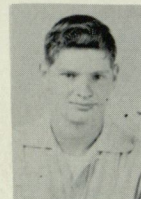

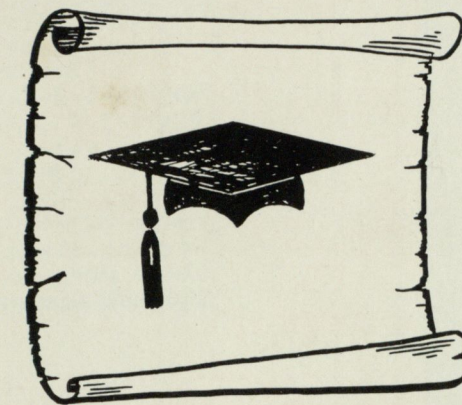

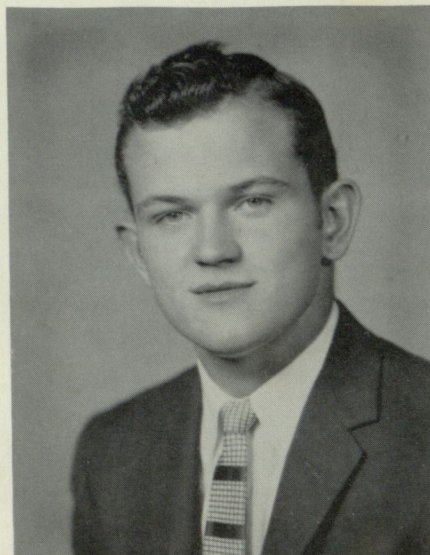
The sophomore year began with a good start as we elected as our sponsor, Mrs. Sarah Phelps. We lost quite a few classmates, but we still had sixteen left.

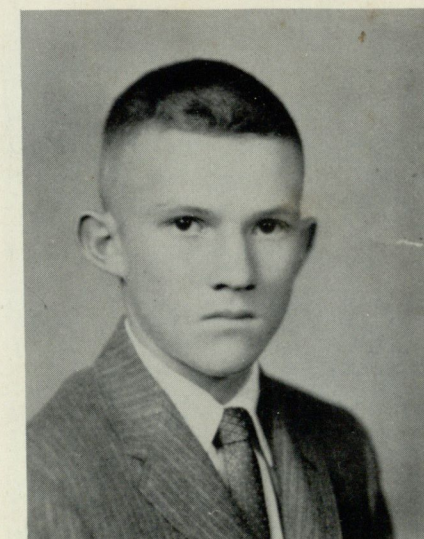
### Smith-Leonard

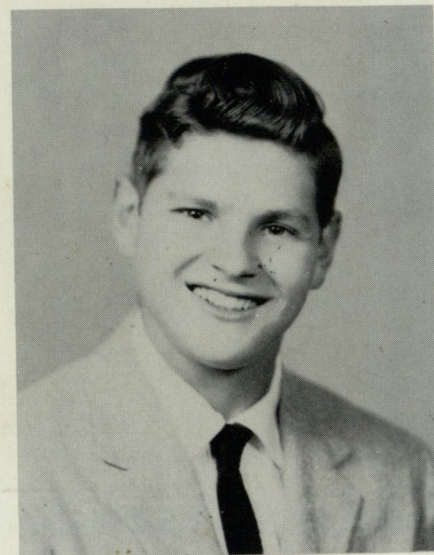

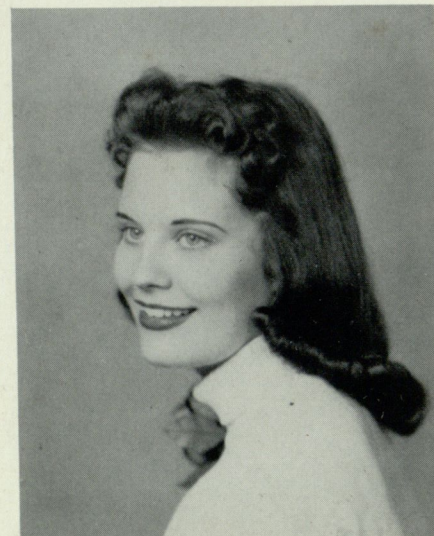
### Announce Engagement

I, Barney Russell, will my office job to Bobby Stowers and my ability to get into trouble to Sarah Myers.

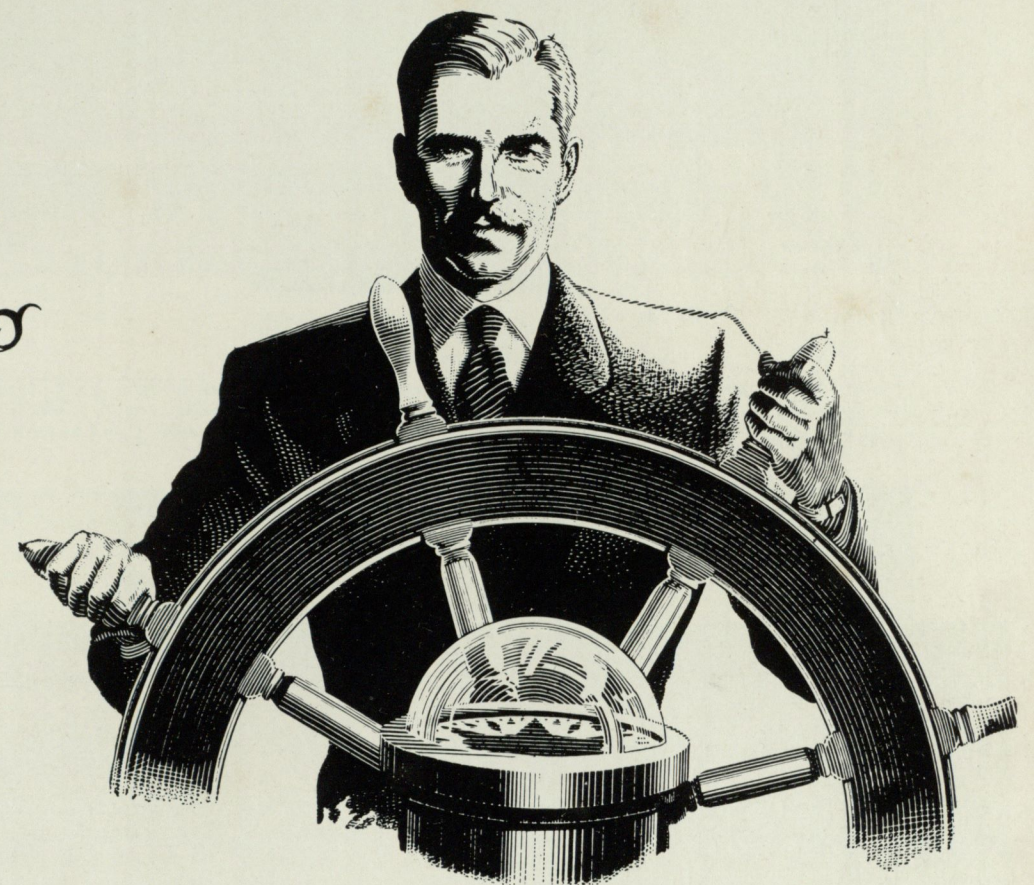
