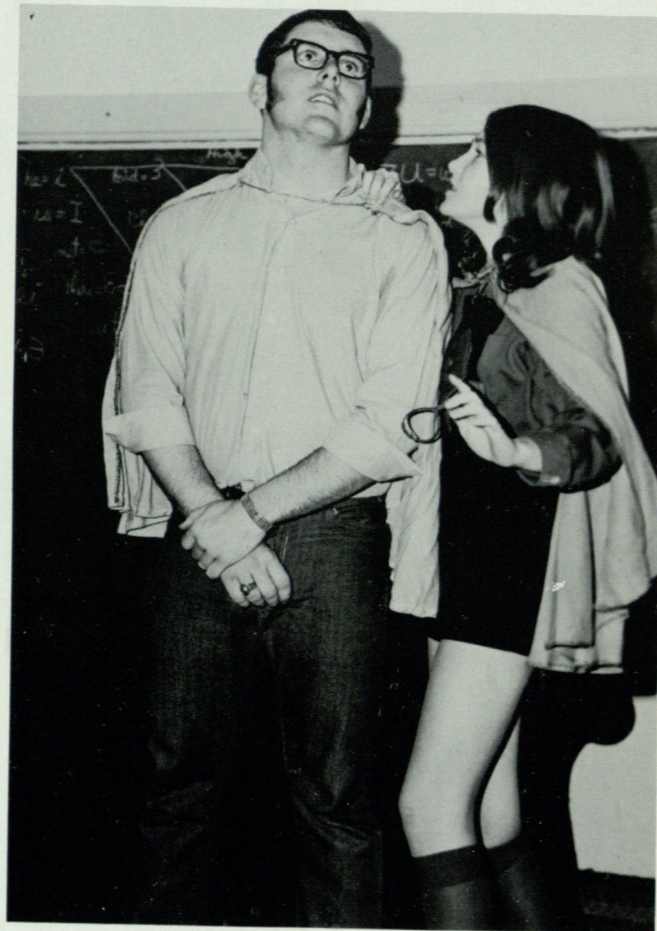

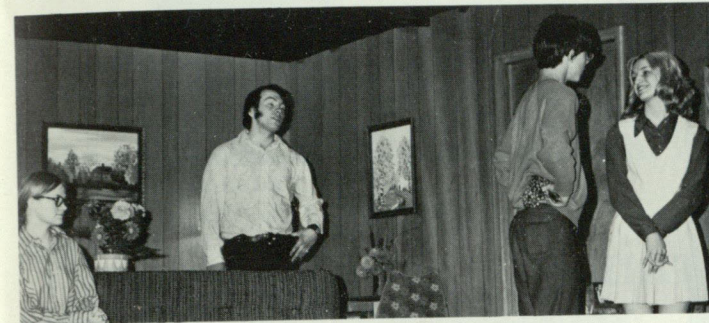

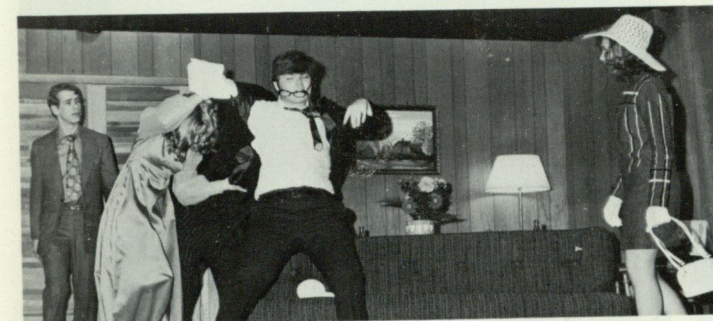

