Dr. Marion A. McGhehey, 61, Executive Director of the Kansas Association of School Boards, died September 2, 1982 of a heart attack. In addition to his services to KASB, Dr. McGhehey also served as Executive Secretary of the National Organization on Legal Problems of Education. His leadership in the fields of public education and school law leaves a multitude of friends and colleagues who mourn his passing.

Dr. McGhehey received his B.S. Degree from Central Normal College and his M.A. Degree from Indiana University in Bloomington and did post-graduate work at Rutgers University, George Washington University Law School and Washburn Law School.

Dr. McGhehey is survived by his wife, Sara Jean, and six children; Michael, Kathy, John, Peggy, Steve and Jeff. In addition he

is survived by one sister, Evelyn Seymour, of Fishers Indiana.
