## WHAT STUDENTS SPEND ON CNC CAMPUS IN

At last a compilation has been made which should furnish certain facts for both students and business men and exceutives concerning the amounts which CMC students spend and what they spend it for. These facts were figured by taking the actual expenditures of 232 students for the first eight weeks of the school year of 1939, figuring from these the total expenses of 100% of the students (359 who were on campus), and then multiplying this by 4½ since 36 weeks is four and one half times as much as for




