Those who were in the class last year are progressing much faster. Those who were not are finding it easier to progress at their individual rate. All are taking advantage of this special opportunity.

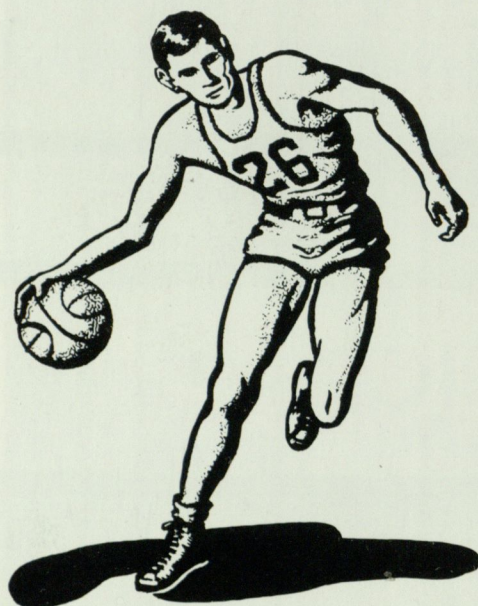