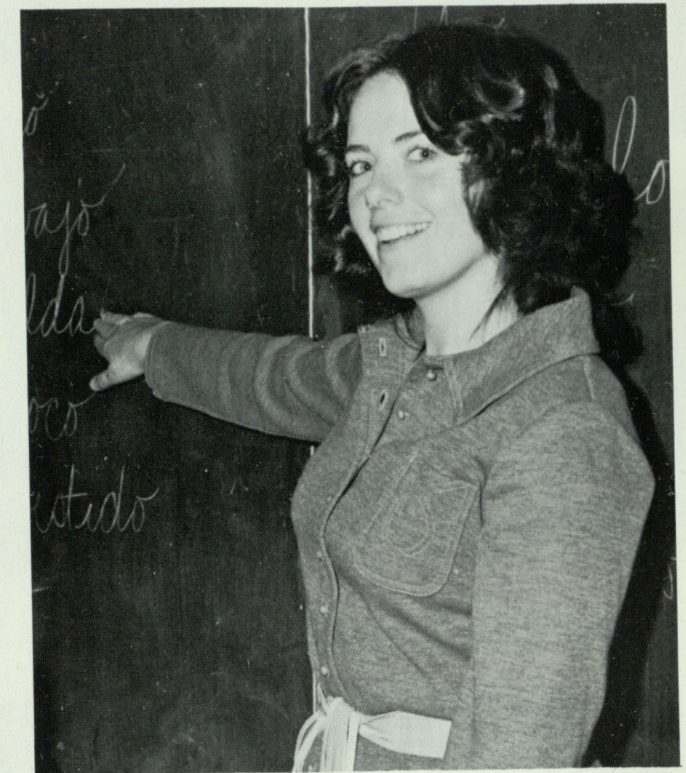

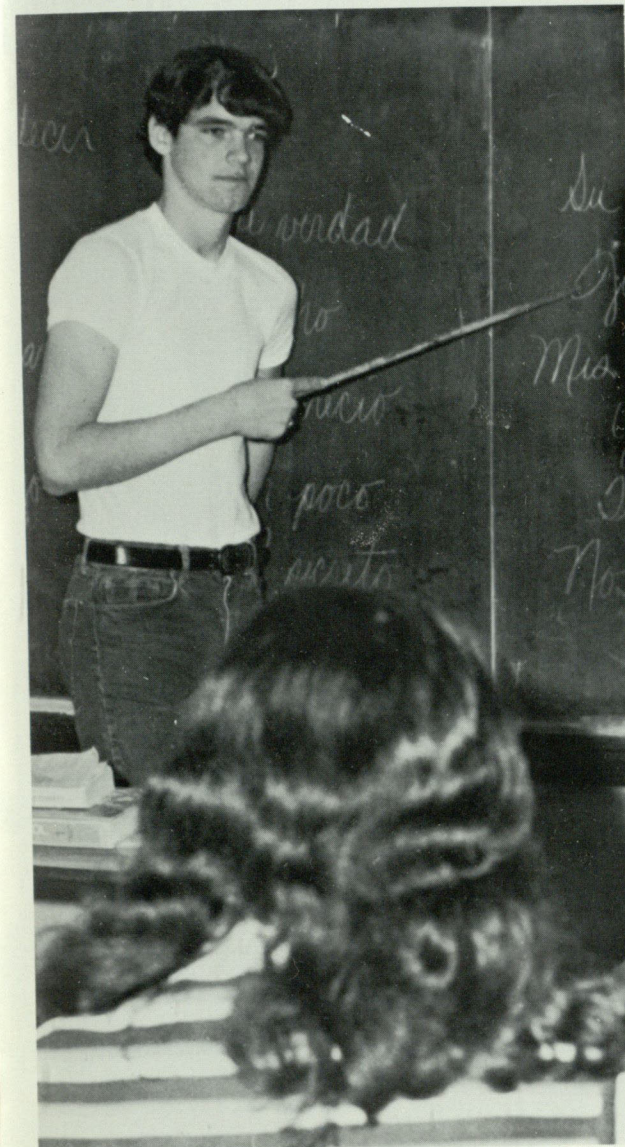


## Students Learn Spanish

