James William Walls only son of Moses Walls and Mary Polly Parks

The Walls are of Irish descent.

Moses and his brother, James, And sisters Susan, Polly Ann and Nancy emigrated from Wilks County, North Carolina to Hendricks County, Indiana in the early part of the nineteenth century.

Moses Walls died on his farm near Pittsboro when his son James was a small Child. The mother then moved to Vermillion County, Illinois where she reared her large family of girls and one boy.

It was in Illinois that James wed Sophronia Ann Butler and to this union were born five children, two of whom died in infancy. The mother died when Van Shelburn was about two years of age. John, the second son, was taken by a family who later moved to Kansas. There John lived until he was about twenty years of age when he again joined the family circle.

James second wife was Cynthia Ann Bloomfield and to this union also were born five children, two of whom died in infancy. The mother died when David Thomas was a small baby.

James third wife was Eliza Ann Elkins Kefauver and to this union were born five children all of whom died in infancy. By a former marriage Eliza Ann had two children --- Francis Marion and Mollie Mae.

In 1883 James moved his family from Illinois to Indiana and spent the remainder of his life in that state residing near Indianapolis.

James was born July 25, 1848 and died July 4, 1917 of Smallpox.

From that time until her death October 10, 1928 Eliza Ann made her home with her daughter.

History

The Walls are of Irish descent.

Moses and his brother James and sisters Susan, Polly ANN, and Nancy emigrated from Wilks County, North Carolina to Hendricks County, Indiana in the early part of the nineteenth century.

^{his son} Moses Walls died, on his farm near Pittsboro, when James was a small child. The mother then moved to Vermillion County, Illinois where she reared her large family of girls and one boy.

It was in Illinois that James wed Sophronia ANN Butler and to this union were born five children, two of whom died in infancy. The mother died when Van Shelburn was about two years of age. John, the second son, was taken by a family who later moved to Kansas. There John lived until he was about twenty years of age when he again joined the family circle.

James' second wife was Cynthia ANN Blumfield and to this union also were born five children two of whom died in infancy. The mother died when David Thomas was a small baby.

James third wife was Eliza ANN Elkins Kiefover and to this union were born five children all of whom died in infancy. By a former marriage Mrs. Kiefover had two children - Francis Marion and Mollie Mae. In 1883 James moved his family

from Illinois to Indiana and spent the remainder of his life in that state residing in and near Indianapolis.

James died July 4, 1917 of smallpox and from that time, until her death on October 10, 1928, ANN made her home with her daughter.
