A letter from George Whitman says: "At a gathering of our families last month we were discussing College days at CNC."

"Ed Cushman and I were roommates in Dr. Rigdon's home then occupied by Russell ("Tangy") and Louise Cook."

"Ed graduated in 1930 and taught 12 years. During World War II he worked at Allisons."

"In 1945 he established a program in the Aeronautical Engineering school at Purdue to train aviation maintenance mechanics."

"In 1949 he became the Assistant Director of the School of Aeronautics at the University of Illinois."

"In 1964 he became a lecturer for NASA, traveling through the USA, Australia and Guam."

"In 1968 he developed a program in Ben Davis High School for students interested in Careers in Aviation."