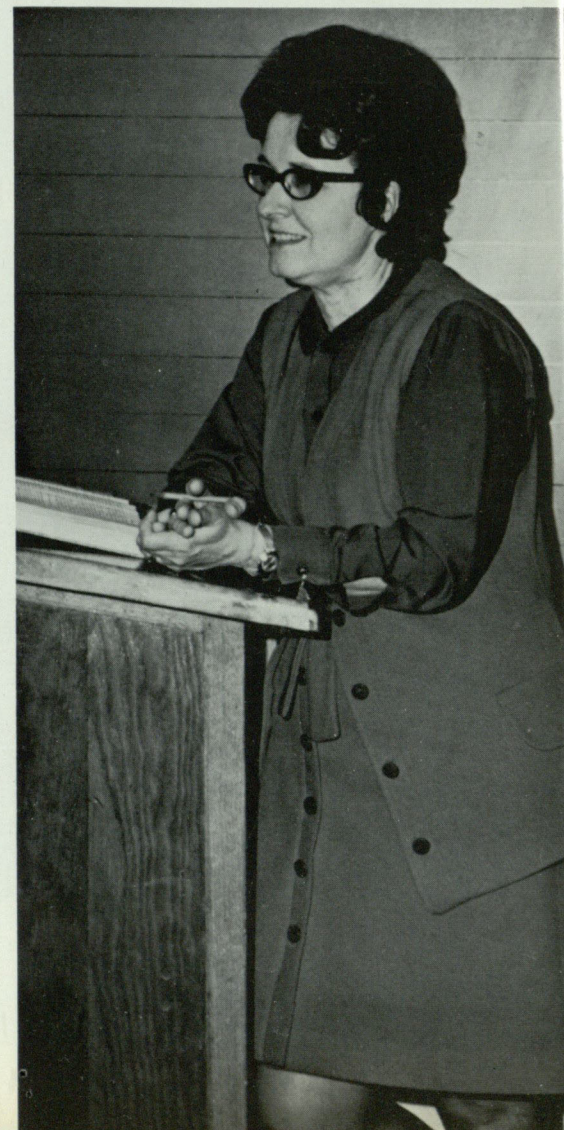

## English And Speech Help

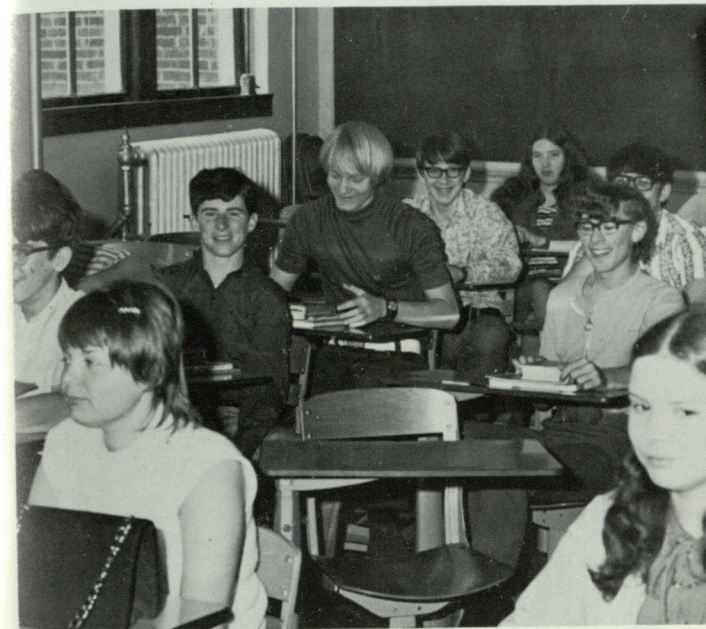

