## Truck Driver Who Hit School Bus Is Fined

NEW WINCHESTER, Ind. (Spl.)—  
A truck driver was fined \$23.25 in a  
Danville Justice of Peace Court to-  
day after his semitrailer plowed into  
the rear of a school bus, injuring 11  
New Winchester pupils.

William Anderson, 50, Lincoln,  
Ill., was charged with failure to stop  
for a loading school bus. He told  
officers his brakes failed.

The collision occurred on U.S. 36,  
a half-mile west of this Hendricks  
County community. A nurse living  
near the scene administered first aid.

Taken to Witham Hospital, Leb-  
anon, were Jo-Ellen Harmless, 13;  
Linda Heagy, 12; Wilma Burdine, 13,  
and Carol Barnes, 10. All were  
treated for cuts, bruises and shock,  
and the Burdine and Barnes girls  
were kept for observation.

Admitted at Putnam County Hos-  
pital in Greencastle were Sylvia

Stanley, 11; Ruthie Young, 16; Sarah  
Jane Kinneman, 13; Cynthia Smith,  
14; Nelson Baxter, 11; Joe Kinne-  
man, 11, and Gwenn Stanley, 17.  
State police said all except Gwenn  
Stanley had been released after  
treatment.

State police said the bus was stop-  
ping in front of a house. The impact  
shoved the loaded bus into the ditch,  
past Billy and Patricia Huntley, who  
were waiting to board the vehicle.

Sylvia Stanley and the Barnes girl,  
in the rear of the bus, were pinned  
in their seats. Mrs. Clara Kidney,  
the nurse, whose two sons were  
waiting for the bus down the road,

ran to the scene in her pajamas to  
administer first aid. Mrs. Huntley  
took some of the children into her  
home.

Both said the children behaved  
"very well" after the accident.  
"There was no panic," they added.

# Kills Are Hurt Ack Runs Into Sed School Bus

Accident Occurs  
On U. S. 36 in <sup>41.25</sup>  
Hendricks County <sup>1957</sup>

Faulty Brakes Believed to Be Cause  
Of Crash; Children Are Hospitalized

TEN school children were injured at 8:45 a. m. to-  
day when a tractor trailer rammed a stopped school  
bus on U. S. 36 a half mile west of New Winchester.  
The Hendricks County town is about 30 miles from

Indianapolis.  
EARLIER reports from  
state police indicated none  
of the 10 injured was in  
critical condition.

Seven of the children were  
taken to Putnam County Hos-  
pital in Greencastle. Three  
were taken to Wilham Me-  
morial Hospital in Lebanon,  
state police said.

There are no hospitals with-  
in Hendricks County.  
The children were en route  
to school in New Winchester,  
state police indicated.

Russell H. Rayburn, Hen-  
dricks County superintendent  
of schools, said early re-  
ports indicated at least one  
pupil suffered a broken leg.

He said "quite a few" were  
known to be cut by flying  
glass.

He said the bus, with about  
21 pupils aboard—was en route  
to New Winchester Grade and  
High School.

AN UNVERIFIED report  
received by Mr. Rayburn said  
the truck driver blamed the  
crash on faulty brakes. His  
name was not learned imme-  
diately.

Hospital at Greencastle in-
