Faulty Brakes Believed to Be Cause Of Crash; Children Are Hospitalized

TEN school children were injured at 8:45 a.m. toy when a tractor trailer rammed a stopped school ous on U. S. 36 a half mile west of New Winchester. The Hendricks County town is about 30 miles from

EARLIER reports from state police indicated none of the 10 injured was in critical condition.

Seven of the children were taken to Putnam County Hospital in Greencastle. Three were taken to Witham Memorial Hospital in Lebanon, state police said.

There are no hospitals with-in Hendricks County.

The children were en route to school in New Winchester, state police indicated. Russell H. Rayburn, Hendricks County superintendent of schools, said early reports indicated at least one pupil suffered a broken leg.

He said "quite a few" were known to be cut by flying glass.

He said the bus—with about 21 pupils aboard—was en route to New Winchester Grade and High School.

AN UNVERIFIED report received by Mr. Rayburn said the truck driver blamed the crash on faulty brakes. His name was not learned immediately.