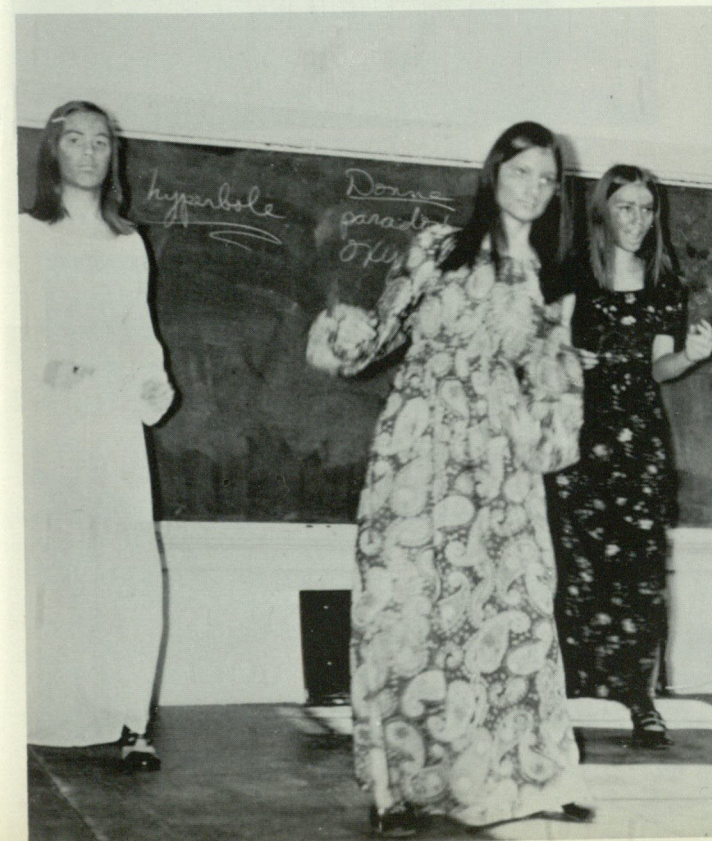

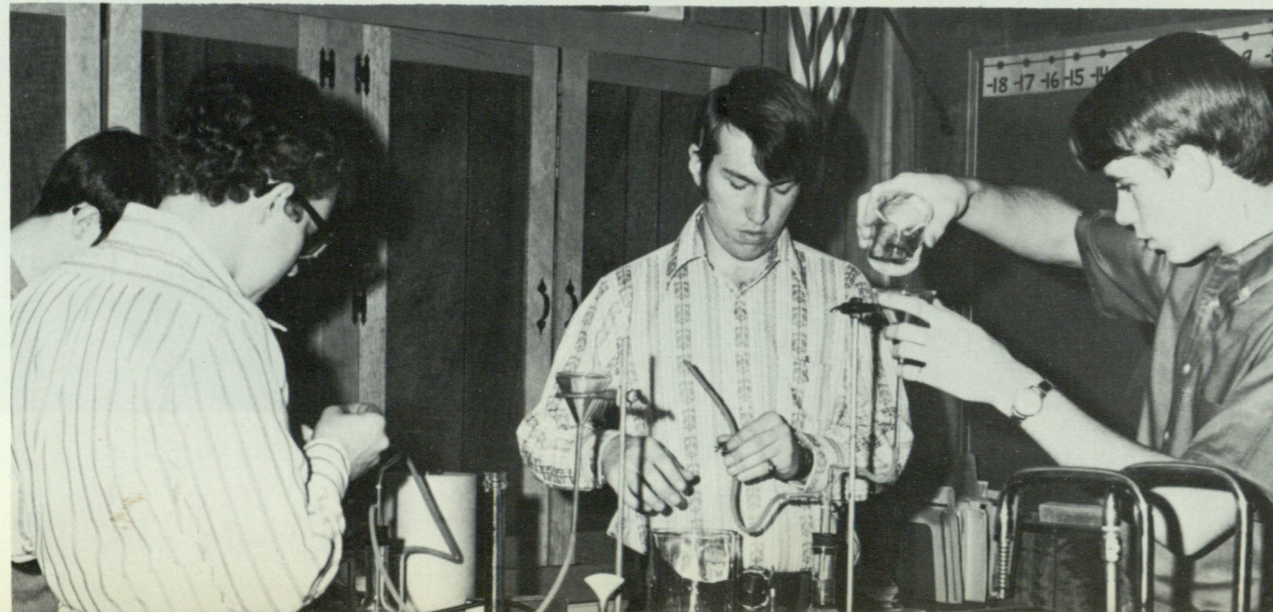
## Advanced Science And Math

