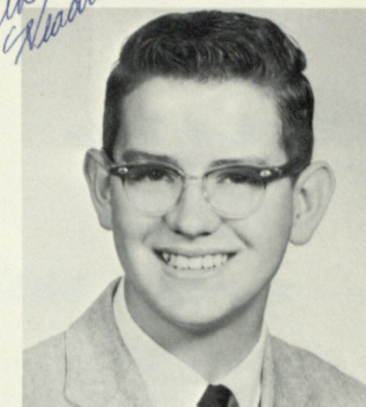
Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Leonard of near Hadley announce the engagement and approaching marriage of their daughter, Janice, to Dallas Summerlot.

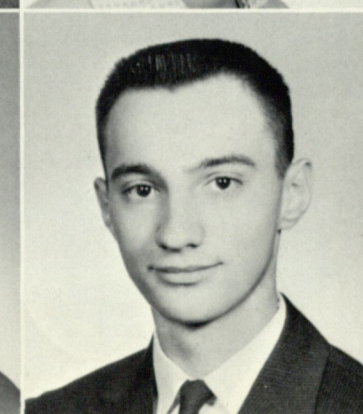

Many thoughts and memories remain with them as they and their classmates take another step toward success.

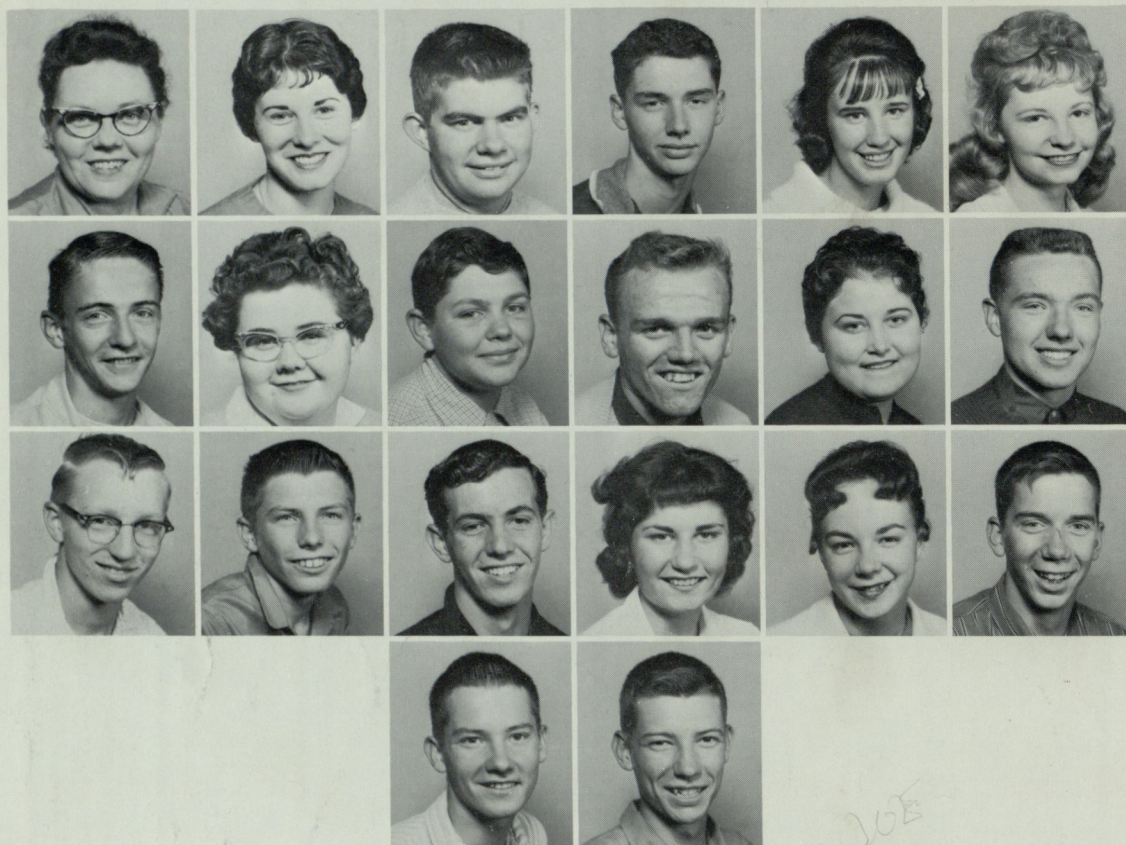
