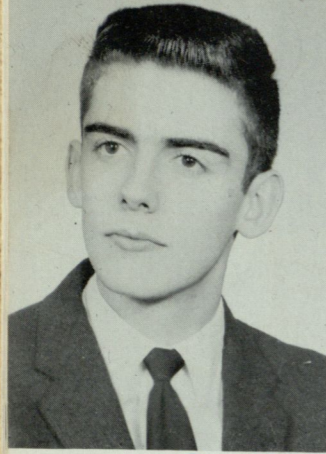


Saran Myers is Homemaker Girl