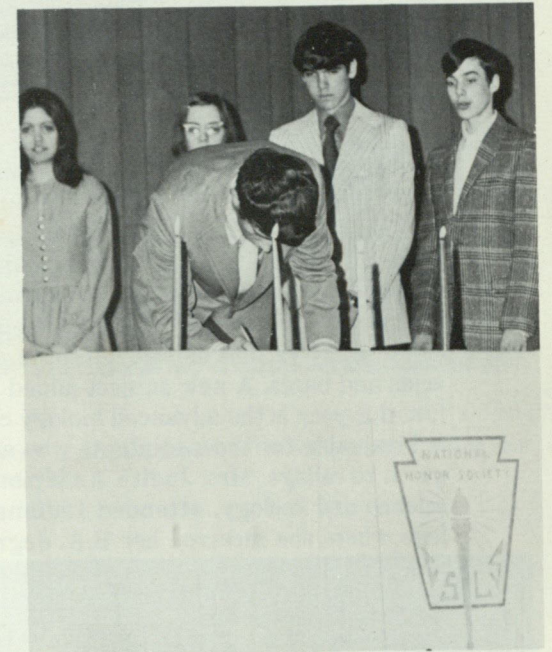

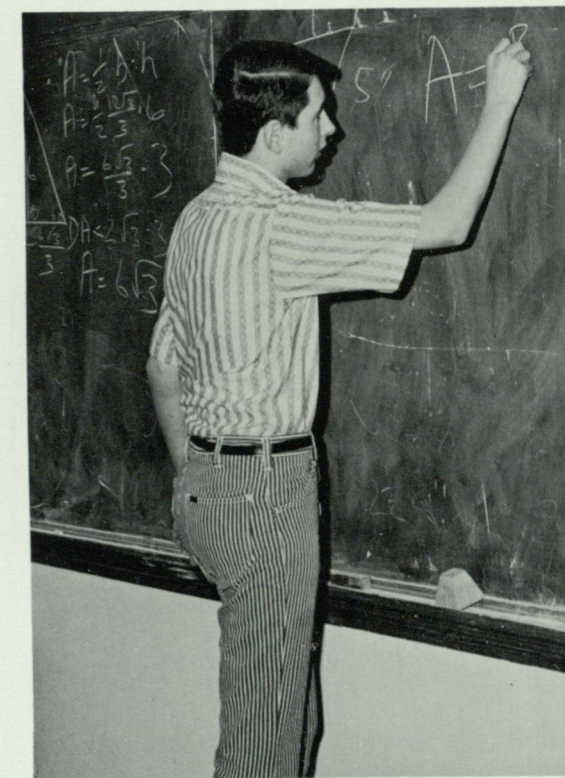

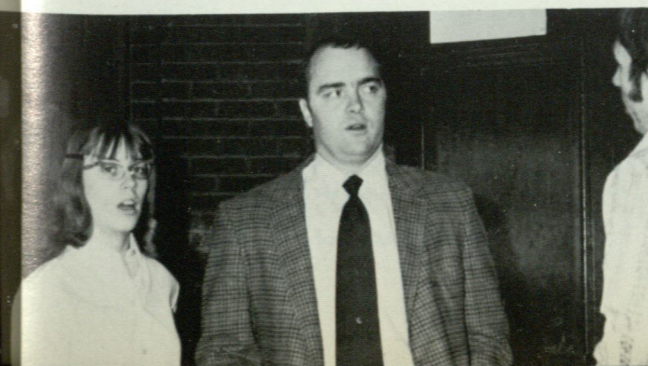

