


1. The following blank for report to successor has been approved and adopted by the State Board of Education, and County Superintendents have been instructed by the State Board of Education to take such measures as will insure its proper use in all township schools.
2. It is the duty of the teacher using this Register to fill out this blank report in full at the close of the term and hand it to the Trustee, and thus leave a record of the condition of the school for his successor.
3. In filling the blanks on pages 2 and 3, write the pupil's name plainly, state the time he entered school, (as, Nov. 2 or Dec. 14, etc.,) the time he left school permanently, the number of times he was tardy, and the number of *half days* he was absent, and make a record of the number of pages of the book in each branch of study which each pupil has mastered. In doing this use the *letters* only in designating the branches of study. For example: John Smith entered school October 20th and left January 7; he was tardy 9 times, and was absent 13 half days; he advanced in his studies as follows, viz: Primary Speller, to page 10; Third Reader, to page 40; Primary Arithmetic, to page 94; Primary Geography, to page 22, and Primary Grammar, to page 29. His record would be made up thus:
