


Now at this time come the parties by their attorneys, and the court being sufficiently advised of the premises, Order that the Order of the board made upon the objection of Predell Jackson refusing to grant an order for the opening of the public highway in the record described be reversed at the costs of the Appellant Wood, and that this case be remanded to said board with directions to ascertain whether or not the notices required by the 12th and 15th sections of the road law were properly and duly given, and make the evidence of such notices or either of them a matter of record, that if the notices required by the said 12th section has not been given, the Board dismiss the original petition; that if such notice as required by said 12th section has been given, and the notice required by said 15th section has not been given the said Board proceed to require such notice to be given, and thereafter proceed according to law; and that if both said notices have been given, said Board take order for the assessment of damages, in favor of the Appellant Predell Jackson, as directed by the 19th section of said law, and thereafter proceed according to law, And it is further Ordered that each party pay the costs of their own

All Roads within the following described boundaries shall form and constitute the first district, commencing at the North East corner of section twenty nine (29) Town 15 north, of range 1 east, thence west to the North West corner of the North East quarter of section twenty five (25) Town 15 north, of range 1 west, thence south to the South West corner of the South East quarter of section thirty six (36) Town 15, one west, thence east to the South East corner of section thirty two (32) Town 15 north of range 1 east, thence north to the place of beginning.

2^d Road District.

All roads within the following boundaries, and such as may be on the boundary lines, shall form and constitute the second road district, commencing at the Amended so, North East corner of the North West quarter of section as to include twenty five (25) Town 15 north of range 1 west, thence the east half west to the North West corner of section twenty six (26) of sections, Town 15 north of range 1 west, thence south to the South 27 & 34 inst. West corner of the North West qr. of section thirty five 15. 1. 4th Road District.

All roads within the following boundaries, and such as may be on the boundary lines, shall form and

constitute the fourth road district, commencing at the North East corner of the North West quarter of section twenty eight (28) Town 15 north of range 1 west, thence west to the North West corner of section twenty nine (29) thence south to the South West corner of section thirty two (32) Town 15 north of range 1 west, thence East to the South East corner of the North West quarter of section thirty three (33) Town 15 north of range 1 west, thence North to the place of beginning.

5th Road District.

All roads within the following boundaries, and such as may be on the boundary lines, (except on the north line) shall form and constitute the fifth road district, commencing at the North East corner of the North West quarter of section four (4) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence west to the North West corner of section five (5) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence south to the South West corner of section eight (8) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence East to the South East corner of the South West quarter of section nine (9) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence North to the place of beginning,

6th Road District.

All roads within the following boundaries, shall form and constitute the sixth road district, commencing at the North East corner of the South West quarter of section three (3) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence west to the North West corner of the South East quarter of section four (4) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence south to the South West corner of the South East quarter of section nine (9) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence East to the South East corner of section ten (10) T. 14 N. of range 1 west, thence North to the place of beginning.

7th Road District.

All roads within the following boundaries, shall form and constitute the seventh road district, Beginning at the North East corner of section one (1) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence west to the North West corner of section two (2) Town 14 north of range 1 west, thence south to the North side of the National Road, thence following the North side of said road until it intersects the section line between sections one and two, T. 14 N. R. 1 W. thence south to the

south side of the National road, thence following the south side of said road to the Meridian line, thence North to the place of beginning.

8th Road District.

All roads within the following boundaries, shall form and constitute the eighth road district. Beginning at the south west corner of section twelve (12) T. 14 N. of range 1 west, thence west to the south west corner of section eleven (11) T. 14 N. R. 1 west, thence North to the north side of the National road, thence following the north side of said road until it intersects the line between sections one and two, T. 14 N. R. 1 W. thence South to the south side of the National road, thence following the south side of said road to the Meridian line, thence South to the place of beginning.

9th Road District.
