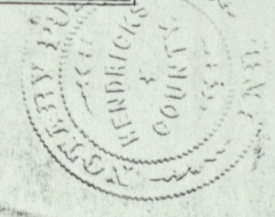

ORGANIZATION CERTIFICATE.

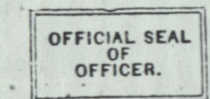