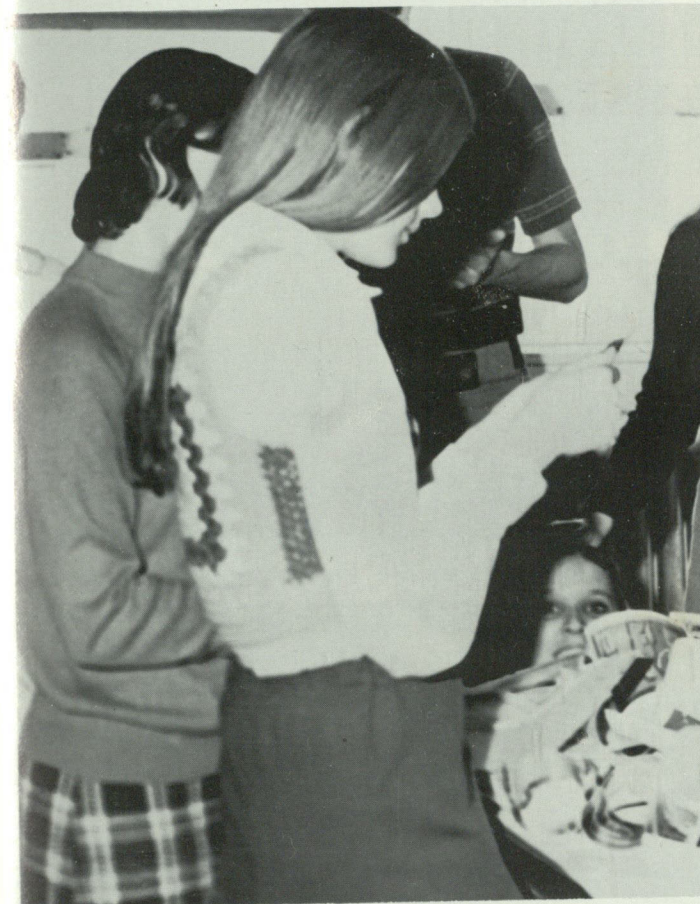

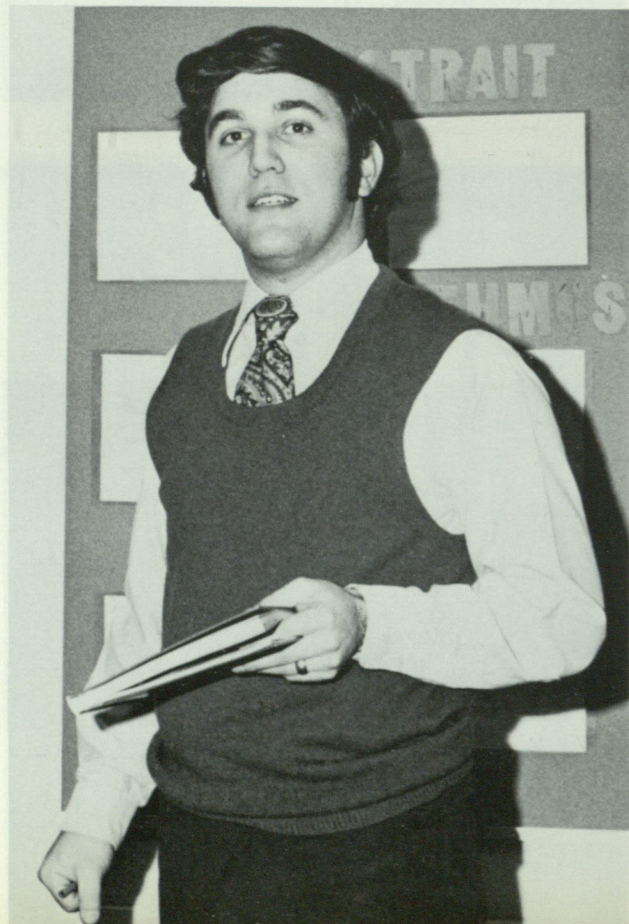

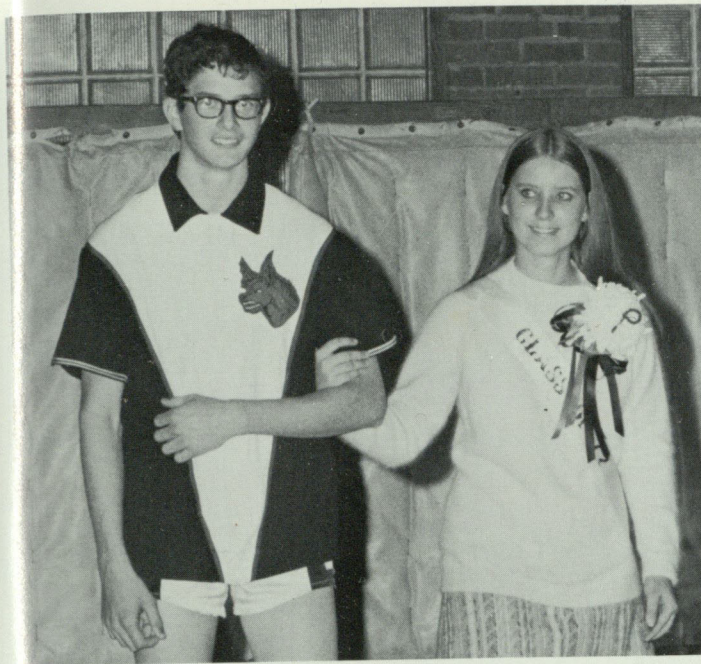


