

The Warriors were not in their finest style and was continuously hounded by the Huntington net men. The visitors got a 2 point lead at the first of the game but soon lost although all through the first half there was never over 6 points difference between scores. The half ended 19 to 18 C.N.C.

The last half of the game was about the same with the Warriors leading until about 7 minutes to go and the visitors hit a hot streak and went ahead 4 points only to lose it with 3 minutes to go when the Warriors hit their final stride and forged ahead 9 points.
