We have examined to accompanying abstract to 53 1/2 feet out of the center of lot 2 in Block 4 in Crawfords addition to the town of Danville and find the title of the same to be in William E. and Mary F. Wise.

We note the following irregularities:-

First. There is nothing of record to show how title passed from James Wood to Thomas Walls. There are two affidavits showing adverse possession for a long period of time, more than sufficient to give title by adverse possession, but this does not close up the gap as a record title. There is also a transcript of a judgment quieting title in Mary J. Crawford, the wife of Francis R. Crawford to said real estate but this was at a time subsequent to the conveyance of said real estate by said Francis R. Crawford and would probably be of no force so far as this property is concerned.

Second. The plat of Crawfords addition to the town of Danville, of which this is a part is laid out as in the North West quarter of section 3 instead of the South West quarter where it in fact is. This defect could only be cured by adverse possession of which there is no proof by affidavit or otherwise.

Third. We also note a deed of correction by Mary E. Ayers at no 16 which would indicate that previous deeds were wrong in description. If such is the case the heirs of William P. Ayers, who ~~quit~~ conveyed to Mary E. Ayers at no 11 should have joined in the deed of correction as they conveyed to Mary E. Ayers by erroneous description.

An Ordinance to compel owners of lots fronting on Main Street between Cross and Wayne Streets to grade, Curb pave or gravel the same unimproved sidewalks of said Street

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Danville that the owners of lots fronting on and adjacent to Main Street between Cross and Wayne Streets shall grade, Curb pave and pave the all unimproved sidewalks of ~~said street~~ within of said street fronting such lots within ~~20~~ 20 days from the taking effect of this ordinance.

Sec. 2. Sec. 4. That when any person or persons may be desirous of having any grade established within the limits of said Town they shall apply by petition to said Board of Trustees, setting forth the part to be established which petition shall be referred to

a committee who shall in conjunction with the Town Surveyor report a suitable grade for the same and the said Board shall take such further order thereon by resolution or otherwise as the nature of the case may require.

Sec. 5. An Ordinance to levy a tax for the year 1859 and providing for the collection thereof —

Whereas it is necessary to levy a tax for the year 1859 to enable the Trustees of the Town of Danville in Hendricks County in the State of Indiana to fully carry into effect the object of said Corporation.

County a copy of the assessment of the property as aforesaid for the year 1859 and that he from the said assessment and the assessment made by the Marshall as aforesaid make two duplicates and thereon charge the respective owners, ^{the tax so assessed as aforesaid,} together with the polls aforesaid and within twenty days from and after the passage of this ordinance deliver ^{with a warrant annexed} one of said duplicates to the Marshall of the Town of Danville and the other to the Treasurer of said Town.

Be it further ordained that the Marshall shall upon the receipt of the duplicate give notice by a written ^{advertisement} notice posted up in each ward setting out the amount of tax levied on each hundred dollars and the poll - and proceed forthwith to collect the taxes so assessed upon the duplicate as aforesaid.

Provided always that the tax, penalty damages and cost levied and accruing shall be a lien upon all property Real and personal assessed as aforesaid from and after the assessment so made.

Be it further ordained in case any person shall refuse or neglect to pay the tax imposed on him or her, the Marshall shall after the first day of April next levy the

same together with ten per centum damages and the costs and accruing costs by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of such person who ought to pay the same after having given ten days notice by posting up five ^{advertisements} written notices, in said Town of Danville and sell a sufficient amount of the property so levied upon to satisfy said taxes penalty and costs without any valuation or appraisement of said property so levied upon

An Ordinance to make and establish By-laws to carry into effect the provisions of an Act ^{of the Legislature of the State of Kentucky passed June 11th 1812} entitled ~~an act~~ for the incorporation of Towns, defining their powers, providing for the election of the officers thereof and declaring their duties"

Sec 1. Be it ordained By, the Trustees of the Town of Danville that the officers of said Town of Danville shall consist of ^{Trustees,} a Treasurer, a Clerk ^{and an assessor,} and a Marshal, ~~and a surveyor,~~ who shall be elected annually on the first Monday in May of each year, and shall respectively hold their offices until the first Monday in May following or until their successors are elected and qualified. The said Trustees shall consist of one Trustee from each district.

