Journeying half way around the Continent, we caught up with RONNIE REED. He was welding a fence around the world and had done all but a 5-mile stretch in Florida.


Next on the list was Hawaii. Among the palm trees and the coconuts we found WANDA McCOY. She was a Hawaiian Hula Dancer and had many admirers.
