

ECLIPSES, 1889.

There will be five Eclipses this year, three of the Sun and two of the Moon, as follows:

I. A Total Eclipse of the Sun, Jan. 1. Throughout all the States east of Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Indian Territory, and E. Texas the Sun will set more or less eclipsed. The path of totality enters the Pacific Coast just north of San Francisco, at Point Arena, passing close to Sacramento and Carson City, and Fremont's Peak is near the center of the path. The duration of total phase is 2 m. At New-York City the beginning occurs at 4.41.

II. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, Jan. 16-17, visible generally throughout North and South America, Europe, etc. Eclipse begins, New-York, 11.2°; middle, 0.34°; end, 2.5°. Size, 8.4 digits, the Moon's diameter being 12 digits.
III. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, June 28, invisible in

IV. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, July 12, invisible in U. S.
V. A Total Eclipse of the Sun, Dec. 22, invisible in the United States, except at the very extremity of Cape Hatteras, and the Lake Worth region and Keys of South Florida.

AUSTRIA AND RUSSIA.—The Paper Currencies are continually subject to important fluctuations.

IN FRANCE, BELGIUM, SWITZERLAND, AND ITALY, 1 franc=100 centimes. GERMANY, 1 mark=100 pfennig. HOLLAND, 1 florin or guilder=100 cents. NORWAY, SWEDEN, AND DENMARK, 1 kroner=100 ore. U. S. OF STATES, 1 dollar=100 cents. SPAIN, 1 peseta=100 centavos. AUSTRIA, 1 florin=100 kreuzer. PORTUGAL, 1 milreis=1000 reis. GREECE, 1 drachma=100 lepta. TURKEY, 1 piaster=40 paras. RUSSIA, 1 rouble=100 copecks.

Italian notes and silver are not current in France, Belgium, and Switzerland, but the silver of these countries passes current in Italy.