Sec 2. The Clerk shall give ^{of such elections,} 'Ten day' notice by publication in a newspaper printed within ^{said} Town, naming the place therein and the day upon which the same shall be had.

Sec 3. The Trustees of the preceding board ^{or any three of them shall act as inspectors of such election,} ~~or any three of them shall act as inspectors of such election,~~ and in receiving and canvassing the votes shall be governed by the laws then existing, so far as they are applicable, for the election of township officers.

Sec 4. The persons having the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected and if two or more shall have an equal number of votes for the respective offices of Trustee, Clerk, Marshal, ^{assessor,} and Treasurer as designated by the ballot for such office, shall be declared to be elected; and if two or more shall have an equal and highest number of votes, and there be no choice, the inspectors of such election shall forthwith determine by lot which shall be deemed elected, and it shall be the duty of such inspectors to make a certified statement over their own signatures of the persons elected to fill the offices of said Town and file the same with the Clerk of the Circuit Court of ^{County} ~~the County~~ within Ten days from such election, and it is the duty of said clerk to make a record of

Sec 5. No act or ordinance of any Board of Trustees chosen at such election shall be valid until the provisions of the ^{act, preceding} ~~act~~ are substantially complied with

Sec 6. A vacancy occurring in the Board of Trustees or any Corporation office shall be filled by appointment at any special meeting of the Trustees called for that purpose; but the appointment of any Trustee shall be made from the district in which the vacancy ~~occurs~~ has occurred, and shall not in no case shall ~~such appointment~~ ^{such appointment} extend beyond the next annual election.

Sec 7. The Board of Trustees shall elect a President from their own body and such President, Trustees and all other officers elected shall within five days after such election take and subscribe ~~and before some~~ before some person authorized to administer the same ^{the usual} ~~an oath~~ or affirmation for the faithful performance of the duties of their respective offices

Sec 8. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board

Sec 8. of Trustees any three of whom shall constitute a quorum to do business; he shall sign all minutes of the proceedings of the board. All laws and ordinances ~~and~~ passed by the same all ~~and~~ warrants upon the Treasurer for money authorized to be drawn therefrom by the Board, and call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees by giving notice to the Clerk of the time and place who shall ~~come~~ ^{shall} notify the members thereof

Upon the return of the assessment roll he shall put up notices in three or more public places in said Town stating that the assessment roll is returned and open for inspection, and that on a day and at a place specified therein the Trustees will hear and decide all complaints of and appeals from the acts of the assessor.

The ~~following~~ Marshall shall possess the powers, and be subject to the liabilities and liabilities and ~~be~~ possessed by and conferred by law upon Constables, in executing the ~~the~~ orders of the Trustees or enforcing the by-laws and ordinances of said Town. ^{In case he shall hold the office of assessor} He shall assess all property liable to taxation in said Town under such rules and regulations as the Trustees may prescribe and shall make return of his assessment roll to such board on or before the second Tuesday in June of each year. He shall collect all taxes on the duplicate when so required; and shall have the same power to enforce collections, to collect by distress and sale and to make conveyances and certificates of Real estate sold by virtue of such sale which sale ~~if at a Court seat~~ shall be at the door of the Court house or place of holding courts and the Clerk shall perform all the like duties at said sale ~~for~~ as are required of the County Auditor at a sale for State and County taxes ~~and all debts~~ which sales and collections shall be governed by the same rules and regulations as County Treasurers and County Auditors. He shall receive all monies for licenses authorized by the ^{duplicate} any laws or ordinances of said Town and give receipt for the same one of which he shall ~~immediately~~ ^{forthwith} be delivered to the Clerk, and the other to the Treasurer who shall issue a license therefor. He shall pay over all monies ~~by him~~ received into the hands of the Treasurer and take his

But the Trustees may deliver the tax duplicate to the Auditor of Mendocino County on or before the first day of August in each year, instead of the Marshal, to collect enter such tax, and if delinquent the interest and penalty thereon upon his duplicate. They shall superintend the grading and paving and improving of streets and building and repairing of sidewalks.
