Tribute to Russ (Sam) Williams from Richard L. Roudebush:

"Probably no other individual has contributed as much to the rehabilitation of the nation's blinded veterans as has Russ Williams. He has spearheaded rehabilitation programs for blinded veterans since the fall of 1945, when he became a counselor at the Army's Valley Forge General Hospital following his own rehabilitation there and at Avon Old Farms. In May 1948, he became chief of the Central Blind Rehabilitation Center, VA Hospital, Hines, Illinois, the first of the VA's rehabilitation centers for blinded veterans. He became chief of Blind Rehabilitation at VA Central Office in 1959, the second person ever to hold that position.

Under his leadership, VA rehabilitation programs for blinded veterans have made great strides, increasing in size, scope, and effectiveness. From the nine-bed unit at the Hines Center in 1958, the VA's rehabilitation programs have expanded to include two additional centers at the Palo Alto, California and West Haven, Connecticut hospitals and five specialized psychiatric rehabilitation clinics for the blind. In addition, 72 VA hospitals now have visual impairment services teams that work with blinded veterans after they have returned to their home areas.

Another Outstanding CNC Alumni

Melvin M. Esarey '34. Melvin has been outstanding in the field of Driver Education Programs at Mt. Carmel and at New Trier High Schools, Winnetka, Ill. He has written Let's Drive Right, which has been used widely. In 1975 he was awarded the special award by the Illinois High School and Driver Education Association.

Our Housemothers

Rarely do we express appreciation for the relation—ship which existed and has continued to exist between the CNC Housemothers and the students of CNC. Nearly every house "kept students". In many instances the relationship was close and has continued through the years.

For the housemother - or the family: It helped with the finances - but not much! (at \$1.50 per week) with each new student the household grew. It wasn't long until the students were "our boys" or "our girls". Many widows now live alone - and are worried about - who would have had company.

For the Student, his room became his home. Many times it meant that he wouldn't go hungry. During the subsequent years his "housemother" has become almost as close as his mother.

And this situation has changed Danville!
