that only the physical vestiges of the campus remain today, I meant to continue with . . .

## LETTER FROM ALBERTA RIGDON

Dear College Friends,

Nothing more was needed to make me feel utterly at home than to get your card announcing the Central Normal College Alumni Dinner. However I must be content with sending you this letter.

40 years! Just to write those two words quite overwhelms me. The music in my heart oft flows from "Far Off Things and Battles Long Ago." I take possession of the "Old World" - I inhale it - I appreciate it!

Perhaps not many at the Banquet were students in the College when my husband, Dr. Jonathan Rigdon, was your president.

My Louisville years have been most happy years. Father and I came here so that we might be near my sister, Chloe, and her husband, Judge Lorenzo K. Wood. They are living in the Puritan Hotel. Glaucoma has impaired the vision of Judge Wood, and my sister has had to give up her active life in church and clubs and committees because of hardening of the arteries.

My whole time is spent in reading and study of World Literature. I read till two and three o'clock - and then sleep late in the morning. You should see my stacks of Note-Books. My eyes are wonderful.

During these years in Louisville I have interpreted for the "Great Books" Class of Louisville Women's Club at least one "Great Book" each of the 20 years I've been here. Sometimes I have accepted invitations to give two or three books. But I do limit my engagements. Believe me, I am 82 years old. So I consider myself a very privileged person. I am well and happy. I have many students around me - most of them from the Baptist Seminary - a few from Presbyterian Seminary and the University of Louisville. I help some high school pupils in their study of the plays of Shakespeare. These students can't believe my age. I rake leaves with the yard workers. They run the power mower. Life is great fun for me - very exciting. I shall be thinking of all of you.
