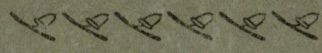

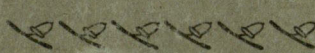

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SUGGESTIONS TO TEACHERS

"A Well Kept Register Indicates a Well Kept School."

Follow these distinctions exactly:

1. Make all entries with pen and ink.
2. E—Entered, and is placed in the record indicating the day the pupil enters school.
 - \—Absence in morning.
 - /—Absence in afternoon.
 - X—Absence the entire day.

(Do not record presence, simply absence.)

W—Withdrawal.

R—Re-entered.

Three days' absence equals withdrawal (marked XXW), unless the cause is known to the teacher on the first day's absence.

3. Tardiness should be indicated by writing the figure representing the number of minutes late in the upper half of the attendance space for tardiness in the forenoon; and in the lower half for tardiness in the afternoon.

4. The year or grade of a pupil should be determined by the greatest number of recitations the pupil has in any one year of the course of study; thus John Smith has four recitations in the fifth year, two in the sixth and one in the fourth, hence he is in the fifth year or grade.

5. The year in each branch should be carefully determined, so that all concerned may see at a glance the exact standing of the pupil in his work and conduct. Observe exactly the State Course of Study in the use of this Register.

6. The average daily attendance of any term or period is found by dividing the aggregate days' attendance by the number of days in the term or period.

7. The per cent. of attendance for any term or period is found by dividing the actual days' attendance by the possible days' attendance in the term or period.

8. Pupils should be counted as present on legal holidays.

9. Each teacher should fill out properly and in a business-like manner all of the blanks in the Register. A partial record of a school is almost as worthless as no record at all. "Good enough is the enemy of the best."