# Homecoming Climaxes Hours Of Preparation

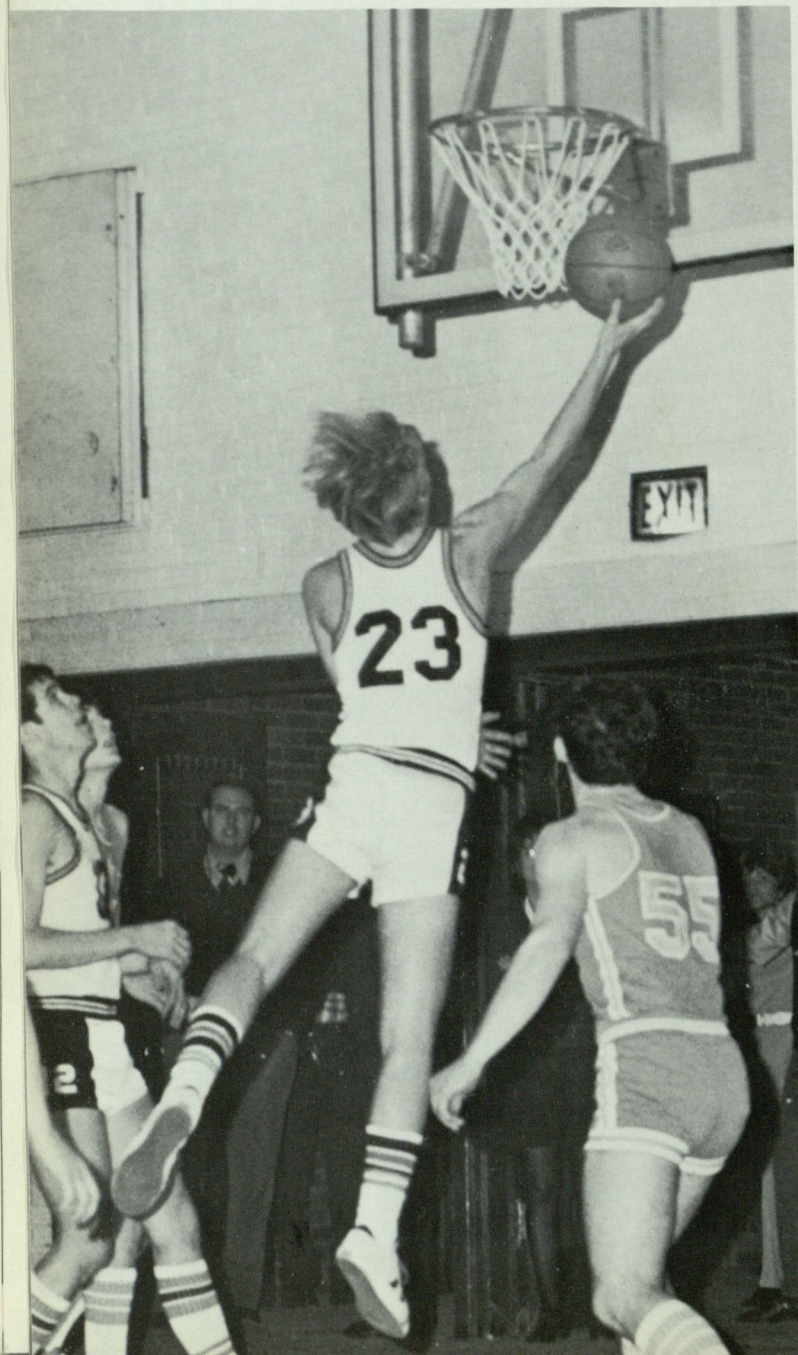

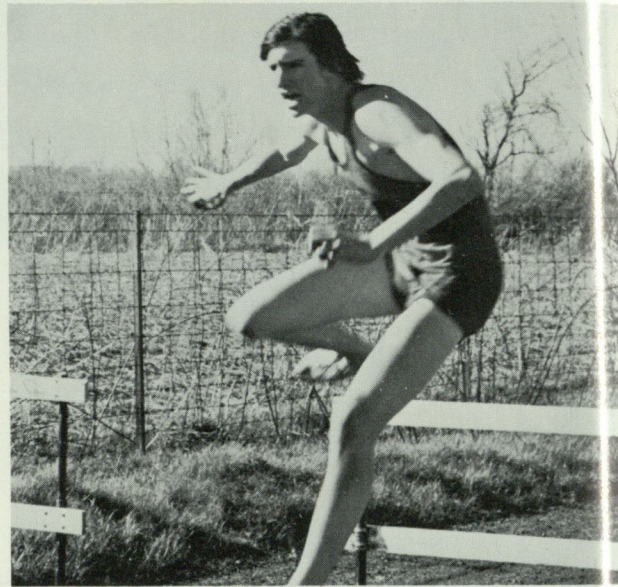
